## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (16-8) VS. ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (13-11)

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 19, 2020 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Were swept in a two-game series at Arizona to end the last road trip after winning four straight...however, have won 13 of the last 17 games and are 16-8 (.667) for the season...that is tied for the second best record in the American League and tied for fourth best in the majors...it is the A's best record after 24 games since the 1990 club started the year 18-6 (won game 25)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 16th consecutive day and are 2½ games ahead of second place Houston...that is the A's smallest lead since Aug. 6 when they also led by 2½ ...have held at least a share of first place for 24 of 26 days this year (16 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin a five-game homestand against Arizona (two games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games) tonight...these are the A's only five home games over a 23-game stretch from Aug. 10 to Sept. 3...went 6-0 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and Houston (3-0) for their first undefeated homestand of six or more games since July 3-8, 2014 when they went 4-0 against Toronto and 2-0 against San Francisco...have a six-game home winning streak, which matches their longest home winning streak over the last two years (July 4-17, 2019 and Aug. 1-17, 2019)...have not won more than six straight home games since an eight-game streak from July 21-Aug. 5, 2018...are 9-3 (.750) at home compared to 7-5 (.583) on the road...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), San Francisco (3-0) and Arizona (0-2).

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's are 3-4 (.429) in interleague play compared to 13-4 (.765) against the American League...are in a stretch of seven consecutive games against National League West teams, that began with a three-game series at San Francisco last weekend and concludes with four games against Arizona (two in Phoenix, two in Oakland)...will also travel to Colorado (Sept. 15-16) and Los Angeles (Sept. 22-24) and will host San Diego (Sept. 4-6) and San Francisco (Sept. 18-20)...the A's went 11-9 (.550) in interleague play last year, which tied for the 10th best record in the majors...are 231-200 (.536) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

**OFFENSE:** The A's scored four runs on 10 hits in the two games at Arizona after tallying 38 runs on 44 hits over the previous four games...have 122 runs scored for the season, which ranks sixth in the majors...have hit 28 home runs in the last 14 games and are tied for seventh in home runs (36)...lead the majors in walks (104), are tied for second in triples (7), rank third in hit by pitches (17) and 10th in on-base percentage (.325)...have been successful in 11-of-13 (84.6%) stolen base attempts...are tied for fifth in stolen base percentage and tied for ninth in steals...are second in most strikeouts (242), tied for third in most grounded into double plays (21) and have the seventh lowest batting average (.224)...are 10-for-24 (.417) with a triple, three home runs, 31 RBI and three walks with the bases loaded...lead the majors in RBI with the bases full, are tied for the lead in home runs and rank second in hits...the three grand slams are one short of the A's season total from each of the previous two seasons.

**LATE OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .244 with 14 home runs, 51 runs scored and an .850 OPS in the seventh inning or later compared to .214 with 22 home runs, 71 runs scored and a .683 OPS over innings one through six...lead the majors in OPS in the seventh inning or later, are tied with the Dodgers for most home runs and rank second to the Diamondbacks (54) in runs scored...lead the majors in runs scored in extra innings (8) and rank fourth in runs in the ninth inning (14).

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed 50 runs in the last eight games (49 er in 69.1 ip, 6.36 ERA) after allowing just 48 runs over the first 16 contests (2.66 ERA)...have a 3.83 ERA for the season, which is sixth lowest in the majors...have the ninth lowest opponents OPS (.696) and on-base percentage (.303)...have surrendered 19 home runs over the last eight games after yielding just nine over the first 16 contests...are tied for second in the majors in fewest hit batters (4) and rank seventh in fewest walks per nine innings (3.01).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers went 2-2 with a 9.45 ERA (35 in 33.1 ip) in eight games on the last road trip after going 5-0 with a 2.51 ERA over the previous eight games...tossed fewer than five innings four times on the trip and six innings or fewer in all eight games...have tossed fewer than five innings in 11 of the 24 games this year but have 116.0 innings pitched for the season, which is 10th most in the majors...surrendered 12 home runs

on the trip after yielding just seven over the first 16 games...have a 5.20 ERA for the season, which is third highest among teams in the West divisions (Diamondbacks, 5.46; Angels, 5.27).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed four errors over the last 14 games after making six over the first 10 contests...have 10 errors for the season, which is tied for sixth fewest in the majors...are tied for eighth in defensive runs saved (6)...have turned just 14 double plays, which is tied for fourth fewest...A's outfielders have four assists, which is tied for seventh most in the majors.

