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## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (18-8) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (8-18)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won two straight, six of the last eight and 15 of the last 19...are 18-8 (.680) overall and are a season-high tying 10 games over .500 for the second time this year (16-6 on Aug. 16)...the A's record is second best in the majors to the Dodgers (19-8) and tied for fifth best in Oakland history after 26 games...it is the best since the 1990 club started the year 20-6...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 18th consecutive day and are 2½ games ahead of second place Houston for the third consecutive day...have held at least a share of first place for 26 of 28 days this year (18 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's extended their home winning streak to eight games last night, which is their longest home winning streak since July 21-Aug. 5, 2018 when they also won eight in a row...have not won more than eight straight home games since May 17-June 13, 2013 when they had an 11-game home winning streak...are 2-0 on this five-game homestand against Arizona (2-0) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...these are the A's only five home games over a 23-game stretch from Aug. 10 to Sept. 3...went 6-0 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and Houston (3-0) for their first undefeated homestand of six or more games since July 3-8, 2014 when they went 4-0 against Toronto and 2-0 against San Francisco...are 11-3 (.786) at home compared to 7-5 (.583) on the road...have the second best home record in the majors behind the Twins (12-3)...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), San Francisco (3-0) and Arizona (0-2)...leave following the game Sunday for a season-long 10-game road trip to Texas (four games), Houston (three games) and Seattle (three games).

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the second consecutive game today after 10 consecutive games against right-handed starters...are 6-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 12-8 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied for second most in the majors (Dodgers, 7) and Oakland is one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox, 6-0)...the six games against lefties are tied for seventh fewest in the majors.

**IN AUGUST:** The A's are 15-4 (.789) in the month of August, which is the best record in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (14-5)...lead the majors in saves this month (9), rank fifth in ERA (3.58) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (163)...the nine saves match the most by the A's in August over the last eight years...the offense leads the majors in extra base hits (69), walks (89) and strikeouts (196), is tied for the lead in hit by pitches (14), tied for second in runs (107) and triples (5), ranks third in home runs (35) and fourth in OPS (.802) and on-base percentage (.341).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .237 (127-for-535) with 90 runs (5.6 per game) and 32 home runs (2.0 per game) over the last 16 games after hitting .204 with 41 runs (4.1 per game) and eight home runs (0.8 per game) over the first 10 contests...rank second in the majors in walks (114), third in hit by pitches (18), tied for third in triples (7), seventh in home runs (40), eighth in runs (131) and ninth in on-base percentage (.327)...lead the majors in strikeouts (259)...lead the majors in OPS in the seventh inning or later (.850), are tied with the Dodgers for the lead in home runs (15) and rank second in runs scored (53)...are 11-for-26 (.423) with a double, triple, three home runs, 33 RBI and three walks with the bases loaded...are tied for the Major League lead in hits with the bases full, rank second in home runs and RBI and tied for second in extra base hits (5)...the three grand slams are one short of the A's season total from each of the previous two seasons.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed one run in each of the first two games of the homestand and now have a 2.61 ERA (38 er in 131.0 ip) at home compared to 4.87 on the road...have a 3.62 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...are tied for second in fewest hit batters (5), rank fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.93), sixth in opponents on-base percentage (.299), seventh in OPS (.682) and eighth in slugging (.383)...have allowed nine home runs in 131.0 innings at home compared to 20 in 105.1 innings on the road.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 2-0 with a 0.77 ERA (1 er in 11.2 ip) on the homestand and are now 5-3 with a 3.28 ERA (26 er in 71.1 ip) at home for the season...are 4-3 on the road but have a 6.71 ERA (42 er in 56.1 ip)...are tied for fourth in the majors in wins (9) and tied for eighth in innings

pitched (127.2)...have surrendered 13 home runs over the last 10 games after yielding just seven over the first 16 games...the 20 home runs are tied for seventh most in the majors.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed four errors over the last 16 games after making six over the first 10 contests...have 10 errors for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors...A's outfielders have four assists, which is tied for seventh most in the majors.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have been successful in 12-of-14 (85.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the fifth best percentage in the majors...are tied for eighth in steals...however, opponents have been successful in 13-of-15 (86.7%) steal attempts, which is fifth highest in the majors...are tied for eighth in stolen bases allowed

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's lead the majors with three walk-off wins, two of which are grand slams...are 6-2 in games decided in the last at bat...the six wins are tied with the Rays for the most in the majors and the eight games are tied for second most to the Blue Jays (12)...are 4-0 in extra inning games...the wins are the most in the majors and the four extra games are tied for third most...are 5-2 in one-run games and the wins are tied for third most in the majors...are 9-3 in games decided by two runs or fewer...have nine come-from-behind wins, which is tied for second most to the Dodgers (10)...are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (2) and seven innings (3).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 9-3 (.750) in day games, 9-5 (.643) at night...have the most day games in the majors...are 18-3 when homering, 0-5 when going homerless...are one of four teams that has not won a game when going homerless (Pirates, Phillies, Yankees)...are 5-4 (.556) in interleague play compared to 13-4 (.765) against the American League...are 15-5 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 where they are scheduled to have just one day off in 31 days...are 10-2 (.833) on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, 8-6 (.571) on Monday through Thursday...have two players on the injured list (Puk, Smith) and have used the IL four times this year...are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season.

