## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-10) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (11-17)

TUESDAY, AUGUST 25, 2020 — GLOBE LIFE FIELD — 7:05 CDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost two of the last three games but are 8-4 over the last 12 and 17-6 over the last 23...are 20-10 (.667) for the season, which is tied with the Twins for the second best record in the majors (Dodgers, 22-8)...it is tied for the fifth best record in Oakland history after 30 games and is the best since the 1990 club started the year 22-8...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 22nd consecutive day and are 3½ games ahead of second place Houston...have held at least a share of first place for 30 of 32 days this year (22 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19.

**CLOSE CALLS:** Each of the A's last three games have been decided by one run and Oakland is 6-4 in one-run games for the season...are tied for third in the majors in one-run wins and tied for sixth in one-run decisions...are 5-0 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and are tied for third in games...had just six extra inning wins all last year...now have a six-game winning streak in extra inning games dating back to Sept. 18, 2019, which is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight...are 7-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Rays for the most last at bat wins and tied for the second most games...have 10 come-from-behind wins, which is fourth most...lead the majors in wins when trailing after six (5) and four (8) innings, are tied for the lead when trailing after eight (2) and five (6) and tied for second when trailing after seven (3)...lead the majors in walk-off wins (4).

**IN AUGUST:** The A's are 17-6 (.739) in the month of August, which is the second best record in the majors to the Dodgers (17-5)...the 17 wins match the A's August total from last year (had 18 in 2018)...lead the majors in saves this month (10) and rank sixth in ERA (3.48)...the 10 saves are second most by an A's team in August over the last 14 years (11 in 2012)...the offense leads the majors in extra base hits (82), walks (102), hit by pitches (17) and strikeouts (238), ranks second in runs (122), tied for second in triples (5) and fourth in home runs (38)...the 238 strikeouts are six short of the Athletics record for the most in August (244 in 2017).

**FUN WITH SMALL SAMPLE SIZES:** Last night was the A's 30th game of the season, which marks the half-way point of the schedule...Oakland's 20 wins over the first 30 games are the equivalent of 108 victories over a 162-game season...the franchise record for wins in a season is 107 in 1931...the A's 12 saves would be 64.8 in 162 games (franchise record is 64 in 1988 and 1990)...have been hit by a pitch 21 times, which would be 113.4 in 162 games (Major League record since 1900 is 103 by Cleveland in 2008)...Ramón Laureano leads the A's with eight hit by pitches, which would be 43.2...since 1900, only one Major Leaguer has been hit more than 35 times in a season (50 by Ron Hunt in 1971 with the Expos)...have struck out 301 times, which would be 1625.4 in 162 games (ML record is 1595 by the Tigers in 2019)...are batting .225 and have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on their longest road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Texas (0-1), Houston (three games) and Seattle (three games)...the trip concludes a stretch that began on Aug. 10 where the A's are scheduled to play 18 of 23 games on the road...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), San Francisco (3-0) and Arizona (0-2) and are 7-6 (.538) on the road...went 4-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and are 13-4 (.765) at home, which is the third best home record in the majors...have a 2.66 ERA at home compared to 4.76 (60 er in 113.1 ip) on the road...have allowed 10 home runs in 159.0 innings in the Coliseum and 21 in 113.1 innings on the road...had their home winning streak snapped at nine games Saturday, which tied for the sixth longest home winning streak in Oakland history.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .212 (55-for-259) with 28 runs (3.5 per game) and eight home runs in eight games since scoring 15 runs on 17 hits Aug. 16 at San Francisco...rank second in the majors in walks (127), third in hit by pitches (21), tied for third in triples (7), sixth in runs (146), eighth in home runs (43) and ninth in extra base hits (94)...lead the majors in strikeouts (301) and have the sixth lowest batting average (.225)...have been successful

in 15-of-17 (88.2%) stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors to the Tigers (8-for-9, 88.9%)...rank eighth in steals...rank second in the majors with three grand slams (Padres, 6)...are also second in RBI (33) and slugging (.821) with the bases loaded, tied for second in hits (11) and extra base hits (5) and sixth in batting (.393)...the three grand slams are one short of the A's season total from each of the previous two seasons.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed just 16 runs over the last six games (14 er in 54.0 ip, 2.33 ERA) and now have a 3.54 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...rank sixth in opponents OPS (.680) and slugging (.376) and seventh in on-base percentage (.307)...are tied for second in fewest hit batters (8) and are averaging the fourth fewest pitches per inning (15.9)...A's starting pitchers rank fifth in the majors in innings pitched (150.0).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed four errors over the last three games and now have 14 for the season, which is tied for ninth fewest in the majors...are tied for fifth in fewest double plays turned (19)...A's outfielders have five assists, which is tied for fifth most in the majors.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 7-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 13-10 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied for second most in the majors (Dodgers, 8) and Oakland is one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox, 7-0)...the seven games against lefties are tied for eighth fewest in the majors.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 15-6 (.714) against the American League compared to 5-4 (.556) in interleague play...are 19-5 when homering, 1-5 when going homerless...are 12-2 when scoring first, which is the second best record in the majors (Tigers, 7-1)...are 10-4 (.714) in day games, 10-6 (.625) at night...have the most day games in the majors...are 17-7 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 where they are scheduled to have just one day off in 31 days...have two players on the injured list (Puk, Smith) and have used the IL four times this year...are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season.