**IN AUGUST:** The A's are 13-4 (.765) in the month of August, which is tied with the Dodgers for the best record in the majors...lead the majors in saves this month (8), rank seventh in ERA (3.88) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (145)...the offense leads the majors in walks (79) and strikeouts (179), is tied for the lead in hit by pitches (13), ranks second in runs (98), tied for second in home runs (31) and triples (95) and third in extra base hits (60).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's lead the majors with three walk-off wins, two of which are grand slams...are 6-2 in games decided in the last at bat...the six wins are tied with the Rays for the most in the majors and the eight games are tied for second most to the Blue Jays (10)...are 4-0 in extra inning games...the wins are two more than any other team and the four extra inning games are tied for third most...are 5-2 in one-run games and the wins are tied for second most in the majors (Diamondbacks, 6)...are 9-3 in games decided by two runs or fewer...have nine come-from-behind wins, which is second most to the Dodgers (10)...are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eighth innings (2) and seven innings (3)...are 5-8 when trailing or tied after eight innings and 6-8 when trailing or tied after seven innings

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 5-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 11-8 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied for sixth most in the majors and Oakland is one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox, 6-0)...have faced a righty in each of the previous nine games and the five games against lefties are tied for fifth fewest in the majors.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 9-3 (.750) in day games, 7-5 (.583) at night...have the most day games in the majors...are 16-3 when homering, 0-5 when going homerless...are one of four teams that has not won a game when going homerless (Pirates, Phillies, Yankees)...are 13-5 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 where they are scheduled to have just one day off in 31 days...had a day off last Thursday and will play 17 consecutive days before their next day off on Aug. 31...have two players on the injured list (Puk, Smith) and have used the IL four times this year.

**A's vs. DIAMONDBACKS:** The A's were swept in a two-game series in Arizona on Monday and Tuesday to open the season series...it was the first meeting between the two clubs since 2018 when the A's won two of three in Oakland...have won seven of the previous 11 season series and are 17-18 all-time against the Diamondbacks...are 9-9 in Oakland and 8-9 in Arizona.

**Matt Chapman** is tied for third in the majors in triples (2), tied for sixth in extra base hits (14) and tied for 10th in multiple hit games (8) and total bases (51)...**Robbie Grossman** is tied for third in the majors in triples (2), tied for fifth in hit by pitches (4), ranks eighth in on-base percentage (.438), 10th in OPS (1.041) and tied for 10th in stolen bases (4)...**Liam Hendriks** is tied for second in the majors in saves (7) and tied for ninth among relievers in strikeouts (17)...**Matt Olson** is tied for fifth in the majors in walks (17) and tied for sixth in home runs (8)...**Yusmeiro Petit** is tied for third in the majors in games pitched (12) and leads the majors with 166 games pitched over the last three seasons.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1931** Lefty Grove wins his 16<sup>th</sup> consecutive game, tying the American League record set by Walter Johnson and Joe Wood in 1912...in **1989**, in the midst of a 19-game hitting streak, Carney Lansford records his 1000<sup>th</sup> hit in an A's uniform...in **1991** Jose Canseco hits his 200<sup>th</sup> career home run in the A's 8-7 win at Minnesota...he becomes the second Oakland Athletic and fifth Athletic all-time to reach the 200 plateau...in **2010** Trevor Cahill allows seven hits, ending a modern major league record tying stretch of 20 consecutive starts with six hits or fewer and five innings or more.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesús Luzardo (1-0, 4.79 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his sixth appearance and fourth start of the season...allowed six runs in 3.1 innings in his last start after allowing seven runs in 29.1 innings over the first 10 games of his career (2.15 ERA)...is 1-0 with a 5.14 ERA (8 er in 14.2 ip) in his three starts and 0-0 with a 4.05 ERA in two relief appearances...is in his second season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Is 0-0 with an 11.57 ERA (7.0 ip, 14 h, 9 r, 9 er, 4 bb, 8 so) in two career interleague games, including one start, both this year...is 1-0 with a 1.40 ERA (4 er in 25.2 ip) in nine career appearances against the American League.

