OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-9) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (10-17)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last five games, eight of the last 11 and 17 of the last 22...are a season-high tying 11 games over .500 for the second time (19-8 on Aug. 21)...are 20-9 (.690), which is the second best record in the majors to the Dodgers (22-8) and tied for fourth best in Oakland history after 29 games...it is the best since the 1990 club started the year 22-7...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 21st consecutive day and are 4½ games ahead of second place Houston...the A's largest lead of the season is five games on Aug. 9...have not led by more than five games since June 29, 2014 when they led by 5½ games...have held at least a share of first place for 29 of 31 days this year (21 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their fourth walk-off win of the season yesterday, which is the most in the majors...defeated the Angels 5-4 in 10 innings to improve to 5-0 in extra inning games...the wins are the most in the majors and the games are tied for third...had six extra inning wins all last year...now have a six-game winning streak in extra inning games dating back to Sept. 18, 2019, which is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight...are 7-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Rays for the most wins and tied for the second most games...are 6-3 in one-run games and the wins are tied for third most in the majors...are 11-4 in games decided by two runs or fewer...have 10 come-from-behind wins, which is fourth most...lead the majors in wins when trailing after six (5), five (6) and four (8) innings, are tied for the lead when trailing after eight (2) and tied for second when trailing after seven (3).

IN AUGUST: The A's are 17-5 (.773) in the month of August, which is tied with the Dodgers for the best record in the majors...the 17 wins match the A's August total from last year...lead the majors in saves this month (10) and rank fifth in ERA (3.49)...the 10 saves are second most by an A's team in August over the last 14 years (11 in 2012)...the offense leads the majors in walks (98), hit by pitches (16) and strikeouts (225), ranks second in runs (120) and extra base hits (80), tied for second in triples (5) and fourth in home runs (37).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their longest road trip of the season tonight, a 10-game trip to Texas (four games), Houston (three games) and Seattle (three games)...the trip concludes a stretch that began on Aug. 10 where the A's are scheduled to play 18 of 23 games on the road...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), San Francisco (3-0) and Arizona (0-2) and are 7-5 (.583) on the road...went 4-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and are now 13-4 (.765) at home, which is the third best home record in the majors...had their home winning streak snapped at nine games Saturday, which tied for the sixth longest home winning streak in Oakland history.

OFFENSE: The A's rank third in the majors in walks (123) and hit by pitches (20), tied for third in triples (7), tied for seventh in runs (144) and home runs (42) and tied for ninth in extra base hits (92)...lead the majors in strikeouts (288) and have the seventh lowest batting average (.225)...rank third in the majors in home runs in the seventh inning or later (15), fourth in OPS (.799) and tied for fourth in runs (54)...rank second in the majors with three grand slams (Padres, 6)...are also second in RBI (33) and slugging (.885) with the bases loaded, tied for second in hits (11) and extra base hits (5) and third in batting (.423).

