OAKLAND ATHLETICS (16-6) VS. ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (11-11)

MONDAY, AUGUST 17, 2020 — CHASE FIELD — 6:40 PDT RHP CHRIS BASSITT (2-0, 2.42) VS. RHP ZAC GALLEN (0-0, 2.74) NBCSCA — A'S CAST ON IHEART RADIO — A'S RADIO NETWORK (960 AM, 103.7 FM HD2, 1140 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a three-game series at San Francisco over the weekend for their Major League leading third series sweep of the season...have won four straight and 13 of the last 15 games and are a season-high 10 games over .500 at 16-6 (.727)... that is the best record in the majors and the fourth best record in Oakland history after 22 games...with a win tonight, the A's woud match the 1990 club for best record after 23 games over the last 39 years... are in sole possession of first place in the American

League West for the 14th consecutive day and are 4½ games ahead of second place Houston...the A's largest lead of the season is five games on Aug. 9...have not led by more than five games since June 29, 2014 when they led by 5½ games...have held at least a share of first place for 22 of 24 days this year (14 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19.

OFFENSE: The A's had season highs in runs (15), hits (17) and extra base hits (9) yesterday at San Francisco and hit .304 (35-for-115) with 30 runs, seven doubles, three triples and nine home runs in the three-game series against the Giants...have scored at least seven runs in six of their last seven games (54 runs total, 7.7 per game)...the one exception was last Tuesday at Los Angeles (AL) when they were shutout...rank fifth in the majors in runs scored (118)...have hit 27 home runs in the last 12 games and are tied for fifth in home runs (35)...have five triples in the last nine games and are tied with the Rockies and Rays for the Major League lead with seven triples...rank second in the majors in walks (99), third in hit by pitches (17) and seventh in on-base percentage (.333) and OPS (.763)...have been successful in 11-of-13 (84.6%) stolen base attempts...are 10-for-24 (.417) with a triple, three home runs, 30 RBI and three walks with the bases loaded...lead the majors in hits, home runs and RBI with the base full...the three grand slams are one short of the A's season total from each of the previous two seasons...rank sixth in the majors in stolen base percentage and eighth in steals...have struck out 221 times, which is second most in the majors to Atlanta (234).

LATE OFFENSE: The A's have hit 13 home runs in the seventh inning or later, which is tied with the Orioles and Dodgers for the most in the majors...have 48 runs scored, which is second to the Diamondbacks (52)...lead the majors with an .860 OPS...lead the majors in runs scored in extra innings (8) and rank third in runs in the ninth inning (14)...trailed by three runs entering the ninth inning on Saturday at San Francisco and won after coming back from a five-run deficit in the ninth inning the night before...accoring to Stats, Inc., the A's are the fourth team in the modern era to win back-to-back games despite trailing by three or more runs in the ninth or later in both (1933 Pirates, 1971 Tigers, 2017 Angels).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 36 runs in the last six games (35 er in 53.0 ip, 5.94 ERA) after allowing just 19 runs over the first nine games in August (1.88 ERA)...have a 3.52 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the majors...have the sixth lowest opponents OPS (.673) and on-base percentage (.293) and the eighth lowest slugging percentage (.381)...have surrendered 16 home runs over the last six games after yielding just nine over the first 16 contests...are tied for second in the majors in fewest hit batters (2) and rank fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.81).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-1 despite a 7.86 ERA (23 er in 26.1 ip) over the first six games of the road trip...have allowed nine home runs on the trip after yielding just seven over the first 16 games...starters have tossed fewer than five innings in 10 of the 22 games this year but have 109.0 innings pitched for the season, which is tied for seventh most in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in the last three games to snap a nine-game errorless streak, which tied for sixth longest in Oakland history...have three errors in the last 12 games after making six over the first 10 contests...rank sixth in the majors in fielding percentage (.989)... are tied for third in fewest double plays turned (12)...A's outfielders have four assists, which is tied for sixth most in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 6-1 in games decided in the last bat and are tied with Tampa Bay for the most last at bat wins in the majors...have nine come-from-behind wins, which is tied with the Dodgers for the most in the majors...lead the majors with two wins when trailing after eight innings and

are tied for the lead with Arizona with three victories when trailing after seven innings...are 5-6 when trailing or tied after eight innings and 6-6 when trailing or tied after seven innings...are 5-1 in one-run games and the wins are tied for the most in the majors...are 9-2 in games decided by two runs or fewer...are 4-0 in extra inning games...the wins are two more than any other team and the four extra inning games are tied for third most...lead the majors with three walk-off wins, two of which are grand slams.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 3-2 in interleague play compared to 13-4 against the American League...are in a stretch of seven consecutive games against National League West teams, that began with a three-game series at San Francisco and concludes with four games against Arizona (two in Phoenix, two in Oakland)...will also travel to Colorado (Sept. 15-16) and Los Angeles (Sept. 22-24) and will host San Diego (Sept. 4-6) and San Francisco (Sept. 18-20)...the A's went 11-9 (.550) in interleague play last year, which tied for the 10th best record in the majors...are 231-198 (.538) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-2 on their second road trip of the season, an eight-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), San Francisco (3-0) and Arizona (two games)...went 3-1 on their first road trip to Seattle and are 7-3 (.700) on the road...this trip begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 18 of 23 games on the road...played 12 of their first 16 games at home where they are 9-3...went 6-0 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and Houston (3-0)...return home following the game tomorrow for a five-game homestand against Arizona (two games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games).

