OAKLAND ATHLETICS (16-7) VS. ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (12-11)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their four-game winning streak snapped last night and are now 4-3 over the last seven games...however, have won 13 of the last 16 games and are 16-7 (.696) for the season...that is the second best record in the American League (Yankees, 16-6) and third best in the majors (Dodgers, 17-7)...it is tied for fourth best in Oakland history after 23 games and is the best since 1990 (17-6)... are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 15th consecutive day and are 3½ games ahead of second place Houston...have held at least a share of first place for 23 of 25 days

this year (15 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19...swept a three-game series at San Francisco over the weekend for their Major League leading third series sweep of the season.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .252 (121-for-481) with 91 runs scored over the last 14 games (6.5 runs per game) after hitting .188 with 30 runs scored over the first nine contests (3.3 per game)...have scored 121 runs for the season, which is tied for third most in the majors...have hit 28 home runs in the last 13 games and rank seventh in home runs (36)...are also tied for the Major League lead in triples (7), rank second in walks (101), third in hit by pitches (17) and seventh in on-base percentage (.329)...are second in most strikeouts (229) and tied for fourth in most grounded into double plays (20)...have been successful in 11-of-13 (84.6%) stolen base attempts...rank sixth in the majors in stolen base percentage and ninth in steals...are 10-for-24 (.417) with a triple, three home runs, 31 RBI and three walks with the bases loaded...lead the majors in home runs and RBI with the bases full and are tied for the lead in hits...the three grand slams are one short of the A's season total from each of the previous two seasons.

LATE OFFENSE: The A's are batting .249 with 14 home runs, 51 runs scored and an .868 OPS in the seventh inning or later compared to .217 with 22 home runs, 70 runs scored and a .694 OPS over innings one through six...lead the majors in OPS in the seventh inning or later, are tied with the Dodgers for most home runs and rank second to the Diamondbacks (53) in runs scored... lead the majors in runs scored in extra innings (8) and rank fourth in runs in the ninth inning (14).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 40 runs in the last seven games (39 er in 61.1 ip, 5.72 ERA) after allowing just 19 runs over the first nine games in August (1.88 ERA)...have a 3.55 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the majors...have the sixth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.296), the seventh lowest OPS (.680) and the eighth lowest slugging percentage (.384)... have surrendered 17 home runs over the last seven games after yielding just nine over the first 16 contests...are tied for second in the majors in fewest hit batters (3) and rank seventh in fewest walks per nine innings (2.87).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-1 despite a 7.39 ERA (26 er in 31.2 ip) over the first seven games of the road trip...have allowed 10 home runs on the trip after yielding just seven over the first 16 games...starters have tossed fewer than five innings in 10 of the 23 games this year but have 114.1 innings pitched for the season, which is seventh most in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors in the last four games to snap a nine-game errorless streak, which tied for sixth longest in Oakland history...have four errors in the last 13 games after making six over the first 10 contests...rank fifth in the majors in fielding percentage (.988) and tied for ninth in defensive runs saved (7)...are tied for third in fewest double plays turned (13)...A's outfielders have four assists, which is tied for sixth most in the majors.

IN AUGUST: The A's are 13-3 (.813) in the month of August, which is the best record in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (.750)...lead the majors in saves this month (8), rank fourth in ERA (3.48) and tied for sixth in strikeouts (137)...the offense leads the majors in extra base hits (59), walks (76), hit by pitches (13) and strikeouts (166), ranks second in OPS (.819), runs (97) and home runs (31), tied for second in triples (5) and fourth in on-base percentage (.346) and slugging percentage (.473).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their first walk-off loss of the season last night... lead the majors with three walk-off wins, two of which are grand slams...are 6-2 in games decided in the last at bat...the six wins are tied with the Rays for the most in the majors and the eight games are second most to the Blue Jays