PITCHING: The A's allowed 13 runs in five games on the last homestand (2.15 ERA) and now have a 2.66 ERA at home compared to 4.87 (57 er in 105.1 ip) on the road...have a 3.54 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...rank sixth in opponents OPS (.682), slugging (.376) and fewest walks per nine innings (3.06) and seventh in on-base percentage (.304)...have allowed 10 home runs in 159.0 innings at home compared to 20 in 105.1 innings on the road...A's starting pitchers are 6-4 with a 3.62 ERA (35 er in 87.0 ip) at home compared to 4-3 with a 6.71 ERA (42 er in 56.1 ip) on the road.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 13 errors, which is tied for eighth fewest in the majors...have three errors over the last six games, all of which came on Saturday against Los Angeles (AL)...that snapped a 295-game streak with two errors or fewer, which more than doubled the previous longest streak in Oakland history (114 twice)...are tied for eighth in the majors in fewest double plays turned (19)...A's outfielders have five assists, which is tied for fourth most in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen a base in four consecutive games for just the second time over the last six years (May 22-26, 2019)...have been successful in 15-of-17 (88.2%) stolen base attempts, which is second most in the majors to the Tigers (8-for-9, 88.9%)...are tied for seventh in steals...however, opponents have been successful in 14-of-17 (82.4%) steal attempts, which is tied for seventh highest in the majors...are tied for ninth in stolen bases allowed.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 7-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 13-9 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied for second most in the majors (Dodgers, 8) and Oakland is one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox, 7-0)...the seven games against lefties are tied for eighth fewest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's did not homer yesterday for the sixth time this year but won for the first time in those six games...are 19-4 when homering, 1-5 when going homerless...are 10-4 (.714) in day games, 10-5 (.667) at night...have the most day games in the majors...are 5-4 (.556) in interleague play compared to 15-5 (.750) against the American League...are 17-6 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 where they are scheduled to have just one day off in 31 days...have two players on the injured list (Puk, Smith) and have used the IL four times this year...are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series 3-0 after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland Aug. 4-6...after this four-game series, will return to Arlington for a three-game series Sept. 11-13...have won three straight and 10 of the last 11 games and are 25-7 over the last 32 contests...won each of their last four games and 10 of their final 13 at Globe Life Park...have won seven of the last eight and 25 of the last 31 in Oakland...have won each of the previous three season series and are 40-20 (.667) against the Rangers over the last four years ...are 381-373 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 203-176 in Oakland and 178-197 in Texas...went 111-109 at Globe Life Park, which was the second best record by a visiting American League team (Yankees, 57-48, .543)...have an all-time record of 478-455 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is batting .303 (20-for-66) with 15 runs, eight doubles, a triple, seven home runs (.773 slugging percentage) and 18 RBI over his last 16 games...is tied for second in the majors in extra base hits (20), ranks sixth in total bases (70) and tied for ninth in doubles (9) and home runs (9)...**Jake Diekman** not allowed a run in his first 11 appearances (11.0 ip) and now has a career-high tying 14.2-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year...**Robbie Grossman** is batting .326 (14-for-43) with 11 runs, five doubles, two triples, four home runs, nine RBI, 13 walks and two hit by pitches over his last 13 games (.500 obp, .814 slug, 1.314 ops)...ranks ninth in the majors in OPS (1.038) and tied for ninth in on-base percentage (.435)...**Liam Hendriks** has converted each of his last nine save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career...lead the majors in saves (9) and is tied for third in games pitched (15)...**Matt Olson** tied for seventh in the majors in walks (20) and tied for ninth in home runs (9).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1969**, a doubleheader turns into a tripleheader as the A's need 18 innings to win the second game of the twinbill, 9-8...the doubleheader, which starts at 1:34 ends at 9:06 when Ted Kubiak's RBI single ends the 5 hour and 8 minute second game...in **1986** Mark McGwire collects his first major league hit, a second inning single off Tommy John, in the A's 11-4 victory at New York...in **2003** the A's set a franchise record and tie a major league record by hitting two grand slams in a 17-2 win at Toronto...Ramon Hernandez has a grand slam in the first and Miguel Tejada hits his sixth career slam in the sixth inning.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesús Luzardo (2-0, 3.67 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his seventh appearance and fifth start of the season...has not allowed a run in three of his six appearances...made his first two appearances of the season in relief (4.05 ERA) and is 2-0 with a 3.54 ERA (8 er in 20.1 ip) in his four starts since then...ranks second among Major League rookies in strikeouts (27) and fifth in innings pitched (27.0)...the A's are 4-0 in his starting assignments...is in his second season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster.

