OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-6) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (8-13)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and 11 of the last 13 games...are 14-6 (.700) for the season, which is the second best record in the majors to the Cubs (13-4, .765)...it is tied for the fourth best record in Oakland history after 20 games and is the best since the 1990 club was 15-5...are a season-high tying eight games over .500 (also 12-4 on Aug. 9)...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 12th consecutive day and are four games ahead of second place Texas for the fourth consecutive day...that is one short of the season high of five on Aug. 9...have held at least a share of first place for 20 of 22 days this year (12 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19...had a nine-game winning streak from Aug. 1-9, which was the longest in the majors this year and tied for ninth longest in Oakland history...it matched the second longest winning streak by an A's team over the last 14 years (11, May 16-27, 2019).

CLOSE CALLS: Last night marked the fourth time in Athletics history the A's trailed by at least five runs in the ninth inning and came back to win...the last time was on July 15, 1952 when the Philadelphia A's trailed the St. Louis Browns 6-1 entering the bottom of the ninth before scoring six times for a 7-6 win in the first game of a doubleheader...improved to 4-0 in extra inning games with the win last night...Baltimore (2 wins) is the only other team in the majors with more than one extra inning win and the four extra inning games are tied for second most to Houston (5)...have scored eight runs in extra innings, which is the most in the majors...are 5-1 in games decided in the last at bat and the wins are the most in the majors...are 4-1 in one-run games and are tied for second in the majors in one-run wins (Giants, 5)...are 8-2 in games decided by two runs or fewer...lead the majors with three walk-off wins, two of which are grand slams.

BASES LOADED: Stephen Piscotty hit his second grand slam of the season last night and the A's third this year...all three have come in the ninth inning or later and the A's are the 18th team in Major League history with three grand slams in the ninth inning or later in a season (last: Toronto, 2018)...no team has had four...the three grand slams are one short of the A's season total from each of the previous two seasons...the A's have two singles, a triple, a home run and a walk in their last five plate appearances with the bases loaded...are 10-for-23 (.435) with a triple, three home runs, 30 RBI and three walks with the bases full for the season...lead the majors in hits, home runs and RBI.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 27 runs in the last four games after allowing just 19 runs over the first nine games in August...have a 3.47 ERA for the season, which is still third lowest in the majors behind Cleveland (2.40) and the Dodgers (2.69)...have the sixth lowest opponents OPS (.667) and on-base percentage (.291) and the seventh lowest slugging percentage (.376)...have surrendered 13 home runs over the last four games after yielding just nine over the first 16 contests...are tied for eighth in the majors in fewest home runs (22)...are tied for second in the majors in fewest hit batters (2) and rank fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.74).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in three of the last four games and are 1-1 with an 11.15 ERA (19 er in 15.1 ip) over that stretch...have allowed eight home runs in the last four games after yielding seven over the first 16...have tossed fewer than five innings in 10 of the 20 games this year but have 98.0 innings pitched for the season, which is eighth most in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 32 runs in the last five games, which includes a shutout on Tuesday at Los Angeles (AL)...are tied for 10th in the majors with 96 runs for the season...have hit 20 home runs in the last 10 games and are tied for ninth in home runs (28)...are batting .216, which is fourth lowest in the majors...however, are tied for second in walks (87) and rank third in hit by pitches (17)...have a .322 on-base percentage, which is third best among teams in the West...have been successful in 11-of-13 (84.6%) stolen base attempts...rank sixth in the majors in stolen base percentage and eighth in steals...have struck out 199 times, which is second most in the majors to Atlanta (212).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's had their nine-game errorless streak snapped last night on a Sean Murphy catchers interference in the sixth inning...the errorless streak tied for sixth longest in Oakland history...now have one error in the last 10 games after making six over the first 10 contest...the seven

