OAKLAND ATHLETICS (15-6) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (8-14)

SUNDAY, AUGUST 16, 2020 — ORACLE PARK — 1:05 PDT RHP MIKE FIERS (1-1, 6.86) VS. RHP LOGAN WEBB (1-1, 2.81) NBCSCA — A'S CAST ON IHEART RADIO — A'S RADIO NETWORK (960 AM, 103.7 FM HD2, 1140 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight and 12 of the last 14 games...are a season-high nine games over .500 at 15-6 (.714), which is the second best record in the majors to the Cubs (13-5, .722)...it is tied for the fourth best record in Oakland history after 21 games and is the best since the 1990 club was 16-5...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 13th consecutive day and are four games ahead of second place Texas for the fifth consecutive day...the four-game lead is one short of the season high of five on Aug. 9...have held

at least a share of first place for 21 of 23 days this year (13 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19.

THE NINTH INNING: The A's trailed by three runs entering the ninth inning yesterday and won after coming back from a five-run deficit in the ninth inning the night before...accoring to Stats, Inc., the A's are the fourth team in the modern era to win back-to-back games despite trailing by three or more runs in the ninth or later in both (1933 Pirates, 1971 Tigers, 2017 Angels)... scored four runs in the ninth inning yesterday after talling five the night before...it marks the second time in Oakland history the A's have scored four or more runs in the ninth inning in back-to-back games (July 12-13, 1973 at Milwaukee)...have scored 14 runs in the ninth inning for the season, which ranks third in the majors...are tied for the lead with five ninth inning home runs.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their sixth last at bat win of the season yesterday, which is two more than any other team in the majors...lead the majors with two wins when trailing after eight innings and three when trailing after seven innings...are 5-6 when trailing or tied after eight innings and 6-6 when trailing or tied after seven innings...are 5-1 in one-run games and are tied with the Giants for the most one-run wins in the majors...are 9-2 in games decided by two runs or fewer...are 4-0 in extra inning games...the wins are two more than any other team and the four extra inning games are tied for second most to Houston (5)...have scored eight runs in extra innings, which is the most in the majors...lead the majors with three walk-off wins, two of which are grand slams.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored at least seven runs in five of their last six games (39 runs total)...the one exception was Tuesday at Los Angeles (AL) when they were shutout...are tied for ninth in the majors in runs scored (103)... have scored 15 of their last 18 runs in the seventh inning or later and have 46 such runs for the season, which is second most in the majors to Arizona (49)...are tied for the ML lead with 13 home runs in the seventh inning or later (Dodgers)...have hit 24 home runs in the last 11 games and rank seventh in home runs (32)...are batting .219, which is fourth lowest in the majors... however, rank third in walks (92) and hit by pitches (17)...have been successful in 11-of-13 (84.6%) stolen base attempts...rank sixth in the majors in stolen base percentage and eighth in steals...have struck out 213 times, which is second most in the majors to Atlanta (218).

BASES LOADED: The A's have two singles, a triple, a home run and a walk in their last five plate appearances with the bases loaded...are 10-for-23 (.435) with a triple, three home runs, 30 RBI and three walks with the bases full for the season...lead the majors in hits, home runs and RBI...two of the grand slams have come in the ninth inning and the other was in the 10th and the A's are the 18th team in Major League history with three grand slams in the ninth inning or later in a season (last: Toronto, 2018)...no team has had four... the three grand slams are one short of the A's season total from each of the previous two seasons.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 33 runs in the last five games (32 er in 44.0 ip, 6.55 ERA) after allowing just 19 runs over the first nine games in August (1.88 ERA)...have a 3.54 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...have the fifth lowest opponents OPS (.667), the sixth lowest on-base percentage (.291) and the eighth lowest slugging percentage (.377)...have surrendered 14 home runs over the last five games after yielding just nine over the first 16 contests...are tied for eighth in the majors in fewest home runs (23)...are tied for second in the majors in fewest hit batters (2) and rank fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.75).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in four of the last five games and are 1-1 with a 9.30 ERA (21 er in 20.1 ip) over that stretch...have allowed eight home runs in the last five games after

