OAKLAND ATHLETICS (17-8) VS. ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (13-12)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won five of the last seven games and 14 of the last 18...are now 17-8 (.680), which is the second best record in the majors to the Dodgers (18-8)...it is the A's best record after 25 games since the 1990 club started the year 19-6 (won game 26)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 17th consecutive day and are 2½ games ahead of second place Houston for the second consecutive day...have held at least a share of first place for 25 of 27 days this year (17 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher tonight and tomorrow after 10 consecutive games against right-handed starters...are 5-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 12-8 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied for sixth most in the majors and Oakland is one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox, 6-0)...the five games against lefties are tied for fourth fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's extended their home winning streak to seven games last night, which is their longest home winning streak since winning eight straight from July 21-Aug. 5, 2018...are 1-0 on this five-game homestand against Arizona (1-0) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...these are the A's only five home games over a 23-game stretch from Aug. 10 to Sept. 3...went 6-0 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and Houston (3-0) for their first undefeated homestand of six or more games since July 3-8, 2014 when they went 4-0 against Toronto and 2-0 against San Francisco...are 10-3 (.786) at home compared to 7-5 (.583) on the road...have the third best home record in the majors behind the Yankees (10-2) and Twins (11-3)...are averaging 4.23 runs per game at home (55 runs in 13 games) compared to 5.92 on the road...have a 2.73 ERA (37 er in 122.0 ip) at home compared to 4.87 on the road...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), San Francisco (3-0) and Arizona (0-2).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 4-4 (.500) in interleague play compared to 13-4 (.765) against the American League...have a 5.43 ERA (43 er in 71.1 ip) in interleague play compared to 2.94 against the AL...are in a stretch of seven consecutive games against National League West teams, that began with a three-game series at San Francisco last weekend and concludes today...will also travel to Colorado (Sept. 15-16) and Los Angeles (Sept. 22-24) and will host San Diego (Sept. 4-6) and San Francisco (Sept. 18-20)...the A's went 11-9 (.550) in interleague play last year, which tied for the 10th best record in the majors...are 232-200 (.537) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

IN AUGUST: The A's are 14-4 (.778) in the month of August, which is the best record in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (13-5)...lead the majors in saves this month (9), rank sixth in ERA (3.72) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (155)...the nine saves match the most by the A's in August over the last eight years...the offense leads the majors in walks (85) and strikeouts (188), is tied for the lead in hit by pitches (14), ranks second in runs (102) and extra base hits (64), tied for second in triples (5) and third in home runs (32)

OFFENSE: The A's have scored eight runs on 16 hits in three games against Arizona after tallying 38 runs on 44 hits over the previous four games...have 126 runs scored for the season, which is tied for sixth in the majors...have hit 29 home runs in the last 15 games and are tied for eighth in home runs (37)...lead the majors in walks (110), are tied for second in triples (7), rank third in hit by pitches (18) and ninth in on-base percentage (.326)...have been successful in 11-of-13 (84.6%) stolen base attempts...are tied for fifth in stolen base percentage and tied for 10th in steals...have the most strikeouts (251), are tied for sixth in most grounded into double plays (21) and have the seventh lowest batting average (.224)...are 11-for-26 (.423) with a double, triple, three home runs, 33 RBI and three walks with the bases loaded...lead the majors in RBI with the bases full, are tied for the lead in hits, rank second in home runs and tied for second in extra base hits (5)...the three grand slams are one short of the A's season total from each of the previous two seasons.

LATE OFFENSE: The A's are batting .239 with 14 home runs, 51 runs scored and an .838 OPS in the seventh inning or later compared to .214 with 23 home runs, 75 runs scored and a .691 OPS over innings one through six...are tied with the Dodgers for most home runs in the seventh inning or later, rank second to the Diamondbacks (55) in runs scored and are third in OPS.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 51 runs in the last nine games (50 er in 78.1 ip, 5.74 ERA) after allowing just 48 runs over the first 16 contests (2.66 ERA)...have a 3.72 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...have the seventh lowest opponents OPS (.687), rank eighth in on-base percentage (.301) and ninth in slugging percentage (.386)...have surrendered 19 home runs over the last nine games after yielding just nine over the first 16 contests...are tied for second in the majors in fewest hit batters (5) and rank fourth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.97).