errors are tied for seventh fewest in the majors and Oakland has the fifth best fielding percentage (.991)...have turned just 10 double plays, which is tied for third fewest...A's outfielders have four assists, which is tied for fourth most in the majors.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 1-2 in interleague play compared to 13-4 against the American League...last night's game was the A's first of seven consecutive games against the National League West...travel to Arizona following the game tomorrow for a two-game series and then return home to host the Diamondbacks for two games on Wednesday and Thursday...will also travel to Colorado (Sept. 15-16) and Los Angeles (Sept. 22-24) and will host San Diego (Sept. 4-6) and San Francisco (Sept. 18-20)...the A's went 11-9 (.550) in interleague play last year, which tied for the 10th best record in the majors...are 229-198 (.536) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on their second road trip of the season, an eight-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), San Francisco (1-0) and Arizona (two games)...went 3-1 on their first road trip to Seattle and are 5-3 (.625) on the road...this trip begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 18 of 23 games on the road...played 12 of their first 16 games at home where they are 9-3...went 6-0 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and Houston (3-0) for their first undefeated homestand of six or more games since July 3-8, 2014 when they went 4-0 against Toronto and 2-0 against San Francisco...have a six-game home winning streak, which matches their longest home winning streak over the last two years (July 4-17, 2019 and Aug. 1-17, 2019).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 11-3 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 where they are scheduled to have just one day off in 31 days...had a day off on Thursday and will play 17 consecutive days before their next day off on Aug. 31...are 5-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 9-6 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied for the most in the majors...are 14-2 when homering, 0-4 when going homerless...are one of five teams that has not won a game when going homerless (Pirates, Cardinals, Phillies, Yankees)...have one player on the injured list (Puk) and have used the IL three times this year...the A's taxi squad for this road trip features right-handed pitchers Paul Blackburn and James Kaprielian, catcher Jonah Heim, infielder Sheldon Neuse and outfielder Seth Brown...are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's won the first meeting of 2020 last night after going 1-3 against the Giants last year for their first season series loss to San Francisco since 2015 (1-5)...lost both games in Oakland and split two games in San Francisco...are 8-7 over the last four years...over the previous 23 seasons of interleague play, the A's have won eight season series, lost five and split 10...are 65-60 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 36-26 in Oakland and 29-34 in San Francisco...are 25-31 at Oracle Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is tied for second in the majors in triples (2), tied for third in extra base hits (13), tied for sixth in total bases (48) and tied for ninth in home runs (6)...**Robbie Grossman** has a .460 on-base percentage, which is second best in the West (Solano, SF .471) and sixth best in the majors...is third in the West and eighth in the majors in OPS (1.073)...**Liam Hendriks** ranks second in the majors in saves (6) and is tied for fifth among relievers in strikeouts (17)...**Yusmeiro Petit** is tied for second in the majors in games pitched (12) and leads the majors with 165 games pitched over the last three seasons...**Burch Smith** not allowed a run in his first five appearances (10.1 ip) and opponents are 4-for-35 (.114) with a walk...his innings pitched are second most in the majors among pitchers that have not allowed a run (Keller, KC 11.0).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1907** Chief Bender wins his 11th consecutive decision in the A's 4-2 win over Cleveland...in **1976** Joe Rudi collects his 1000th hit as an Oakland Athletic in the A's 8-7 win against Boston...in **1980** Rick Langford pitches a six-hitter as the A's defeat Seattle 11-3...it is his club record ninth consecutive complete game victory...the win comes in the midst of a club record 22 consecutive complete games...in **2009** Adam Kennedy is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 8-1 loss to Chicago...it is Kennedy's second of two five-hit games in 2009.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (0-2, 9.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...has tossed fewer than five innings and allowed four runs or more in each of his first four starts...the streak of four consecutive starts of fewer than five innings and four runs or more is tied for the second longest season-opening streak in Athletics history...the only longer streak is five by Rick Langford in 1983 (April 4-July 17)...has allowed 17 runs for the season, which is tied for sixth most in the majors...has taken the loss in two of his starts, which marks his first two-game losing streak since May 25-30, 2018...has not lost more than two in a row since a career-high tying three-game losing streak from Aug. 1-18, 2017...begins his fifth season in the majors and is on his third Opening Day roster (2017-18, 20).

