OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-9) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (9-19)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their three-game winning streak snapped last night but are 7-3 over the last 10 games and 16-5 over the last 21...are 19-9 (.679) for the season, which is the second best record in the majors to the Dodgers (21-8) and tied for fourth best in Oakland history after 28 games...it is the best since the 1990 club started the year 22-6... are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 20th consecutive day and are 3½ games ahead of second place Houston for the second consecutive day...have held at least a share

of first place for 28 of 30 days this year (20 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this five-game homestand against Arizona (2-0) and Los Angeles-AL (1-1)...these are the A's only five home games over a 23-game stretch from Aug. 10 to Sept. 3...had their home winning streak snapped at nine games yesterday...it tied for the sixth longest home winning streak in Oakland history and was the longest since May 17-June 13, 2013 when they had an 11-game streak...went 6-0 on the last homestand and are 12-4 (.750) at home compared to 7-5 (.583) on the road...have the fourth best home record in the majors...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), San Francisco (3-0) and Arizona (0-2)...leave following the game today for a season-long 10-game road trip to Texas (four games), Houston (three games) and Seattle (three games).

IN AUGUST: The A's are 16-5 (.800) in the month of August, which is tied with the Dodgers for the best record in the majors...the 16 wins are one short of the A's August total from last year...lead the majors in saves this month (10) and rank fifth in ERA (3.48)...the 10 saves are second most by an A's team in August over the last 14 years (11 in 2012)...the offense leads the majors in extra base hits (78), walks (96), hit by pitches (15) and strikeouts (213), ranks second in runs (115), tied for second in triples (5), fourth in home runs (37) and fifth in on-base percentage (.337).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .235 (141-for-599) with 98 runs (5.4 per game) and 34 home runs (1.9 per game) over the last 18 games after hitting .204 with 41 runs (4.1 per game) and eight home runs (0.8 per game) over the first 10 contests...are tied for the Major League lead in walks (121), rank third in hit by pitches (19), tied for third in triples (7), tied for sixth in home runs (42), tied for eighth in runs (139), ninth in extra base hits (90) and tied for 10th in on-base percentage (.325)...lead the majors in strikeouts (276) and have the sixth lowest batting average (.224)...rank third in the majors in runs (53), home runs (15) and OPS (.815) in the seventh inning or later...are 11-for-26 (.423) with a double, triple, three home runs, 33 RBI and three walks with the bases loaded...rank second in hits and extra base hits (5)...the three grand slams are one short of the A's season total from each of the previous two seasons.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed nine runs over the first four games of the homestand (7 er in 36.0 ip, 1.75 ERA) and now have a 2.60 ERA (43 er in 149.0 ip) at home compared to 4.87 on the road...have a 3.54 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...rank fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.94), sixth in opponents OPS (.682) and slugging (.379) and seventh in on-base percentage (.302)...have allowed nine home runs in 149.0 innings at home compared to 20 in 105.1 innings on the road.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-1 with a 2.38 ERA (6 er in 22.2 ip) on the homestand and are now 6-4 with a 3.39 ERA (31 er in 82.1 ip) at home for the season...are 4-3 on the road but have a 6.71 ERA (42 er in 56.1 ip)...are tied for fourth in the majors in wins (10) and tied for eighth in innings pitched (138.2)...have surrendered 13 home runs over the last 12 games after yielding just seven over the first 16 games.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed three errors yesterday, which were their most errors in a game since May 30, 2018 when they had four...it snapped a 295-game streak with two errors or fewer, which more than doubled the previous longest streak in Oakland history (114 twice)...had committed just four errors over the previous 17 games and now have 13 for the season, which is tied for ninth fewest in the majors...are also tied for ninth