**IN RELIEF:** Made his first appearance of 2020 on July 25 against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland...entered the game to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 4-0 and tossed what was then a career-high tying 3.0 scoreless innings...pitched in relief again July 29 against Colorado in Oakland in a 5-1 A's loss...struck out a career-high five in 3.2 innings...matched his career high in walks (2)...allowed a run in the eighth inning to snap a career-high 12.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2019.

**FIRST START:** He had a no decision in his first Major League start, a 5-1 A's win over Texas on Aug. 4 in Oakland...at the age of 22 years and 309 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to start a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...tossed a career-high 5.0 scoreless innings and matched his high with five strikeouts and two walks...retired each of the first six batters and allowed just two base runners into scoring position...was relieved by Petit to start the sixth inning with the score tied 0-0.

**SECOND START:** He recorded his first Major League win in the A's 7-2 victory over Houston on Aug. 9 in Oakland...at the age of 22 years and 314 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to win a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...tossed a career-high 89 pitches in a career-high 5.2 innings and matched his high with five strikeouts...blanked the Astros on two hits over the first three innings before allowing a two-run home run to Gurriel in the fourth...those were the only runs he would allow in 5.2 innings.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning win at San Francisco last Friday...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high nine hits in 3.1 innings...walked a career-high tying two and allowed two home runs in a game for the first time in his career...yielded a solo home run to Longoria in the first and a three-run home run to Pence in the third...also allowed a two-run single to Longoria in the fourth and was relieved by Wendelken with runners on first and second and one out in the fourth and the A's trailing 6-0.

**2019 RECAP:** Had his season interrupted twice by a strained left shoulder but, after going 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games (nine starts) with three minor league teams, he was selected by Oakland on Sept. 9 after Las Vegas concluded its season...had no decisions, two saves, a 1.50 ERA and .119 opponents batting average in six relief appearances in his Major League debut...struck out 16 batters in 12.0 innings (12.00 per nine innings) and walked just three for a .196 on-base percentage...allowed two doubles and one home run for a .238 slugging percentage...left-handed hitters were 1-for-14 (.071) with no extra base hits, one walk and a .205 OPS...right-handed hitters batted .143 (4-for-28) with a .547

OPS...opponents hit .138 with his lone home run with the bases empty, .077 with runners on...they were 1-for-8 (.125) with runners in scoring position...allowed a .095 average with two strikes...did not inherit any runners and first batters faced were 1-for-5 (.200) with a walk.

**2019 WITH OAKLAND:** Made his debut on Sept. 11 at Houston and tossed a season-high 3.0 innings...allowed one run on one hit, a Martin Maldonado solo home run in the sixth inning...did not walk a batter and struck out two...fanned the first batter he faced, Aledmys Diaz...at the age of 21 years, 346 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher since Brett Anderson on Oct. 1, 2009 (21 years, 242 days)...became the first player born in Peru in ML history...in his second outing, he tossed the final three innings of the A's 6-1 win at Texas on Sept. 15 for his first professional save...at the age of 21 years, 350 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to save a game since Houston Street on July 8, 2005 (21 years, 340 days)...allowed one run and struck out a season-high four...did not allow a run over his final four games and finished the season with a 7.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed 1.0 inning twice, 2.0 innings twice and 3.0 innings twice...tossed 3.0 scoreless innings of relief in the AL Wild Card game on Oct. 2 against Tampa Bay (1 h, 2 bb, 4 so)...the appearance came two days after his 22nd birthday, making him the second-youngest pitcher in Oakland postseason history...Rich Harden had two outings in 2003, with the youngest coming at 21 years and 305 days...was rated as the A's number one prospect by *Baseball America* following the season.