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Has allowed five runs over the first three innings of his starts this year (11.2 ip, 3.86 ERA) and 12 in the fourth and fifth innings (10 er in 3.1 ip, 27.00 ERA)...opponents are 10-for-43 (.233) over innings one through three and 14-for-23 (.609) in the fourth and fifth innings...in nine starts over the last two seasons, he has a 1.69 ERA (5 er in 26.2 ip) and .187 (17-for-91) opponents batting average over innings 1-3 and a 7.00 ERA (14 er in 18.0 ip) and .307 (23-for-75) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are hitting .286 (12-for-42) with the bases empty compared to .500 (12-for-24) with runners on...they are 8-for-14 (.571) with runners in scoring position after going 0-for-15 last year...has a .200 (7-for-35) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .548 (17-for-31) after that...has allowed three home runs...the first two were solo shots before Rendon hit a three-run home run in his last start...it was his first home run allowed with a runner on base since Aug. 19, 2018 (Gurriel, HOU, three-run).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is scheduled to make his first interleague start since Aug. 7, 2018 against the Dodgers, a loss (2.2 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...is 3-7 with a 4.28 ERA (36 er in 75.2 ip) in 14 career starts against the National League compared to 32-23 with a 3.87 ERA (186 er in 433.0 ip) in 76 games against the American League.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) July 25 in Oakland...it was his first loss since Aug. 19, 2018 against Houston and it snapped a career-high tying five-game winning streak...retired each of the first 11 batters before Upton homered with two outs in the fourth...then allowed three more runs in the fifth on a Simmons RBI double and a Fletcher two-run double.

SECOND START: He dropped his second consecutive decision in the A's 5-3 loss at Seattle July 31...retired each of the first nine batters before allowing three runs (two earned) in the fourth inning on a Seager two-run double and an error...put runners on first and third with one out in the fifth and was relieved by Wendelken, who allowed both runners to score (one earned).

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over Texas August 5 in Oakland...allowed a first pitch home run to Choo to start the game but then retired nine of the next 11 hitters...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed three runs in the fourth inning on a Solak RBI double, a Kiner-Falefa RBI single and a Refsnyder sacrifice fly...was relieved by Smith with one out in the fourth and the A's trailing 4-2.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 10-9 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Monday at Anaheim...tossed 2.2 innings, which was his shortest outing since Aug. 7, 2018 against the Dodgers when he also pitched 2.2 innings...allowed a three-run home run to Rendon in the first but the A's came back with three in the second and two in the third...yielded a RBI single to Upton in the bottom of the third and was relieved by Wendelken with two outs in the third and the A's leading 5-4.

MANAEA vs. SAN FRANCISCO: Is 2-1 with a 2.53 ERA (21.1 ip, 24 h, 10 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 11 so, 2 hr) in four career starts...is 1-1 with a 2.35 ERA (4 er in 15.1 ip) in three starts in Oakland and 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (2 er in 6.0 ip) in one start in San Francisco...last faced the Giants on July 22, 2018 in Oakland, a 6-5 A's win in 10 innings...retired each of the first 13 batters he faced before Hundley singled with one out in the fifth...Hundley later scored on a Slater double...was relieved with two outs and a

2019 RECAP: Began the season on the 60-day injured list as he continued his recovery from Sept. 19, 2018 surgery on his left shoulder...went 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts before he was reinstated from the IL Sept. 1...made five starts with Oakland and was 4-0 with a 1.21 ERA and .160 opponents batting average...the ERA was second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched (Yates SD, 1.19) and fifth lowest in Oakland history...using the same minimum, the batting average was third lowest in the majors and sixth lowest in Oakland history...allowed two runs or fewer in all five starts, including one run or fewer four times, and four hits or fewer four times...struck out 30 batters in 29.2 innings and walked just seven (2.12 per nine innings)...had a .229 opponents on-base percentage and .280 slugging percentage.

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .129 (8-for-62) against right-handed hitters compared to .211 (8-for-38) against left-handers...however, issued six of his seven walks to righties...yielded two of his three home runs to righties and has surrendered 56 of his 65 career homers to right-handers...now has a .219 opponents batting average and .594 OPS in his career against lefties, .257 with a .744 OPS against righties...opponents were 3-for-31 (.097) with runners on base, 0-for-15 with runners in scoring position and 0-for-8 with RISP and two outs...all three of the home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .073 batting average with two strikes...did not allow a hit to the opponent's eight (0-for-9) or nine (0-for-10) hitter.