yielding seven over the first 16...have tossed fewer than five innings in 10 of the 21 games this year but have 103.0 innings pitched for the season, which is tied for eighth most in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in the last two games to snap a nine-game errorless streak, which tied for sixth longest in Oakland history...now have three errors in the last 11 games after making six over the first 10 contests...rank seventh in the majors in fielding percentage (.989) and seventh in fewest double plays turned (12)...A's outfielders have four assists, which is tied for fourth most in the majors.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 2-2 in interleague play compared to 13-4 against the American League...this series begins a stretch of seven consecutive games against the National League West...travel to Arizona following the game today for a two-game series and then return home to host the Diamondbacks for two games on Wednesday and Thursday...will also travel to Colorado (Sept. 15-16) and Los Angeles (Sept. 22-24) and will host San Diego (Sept. 4-6) and San Francisco (Sept. 18-20)...the A's went 11-9 (.550) in interleague play last year, which tied for the 10th best record in the majors... are 230-198 (.537) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on their second road trip of the season, an eight-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), San Francisco (2-0) and Arizona (two games)...went 3-1 on their first road trip to Seattle and are 6-3 (.667) on the road...this trip begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 18 of 23 games on the road...played 12 of their first 16 games at home where they are 9-3...went 6-0 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and Houston (3-0).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 12-3 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 where they are scheduled to have just one day off in 31 days...had a day off on Thursday and will play 17 consecutive days before their next day off on Aug. 31...are 5-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 10-6 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied for the most in the majors...are 15-2 when homering, 0-4 when going homerless...are one of four teams that has not won a game when going homerless (Pirates, Phillies, Yankees)...have two players on the injured list (Puk, Smith) and have used the IL four times this year...are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's have won the first two meetings of 2020...have not swept a three-game series from the Giants since June 17-19, 2011 in Oakland...have not swept a three-game series in this ballpark since June 13-15, 2008...went 1-3 against the Giants last year for their first season series loss to San Francisco since 2015 (1-5)...lost both games in Oakland and split two games in San Francisco...over the previous 23 seasons of interleague play, the A's have won eight season series, lost five and split 10...are 66-60 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 36-26 in Oakland and 30-34 in San Francisco...are 26-31 at Oracle Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is tied for third in the majors in triples (2), tied for sixth in extra base hits (13) and tied for ninth in home runs (6) and total bases (48)...Robbie Grossman has a .441 on-base percentage, which is second best in the West (Solano, SF .458) and sixth best in the majors...Liam Hendriks is tied for the Major League lead in saves (7) and is tied for sixth among relievers in strikeouts (17)...each of the last seven hits by Matt Olson have been home runs...that is the second time in Oakland history a player has had seven straight hits with each being a home run...the other time was also by Olson (Sept. 13-22, 2017)...Yusmeiro Petit is tied for third in the majors in games pitched (13) and leads the majors with 165 games pitched over the last three seasons.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1930** Lefty Grove wins his 20th game of the season, defeating St. Louis in Philadelphia, 4-2...in **1983** Chris Codiroli and Dave Beard combine on a 4-0 shutout against California, the A's third consecutive shutout...the shutout comes as part of an Oakland record 37 consecutive scoreless innings...in **1991** Dennis Eckersley strikes out Chili Davis at Minnesota for his 2000th career strikeout...in **1996** Geronimo Berroa hits two home runs in the first game of a doubleheader against Boston, the A's 199th and 200th of the season...that broke the A's franchise record of 199.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (1-1, 6.86 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...the A's are 3-1 in his starting assignments this year and 33-13 (.717) when he starts in his career...is in his 10th season in the majors and is with his fourth team.. has pitched for Milwaukee (2011-15), Houston (2015-17), Detroit (2018) and Oakland (2018-present)...is on his sixth Opening Day roster (2013, 15-17, 19-

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is scheduled to make his first interleague start of the season...went 2-0 with a 0.61 ERA in two interleague starts last year and is now 2-0 with a 0.90 ERA (2 er in 20.0 ip) in three career interleague starts with the A's...has allowed one run or fewer in five of his last six interleague starts dating back to Aug. 23, 2017 and is 3-0 with a 2.43 ERA (9 er in 33.1 ip) over that span...is 7-5 with a 2.79 ERA (37 er in 119.1 ip) and .213 (91for-427) opponents batting average in 22 career interleague appearances, including 20 starts.

THE AMERICAN LEAGUE WEST: Has made all four of his starts this year against American League West teams and is 1-1 with a 6.86 ERA (15 er in 19.2 ip) in four starts...is now 15-16 with a 5.62 ERA (193 er in 309.0 ip) in 59 career apearances against the AL West, 55-44 with a 3.46 ERA (305 er in 793.1 ip) in 150 games against all other opponents.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .152 (5-for-33) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .408 (20-for-49) with five of his six home runs after that...opponents are hitting .440 (11-for-25) with runners on base but that drops to .267(4-for-15) with runners in scoring position, including .167 (1-for-6) with RISP and two outs

BY INNING: Has not allowed a run in the first or second inning (8.0 ip) and opponents are 4-for-28 (.143) in those two innings...has allowed all 15 of his runs from the third inning on (11.2 ip, 11.57 ERA) and opponents are hitting .389 (21-for-54)

WITH THE A'S: Was acquired by Oakland on Aug. 6, 2018 and is 21-7 with a 4.09 ERA (117 er in 257.1 ip) in 47 games, including 46 starts, with the A's... the wins are tied for fifth most in the American League over that span

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over Los Angeles (AL) July 26 in Oakland...did not walk or strikeout a batter in 4.0 innings...it was his first career start with no walks and no strikeouts...the A's scored five times in the first and he allowed a three-run home run to Trout in the third inning.. was relieved by Petit with runners on first and third and no outs in the fifth and Petit allowed one of those runners to score.