in fewest double plays turned (19)...A's outfielders have four assists, which is tied for eighth most.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 14-of-16 (87.5%) stolen base attempts, which is tied with the Tigers for the best percentage in the majors...are tied for seventh in steals...however, opponents have been successful in 13-of-16 (81.3%) steal attempts, which is tied for seventh highest in the majors...are tied for ninth in stolen bases allowed.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 7-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 12-9 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied for second most in the majors (Dodgers, 8) and Oakland is one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox, 7-0)...the seven games against lefties are tied for eighth fewest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are tied with the Rays and Braves for the most walk-off wins in the majors (3)...are 6-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for the second most last at bat wins (Rays, 7) and tied for the third most games...are 4-0 in extra inning games...the wins are the most in the majors and the games are tied for fourth...are 5-3 in one-run games and the wins are tied for fifth most in the majors...are 10-4 in games decided by two runs or fewer...have nine come-from-behind wins, which is tied for fourth most... are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (2) and tied for second when trailing after seven innings (3).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-0 on Sunday and are one of two teams that has not lost on Sunday (Braves, 5-0)...are 9-4 (.692) in day games, 10-5 (.667) at night...have the most day games in the majors...are 19-4 when homering, 0-5 when going homerless...are one of four teams that has not won a game when going homerless (Pirates, Phillies, Yankees)...are 5-4 (.556) in interleague play compared to 14-5 (.737) against the American League...are 16-6 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 where they are scheduled to have just one day off in 31 days...have two players on the injured list (Puk, Smith) and have used the IL four times this year...are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 5-4 entering the final game today...won the season series last year 13-6, which was their first season series win since 2013...have not won back-to-back season series since winning three straight from 2011-13 and have never split a season series with the Angels...are 4-2 in Oakland this year and 1-2 in Anaheim...have won 12 of the last 17 games and 25 of the last 39...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 455-386 against the Angels...that includes 239-182 in Oakland and 216-204 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 504-463 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is batting .295 (18-for-61) with 14 runs, seven doubles, a triple, seven home runs (.787 slugging percentage) and 17 RBI over his last 15 games...is tied for second in the majors in extra base hits (19), tied for fifth in total bases (67) and tied for sixth in home runs (9)...Robbie Grossman is 13-for-39 (.333) with 10 runs, four doubles, two triples, four home runs, nine RBI, 13 walks and two hit by pitches over his last 12 games (.519 obp, .846 slug, 1.365 ops)...ranks seventh in the majors in on-base percentage (.443) and eighth in OPS (1.052)...Liam Hendriks has converted each of his last nine save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career...lead the majors in saves (9) and ranks fourth in games pitched (14)... Matt Olson is tied for fifth in the majors in walks (20) and tied for sixth in home runs (9)...Yusmeiro Petit is tied for the most games pitched in the majors (15)...ranks second in the majors in games pitched over the last four seasons (229) and his 275.0 innings pitched as a reliever are the most over that span.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (2-2, 4.74 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...allowed nine runs in 1.2 innings in his last start on Tuesday at Arizona after missing his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness... allowed just four runs in 23.0 innings (1.57 ERA) over his first four starts...is 16-8 with a 3.05 ERA (63 er in 185.2 ip) in 34 games, 32 starts, over the last three years after going 1-3 with a 6.32 ERA in 30 games, two starts, over his first two seasons...is in his fifth season in the majors and is on his third Opening Day roster (2017, 19-20).

THE AMERICAN LEAGUE WEST AND THE REST: Is 2-0 with a 1.00 ERA (2 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts against American League West teams compared to 0-2 with a 14.85 ERA (11 er in 6.2 ip) in two starts against the National League West...now has a seven-game winning streak against divisional foes dating back to April 17, 2019...has a 2.64 ERA (17 er in 58.0 ip) over that stretch, which spans 10 starts...his last loss to an AL West team was on April 5, 2019 at Houston...is 9-3 with a 3.29 ERA (40 er in 109.1 ip) in 28 games against the AL West in his career, compared to 8-8 with a 4.52 ERA (62 er in 123.1 ip) in 36 career games against non AL West teams...is 2-3 with a 6.75 ERA (24 er in 32.0 ip) in nine career interleague appearances, including six starts.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in four of his five starts...received 10 of his 15 runs of support this year in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle...over the last two years, he has received two runs of support or fewer in 11 of his 21 starts and seven runs or more seven times...in his career, he is 11-1 in 14 starts when three runs of support or more.

THIS AND THAT: Was named American League Player of the Week for the week of Aug. 3-9 after going 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA in two starts...struck out 14, walked four and allowed six hits in 14.0 innings...it was his first career Player of the Week honor...opponents are 4-for-21 (.190) when leading off an inning but he has issued four walks (.320 on-base percentage)...yielded a .207 average to batters leading off an inning last year...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number eight hitter (0-for-7).

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-3, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) on Opening Day, July 24 in Oakland...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the A's 13th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 15 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers)...was just the second foreign-born Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Ariel Prieto, April 2, 1997)...scattered two hits, a walk and hit a batter over the first three innings before allowing his only run in the fourth inning on a Goodwin RBI single...was relieved by Petit to start the fifth inning with the scored tied 1-1

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Colorado July 29 in Oakland...it was his first loss since April 29, 2019 at Boston and it snapped a five-game winning streak dating back to May 17, 2019...the A's scored a run in the first and he allowed a RBI single to Wolters in the second inning...also surrendered a sacrifice fly to Hampson in the fourth and was relieved by Luzardo to start the sixth with the A's trailing 2-1.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-1 victory at Seattle on August 3...allowed a RBI double to Seager in the third inning but that would be the only run he would allow in seven innings of work...Oakland scored eight times in the fifth inning and he retired 10 of the final 11 batters he faced.

