OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-6) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (8-12)

FRIDAY, AUGUST 14, 2020 — ORACLE PARK — 6:45 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's lost two of three at Los Angeles (AL) to start the road trip after winning a season-high nine straight...are now 13-6 (.684) for the season, which is the second best record in the majors to the Cubs (13-3, .813)...it matches the 2014 club for the best record by an A's team after 19 games over the last 30 years...with a win tonight, the A's would have the best record after 20 games since the 1990 club was 15-5...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 11th consecutive day and are four games ahead of second place Texas for the third consecutive day...that is one short of the season high of five on Aug. 9...have held at least a share of first place for 19 of 21 days this year (11 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19...the A's nine-game winning streak from Aug. 1-9 was the longest in the majors this year and tied for ninth longest in Oakland history...it matched the second longest winning streak by an A's team over the last 14 years (11, May 16-27, 2019)...swept a pair of three-game series from Texas and Houston on the last homestand...the sweeps were the A's first two sweeps of the season.

FUN WITH SMALL SAMPLE SIZES: Tonight's game is the A's 20th of the season, which is the one-third mark of the schedule...Oakland's 13 wins over the first 19 games are the equivalent of 110.8 victories over a 162-game season...have been hit by a pitch 16 times, which would be 136.4 in 162 games (Major League record since 1900 is 103 by Cleveland in 2008)...Matt Olson and Matt Chapman have six home runs, which is the equivalent of 51.2 in a 162-game season (Oakland record is 52 by Mark McGwire in 1996)...Ramon Laureano has been hit by a pitch six times, or 51.1 over 162 games (ML record since 1900 is 50 by the Expos Ron Hunt in 1971).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 0-2 in interleague play (0-2 vs. Colorado) compared to 13-4 against the American League...tonight's game is the first of seven consecutive games against the National League West...travel to Arizona following the game Sunday for a two-game series and then return home to host the Diamondbacks for two games on Wednesday and Thursday...will also travel to Colorado (Sept. 15-16) and Los Angeles (Sept. 22-24) and will host San Diego (Sept. 4-6) and San Francisco (Sept. 18-20)...the A's went 11-9 (.550) in interleague play last year, which tied for the 10th best record in the majors...are 228-198 (.535) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHING: The A's allowed 20 runs in the three-game series at Los Angeles (AL) after yielding just 19 runs over the first nine games in August...have a 3.31 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the majors behind Cleveland (2.32) and the Dodgers (2.57)...have the fifth lowest opponents OPS (.654), slugging percentage (.367) and on-base percentage (.287) and the 10th lowest batting average (.230)...surrendered 10 home runs in the three games against the Angels after yielding just nine over the first 16 contests...are tied for fifth in the majors in fewest home runs (19)...are tied for second in the majors in fewest hit batters (2) and rank fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.74).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .240 (80-for-334) with 58 runs scored and 19 home runs over the last 10 games after batting .188 with 30 runs and seven home runs over the first nine contests...are hitting .216 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...however, rank second in walks (84), third in hit by pitches (16) and ninth in on-base percentage (.324)...have hit 18 home runs in the last nine games and are tied for ninth in home runs (26)...have been successful in 11-of-13 (84.6%) stolen base attempts...rank sixth in the majors in stolen base percentage and eighth in steals...are 9-for-22 (.409) with two home runs and 26 RBI with the bases loaded...lead the majors in hits and RBI with the bases loaded and are tied for the lead in home runs.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's extended their errorless streak to nine games on Wednesday, which is tied for the sixth longest errorless streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since finishing the 2019 season with an 11-game streak...made six errors over their first 10 contests and the six errors are tied for fourth fewest in the majors...have the third best fielding percentage (.991)...have turned just nine double plays, which is tied with the Twins for second fewest to the Cardinals (1 in 5 games)...A's outfielders have four assists, which is tied for fourth most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on their second road trip of the season, an eight-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), San Francisco (three games) and Arizona (two games)...went 3-1 on their first road trip to Seattle and are 4-3 (.571) on the road...this trip begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to

play 18 of 23 games on the road...played 12 of their first 16 games at home where they are 9-3...went 6-0 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and Houston (3-0) for their first undefeated homestand of six or more games since July 3-8, 2014 when they went 4-0 against Toronto and 2-0 against San Francisco...have a six-game home winning streak, which matches their longest home winning streak over the last two years (July 4-17, 2019 and Aug. 1-17, 2019).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost their first one-run decision of the season Monday night and are now 3-1 in one-run games...are tied for sixth in the majors in one-run wins...are 7-2 in games decided by two runs or fewer...are 3-0 in extra inning games...have the most extra inning wins and are tied for the third most games...have scored seven runs in extra innings, which is the most in the majors...are 4-1 in games decided in the last at bat and the four wins are tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the majors...lead the majors with three walk-off wins, two of which are grand slams.