STARTING PITCHING: Jesús Luzardo tossed 6.1 scoreless innings for the win last night and A's starting pitchers are now 4-3 with a 3.41 ERA (25 er in 66.0 ip) at home...are also 4-3 on the road but have a 6.71 ERA (42 er in 56.1 ip)...have tossed fewer than five innings in 11 of the 25 games but have 122.1 innings pitched for the season, which is 10th most in the majors...have surrendered 12 home runs over the last nine games after yielding just seven over the first 16 games.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors over the last 15 games after making six over the first 10 contests...have 10 errors for the season, which is tied for fifth fewest in the majors...have turned 16 double plays, which is tied for sixth fewest...A's outfielders have four assists, which is tied for seventh most in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lead the majors with three walk-off wins, two of which are grand slams...are 6-2 in games decided in the last at bat...the six wins are tied with the Rays for the most in the majors and the eight games are tied for second most to the Blue Jays (10)...are 4-0 in extra inning games...the wins are two more than any other team and the four extra inning games are tied for third most...are 5-2 in one-run games and the wins are tied for second most in the majors (Diamondbacks, 6)...are 9-3 in games decided by two runs or fewer...have nine come-from-behind wins, which is tied for second most to the Dodgers (10)...are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (2) and seven innings (3)...are 5-8 when trailing or tied after eight innings and 6-8 when trailing or tied after seven innings

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 9-3 (.750) in day games, 8-5 (.615) at night...have the most day games in the majors...are 17-3 when homering, 0-5 when going homerless...are one of four teams that has not won a game when going homerless (Pirates, Phillies, Yankees)...are 14-5 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 where they are scheduled to have just one day off in 31 days...had a day off last Thursday and will play 17 consecutive days before their next day off on Aug. 31...have two players on the injured list (Puk, Smith) and have used the IL four times this year.

A's vs. DIAMONDBACKS: The A's won the first game in Oakland last night after being swept in a two-game series in Arizona on Monday and Tuesday...have won three straight and six of the last eight games in the Coliseum...this is the first meeting between the two clubs since 2018 when the A's won two of three in Oakland...have won seven of the previous 11 season series and are 18-18 all-time against the Diamondbacks...are 10-9 in Oakland and 8-9 in Arizona.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is tied for fourth in the majors in triples (2) and tied for seventh in extra base hits (14)...**Robbie Grossman** ranks second among players in the West divisions in on-base percentage (.452), tied for third in triples (2) and hit by pitches (4), fourth in OPS (1.068), sixth in slugging (.615) and tied for sixth in stolen bases (4)...**Liam Hendriks** has converted each of his last save eight opportunities, which matches the longest such streak of his career (June 22-July 20, 2019 and Aug. 1-29, 2019)...is tied for the Major League lead in saves (8)...**Matt Olson** is tied for sixth in the majors in walks (18) and tied for eighth in home runs (8)...**Yusmeiro Petit** ranks third in the majors in games pitched (13) and leads the majors with 167 games pitched over the last three seasons.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1959** Bob Cerv hits three home runs in Kansas City's 11-10 loss to Boston...in **1963** the A's sweep a doubleheader from Washington...Moe Drabowsky tosses a one-hit shutout in a 9-0 win in Game 1 and Jerry Lumpe hits a two-run home run in the bottom of the 14th inning of Game 2, a 7-5 victory...in **1987** Jose Canseco ties an Oakland record with three doubles, but the A's lose 7-6 to Toronto.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (0-2, 7.65 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...has tossed five innings or fewer and allowed three runs or more in each of his first five starts...has allowed 20 runs for the season, which is fifth most in the majors...has taken the loss in two of his starts, which marks his first two-game losing streak since May 25-30, 2018...has not lost more than two in a row since a career-high tying three-game losing streak from Aug. 1-18, 2017...begins his fifth season in the majors and is on his third Opening Day roster (2017-18, 20).

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Has allowed five runs over the first three innings of his starts this year (14.2 ip, 3.07 ERA) and 15 in the fourth and fifth innings (12 er in 5.1 ip, 20.25 ERA)...opponents are 11-for-52 (.212) over innings one through three and 16-for-31 (.516) in the fourth and fifth innings...in 10 starts over the last two seasons, he has a 1.52 ERA (5 er in 29.2 ip) and .182 (18-for-99) opponents batting average over innings 1-3 and a 7.20 ERA (16 er in 20.0 ip) and .301 (25-for-83) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are hitting .232 (13-for-56) with the bases empty compared to .519 (14-for-27) with runners on...they are 9-for-15 (.600) with runners in scoring position after going 0-for-15 last year...has a .182 (8-for-44) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .487 (19-for-39) after that...has allowed three home runs...the first two were solo shots before Rendon hit a three-run home run Aug. 10...it was his first home run allowed with a runner on base since Aug. 19, 2018 (Gurriel, HOU, three-run).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Had a no decision in his first interleague start last Saturday at San Francisco (5.0 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 3-7 with a 4.24 ERA (38 er in 80.2 ip) in 15 career starts against the National League compared to 32-23 with a 3.87 ERA (186 er in 433.0 ip) in 76 games against the American League.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) July 25 in Oakland...it was his first loss since Aug. 19, 2018 against Houston and it snapped a career-high tying five-game winning streak...retired each of the first 11 batters before Upton homered with two outs in the fourth...then allowed three more runs in the fifth on a Simmons RBI double and a Fletcher two-run double.