FOURTH START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-1 win over Houston Aug. 8 in Oakland...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits, he fewest hits allowed in a start of more than four innings in his career...retired the first four batters, allowed a double to Gurriel in the fourth, retired the next eight batters, allowed a single to Gurriel in the fifth and then retired the final nine batters...now has an 11.0-inning scoreless streak, which is four short of his career high of 15 (June 1-8, 2018).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss at Arizona on Monday...allowed a career-high nine runs on six hits and four walks in 1.2 innings...it was the shortest start of his career...allowed five runs in the first inning, including a three-run home run by Ahmed...also surrendered a solo home run to Calhoun in the second and was relieved by Trivino with the bases loaded and two outs in the second...Trivino allowed all three runs to score.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-0 and did not allow an earned run in three starts...yielded two unearned runs in 5.2 innings...opponents went 4-for-22 (.182) and he walked just one batter in 5.2 innings...his final outing came on Mar. 8 against Milwaukee in Mesa...is now 3-0 with a 0.42 ERA in eight games, five starts, over the last two springs.

2019 RECAP: Went 9-2 with a 2.63 ERA in 16 starts in a season shortened due to an 80-game suspension for violating Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...his ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.230), on-base percentage (.282) and OPS (.646)...had career highs in wins, starts, strikeouts (103), innings (96.0), hits (84), runs (35), walks (23) and hit batters (4) and matched his high in earned runs (28) and wild pitches (4)...averaged 2.16 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.48 was a career high...surrendered eight home runs (0.75 per nine innings).

90 OR MORE INNINGS RANKINGS: His 2.63 ERA was third lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 90 innings...using the same minimum, he ranked fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings, fifth in opponents OPS, sixth in slugging percentage (.364), ninth in on-base percentage and 10th in strikeout-to-walk ratio...averaged 9.66 strikeouts per nine innings, which was second highest in Oakland history (Gio Gonzalez, 9.94 in 2009) and third highest in Athletics history (Wes Stock, 9.77 in 1964) among pitchers with 90 or more innings...his 4.48 strikeout-to-walk ratio was fourth highest in Oakland history.

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING: Had a .229 (38-for-166) opponents batting average and .647 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .231 (46-for-199) with a .645 OPS against left-handers...allowed a .207 average to batters leading off an inning and .115 with two strikes...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...only one came the first time through the batting order...opponents were 4-for-7 (.571) with the bases loaded.

2019 SPLITS: Was 4-0 with a 3.00 ERA in seven starts at home, 5-2 with a 2.33 ERA in nine starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 42.0 innings in Oakland compared to six in 54.0 innings on the road...had a 3-0 record and a 1.50 ERA in four starts during the day, 6-2 with a 3.00 ERA in 12 starts at night...went 5-2 with a 3.00 ERA in 11 starts on four or five days rest, 4-0 with a 1.91 ERA in five starts on six days rest or more.

2019 THIS AND THAT: Allowed just one run in the first inning for a 0.56 ERA... had a 5.63 ERA in the second inning and a 2.39 ERA from the third inning on...the A's were 12-4 (.750) in his starting assignments and are 22-10 (.688) when he starts in his career...committed three errors, which tied for the most among AL pitchers...pitched for Escogido in the Dominican Winter League following the season and was 3-0 with a 1.44 ERA in five starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Jesús Luzardo (2-0, 3.67 ERA): Is scheduled to make his seventh appearance and fifth start of the season...has not allowed a run in three of his six appearances...made his first two appearances of the season in relief (4.05 ERA) and is 2-0 with a 3.54 ERA in his four starts since then...the A's are 4-0 in his starting assignments...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's win over Arizona on Wednesday in Oakland (6.1 ip, 4 h, 2 bb, 7 so)...is 0-0 with a save and a 1.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 11 so, 0 hr) in three career appearances, including one start, against Texas...the start came in his only appearance this year, a no decision in the A's 5-1 win in Oakland on Aug. 4 (5.0 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 5 so)...was 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA and .143 opponents batting average in three starts this spring...struck out 13 batters and walked just one in 8.1 innings...made his Major League debut last year and had no decisions, two saves, a 1.50 ERA and .119 opponents average in six relief appearances.

- The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in the last three games (10.2 ip) and has allowed one run or fewer in 10 of the last 11 contests (9 er in 44.0 ip, 1.84 ERA)...has a 2.10 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors behind the Dodgers (1.82).
- Ranks second in the majors in opponents OPS (.581), on-base percentage (.271) and slugging percentage (.310) and fifth in batting average (.207).
- Has converted 12-of-14 (85.7%) save opportunities...leads the majors in saves and ranks sixth in save percentage.
- Is tied for the fewest losses in the majors (2), tied for fourth in wins (9), tied for fifth in fewest home runs (9), tied for sixth in fewest walks (37), ranks eighth in strikeouts (121) and 10th in innings pitched (115.2).