**A's vs. ANGELS:** The A's lead the season series, which concludes with this three-game series, 4-3...won three of four in Oakland to start the season and lost two of three in Anaheim Aug. 10-12...the A's have won 11 of the last 15 games and 24 of the last 37...won the season series last year 13-6 for the their first season series win since 2013...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 454-385 against the Angels...that includes 238-181 in Oakland and 216-204 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 503-462 against the Angels.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** is tied for fourth in the majors in extra base hits (17) and triples (2) and tied for 10th in home runs (8)...**Robbie Grossman** ranks second among players in the West divisions in on-base percentage (.452), tied for third in triples (2) and hit by pitches (4), fourth in OPS (1.068), fifth in slugging (.615) and tied for sixth in stolen bases (4)...**Liam Hendriks** has converted each of his last eight save opportunities, which matches the longest such streak of his career (June 22-July 20, 2019 and Aug. 1-29, 2019)...is tied for the Major League lead in saves (8)...**Matt Olson** hit his 98th career home run in his 385th game last night, which is tied for the seventh most home runs in Major League history by a player over his first 385 career games...**Yusmeiro Petit** is tied for the Major League lead in games pitched (14)...ranks second in the majors in games pitched over the last four seasons (228) and his 274.0 innings pitched as a reliever are the most over that span.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1983** Rickey Henderson steals the 399th base of his career, breaking Bert Campaneris' Oakland record of 398...in **1997** Jason Giambi, Ernie Young, Jason McDonald and Jose Canseco all homer in the third inning of the A's 13-6 win over Boston...the four home runs in an inning sets an Oakland record...in **2002** Cory Lidle tosses his second complete game one-hitter of the season in the A's 6-0 win at Cleveland, extending his scoreless streak to 31 innings...the streak would end at 32 innings in his next start on August 26...in **2006** the A's tie what was then an Oakland record by overcoming an eight-run deficit to defeat Toronto, 12-10...Dan Haren allows eight runs in the first two innings and nine runs total, setting an Oakland record for runs allowed in a win.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (2-1, 5.96 ERA)

**FOR OPENERS:** Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...the A's are 4-1 (.800) in his starting assignments this year and 34-13 (.723) when he starts in his career...is tied for fifth in the majors in home runs allowed (7) and tied for sixth in hits (32)...is in his 10th season in the majors and is with his fourth team...has pitched for Milwaukee (2011-15), Houston (2015-17), Detroit (2018) and Oakland (2018-present)...is on his sixth Opening Day roster (2013, 15-17, 19-20).

**AT THE COLISEUM:** Has a win and a no decisions in two starts at home this year and is now 13-1 with a 2.95 (47 er in 143.1) ERA in 24 starts in the Coliseum since he was acquired from Detroit on Aug. 6, 2018...is 8-0 with a 2.87 ERA (30 er in 94.0 ip) over his last 15 home starts and has not lost at home since April 20, 2019 vs. Toronto...is 14-3 with a 3.28 ERA (63 er in 172.2 ip) and .226 (142-for-628) opponents batting average in 30 career games, including 29 starts, in the Coliseum...last year, he was 9-2 with a 2.90 ERA and .641 OPS in 17 starts at home compared to 6-2 with a 5.14 ERA and .796 OPS in 16 starts on the road...had the fifth-lowest home ERA in the AL and the fourth-highest road ERA...tied for fourth in the AL in home wins and ranked eighth in OPS.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has a .171 (7-for-41) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .385 (25-for-65) with six of his seven home runs after that...opponents are hitting .351 (13-for-37) with runners on base but that drops to .263 (5-for-19) with runners in scoring position, including .143 (1-for-7) with RISP and two outs...has allowed a 370 (10-for-27) average to batters leading off an inning.

**BY INNING:** Has not allowed a run in the first inning (5.0)...has allowed just one run over the first two innings (1 er in 10.0 ip, 0.90 ERA) and opponents are 5-for-34 (.147) in those two innings...has allowed 16 runs from the third inning on (15.2 ip, 9.19 ERA) and opponents are hitting .375 (27-for-72).

**THE AMERICAN LEAGUE WEST:** Is 1-1 with a 6.86 ERA (15 er in 19.2 ip) in four starts against American League West teams compared to 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (2 er in 6.0 ip) in one start against the National League West...is now 15-16 with a 5.62 ERA (193 er in 309.0 ip) in 59 career appearances against the AL West, 56-44 with a 3.46 ERA (307 er in 799.1 ip) in 151 games against all other opponents.

**WITH THE A'S:** Was acquired by Oakland on Aug. 6, 2018 and is 22-7 with a 4.07 ERA (119 er in 263.1 ip) in 48 games, including 47 starts, with the A's...the wins are tied for fourth most in the American League over that span.