THIS AND THAT: The A's scored nine runs in the fifth inning yesterday, which were their most runs in an inning since June 18, 2019 against Baltimore (10 in the 6th)...had eight hits in the inning, which matched the season high (Aug. 3 at Seattle, 5th)...are 13-3 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 where they are scheduled to have just one day off in 31 days...had a day off last Thursday and will play 17 consecutive days before their next day off on Aug. 31...are 5-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 11-6 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied for third most in the majors and Oakland is one of three teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (Cubs 5-0, White Sox 4-0)...are 16-2 when homering, 0-4 when going homerless...are one of four teams that has not won a game when going homerless (Pirates, Phillies, Yankees)...have two players on the injured list (Puk, Smith) and have used the LI four times this year...are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season.

A's vs. DIAMONDBACKS: The two clubs last met in 2018 when the A's won two of three in Oakland...are playing in Phoenix for the first time since Aug. 28-30, 2015 when the A's won two of three...the A's have won four of the last five games...have won seven of the previous 11 season series and are 17-16 all-time against the Diamondbacks...are 9-9 in Oakland and 8-7 in Arizona.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is tied for third in the majors in triples (2), tied for fourth in extra base hits (14), tied for seventh in multiple hit games (8) and tied for eighth in total bases (51)...*Robbie Grossman* leads players in the West divisions in on-base percentage (.452) and ranks fourth in OPS (1.041)...*Liam Hendriks* is tied for second in the majors in saves (7) and tied for seventh among relievers in strikeouts (17)...*Matt Olson* is tied for fourth in the majors in home runs (8) and tied for fifth in walks (17)...*Yusmeiro Petit* is tied for third in the majors in games pitched (13) and leads the majors with 165 games pitched over the last three seasons.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1934** Ed Coleman hits three consecutive home runs in the first game of a doubleheader against Chicago, a 9-8, 10 inning A's win...in **1980** Brian Kingman tosses the A's Oakland record ninth consecutive complete game in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle...in **1987** Reggie Jackson hits the 563rd and final home run of his career against his teammates from the previous season, the California Angels...he homers off Mike Witt, but the A's would go on to lose, 6-4...in **1990** Bob Welch wins his 20th game of the season en route to a club record 27 wins and the AL Cy Young...the 27 wins are the most by an American League pitcher since Denny McClain's 31 in 1968.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (2-0, 2.42 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his first four starts and opponents are batting .198 (16-for-81)...allowed four runs over 5.2 innings in his last start after yielding two runs in 16.2 innings over his first three outings...the A's are 4-0 in his starting assignment this year and 19-10 (.655) over the last two years... begins his sixth season in the majors and is on his second Opening Day roster...his other was in 2016 with Oakland.

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Has two wins and two no decisions in four starts this year to extend his winning streak to a career-high five games dating back to Aug. 11, 2019...has a 3.32 ERA (22 er in 59.2 ip) and .228 (52-for-228) opponents batting average during the streak, which spans 13 games, including 10 starts...has walked just 12 (1.81 per nine innings) while striking out 59 (8.90 per nine innings) in 59.2 innings during the streak...has not lost since July 24, 2019 at Houston.

INTERLEAGUE: Is scheduled to make his first interleague start of the season after gong 0-1 with a 3.48 ERA in six starts against the National League last year...is now 0-3 with a 3.28 ERA (18 er in 49.1 ip) in nine career interleague starts.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-0 with a 2.93 ERA (5 er in 15.1 ip) in three starts during the day, 0-0 with a 1.29 ERA (1 er in 7.0 ip) at night...is now 9-1 with a 3.06 ERA (27 er in 79.1 ip) in 15 day games dating back to May 16, 2019 after going 0-9 with a 4.06 ERA over his first 17 career games during the day.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-0 with a 0.82 ERA (1 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland compared to 2-0 with a 3.97 ERA (5 er in 11.1 ip) in two starts on the road...has allowed both of his home runs on the road...is now 7-9 with a 2.72 ERA (49 er in 162.0 ip) in 31 career games in the Coliseum, 9-10 with a 4.55 ERA (100 er in 195.2 ip) in 41 games in all other ballparks...has yielded just 11 home runs in 162.0 career innings in Oakland (0.61 per nine innings).