**2019 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP:** Was a non-roster invitee with the A's during the spring and had a 0.93 ERA in four games before he was shut down with a supraspinatus muscle strain...was assigned to Single-A Stockton June 11 and appeared in two games with the Ports and three with Las Vegas before going on the injured list July 4...made one rehab start with the AZL A's Green before he was reinstated from the IL Aug. 10 and sent to Stockton...moved back to Las Vegas Aug. 15...combined to strike out 57 batters in 43.0 minor league innings (11.93 per nine innings)...walked just eight (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.13...his opponents batting average broke down to .132 (5-for-38) against left-handed hitters compared to .248 (31-for-125) with all four of his home runs against right-handers...had a .379 OPS against lefties, .675 against righties...all four of the home runs were solo shots...yielded a .132 average with runners in scoring position...tossed fewer than five innings in nine of his 11 appearances, but logged at least two innings each time...surrendered one run or fewer eight times...had more strikeouts than innings pitched seven times.

**2019 MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS:** His only two relief appearances came in his first two outings with Stockton on June 11 against San Jose (3.0 scoreless innings) and June 16 at Modesto (nine strikeouts in 4.0 innings)...was transferred to Las Vegas June 22 and went 1-0 with a 3.65 ERA in three starts before going on the IL July 4 with a Grade 2 latissimus dorsi muscle strain...logged a season-low 2.0 innings in his rehab start with the A's Green squad in the Arizona Rookie League on Aug. 5 against the White Sox...was sent to Stockton for one start on Aug. 10 against Rancho Cucamonga and pitched 3.0 scoreless and hitless innings while striking out seven...returned to Las Vegas Aug. 15 and allowed a season-high five runs on a season-high six hits in 3.1 innings for his only loss that day against Albuquerque...then went 0-0 with a 1.17 ERA over his final three regular season starts...walked a season-high three batters Aug. 25 at Tacoma...struck out a season-high 10 batters and did not issue a walk in a season-high 6.0 innings in his final start on Aug. 30 against Tacoma...also had a season-high 93 pitches and a season-high tying six hits but yielded just one run and had a no decision in a 4-2 loss...also started Game 3 of the Pacific Coast League Conference Championship Series against Sacramento on Sept. 6 and was the winning pitcher in the Aviators 11-4 victory (5.2 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 7 so).

<b>LHP Sean Manaia (0-2, 7.65 ERA):</b>	Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...has tossed five innings or fewer and allowed three runs or more in each of his first five starts...has allowed 20 runs for the season, which is fifth most in the majors...is tied for 10th in hits allowed (27)...has taken the loss in two of his starts, which marks his first two-game losing streak since May 25-30, 2018...has allowed five runs over the first three innings of his starts this year (3.07 ERA) and 15 in the fourth and fifth innings (20.25 ERA)...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-6 A's win at San Francisco on Saturday (5.0 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against Arizona, a start in the A's 7-2 loss in Oakland on May 25, 2018 (3.2 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...is 3-7 with a 4.24 ERA in 15 career interleague starts compared to 32-23 with a 3.87 ERA in 76 games against the American League.

- The A's bullpen allowed eight runs over the final seven games of the road trip (30.2 ip, 2.35 ERA) after yielding six runs in the first game on Aug. 10... now has a 2.29 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors behind the Dodgers (1.57).
- Ranks third in the majors in opponents OPS (.599), on-base percentage (.274) and slugging percentage (.325) and sixth in batting average (.209).
- Leads the majors in saves (10), is tied for second in fewest losses (2), ranks fourth in wins (9), sixth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.99) and eighth in strikeouts (111) and innings pitched (102.1).
- First batters faced are 13-for-75 (.173) with six walks, three doubles and a home run...rank fourth in the majors in opponents OPS (.485) and on-base percentage (.232) against first batters, fifth in slugging percentage (.253) and sixth in batting average.

- Has not allowed a run in his first nine appearances (7.2 ip) and now has an 11.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year...his career high is 14.2 innings from May 11 to June 18, 2016.
- Allowed two hits Monday night after opponents went 2-for-23 (.087) against him over his first eight games.
- Has allowed a .091 (1-for-11) average against left-handed hitters, .200 (3-for-15) against right-handers.