2019 NIGHT AND DAY: Was 2-0 with a 0.50 ERA in three starts during the day, 2-0 with a 2.31 ERA in two starts at night...is now 16-5 with a 3.32 ERA (72 er in 195.1 ip) in 33 career day games, 19-25 with a 4.31 ERA (150 er in 313.1 ip) in 57 starts at night.

2019 THIS AND THAT: Did not allow a run in innings one through four (20.0 ip) and opponents were 8-for-63 (.127)...had a 3.72 ERA and .216 opponents average from the fifth inning on...went 4-0 in four starts with three runs of support or more...is now 4-28 in 46 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 31-2 in 43 starts with support of three runs or more.

2019 IN MINORS: Started his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton July 8 and was 0-1 with a 9.72 ERA in three starts when he was transferred to Triple-A Las Vegas July 23...went 0-1 with a 6.10 ERA in two starts with the Aviators before his rehab assignment was halted on Aug. 2 due to a strained right oblique...returned to action Aug. 13 and went 3-0 with a 1.53 ERA over his final three starts...was 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts overall...struck out 53 batters in 36.1 innings (13.13 per nine innings) and walked 10 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.3...his opponents batting average broke down to .214 against left-handed hitters compared to .226 with five of his six home runs and eight of his 10 walks against right-handed hitters.

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in 13 of the last 14 games (11 er in 56.2 ip, 1.75 ERA)...now has a 2.09 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the majors behind the Cardinals (0.98) and Dodgers (1.49).
- Ranks second in the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.259), third in OPS (.568) and slugging percentage (.309) and sixth in batting average (.201).
- Leads the majors in saves (9), is tied for second in wins (8), has the third fewest losses (1), ranks fifth in strikeouts (95) and tied for sixth in innings pitched (86.0) and fewest walks (26).
- Has allowed five home runs in the last four games (19.2 ip) after yielding just two over the first 16 contests (66.1 ip).
- First batters faced are 10-for-62 (.161) with six walks and three doubles...rank third in the majors in opponents slugging percentage against first batters (.210), fourth in OPS (.442), fifth in batting average and seventh in on-base percentage (.232).
- Has allowed 4-of-21 (19.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the seventh lowest percentage in the majors.

- Left-handed hitters are 0-for-9 and opponents are 0-for-12 with runners on base.
- Had a loss in three outings against San Francisco last year (2.0 ip, 1 h, 3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 1 so, 9.00 ERA).

Last Year: Began the season with Kansas City and was 0-6 with a 4.75 ERA in 48 relief appearances when he was traded to Oakland on July 27...went 1-1 with a 4.43 ERA in 28 games with the A's and had a 4.65 ERA in a career-high 76 relief appearances overall.

- Has six saves and a win over his last nine outings (9.1 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 15 so) after being charged with the blown save in his first appearance on Opening Night...ranks second in the majors in saves (Britton, NYY 7).
- Has struck out at least one batter in each game this year and now has a streak of 29 consecutive games with a strikeout dating back to Aug. 20, 2019...that breaks his own Athletics record for consecutive games with a strikeout by a reliever (27, June 8-Aug. 14, 2019)...has 17 strikeouts this year, which are the most among relievers in the West and tied for fifth most in the majors.
- Has allowed a .100 (2-for-20) average against right-handed hitters, .294 (5-for-17) against left-handers.

- Has started each of the A's last 153 games batting leadoff, which is the longest streak in Oakland history (previous: 148 by Rickey Henderson from May 12, 1981-June 22, 1982)...it is third longest in Athletics to Topsy Hartsel (177 from May 17, 1906-June 20, 1907 and 156 from April 23, 1902-May 11, 1903).
- Leads the majors in at bats (87).
- Hit his first home run of the season a week ago today against Houston, a lead-off shot in the bottom of the first...it was his seventh career lead-off home run, which is fourth most in Oakland history (Henderson 43, Crisp 15, Campaneris 10)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletic (since 1901) to leadoff a game with a home run after ending the previous game with a walk-off RBI...the last Major Leaguer to do it was Charlie Blackmon last year on April 19-20 against Philadelphia.

Last Year: Finished in the top five in Oakland history in eight different categories...scored 123 runs, which tied the Oakland record set by Reggie Jackson in 1969...also tied the record for games played (162)...finished third in AL Most Valuable Player voting.