SINCE THE SURGERY: Did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 14-8 with a 3.49 ERA (83 er in 214.0 ip) and is averaging 8.45 strikeouts per nine innings (201 so in 214.0 ip) in 43 games (36 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

FIRST START: He combined with five A's relievers on a nine-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) July 27 in Oakland...had a no decision as he tossed four innings...allowed five of the hits and walked a batter but ended up stranding five base runners (also had a GIDP)...was relieved by Smith to start the fifth inning with the A's leading 3-0.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-2 win at Seattle Auust 2...allowed a RBI single to Vogelbach in the first inning but then blanked the Mariners on two hits over his final 4.2 innings...retired 10 straight at one point...Oakland scored three times in the fifth to take a 3-1 lead and he was relieved by McFarland with two outs in the sixth.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 13-inning win over Houston Aug. 7 in Oakland...allowed just one run, giving him one run or fewer in each of his first three starts, to become the first A's pitcher to begin the season in the starting rotation and allow one run or fewer in each of his first three starts since Gio Gonzalez in 2011 (April 3-14)...retired seven of the first eight batters before a Maldonado walk, a wild pitch and a Tucker RBI double gave the Astros their first run...that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work and he was relieved by Soria to start the eighth with the scored tied 1-1.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Wednesday...Oakland scored a run in the first but he allowed a solo home run to Trout in the bottom of the first...the A's came back with two inthe second but he allowed two in the third on a La Stella RBI single and a Trout sacrifice fly...had a 5-3 lead when he allowed a two-out home run to Rendon in the sixth...was relieved by Diekman following the home run.

2019 RECAP: Saw the most extensive action of his five-year career, going 10-5 with a 3.81 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 28 games, including 25 starts...had career highs in every category except losses as he was 4-14 in 40 games over his first four years...had career lows in opponents on-base percentage (.303) and fewest walks per nine innings (2.94)...led the A's with 141 strikeouts, which were the most by an Oakland pitcher since Sonny Gray had 169 in 2015...tied an Oakland record and tied for third in the American League with 13 hit batters...shares the record with Barry Zito, who did it three times (2001, 2005 and 2006)...went 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .179 opponents average over his first five starts through May 16 and 3-3 with a 6.00 ERA and .249 opponents average over his next nine starts leading into the All-Star Break...then went 5-1 with a 3.26 ERA in 14 games after the break... his post-break ERA was seventh lowest in the AL among pitchers with 60 or more innings.

2019 STARTING AND RELIEVING: Began the season with 25 starts and concluded the year with three relief appearances...was 10-5 with a 3.95 ERA in his starting assignments, with his last coming on Sept. 13...did not allow a run in 5.0 innings in relief...is 16-19 with a 3.85 ERA (141 er in 330.0 ip) in 59 career starts, 0-0 with a 2.60 ERA in 13 relief appearances...retired all three of his first batters faced in relief and they are 1-for-10 (.100) with two walks and a hit by pitch in his career.

2019 SPLITS: Went 6-2 with a 3.01 ERA in 13 games at home in 2019 compared to 4-3 with a 4.54 ERA in 15 games on the road...surrendered five home runs in 68.2 innings at home, 16 in 75.1 innings on the road...was 7-2 with a 2.97 ERA in 14 games during the day, 3-3 with a 4.82 ERA in 14 games at night...tied for third in the AL in day wins.

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING AVERAGE: His opponents batting average broke down to .209 (58-for-278) against left-handed hitters compared to .251 (67-for-267) against right-handers...the mark against lefties was sixth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 140 or more innings...surrendered 14 of his 21 home runs and issued 29 of his 47 walks to lefties for a .701 OPS...had a .695 OPS against righties...yielded a .221 average with runners in scoring position...had a .206 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .266 the second time and .211 after that...surrendered 12 of his 21 home runs the second time through the lineup.

2019 RUN SUPPORT: Had a run support average of 6.69, which was ninth highest in the AL among pitchers with 140 or more innings...received two runs of support or fewer in 13 of his 25 starts and went 2-5 in those games... was 8-0 in 12 starts with support of three runs or more...entered the season with a 2.67 RSA in his career as a starter...has received two runs of support or fewer in 38 of his 58 career starts and is 4-19 in those games...is 12-0 in 21 career starts with run support of three runs or more.

2019 THIS AND THAT: Was 5-1 with a 2.65 ERA in 10 starts following an A's loss...had a 2.88 ERA in the first inning, 4.01 from the second inning on...did not commit an error in 19 chances and turned three double plays, which tied for third among AL pitchers...went 5-0 with a 2.23 ERA in seven starts against AL Central teams...opponents were successful in 10-of-12 (83.3%) stolen base attempts off him...the A's were 15-10 (.600) in his starting assignments.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (2-1, 1.57 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season, his first since Aug. 8 against Houston in Oakland when he was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 victory (7.0 ip, 2 h, 5 so)...was scratched prior to his scheduled start on Friday at San Francisco with upper back tightness...has allowed two runs or fewer and five hits or fewer in each of his four starts...was named American League Player of the Week for the week of Aug. 3-9...was 2-0 in two starts...struck out 14, walked four, allowed six hits and had 0.64 ERA...it was his first career Player of the Week honor...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against Arizona, a start in the A's 2-1 win in Oakland on May 27, 2018 (6.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 7 so)... was 9-2 with a 2.63 ERA in 16 starts last year in a season shortened due to an 80-game suspension for violating Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program.
