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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-8) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (8-19)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight, seven of the last nine and 16 of the last 20...are a season-high 11 games over .500 at 19-8 (.704)...that is the second best record in the majors to the Dodgers (20-8) and tied for fourth best in Oakland history after 27 games...it is the best since the 1990 club started the year 21-6...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 19th consecutive day and are 3½ games ahead of second place Houston...have held at least a share of first place for 27 of 29 days this year (19 days in first, eight days tied for

first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's extended their home winning streak to nine games last night, which is tied for the sixth longest home winning streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since May 17-June 13, 2013 when they had an 11-game home winning streak...are 3-0 on this five-game homestand against Arizona (2-0) and Los Angeles-AL (1-0)...these are the A's only five home games over a 23-game stretch from Aug. 10 to Sept. 3...went 6-0 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and Houston (3-0) for their first undefeated homestand of six or more games since July 3-8, 2014 when they went 4-0 against Toronto and 2-0 against San Francisco...are 12-3 (.800) at home compared to 7-5 (.583) on the road...are tied with the Twins for the best home record in the majors)...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), San Francisco (3-0) and Arizona (0-2)...leave following the game Sunday for a season-long 10-game road trip to Texas (four games), Houston (three games) and Seattle (three games).

IN AUGUST: The A's are 16-4 (.800) in the month of August, which is the best record in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (15-5)...the 16 wins are one short of the A's August total from last year...lead the majors in saves this month (10) and rank fourth in ERA (3.55)...the 10 saves are second most by an A's team in August over the last 14 years (11 in 2012)...the offense leads the majors in extra base hits (74), walks (93), hit by pitches (15) and strikeouts (208), ranks second in runs (112), tied for second in triples (5), fourth in home runs (36) and on-base percentage (.341) and fifth in OPS (.803).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .238 (135-for-567) with 95 runs (5.6 per game) and 33 home runs (1.9 per game) over the last 17 games after hitting .204 with 41 runs (4.1 per game) and eight home runs (0.8 per game) over the first 10 contests...rank second in the majors in walks (118), third in hit by pitches (19), tied for third in triples (7), seventh in home runs (41), tied for seventh in runs (136), eighth in on-base percentage (.328) and ninth in extra base hits (86)...lead the majors in strikeouts (271)...lead the majors in OPS in the seventh inning or later (.839), rank second in runs scored (53) and tied for second in home runs (15)...are 11-for-26 (.423) with a double, triple, three home runs, 33 RBI and three walks with the bases loaded...are tied for the Major League lead in hits with the bases full, rank second in home runs and RBI and tied for second in extra base hits (5)...the three grand slams are one short of the A's season total from each of the previous two seasons.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed five runs on the homestand (27.0 ip, 1.67 ERA) and now have a 2.64 ERA (41 er in 140.0 ip) at home compared to 4.87 on the road...have a 3.60 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the majors...rank fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.93), sixth in opponents OPS (.685) and slugging (.382) and eighth in on-base percentage (.303)... have allowed nine home runs in 140.0 innings at home compared to 20 in 105.1 innings on the road.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have picked up the win in three consecutive games for the first time this year...are 3-0 with a 2.12 ERA (4 er in 17.0 ip) on the homestand and are now 6-3 with a 3.40 ERA (29 er in 76.2 ip) at home for the season...are 4-3 on the road but have a 6.71 ERA (42 er in 56.1 ip)...are tied for fourth in the majors in wins (10) and rank eighth in innings pitched (133.0)...have surrendered 13 home runs over the last 11 games after yielding just seven over the first 16 games.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have a four-game errorless streak and have committed four errors over the last 17 games after making six over the first 10 contests...have 10 errors for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in