(9)...are 5-2 in one-run games and the wins are tied for second most in the majors (Diamondbacks, 6)...are 9-3 in games decided by two runs or fewer... have nine come-from-behind wins, which is second most to the Dodgers (10)...are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eighth innings (2) and seven innings (3)...are 5-7 when trailing or tied after eight innings and 6-7 when trailing or tied after seven innings...are 4-0 in extra inning games...the wins are two more than any other team and the four extra inning games are tied for third most.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 5-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 11-7 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied for fourth most in the majors and Oakland is one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox 5-0)...have faced a righty in each of the previous eight games and the five games against lefties are tied for sixth fewest in the majors.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 3-3 in interleague play compared to 13-4 against the American League...are in a stretch of seven consecutive games against National League West teams, that began with a three-game series at San Francisco and concludes with four games against Arizona (two in Phoenix, two in Oakland)...will also travel to Colorado (Sept. 15-16) and Los Angeles (Sept. 22-24) and will host San Diego (Sept. 4-6) and San Francisco (Sept. 18-20)...the A's went 11-9 (.550) in interleague play last year, which tied for the 10th best record in the majors...are 231-199 (.537) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-3 on their second road trip of the season, an eight-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), San Francisco (3-0) and Arizona (0-1)...went 3-1 on their first road trip to Seattle and are 7-4 (.636) on the road...this trip begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 18 of 23 games on the road...played 12 of their first 16 games at home where they are 9-3...went 6-0 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and Houston (3-0)... return home following the game today for a five-game homestand against Arizona (two games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 9-2 (.818) in day games, 7-5 (.583) at night...have the most day games in the majors...are 16-3 when homering, 0-4 when going homerless...are one of four teams that has not won a game when going homerless (Pirates, Phillies, Yankees)...are 13-4 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 where they are scheduled to have just one day off in 31 days...had a day off last Thursday and will play 17 consecutive days before their next day off on Aug. 31...have two players on the injured list (Puk, Smith) and have used the IL four times this year...are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season.

A's vs. DIAMONDBACKS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2020 last night... prior to that, the two clubs last met in 2018 when the A's won two of three in Oakland...are playing in Phoenix for the first time since Aug. 28-30, 2015 when the A's won two of three...have won seven of the previous 11 season series and are 17-17 all-time against the Diamondbacks...are 9-9 in Oakland and 8-8 in Arizona.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is tied for third in the majors in triples (2), tied for sixth in extra base hits (14), tied for ninth in multiple hit games (8) and tied for 10th in total bases (51)...Robbie Grossman homered for the fourth time in his last nine games last night and his four home runs in August match his most in a month (May, 2017; June, 2016)...Liam Hendriks is tied for second in the majors in saves (7) and tied for seventh among relievers in strikeouts (17)...Matt Olson is tied for fifth in the majors in home runs (8) and walks (17)...is tied for third in go-ahead RBI (5)...Yusmeiro Petit ranks third in the majors in games pitched (12) and leads the majors with 166 games pitched over the last three seasons...Stephen Piscotty extended his errorless streak to 166 games last night, which is third longest in Athletics history by an outfielder behind Ryan Sweeney (209) and Al Simmons (187).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1990** Rickey Henderson hits a two-run homer to break a 1-1 tie in the A's 3-1 win at Baltimore...it is Henderson 744th run as an Athletic, most ever by an Oakland player...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits his 145th career home run in the Coliseum, breaking Reggie Jackson's Coliseum Career Home Run record...in **2004** Erubiel Durazo hits three home runs to account for all of the A's scoring in a 5-4 win at Baltimore.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (2-1, 1.57 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season, his first since Aug. 8 against Houston...was scratched prior to his scheduled start on Friday at San Francisco with upper back tightness...has allowed two runs or fewer and five hits or fewer in each of his four starts...has a 1.57 ERA, which is second lowest among West division pitchers (lynn, TEX 1.11) and fifth lowest in the majors...has not allowed a home run and is third in the majors in opponents slugging percentage (.213)...has tossed seven innings in back-to-back starts for the second time in his career (June 1-8, 2018)...is 16-7 with a 2.64 ERA (54 er in 184.0 ip) in 33 games, 31 starts, over the last three years after going 1-3 with a 6.32 ERA in 30 games, two starts, over his first two seasons...is in his fifth season in the majors and is on his third Opening Day roster (2017, 19-20).