THIS AND THAT: Yesterday was the A's second off-day of the season (also July 30)...it was their only off-day during a 31-day stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30...are 10-3 over the first 13 games of this stretch and will play 17 consecutive days before their next day off on Aug. 31...are 5-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 8-6 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied with the Cubs, Reds and Rockies for the most in the majors...are 13-2 when homering, 0-4 when going homerless...are one of five teams that has not won a game when going homerless (Pirates, Cardinals, Phillies, Yankees)...are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have two players on the injured list (Puk, Weems) and have used the IL three times this year...used it 17 times last year, which tied Houston for the second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (13)...began the season with one player on the injured list (Puk), which marked the first time Oakland had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

TAXI SQUAD: The A's taxi squad for this road trip features right-handed pitchers Paul Blackburn and James Kaprielian, catcher Jonah Heim, infielder Sheldon Neuse and outfielder Seth Brown...Heim was on the taxi squad for the first trip and Kaprielian was on the active roster Aug. 4 and 5...all five players are on the A's 40-man roster.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's went 1-3 against the Giants last year for their first season series loss to San Francisco since 2015 (1-5)...lost both games in Oakland and split two games in San Francisco...are 7-7 over the previous three years...over the previous 23 seasons of interleague play, the A's have won eight season series, lost five and split 10...are 64-60 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 36-26 in Oakland and 28-34 in San Francisco...are 24-31 at Oracle Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is tied for the Major League lead in extra base hits (13) and triples (2), ranks fourth in total bases (48) and tied for seventh in home runs (6)...**Robbie Grossman** has hit safely in each of his last five games and is 7-for-15 (.467) with two doubles, three home runs, four RBI, seven walks, two hit by pitches and two stolen bases over that span...**Liam Hendriks** is tied for second in the majors in saves (5)...has a streak of 28 consecutive games with a strikeout, which breaks his own Athletics record for consecutive games with a strikeout by a reliever (27, June 8-Aug. 14, 2019)...**Yusmeiro Petit** ranks second in the majors in games pitched (11) and leads the majors with 165 games pitched over the last three seasons...**Burch Smith** not allowed a run in his first five appearances (10.1 ip) and opponents are 4-for-35 (.114) with a walk...his innings pitched are second most in the majors among pitchers that have not allowed a run (Keller, KC 11.0)...**Joakim Soria** is tied for second among relievers in the West and tied for 10th in the majors in strikeouts (14).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1933 Jimmie Foxx hits for the cycle and drives in nine runs in the A's 11-5 win over Cleveland...in 1987 Mark McGwire breaks the Major League rookie home run record with his 39th of the season, a two-run shot in the sixth inning of the A's 7-6 win at California...he would go on to hit what was then an Oakland record 49 round trippers.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: **Jesús Luzardo (1-0, 2.60 ERA)**

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth appearance and third start of the season...has gone 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (2 er in 10.2 ip) over his last two starts after posting a 4.05 ERA over his first two appearances, both in relief... is in his second season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster.

IN RELIEF: Made his first appearance of 2020 on July 25 against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland...entered the game to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 4-0 and tossed what was then a career-high tying 3.0 scoreless innings... pitched in relief again July 29 against Colorado in Oakland in a 5-1 A's loss in his first career interleague appearance...struck out a career-high five in 3.2 innings...also had career highs in hits (5), runs (3) and earned runs (3) and matched his high in walks (2)...allowed a run in the eighth inning to snap a career-high 12.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2019.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his first Major League start, a 5-1 A's win over Texas on Aug. 4 in Oakland...at the age of 22 years and 309 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to start a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...tossed a career-high 5.0 scoreless innings and matched his high with five strikeouts and two walks...retired each of the first six batters and allowed just two base runners into scoring position...was relieved by Petit to start the sixth inning with the score tied 0-0.