AL AND NL: Is 1-0 with a 1.32 ERA (2 er in 13.2 ip) in three games against American League teams compared to 1-0 with a 6.08 ERA (9 er in 13.1 ip) in three games against National League teams...the three interleague games are the first of his career and he is 1-0 with a 1.40 ERA (4 er in 25.2 ip) in nine career games against the AL.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed all three of his home runs and issued 10 of his 11 walks to right-handed hitters...has allowed all four of his career home runs and has 12 of his 14 walks against righties...has allowed a .190 (4-for-21) average with runners in scoring position this year and .172 (5-for-29) in his career...opponents are hitting .385 (10-for-26) with three walks (.448 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has received no run support in two of his four starts, both no decisions...is 2-0 in his other two starts (10 runs of support).

IN RELIEF: Made his first appearance of 2020 on July 25 against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland...entered the game to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 4-0 and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings...pitched in relief again July 29 against Colorado in Oakland in a 5-1 A's loss...struck out a five in 3.2 innings and matched his career high in walks (2)...allowed a run in the eighth inning to snap a career-high 12.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2019.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his first Major League start, a 5-1 A's win over Texas on Aug. 4 in Oakland...at the age of 22 years and 309 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to start a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and matched his high with two walks...retired each of the first six batters and allowed just two base runners into scoring position...was relieved by Petit to start the sixth inning with the score tied 0-0.

SECOND START: He recorded his first Major League win in the A's 7-2 victory over Houston on Aug. 9 in Oakland...at the age of 22 years and 314 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to win a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...blanked the Astros on two hits over the first three innings before allowing a two-run home run to Gurriel in the fourth...those were the only runs he would allow in 5.2 innings.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning win at San Francisco Aug. 14...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high nine hits in 3.1 innings...walked a career-high tying two and allowed two home runs in a game for the first time in his career...yielded a solo home run to Longoria in the first and a three-run home run to Pence in the third...also allowed a two-run single to Longoria in the fourth and was relieved by Wendelken with runners on first and second and one out in the fourth and the A's trailing 6-0.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win over Arizona last Wednesday in Oakland...struck out a career-high seven in a career-high 6.1 scoreless innings...had a career-high 92 pitches and matched his high with two walks...scattered four hits and allowed just two base runners to advance into scoring position...retired the side in order just once (second inning).

LUZARDO vs. TEXAS: Is 0-0 with a save and a 1.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 11 so, 0 hr) in three career appearances, including one start...the start came in his only appearance this year, a no decision in the A's 5-1 win in Oakland on Aug. 4 (see first start above)...his other two appearances came in relief last year...the first outing came in Texas on Sept. 15 and he picked up his first Major League save in the A's 6-1 win (3.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...relieved Sean Manaea to start the seventh inning...allowed a run to score in the eighth when Trevino scored on a passed ball...then pitched a scoreless seventh inning in a 12-3 A's win in Oakland on Sept. 21 (1.0 ip, 1 bb, 2 so).

2019 RECAP: Had his season interrupted twice by a strained left shoulder but, after going 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games (nine starts) with three minor league teams, he was selected by Oakland on Sept. 9 after Las Vegas concluded its season...had no decisions, two saves, a 1.50 ERA and .119 opponents batting average in six relief appearances in his Major League debut...struck out 16 batters in 12.0 innings (12.00 per nine innings) and walked just three for a .196 on-base percentage...allowed two doubles and one home run for a .238 slugging percentage...left-handed hitters were 1-for-14 (.071) with no extra base hits, one walk and a .205 OPS...right-handed hitters batted .143 (4-for-28) with a .547 OPS...opponents hit .138 with his lone home run with the bases empty, .077 with runners on...they were 1-for-8 (.125) with runners in scoring position...allowed a .095 average with two strikes...did not inherit any runners and first batters faced were 1-for-5 (.200) with a walk.