**A's vs. RANGERS:** The A's lead the season series 3-1...lost the first game in Arlington last night after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland Aug. 4-6...after this four-game series, will return to Texas for a three-game series Sept. 11-13...have won 10 of the last 12 games and are 25-8 over the last 33 contests...won each of their last four games and 10 of their final 13 at Globe Life Park...have won seven of the last eight and 25 of the last 31 in Oakland...have won each of the previous three season series and are 40-21 (.656) against the Rangers over the last four years...are 381-374 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 203-176 in Oakland and 178-198 in Texas...went 111-109 at Globe Life Park, which was the second best record by a visiting American League team (Yankees, 57-48, .543)...have an all-time record of 478-456 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** is batting .282 (20-for-71) with 15 runs, eight doubles, a triple, seven home runs (.718 slugging percentage) and 18 RBI over his last 17 games...is tied for second in the majors in extra base hits (20), ranks eighth in total bases (70), tied for ninth in home runs (9) and tied for 10th in doubles (9)...**Jake Diekman** not allowed a run in his first 11 appearances (11.0 ip) and now has a career-high tying 14.2-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year...**Robbie Grossman** is tied for third among players in West divisions in triples (2) and hit by pitches (4), ranks fifth in on-base percentage (.427), seventh in OPS (1.006) and eighth in slugging (.579)...**Liam Hendriks** has converted each of his last nine save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career...lead the majors in saves (9) and is tied for fourth in games pitched (15)...**Matt Olson** is tied for fifth in the majors in walks (21) and tied for ninth in home runs (9)...**Stephen Piscotty** ranks second in the majors with 22 RBI in August...over the last 16 years, the only Athletic with more RBI in August is Josh Reddick (23 in 2012).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1986** Mark McGwire hits his first major league home run, a two-run shot in the fifth inning off Walt Terrell, in the A's 8-4 win at Detroit...in **2006** Barry Zito takes a no-hitter into the eighth inning and wins the 100<sup>th</sup> game of his career in the A's 9-3 win at Texas.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (1-2, 6.39 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his team-leading seventh start of the season...is 1-0 with a 2.61 ERA (3 er in 10.1 ip) and .216 (8-for-37) opponents batting average over his last two starts (both interleague) after going 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA and .364 opponents average over his first four starts (all against the American League)...is in his fifth season in the majors and is on his third Opening Day roster (2017-18, 20).

**THE FIRST THREE INNINGS:** Has allowed five runs over the first three innings of his starts this year (17.2 ip, 2.55 ERA) and 16 from the fourth inning on (13 er in 7.2 ip, 15.26 ERA)...opponents are 13-for-62 (.210) over innings one through three and 19-for-41 (.463) from the fourth inning on...in 11 starts over the last two seasons, he has a 1.38 ERA (5 er in 32.2 ip) and .182 (20-for-110) opponents batting average over innings 1-3 and a 6.85 ERA (17 er in 22.1 ip) and .301 (28-for-93) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are hitting .254 (18-for-71) with the bases empty compared to .438 (14-for-32) with runners on...they are 9-for-18 (.500) with runners in scoring position after going 0-for-15 with RISP last year...has a .189 (10-for-53) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .440 (22-for-50) after that...has allowed four home runs, three of which are solo shots...six of the seven home runs he allowed over the last two years have come with the bases empty...opponents are batting .370 (10-for-27) when leading off an inning.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) July 25 in Oakland...it was his first loss since Aug. 19, 2018 against Houston and it snapped a career-high tying five-game winning streak...retired each of the first 11 batters before Upton homered with two outs in the fourth...then allowed three more runs in the fifth on a Simmons RBI double and a Fletcher two-run double.

**SECOND START:** He dropped his second consecutive decision in the A's 5-3 loss at Seattle July 31...retired each of the first nine batters before allowing three runs (two earned) in the fourth inning on a Seager two-run double and an error...put runners on first and third with one out in the fifth and was relieved by Wendelken, who allowed both runners to score (one earned).

**THIRD START:** He had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over Texas August 5 in Oakland...allowed a first pitch home run to Choo to start the game but then retired nine of the next 11 hitters...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed three runs in the fourth inning on a Solak RBI double, a Kiner-Falefa RBI single and a Refsnyder sacrifice fly...was relieved by Smith with one out in the fourth and the A's trailing 4-2.