**FIRST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over Los Angeles (AL) July 26 in Oakland...did not walk or strikeout a batter in 4.0 innings...it was his first career start with no walks and no strikeouts...the A's scored five times in the first and he allowed a three-run home run to Trout in the third inning...was relieved by Petit with runners on first and third and no outs in the fifth and Petit allowed one of those runners to score.

**SECOND START:** He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 10-inning win at Seattle on Aug. 1...allowed a two-run single to Seager in the third inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...the A's tied the game with two runs in the seventh and he was relieved by Diekmann to start the bottom of the seventh.

**THIRD START:** He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 6-4 victory over Texas Aug. 6 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on a hit and a walk over the first four innings and had a 5-0 lead entering the fifth...allowed a RBI single to Tejada in the fifth, a solo home run to Frazier in the sixth and a two-run home run to Tejada in the seventh...was relieved by McFarland with no outs in the seventh and the A's leading 5-4.

**FOURTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on Aug. 11...allowed five runs in 3.2 innings, all on home runs in the fourth inning...Rendon led off the inning with a home run, Castro added a three-run shot and Goodwin capped the scoring with a solo home run...Bundy, Mayers and Robles combined to shut out the A's on five hits.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 15-2 win at San Francisco last Sunday...Oakland scored a run in the second but he allowed a Belt solo home run in the bottom of the second...the A's added a run in the third but he allowed a Yastrzemski RBI single in the bottom of the third...those are the only two runs he would allow in six innings of work and the A's scored nine times in the fifth to put the game away.

**FIERS vs. LOS ANGELES:** Is 6-5 with a 5.48 ERA (87.0 ip, 96 h, 54 r, 53 er, 24 bb, 61 so, 19 hr) in 16 career appearances, 15 starts...is 3-4 with a 8.31 ERA (36 er in 39.0 ip) in eight games in Angel Stadium and 3-1 with a 3.19 ERA (17 er in 48.0 ip) in eight starts in his home ballparks...including 1-0 with a 4.80 ERA (8 er in 15.0 ip) in three starts in the Coliseum...is 0-1 with a 10.57 ERA (7.2 ip, 14 h, 9 r, 9 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 4 hr) in two starts this year...had a no decision in his first start this year, a 6-4 A's win in Oakland on July 26 (see first start above)...then took the loss in a 6-0 decision at Los Angeles (AL) on Aug. 11 (see fourth start above)...went 3-0 with a 3.04 ERA (23.2 ip, 21 h, 8 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 15 so, 3 hr) in four starts last year.

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Was 1-3 with a 5.51 ERA in five starts during the spring...however, held the opposition to a .210 batting average...the five starts tied for the most in the majors...his 16.1 innings pitched led the Cactus League and ranked fifth in the majors...is now 7-11 with a 5.96 ERA (77 er in 116.1 ip) in 43 games, including 31 starts, in his career during the spring.

**2019 RECAP:** Was 15-4 with a 3.90 ERA in 33 starts in his first full season with the A's...ranked third in the American League in winning percentage (.789), sixth in opponents batting average (.243), tied for eighth in wins and 10th in OPS (.712) and on-base percentage (.304)...also tied for third in wild pitches (13) and tied for fifth in games started...had career highs in wins, games (33), games started, innings pitched (184.2) and winning percentage...led the A's in wins, starts, innings pitched, runs (82), walks (53) and home runs (30)...is the first A's pitcher to win 15 games since Scott Kazmir had 15 in 2014 and the first to make 33 starts since Sonny Gray had 33 in 2014...his innings pitched were the most by an A's pitcher over the last three years...his .789 winning percentage was fourth best in Oakland history among pitchers with 15 or more decisions...his 30 home runs tied for 10th most in a season in Oakland history...struck out 126 batters, an average of 6.14 per nine innings...that was the third-lowest mark in the AL...had the fifth-lowest strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.38)...went 2-3 with a 6.81 ERA, .297 opponents batting average and .854 OPS over his first eight starts last year, 10-0 with a 2.12 ERA, .199 opponents average and .572 OPS over his next 17 starts from May 7-Aug. 9 and 3-1 with a 6.27 ERA, .304 opponents average and .940 OPS over his final eight starts...the A's were 22-11 (.667) in his starting assignments...left with the lead in eight of his no decisions in 2019 only to have the bullpen blow the save...has left with the lead in 12 of his 46 career starts with the A's only to have the bullpen blow the save.

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER**  
**RHP Chris Bassitt (2-0, 2.93 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his first five starts and opponents are batting .206...has allowed seven runs and three home runs over his last two starts (5.72 ERA) after allowing two runs and no home runs over his first three (1.08 ERA)...is 0-0 with a 0.82 ERA in two starts in Oakland compared to 2-0 with a 4.32 ERA in three starts on the road...has allowed all three of his home runs on the road...is now 7-9 with a 2.72 ERA in 31 career games in the Coliseum, 9-10 with a 4.62 ERA in 42 games in all other ballparks...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss at Arizona last Monday (5.1 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...is 3-2 with a 5.52 ERA (31.0 ip, 36 h, 23 r, 19 er, 6 bb, 31 so, 5 hr) in eight career appearances, including six starts, against Los Angeles...is 1-0 with a 3.72 ERA (9.2 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year.