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Was named American League Player of the Week for the week of Aug. 3-9...was 2-0 in two starts...struck out 14, walked four, allowed six hits and had 0.64 ERA...it was his first career Player of the Week

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held right-handed hitters to a .081 (3-for-37) batting average and .254 OPS over his first four starts compared to a .256 (11-for-43) average and .662 OPS against left-handers...the batting average against righties is the lowest in the majors among pitchers with 20 or more innings pitched and the OPS ranks second...opponents are 2-for-19 (.105) when leading off an inning but he has issued four walks (.261 on-base percentage)...yielded a .207 average to batters leading off an inning last year.

THE AMERICAN LEAGUE WEST, THE REST AND INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 2-0 with a 1.00 ERA (2 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts against American League West teams and now has a seven-game winning streak against divisional foes dating back to April 17, 2019...has a 2.64 ERA (17 er in 58.0 ip) over that stretch, which spans 10 starts...his last loss to an AL West team was on April 5, 2019 at Houston...is 9-3 with a 3.29 ERA (40 er in 109.1 ip) in 28 games against the AL West in his career, compared to 8-7 with a 3.92 ERA (53 er in 121.2 ip) in 35 career games against non AL West teams...was the losing pitcher in his only interleague start this year against Colorado on July 29 (2 er in 5.0 ip, 3.60 ERA) and is 2-2 with a 4.45 ERA (15 er in 30.1 ip) in eight career interleague appearances, including five starts.

INNING BY INNING: Has not allowed a run in the first inning (4.0 ip) after surrendering just one run in the first inning last last year (16.0 ip)...has allowed all four of his runs in the second through fourth innings (4 er in 12.0 ip, 3.00 ERA)...has not allowed a run from the fifth inning on (7.0 ip) and opponents are 1-for-22.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-3, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) on Opening Day, July 24 in Oakland...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the A's 13th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 15 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers)...was just the second foreign-born Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Ariel Prieto, April 2, 1997)...scattered two hits, a walk and hit a batter over the first three innings before allowing his only run in the fourth inning on a Goodwin RBI single...was relieved by Petit to start the fifth inning with the scored tied 1-1

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Colorado July 29 in Oakland...it was his first loss since April 29, 2019 at Boston and it snapped a five-game winning streak dating back to May 17, 2019...the A's scored a run in the first and he allowed a RBI single to Wolters in the second inning...also surrendered a sacrifice fly to Hampson in the fourth and was relieved by Luzardo to start the sixth with the A's trailing 2-1.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-1 victory at Seattle on August 3...allowed a RBI double to Seager in the third inning but that would be the only run he would allow in seven innings of work...Oakland scored eight times in the fifth inning and he retired 10 of the final 11 batters he faced.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-1 win over Houston Aug. 8 in Oakland...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits, he fewest hits allowed in a start of more than four innings in his career...retired the first four batters, allowed a double to Gurriel in the fourth, retired the next eight batters, allowed a single to Gurriel in the fifth and then retired the final nine batters...now has an 11.0-inning scoreless streak, which is four short of his career high of 15 (June 1-8, 2018).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-0 and did not allow an earned run in three starts...yielded two unearned runs in 5.2 innings...opponents went 4-for-22 (.182) and he walked just one batter in 5.2 innings...his final outing came on Mar. 8 against Milwaukee in Mesa...is now 3-0 with a 0.42 ERA in eight games, five starts, over the last two springs.

2019 RECAP: Went 9-2 with a 2.63 ERA in 16 starts in a season shortened due to an 80-game suspension for violating Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...his ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.230), on-base percentage (.282) and OPS (.646)...had career highs in wins, starts, strikeouts (103), innings (96.0), hits (84), runs (35), walks (23) and hit batters (4) and matched his high in earned runs (28) and wild pitches (4)...averaged 2.16 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.48 was a career high...surrendered eight home runs (0.75 per nine innings).

90 OR MORE INNINGS RANKINGS: His 2.63 ERA was third lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 90 innings...using the same minimum, he ranked fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings, fifth in opponents OPS, sixth in slugging percentage (.364), ninth in on-base percentage and 10th in strikeout-to-walk ratio...averaged 9.66 strikeouts per nine innings, which was second highest in Oakland history (Gio Gonzalez, 9.94 in 2009) and third highest in Athletics history (Wes Stock, 9.77 in 1964) among pitchers with 90 or more innings...his 4.48 strikeout-to-walk ratio was fourth highest in Oakland history.