SECOND START: He dropped his second consecutive decision in the A's 5-3 loss at Seattle July 31...retired each of the first nine batters before allowing three runs (two earned) in the fourth inning on a Seager two-run double and an error...put runners on first and third with one out in the fifth and was relieved by Wendelken, who allowed both runners to score (one earned).

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over Texas August 5 in Oakland...allowed a first pitch home run to Choo to start the game but then retired nine of the next 11 hitters...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed three runs in the fourth inning on a Solak RBI double, a Kiner-Falefa RBI single and a Refsnyder sacrifice fly...was relieved by Smith with one out in the fourth and the A's trailing 4-2.

FOURTH START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 10-9 loss at Los Angeles (AL) Aug. 10...tossed 2.2 innings, which was his shortest outing since Aug. 7, 2018 against the Dodgers when he also pitched 2.2 innings...allowed a three-run home run to Rendon in the first but the A's came back with three in the second and two in the third...yielded a RBI single to Upton in the bottom of the third and was relieved by Wendelken with two outs in the third and the A's leading 5-4.

LAST START: He had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 7-6 win at San Francisco last Saturday...retired eight of the first nine batters before allowing three runs in the fourth inning on a Slater walk, a Solano single and a Yastrzemski triple and error...then retired each of the final six batters he faced and was relieve by Smith to start the sixth with the score tied 3-3.

2019 RECAP: Began the season on the 60-day injured list as he continued his recovery from Sept. 19, 2018 surgery on his left shoulder...went 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts before he was reinstated from the IL Sept. 1...made five starts with Oakland and was 4-0 with a 1.21 ERA and .160 opponents batting average...the ERA was second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched (Yates SD, 1.19) and fifth lowest in Oakland history...using the same minimum, the batting average was third lowest in the majors and sixth lowest in Oakland history...allowed two runs or fewer in all five starts, including one run or fewer four times, and four hits or fewer four times...struck out 30 batters in 29.2 innings and walked just seven (2.12 per nine innings)...had a .229 opponents on-base percentage and .280 slugging percentage.

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .129 (8-for-62) against right-handed hitters compared to .211 (8-for-38) against left-handers...however, issued six of his seven walks to righties...yielded two of his three home runs to righties and has surrendered 56 of his 65 career homers to right-handers...now has a .220 opponents batting average and .601 OPS in his career against lefties, .255 with a .740 OPS against righties...opponents were 3-for-31 (.097) with runners on base, 0-for-15 with runners in scoring position and 0-for-8 with RISP and two outs...all three of the home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .073 batting average with two strikes...did not allow a hit to the opponent's eight (0-for-9) or nine (0-for-10) hitter.

2019 NIGHT AND DAY: Was 2-0 with a 0.50 ERA in three starts during the day, 2-0 with a 2.31 ERA in two starts at night...is now 16-5 with a 3.32 ERA (74 er in 200.1 ip) in 34 career day games, 19-25 with a 4.31 ERA (150 er in 313.1 ip) in 57 starts at night.

2019 THIS AND THAT: Did not allow a run in innings one through four (20.0 ip) and opponents were 8-for-63 (.127)...had a 3.72 ERA and .216 opponents average from the fifth inning on...went 4-0 in four starts with three runs of support or more...is now 4-28 in 46 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 31-2 in 44 starts with support of three runs or more.

2019 IN MINORS: Started his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton July 8 and was 0-1 with a 9.72 ERA in three starts when he was transferred to Triple-A Las Vegas July 23...went 0-1 with a 6.10 ERA in two starts with the Aviators before his rehab assignment was halted on Aug. 2 due to a strained right oblique...returned to action Aug. 13 and went 3-0 with a 1.53 ERA over his final three starts...was 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts overall...struck out 53 batters in 36.1 innings (13.13 per nine innings) and walked 10 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.3...his opponents batting average broke down to .214 against left-handed hitters compared to .226 with five of his six home runs and eight of his 10 walks against right-handed hitters.

RHP Mike Fiers (1-1, 6.86 ERA):	Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...the A's are 4-1 (.800) in his starting assignments this year and 34-13 (.723) when he starts in his career...is 13-1 with a 2.95 ERA in 24 starts in the Coliseum since he was acquired from Detroit on Aug. 6, 2018...is 8-0 with a 2.87 ERA over his last 15 home starts and is 14-3 with a 3.28 ERA in 30 career games, including 29 starts, in the Coliseum...has a .171 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .385 with six of his seven home runs after that...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 15-3 A's win at San Francisco last Sunday (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...is 6-5 with a 5.48 ERA (87.0 ip, 96 h, 54 r, 53 er, 24 bb, 61 so, 19 hr) in 16 career appearances, 15 starts, against the Angels...including 0-1 with a 10.57 ERA (7.2 ip, 14 h, 9 r, 9 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 4 hr) in two starts this year...was 15-4 with a 3.90 ERA in 33 starts in his first full season with the A's last year.