SECOND START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 10-inning win at Seattle on Aug. 1...allowed a two-run single to Seager in the third inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...the A's tied the game with two runs in the seventh and he was relieved by Diekman to start the bottom of the seventh.

THIRD START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 6-4 victory over Texas Aug. 6 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on a hit and a walk over the first four innings and had a 5-0 lead entering the fifth...allowed a RBI single to Tejeda in the fifth, a solo home run to Frazier in the sixth and a tworun home run to Tejeda in the seventh...was relieved by McFarland with no outs in the seventh and the A's leading 5-4.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Tuesday...allowed five runs in 3.2 innings, all on home runs in the fourth inning...Rendon led off the inning with a home run, Castro added a three-run shot and Goodwin capped the scoring with a solo home run...Bundy, Mayers and Robles combined to shut out the A's on five hits.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 1-3 with a 5.51 ERA in five starts during the spring...however, held the opposition to a .210 batting average...the five starts tied for the most in the majors...his 16.1 innings pitched led the Cactus League and ranked fifth in the majors...is now 7-11 with a 5.96 ERA (77 er in 116.1 ip) in 43 games, including 31 starts, in his career during the spring.

2019 RECAP: Was 15-4 with a 3.90 ERA in 33 starts in his first full season with the A's...ranked third in the American League in winning percentage (.789), sixth in opponents batting average (.243), tied for eighth in wins and 10th in OPS (.712) and on-base percentage (.304)...also tied for third in wild pitches (13) and tied for fifth in games started...had career highs in wins, games (33), games started, innings pitched (184.2) and winning percentage...led the A's in wins, starts, innings pitched, runs (82), walks (53) and home runs (30).. is the first A's pitcher to win 15 games since Scott Kazmir had 15 in 2014 and the first to make 33 starts since Sonny Gray had 33 in 2014...his innings pitched were the most by an A's pitcher over the last three years...his .789 winning percentage was fourth best in Oakland history among pitchers with 15 or more decisions...his 30 home runs tied for 10th most in a season in Oakland history...struck out 126 batters, an average of 6.14 per nine innings...that was the third-lowest mark in the AL...had the fifth-lowest strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.38)...went 2-3 with a 6.81 ERA, .297 opponents batting average and .854 OPS over his first eight starts last year, 10-0 with a 2.12 ERA, .199 opponents average and .572 OPS over his next 17 starts from May 7-Aug. 9 and 3-1 with a 6.27 ERA, .304 opponents average and .940 OPS over his final eight starts...the A's were 22-11 (.667) in his starting assignments... left with the lead in eight of his no decisions in 2019 only to have the bullpen blow the save...has left with the lead in 12 of his 45 career starts with the A's only to have the bullpen blow the save.

2019 HOME AND AWAY: Was 9-2 with a 2.90 ERA and .641 OPS in 17 starts at home compared to 6-2 with a 5.14 ERA and .796 OPS in 16 starts on the road...had the fifth-lowest home ERA in the AL and the fourth-highest road ERA...tied for fourth in the AL in home wins and ranked eighth in OPS...one of his home losses was in Tokyo and he is now 13-1 with a 2.95 (47 er in 143.1) ERA in 24 starts in the Coliseum since he was acquired from Detroit on Aug. 6, 2018...is 8-0 with a 2.87 ERA (30 er in 94.0 ip) over his last 15 home starts and has not lost at home since April 20, 2019 vs. Toronto...is 14-3 with a 3.28 ERA (63 er in 172.2 ip) and .226 (142-for-628) opponents batting average in 30 career games, including 29 starts, in the Coliseum.

2019 NIGHT AND DAY: Was 11-2 with a 3.66 ERA and .683 OPS in 24 starts at night, 4-2 with a 4.60 ERA and .800 OPS in nine starts during the day...tied for fifth in the AL in night wins and ranked seventh in ERA and OPS...is now 16-4 with a 3.76 ERA (82 er in 196.1 ip) in 36 career appearances at night with the A's.

2019 DAYS REST: Compiled an 11-1 record and a 3.21 ERA in 17 starts on five days rest and is now 14-1 with a 3.12 ERA (48 er in 138.1 ip) in 23 starts on five days rest in his A's career...went 2-1 with a 4.59 ERA in 10 starts on four days rest and 2-2 with a 5.10 ERA in six starts on six days rest or more

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING: His .243 opponents batting average broke down to .239 against righthanded hitters compared to .248 against left-handers. yielded a .264 average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .185 with RISP and two outs...now has a .191 (76-for-398) career opponents average with RISP and two outs...allowed a .216 opponents average with two outs.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (2-0, 2.42 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his first four starts and opponents are batting .198...allowed four runs over 5.2 innings in his last start after yielding two runs in 16.2 innings over his first three outings...has two wins and two no decisions in four starts this year to extend his winning streak to a career-high five games dating back to Aug. 11, 2019...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-4 A's win over Los Angeles (AL) Wednesday in Anaheim (5.2 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 so)...has never faced Arizona in his career...did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 14-8 with a 3.49 ERA and is averaging 8.45 strikeouts per nine innings in 43 games (36 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.