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING: Had a .229 (38-for-166) opponents batting average and .647 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .231 (46-for-199) with a .645 OPS against left-handers...allowed a .207 average to batters leading off an inning and .115 with two strikes...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...only one came the first time through the batting order...opponents were 4-for-7 (.571) with the bases loaded.

2019 SPLITS: Was 4-0 with a 3.00 ERA in seven starts at home, 5-2 with a 2.33 ERA in nine starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 42.0 innings in Oakland compared to six in 54.0 innings on the road...had a 3-0 record and a 1.50 ERA in four starts during the day, 6-2 with a 3.00 ERA in 12 starts at night...went 5-2 with a 3.00 ERA in 11 starts on four or five days rest, 4-0 with a 1.91 ERA in five starts on six days rest or more...is now 7-2 with a 2.39 ERA (19 er in 71.2 ip) in 11 career starts on six days rest or more.

2019 RUN SUPPORT: Received two runs of support or fewer in seven of his 16 starts but had six starts with seven runs of support or more...had a 6.84 RSA overall...was 7-1 in nine starts with three runs of support or more and is 11-1 in 14 such starts in his career.

2019 THIS AND THAT: Allowed just one run in the first inning for a 0.56 ERA... had a 5.63 ERA in the second inning and a 2.39 ERA from the third inning on... the A's were 12-4 (.750) in his starting assignments and are 22-9 (.710) when he starts in his career...committed three errors, which tied for the most among AL pitchers...pitched for Escogido in the Dominican Winter League following the season and was 3-0 with a 1.44 ERA in five starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Jesús Luzardo (1-0, 4.79 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth appearance and fourth start of the season...allowed six runs in his last start, a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning win at San Francisco last Friday (3.1 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...allowed seven runs in 29.1 innings over the first 10 games of his career (2.15 ERA)...is 1-0 with a 5.14 ERA in his three starts and 0-0 with a 4.05 ERA in two relief apperances...has never faced the Diamondbacks in his career...was 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA and .143 opponents batting average in three starts this spring...struck out 13 batters and walked just one in 8.1 innings... had his 2019 season interrupted twice by a strained left shoulder but, after going 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA and .221 opponents average in 11 games (nine starts) with three minor league teams, he was selected by Oakland on Sept. 9 after Las Vegas concluded its season...had no decisions, two saves, a 1.50 ERA and .119 opponents average in six relief appearances in his ML debut.

- The A's bullpen has allowed 13 runs and seven home runs in the last seven games (29.2 ip, 3.94 ERA) after yielding 14 runs (12 earned) and two home runs over the first 16 contests (1.63 ERA)...now has a 2.34 ERA for the season, which is seocnd lowest in the majors behind the Dodgers (1.52).
- Ranks third in the majors in opponents OPS (.599) and on-base percentage (.272), fourth in slugging percentage (.327) and sixth in batting average (.208).
- Leads the majors in saves (10), is tied for second in fewest losses (2), tied for third in wins (9), tied for ninth in strikeouts (104) and tied for 10th in innings pitched (96.0).
- First batters faced are 12-for-73 (.164) with six walks, three doubles and a home run...rank fourth in the majors in opponents OPS (.472) and onbase percentage (.225) against first batters and fifth in slugging percentage (.247) and batting average.
- Has allowed 5-of-25 (20.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the seventh lowest percentage in the majors.

- Has not allowed a run in his first nine appearances (7.2 ip) and now has an 11.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year...his career high is 14.2 innings from May 11 to June 18, 2016.
- Allowed two hits last night after opponents went 2-for-23 (.087) against him over his first eight games.
- Has allowed a .091 (1-for-11) average against left-handed hitters, .200 (3for-15) against right-handers.
- Last night was his first appearance against the Diamondbacks since July 30, 2018 at Arizona (1.0 ip, 2 so)...he has a 1.86 ERA (2 er in 9.2 ip) in seven career appearances against Arizona...pitched in 24 games for the Diamondbacks in 2018 and has a 6.92 ERA (10 er in 13.0 ip) in 17 career appearances at Chase Field.