the majors...A's outfielders have four assists, which is tied for eighth most in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 13-of-15 (86.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the fourth best percentage in the majors...are tied for seventh in steals...however, opponents have been successful in 13-of-15 (86.7%) steal attempts, which is third highest in the majors...are tied for eighth in stolen bases allowed.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 7-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 12-8 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied with the White Sox and Dodgers for the most in the majors and Oakland is one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox, 7-0)...the seven games against lefties are tied for 10th fewest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lead the majors with three walk-off wins, two of which are grand slams...are 6-2 in games decided in the last at bat...the six wins are tied with the Rays for the most in the majors and the eight games are tied for second most to the Blue Jays (13)...are 4-0 in extra inning games...the wins are the most in the majors and the four extra games are tied for third...are 5-2 in one-run games and the wins are tied for third most in the majors...are 10-3 in games decided by two runs or fewer...have nine come-from-behind wins, which is tied for third most...are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (2) and seven innings (3).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 9-3 (.750) in day games, 10-5 (.667) at night...have the most day games in the majors...are 19-3 when homering, 0-5 when going homerless...are one of four teams that has not won a game when going homerless (Pirates, Phillies, Yankees)...are 5-4 (.556) in interleague play compared to 14-4 (.778) against the American League...are 16-5 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 where they are scheduled to have just one day off in 31 days...are 11-2 (.846) on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, 8-6 (.571) on Monday through Thursday...have two players on the injured list (Puk, Smith) and have used the IL four times this year...are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 5-3...need one more win in the final two games to clinch the season series for the second consecutive year...had lost five consecutive season series prior to last year and have not won back-to-back season series since winning three straight from 2011-13... are 4-1 in Oakland and 1-2 in Anaheim...have won 12 of the last 16 games and 25 of the last 38...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 455-385 against the Angels...that includes 239-181 in Oakland and 216-204 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 504-462 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is tied for second among players in the West divisions in extra base hits (18), tied for third in triples (2), ranks fifth in home runs (8), tied for fifth in doubles (8), tied for seventh in runs (19) and RBI (20) and 10th in slugging (.578)...Robbie Grossman ranks third among players in the West divisions in on-base percentage (.452) and OPS (1.068), tied for third in triples (2) and hit by pitches (4) and fifth in slugging (.615...Liam Hendriks has converted each of his last nine save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career...lead the majors in saves (9)...Matt Olson is tied for fourth in the majors in home runs (9) and walks (20)...Yusmeiro Petit is tied for third in the majors in games pitched (14)...ranks second in the majors in games pitched over the last four seasons (228) and his 274.0 innings pitched as a reliever are the most over that span.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1928 Mule Haas leads off the bottom of the 17th inning with a home run as the A's defeat Cleveland, 6-5...Eddie Rommel tosses nine innings of scoreless relief for the win...in 1971 the A's and the Red Sox are tied at 1-1 entering the bottom of the ninth of the first game of a doubleheader when Reggie Jackson hits an inside the park home run with two outs to give the A's the win...in 1990 Rickey Henderson scores his 744th run in an A's uniform, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland record...Rickey finished his A's career with 1270 runs scored.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (2-0, 2.93 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his first five starts and opponents are batting .206 (21-for-102)...has allowed seven runs and three home runs over his last two starts (11.0 ip, 5.72 ERA) after allowing two runs and no home runs over his first three (1.08 ERA)...the A's are 4-1 (.800) in his starting assignment this year and 19-11 (.633) over the last two years...begins his sixth season in the majors and is on his second Opening Day roster...his other was in 2016 with Oakland

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Has two wins and three no decisions in five starts this year to extend his winning streak to a career-high five games dating back to Aug. 11, 2019...has a 3.46 ERA (25 er in 65.0 ip) and .229 (57-for-249) opponents batting average during the streak, which spans 14 games, including 11 starts...has walked just 15 (2.08 per nine innings) while striking out 62 (8.58 per nine innings) in 65.0 innings during the streak...has not lost since July 24, 2019 at Houston.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-0 with a 0.82 ERA (1 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland compared to 2-0 with a 4.32 ERA (8 er in 16.2 ip) in three starts on the road...has allowed all three of his home runs on the road...is now 7-9 with a 2.72 ERA (49 er in 162.0 ip) in 31 career games in the Coliseum, 9-10 with a 4.62 ERA (103 er in 201.0 ip) in 42 games in all other ballparks...has yielded just 11 home runs in 162.0 career innings in Oakland (0.61 per nine innings).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-0 with a 2.93 ERA (5 er in 15.1 ip) in three starts during the day, 0-0 with a 2.92 ERA (4 er in 12.1 ip) in two starts at night...is now 9-1 with a 3.06 ERA (27 er in 79.1 ip) in 15 day games dating back to May 16, 2019 after going 0-9 with a 4.06 ERA over his first 17 career games during the day.

SINCE THE SURGERY: Did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 14-8 with a 3.53 ERA (86 er in 219.1 ip) and is averaging 8.37 strikeouts per nine innings (204 so in 219.1 ip) in 44 games (36 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

FIRST START: He combined with five A's relievers on a nine-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) July 27 in Oakland...had a no decision as he tossed four innings...allowed five of the hits and walked a batter but ended up stranding five base runners (also had a GIDP)...was relieved by Smith to start the fifth inning with the A's leading 3-0.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-2 win at Seattle Auust 2...allowed a RBI single to Vogelbach in the first inning but then blanked the Mariners on two hits over his final 4.2 innings...retired 10 straight at one point...Oakland scored three times in the fifth to take a 3-1 lead and he was relieved by McFarland with two outs in the sixth.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 13-inning win over Houston Aug. 7 in Oakland...allowed just one run, giving him one run or fewer in each of his first three starts, to become the first A's pitcher to begin the season in the starting rotation and allow one run or fewer in each of his first three starts since Gio Gonzalez in 2011 (April 3-14)...retired seven of the first eight batters before a Maldonado walk, a wild pitch and a Tucker RBI double gave the Astros their first run...that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work and he was relieved by Soria to start the eighth with the scored tied 1-1.

FOURTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) Aug. 12...Oakland scored a run in the first but he allowed a solo home run to Trout in the bottom of the first...the A's came back with two in the second but he allowed two in the third on a La Stella RBI single and a Trout sacrifice fly...had a 5-3 lead when he allowed a two-out home run to Rendon in the sixth...was relieved by Diekman following the home run.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss at Arizona on Monday... allowed a solo home run to Peralta in the third and two more runs in the sixth on an Escobar RBI fielders choice and a Kelly RBI single...was relieved by Petit with one out and a runner on first in the sixth inning with the A's trailing 3-0...Oakland then scored once in the seventh and twice in the eighth to get him off the hook.

2019 RECAP: Saw the most extensive action of his five-year career, going 10-5 with a 3.81 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 28 games, including 25 starts...had career highs in every category except losses as he was 4-14 in 40 games over his first four years...had career lows in opponents onbase percentage (.303) and fewest walks per nine innings (2.94)...led the A's with 141 strikeouts, which were the most by an Oakland pitcher since Sonny Gray had 169 in 2015...tied an Oakland record and tied for third in the American League with 13 hit batters...shares the record with Barry Zito, who did it three times (2001, 2005 and 2006)...went 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .179 opponents average over his first five starts through May 16 and 3-3 with a 6.00 ERA and .249 opponents average over his next nine starts leading into the All-Star Break...then went 5-1 with a 3.26 ERA in 14 games after the break... his post-break ERA was seventh lowest in the AL among pitchers with 60 or more innings...began the season with 25 starts and concluded the year with three relief appearances.

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING AVERAGE: His opponents batting average broke down to .209 (58-for-278) against left-handed hitters compared to .251 (67-for-267) against right-handers...the mark against lefties was sixth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 140 or more innings...surrendered 14 of his 21 home runs and issued 29 of his 47 walks to lefties for a .701 OPS...had a .695 OPS against righties...yielded a .221 average with runners in scoring position...had a .206 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .266 the second time and .211 after that...surrendered 12 of his 21 home runs the second time through the lineup.

2019 THIS AND THAT: Received two runs of support or fewer in 13 of his 25 starts and went 2-5 in those games...was 8-0 in 12 starts with support of three runs or more...has received two runs of support or fewer in 39 of his 59 career starts and is 4-19 in those games...is 12-0 in 21 career starts with run support of three runs or more...was 5-1 with a 2.65 ERA in 10 starts following an A's loss...had a 2.88 ERA in the first inning, 4.01 from the second inning on...did not commit an error in 19 chances and turned three double plays, which tied for third among AL pitchers...opponents were successful in 10-of-12 (83.3%) stolen base attempts off him.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (2-2, 4.74 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...allowed nine runs in 1.2 innings in his last start last Tuesday at Arizona after missing his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness...allowed just four runs in 23.0 innings (1.57 ERA) over his first four starts...is 2-0 with a 1.00 ERA in three starts against American League West teams compared to 0-2 with a 14.85 ERA in two starts against the National League West...now has a seven-game winning streak against divisional foes dating back to April 17, 2019...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 10-1 A's loss at Arizona on Monday (1.2 ip, 6 h, 9 r, 9 er, 4 bb, 1 so, 2 hr)...is 2-0 with a 2.87 ERA (31.1 ip, 26 h, 10 r, 10 er, 12 bb, 28 so, 3 hr) in eight career appearances, including five starts, against the Angels...including a no decision in his only start this year, a 7-3 A's win in 10 innings on Opening Night in Oakland, July 24 (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 5 so).

9-2, 2.16 ERA (27 er in 112.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 12-for-14 (85.7%)

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in nine of the last 10 games (9 er in 40.2 ip, 1.99 ERA)...has a 2.16 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors behind the Dodgers (1.81).
- Ranks second in the majors in opponents OPS (.586), on-base percentage (.272) and slugging percentage (.314) and fourth in batting average (.208).
- Has converted 12-of-14 (85.7%) save opportunities...leads the majors in saves and ranks sixth in save percentage.