**FOURTH START:** He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 10-9 loss at Los Angeles (AL) Aug. 10...tossed 2.2 innings, which was his shortest outing since Aug. 7, 2018 against the Dodgers when he also pitched 2.2 innings...allowed a three-run home run to Rendon in the first but the A's came back with three in the second and two in the third...yielded a RBI single to Upton in the bottom of the third and was relieved by Wendelken with two outs in the third and the A's leading 5-4.

**FIFTH START:** He had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 7-6 win at San Francisco Aug. 15...retired eight of the first nine batters before allowing three runs in the fourth inning on a Slater walk, a Solano single and a Yastrzemski triple and error...then retired each of the final six batters he faced and was relieve by Smith to start the sixth with the score tied 3-3.

**LAST START:** He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 5-1 victory over Arizona last Thursday in Oakland...blanked the Diamondbacks on three hits over the first four innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Escobar in the fifth...was relieved by Wendelken with one out and a runner on first base in the sixth with the A's leading 3-1.

**MANAEA vs. TEXAS:** Is 6-2 with a 3.52 ERA (69.0 ip, 63 h, 29 r, 27 er, 16 bb, 62 so, 9 hr) in 12 career starts...including 5-0 with a 2.48 ERA (11 er in 40.0 ip) over his last seven starts...is 4-0 with a 3.27 ERA (12 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts in Oakland and 2-2 with a 3.75 ERA (15 er in 36.0 ip) in six starts in Texas...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 6-4 A's win in Oakland on Aug. 5 (see third start above)...was 2-0 with a 1.54 ERA in two starts last year (11.2 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 10 so).

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Went 0-2 with a 10.66 ERA in four games this spring, all starts...led the A's and tied for eighth in the Cactus League in strikeouts (14)...did not walk a batter in 12.2 innings...allowed a .321 (18-for-56) opponents batting average...yielded at least two runs in each of his assignments.

**2019 RECAP:** Began the season on the 60-day injured list as he continued his recovery from Sept. 19, 2018 surgery on his left shoulder...went 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts before he was reinstated from the IL Sept. 1...made five starts with Oakland and was 4-0 with a 1.21 ERA and .160 opponents batting average...the ERA was second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched (Yates SD, 1.19) and fifth lowest in Oakland history...using the same minimum, the batting average was third lowest in the majors and sixth lowest in Oakland history...allowed two runs or fewer in all five starts, including one run or fewer four times, and four hits or fewer four times...struck out 30 batters in 29.2 innings and walked just seven (2.12 per nine innings)...had a .229 opponents on-base percentage and .280 slugging percentage.

**MORE FROM 2019:** His opponents batting average broke down to .129 (8-for-62) against right-handed hitters compared to .211 (8-for-38) against left-handers...however, issued six of his seven walks to righties...yielded two of his three home runs to righties and has surrendered 57 of his 66 career homers to right-handers...now has a .219 opponents batting average and .598 OPS in his career against lefties, .256 with a .741 OPS against righties...yielded a .073 batting average with two strikes...did not allow a hit to the opponent's eight (0-for-9) or nine (0-for-10) hitter...was 2-0 with a 0.50 ERA in three starts during the day, 2-0 with a 2.31 ERA in two starts at night...is now 16-5 with a 3.32 ERA (74 er in 200.1 ip) in 34 career day games, 20-25 with a 4.26 ERA (151 er in 318.2 ip) in 58 starts at night...went 4-0 in four starts with three runs of support or more...is now 4-28 in 46 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 32-2 in 45 starts with support of three runs or more.

**2019 IN MINORS:** Started his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton July 8 and was 0-1 with a 9.72 ERA in three starts when he was transferred to Triple-A Las Vegas July 23...went 0-1 with a 6.10 ERA in two starts with the Aviators before his rehab assignment was halted on Aug. 2 due to a strained right oblique...returned to action Aug. 13 and went 3-0 with a 1.53 ERA over his final three starts...was 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts overall...struck out 53 batters in 36.1 innings (13.13 per nine innings) and walked 10 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.3.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
<b>RHP Mike Fiers (3-1, 5.81 ERA):</b> Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...the A's are 5-1 (.833) in his starting assignments this year and 35-13 (.729) when he starts in his career...made three of his first six starts against the Angels and was 1-1 with an 8.31 ERA...is 2-0 with a 4.00 ERA in his other three starts... has allowed just one run over the first two innings (0.75 ERA) and opponents are 6-for-41 (.146) in those two innings...has allowed 19 runs from the third inning on (9.00 ERA) and opponents are hitting .379...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-3 A's win over Los Angeles (AL) last Friday in Oakland (5.1 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...is 5-3 with a 5.78 ERA (76.1 ip, 76 h, 49 r, 49 er, 22 bb, 67 so, 19 hr) in 14 career appearances, including 13 starts, against Texas...is 5-0 with a 3.60 ERA over his last eight starts...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 6-4 A's win on Aug. 6 in Oakland (6.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 2 so).