LAST START: He recorded his first Major League win in the A's 7-2 victory over Houston last Sunday in Oakland...at the age of 22 years and 314 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to win a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...tossed a career-high 89 pitches in a career-high 5.2 innings and matched his high with five strikeouts and five hits... blanked the Astros on two hits over the first three innings before allowing a two-run home run to Gurrriel in the fourth...those were the only runs he would allow in 5.2 innings.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA and .143 opponents batting average in three starts this spring...struck out 13 batters and walked just one in 8.1 innings...did not pitch in either of the two July exhibition games against San Francisco.

2019 RECAP: Had his season interrupted twice by a strained left shoulder but, after going 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games (nine starts) with three minor league teams, he was selected by Oakland on Sept. 9 after Las Vegas concluded its season...had no decisions, two saves, a 1.50 ERA and .119 opponents batting average in six relief appearances in his Major League debut...struck out 16 batters in 12.0 innings (12.00 per nine innings) and walked just three for a .196 on-base percentage...allowed two doubles and one home run for a .238 slugging percentage...left-handed hitters were 1-for-14 (.071) with no extra base hits, one walk and a .205 OPS...right-handed hitters batted .143 (4-for-28) with a .547 OPS...opponents hit .138 with his lone home run with the bases empty, .077 with runners on...they were 1-for-8 (.125) with runners in scoring position... allowed a .095 average with two strikes...did not inherit any runners and first batters faced were 1-for-5 (.200) with a walk.

2019 WITH OAKLAND: Made his debut on Sept. 11 at Houston and tossed a season-high 3.0 innings...allowed one run on one hit, a Martin Maldonado solo home run in the sixth inning...did not walk a batter and struck out two... fanned the first batter he faced, Aledmys Díaz...at the age of 21 years, 346 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher since Brett Anderson on Oct. 1, 2009 (21 years, 242 days)...became the first player born in Peru in ML history...in his second outing, he tossed the final three innings of the A's 6-1 win at Texas on Sept. 15 for his first professional save...at the age of 21 years, 350 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to save a game since Houston Street on July 8, 2005 (21 years, 340 days)...allowed one run and struck out a

season-high four...did not allow a run over his final four games and finished the season with a 7.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed 1.0 inning twice, 2.0 innings twice and 3.0 innings twice...tossed 3.0 scoreless innings of relief in the AL Wild Card game on Oct. 2 against Tampa Bay (1 h, 2 bb, 4 so)...the appearance came two days after his 22nd birthday, making him the second-youngest pitcher in Oakland postseason history...Rich Harden had two outings in 2003, with the youngest coming at 21 years and 305 days...was rated as the A's number one prospect by *Baseball America* following the season.

2019 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Was a non-roster invitee with the A's during the spring and had a 0.93 ERA in four games before he was shut down with a supraspinatus muscle strain...was assigned to Single-A Stockton June 11 and appeared in two games with the Ports and three with Las Vegas before going on the injured list July 4...made one rehab start with the AZL A's Green before he was reinstated from the IL Aug. 10 and sent to Stockton...moved back to Las Vegas Aug. 15...combined to strike out 57 batters in 43.0 minor league innings (11.93 per nine innings)...walked just eight (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.13...his opponents batting average broke down to .132 (5-for-38) against left-handed hitters compared to .248 (31-for-125) with all four of his home runs against right-handers...had a .379 OPS against lefties, .675 against righties...all four of the home runs were solo shots... yielded a .132 average with runners in scoring position...tossed fewer than five innings in nine of his 11 appearances, but logged at least two innings each time...surrendered one run or fewer eight times...had more strikeouts than innings pitched seven times.

2019 MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS: His only two relief appearances came in his first two outings with Stockton on June 11 against San Jose (3.0 scoreless innings) and June 16 at Modesto (nine strikeouts in 4.0 innings)...was transferred to Las Vegas June 22 and went 1-0 with a 3.65 ERA in three starts before going on the IL July 4 with a Grade 2 latissimus dorsi muscle strain... logged a season-low 2.0 innings in his rehab start with the A's Green squad in the Arizona Rookie League on Aug. 5 against the White Sox...was sent to Stockton for one start on Aug. 10 against Rancho Cucamonga and pitched 3.0 scoreless and hitless innings while striking out seven...returned to Las Vegas Aug. 15 and allowed a season-high five runs on a season-high six hits in 3.1 innings for his only loss that day against Albuquerque...then went 0-0 with a 1.17 ERA over his final three regular season starts...walked a season-high three batters Aug. 25 at Tacoma...struck out a season-high 10 batters and did not issue a walk in a season-high 6.0 innings in his final start on Aug. 30 against Tacoma...also had a season-high 93 pitches and a season-high tying six hits but yielded just one run and had a no decision in a 4-2 loss...also started Game 3 of the Pacific Coast League Conference Championship Series against Sacramento on Sept. 6 and was the winning pitcher in the Aviators 11-4 victory (5.2 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 7 so).