2019 WITH OAKLAND: Made his debut on Sept. 11 at Houston and tossed a season-high 3.0 innings...allowed one run on one hit, a Martin Maldonado solo home run in the sixth inning...did not walk a batter and struck out two...fanned the first batter he faced, Aledmys Diaz...at the age of 21 years, 346 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher since Brett Anderson on Oct. 1, 2009 (21 years, 242 days)...became the first player born in Peru in ML history...in his second outing, he tossed the final three innings of the A's 6-1 win at Texas on Sept. 15 for his first professional save...at the age of 21 years, 350 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to save a game since Houston Street on July 8, 2005 (21 years, 340 days)...allowed one run and struck out a season-high four...did not allow a run over his final four games and finished the season with a 7.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed 1.0 inning twice, 2.0 innings twice and 3.0 innings twice...tossed 3.0 scoreless innings of relief in the AL Wild Card game on Oct. 2 against Tampa Bay (1 h, 2 bb, 4 so)...the appearance came two days after his 22nd birthday, making him the second-youngest pitcher in Oakland postseason history...Rich Harden had two outings in 2003, with the youngest coming at 21 years and 305 days...was rated as the A's number one prospect by *Baseball America* following the season.

2019 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Was a non-roster invitee with the A's during the spring and had a 0.93 ERA in four games before he was shut down with a supraspinatus muscle strain...was assigned to Single-A Stockton June 11 and appeared in two games with the Ports and three with Las Vegas before going on the injured list July 4...made one rehab start with the AZL A's Green before he was reinstated from the IL Aug. 10 and sent to Stockton...moved back to Las Vegas Aug. 15...combined to strike out 57 batters in 43.0 minor league innings (11.93 per nine innings)...walked just eight (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.13...his opponents batting average broke down to .132 (5-for-38) against left-handed hitters compared to .248 (31-for-125) with all four of his home runs against right-handers...had a .379 OPS against lefties, .675 against righties...all four of the home runs were solo shots...yielded a .132 average with runners in scoring position...tossed fewer than five innings in nine of his 11 appearances, but logged at least two innings each time...surrendered one run or fewer eight times...had more strikeouts than innings pitched seven times.

LHP Sean Manaea (1-2, 6.39 ERA):	Is scheduled to make his team-leading seventh start of the season...is 1-0 with a 2.61 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his last two starts (both interleague) after going 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA and .364 opponents average over his first four starts (all against the American League...has allowed five runs over the first three innings of his starts this year (2.55 ERA) and 16 from the fourth inning on (15.26 ERA)...opponents are 13-for-62 (.210) over innings one through three and 19-for-41 (.463) from the fourth inning on...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-1 A's win over Arizona last Thursday in Oakland (5.1 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 so)...is 6-2 with a 3.52 ERA (69.0 ip, 63 h, 29 r, 27 er, 16 bb, 62 so, 9 hr) in 12 career starts against Texas...including 5-0 with a 2.48 ERA (11 er in 40.0 ip) over his last seven starts...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 6-4 A's win in Oakland on Aug. 5 (3.1 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so).

- The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in the last four games (16.0 ip) and has a season-high 17.0-inning scoreless streak...has allowed one run or fewer in 11 of the last 12 contests (9 er in 49.1 ip, 1.64 ERA) and has a 2.01 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors behind the Dodgers (1.82).
- Ranks second in the majors in opponents OPS (.573), on-base percentage (.271) and slugging percentage (.302) and third in batting average (.203).
- Has converted 12-of-14 (85.7%) save opportunities...leads the majors in saves and ranks sixth in save percentage.
- Is tied for the fewest losses in the majors (2), ranks fourth in wins (10), tied for fourth in fewest home runs (9), tied for eighth in strikeouts (126), tied for ninth in fewest walks (41) and 10th in innings pitched (121.0).
- First batters faced are 18-for-92 (.196) with seven walks, three doubles and a home run...rank fifth in the majors in opponents OPS (.511) and slugging percentage (.261) against first batters (.511), sixth in on-base percentage (.250) and eighth in batting average.
- Has allowed 10-of-37 (27.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the 10th lowest percentage in the majors.