Saves/Opportunities: 8-for-10 (80.0%)

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in 12 of the last 13 games (10 er in 50.0 ip, 1.80 ERA)...now has a 2.16 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the majors behind the Cardinals (0.98) and Dodgers (1.20).
- Ranks second in the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.263), third in OPS (.573) and slugging percentage (.309) and fifth in batting average (.203).
- Is tied for the Major League lead in saves (8), has the third fewest losses (1) and is tied for third in wins (7).
- Ranks third in fewest walks per nine innings (2.84).
- Has allowed four home runs in the last three games (13.0 ip) after yielding just two over the first 16 contests (66.1 ip).
- First batters faced are 9-for-57 (.158) with six walks and three doubles...rank third in the majors in opponents slugging percentage against first batters (.211), fourth in OPS (.445), sixth in on-base percentage (.234) and seventh in batting average.
- Have allowed 4-of-19 (21.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the eighth lowest percentage in the majors.

- Now has an 11.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year...his career high is 14.2 innings from May 11 to June 18, 2016.
- Left-handed hitters are 0-for-9 and opponents are 0-for-12 with runners on base.
- Had a loss in three outings against San Francisco last year (2.0 ip, 1 h, 3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 1 so, 9.00 ERA).

Last Year: Began the season with Kansas City and was 0-6 with a 4.75 ERA in 48 relief appearances when he was traded to Oakland on July 27...went 1-1 with a 4.43 ERA in 28 games with the A's and had a 4.65 ERA in a career-high 76 relief appearances overall.

- Has five saves and a win over his last eight outings (8.1 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1er, 12 so) after being charged with the blown save in his first appearance on Opening Night...is tied for second in the majors in saves.
- Has struck out at least one batter in each game this year and now has a streak of 28 consecutive games with a strikeout dating back to Aug. 20, 2019...that breaks his own Athletics record for consecutive games with a strikeout by a reliever (27, June 8-Aug. 14, 2019)...has 14 strikeouts this year, which is tied for second among relievers in the West...struck out Correa in the ninth inning a week ago tonight against Houston for the 500th strikeout of his career.
- Has allowed a .105 (2-for-19) average against right-handed hitters, .333 (5-for-15) against left-handers.
- Opponents are 1-for-15 (.067) with runners on base, 6-for-19 (.316) with the bases empty.
- Had a save in two outings against San Francisco last year (2.1 ip, 2 h, 4 so) and has not allowed a run in four career games against the Giants (5.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 7 so).
- Had a 0.84 ERA in 10 interleague appearances last year.

Last Year: Began the season as a set-up man and occasional opener but took over the closer role after Treinen went on the IL retroactive to June 21...saved a ML-leading 25 games over that span after tallying just one save over his first 279 career appearances.

- Faced the Giants nine times last year while pitching for Arizona and had a 9.69 ERA and .441 opponents batting average (13.0 ip, 26 h, 14 r, 14 er, 6 bb, 8 so)...has an 8.18 ERA (20 er in 22.0 ip) in 17 career appearances against San Francisco, including 10.38 (10 er in 8.2 ip) in eight outings at Oracle Park.

Last Year: Had no decisions, no save opportunities and a 4.82 ERA in a career-high 51 relief appearances with Arizona...since the save became a stat in 1969, he is one of three pitchers to appear in 50 or more games with no wins, losses or save opportunities.

- Hit his first home run of the season last Saturday against Houston, a lead-off shot in the bottom of the first...it was his seventh career lead-off home run, which is fourth most in Oakland history (Henderson 43, Crisp 15, Campaneris 10)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletic (since 1901) to leadoff a game with a home run after ending the previous game with a walk-off RBI...the last Major Leaguer to do it was Charlie Blackmon last year on April 19-20 against Philadelphia.
- Had the game-winning RBI single in the bottom of the 13th inning a week ago tonight against the Astros for his second career walk-off RBI (March 29, 2018 vs. LAA, single).

Last Year: Finished in the top five in Oakland history in eight different categories...scored 123 runs, which tied the Oakland record set by Reggie Jackson in 1969...also tied the record for games played (162)...finished third in AL Most Valuable Player voting.
