ABOUT THE A'S: Are 5-4 over the last nine games but have won nine of the last 13 and 18 of the last 24...are a season-high tying 11 games over .500 at 21-10 (.677)...that is the second best record in the majors to the Dodgers (22-9)...it is tied for the fourth best record in Oakland history after 31 games and is the best since the 1990 club started the year 22-9...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 23rd consecutive day and are four games ahead of second place Houston...have held at least a share of first place for 31 of 33 days this year (23 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 7-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 14-10 when they start a right-

hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied for fourth most in the majors and Oakland is one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox, 8-0)...the seven games against lefties are tied for seventh fewest in the majors...are batting .240 against left-handed pitchers, .222 against right-handers.

IN AUGUST: The A's are 18-6 (.750) in the month of August, which is the best record in the majors...the 18 wins match the A's most in August over the last 14 years (2012, 2018)...have not won more than 18 games in August since going 21-6 in 2006 and have not won more than 18 games in any month since going 19-8 in Sept. 2013...are tied with the Rays for the most saves in the majors this month (10) and rank fifth in ERA (3.38)...the 10 saves are second most by an A's team in August over the last 14 years (11 in 2012)...the of fense leads the majors in walks (107), hit by pitches (20) and strikeouts (248), is tied for the lead in extra base hits (86), ranks second in runs (132), tied for third in triples (5) and fourth in home runs (40)...the 248 strikeouts are an Athletics record for the month of August and their most in any month since fanning 260 times in May of 2018...the 20 hit by pitches are tied for third most in Athletics history in any month (22 in Aug. 2019, 21 in June 2001).

OUCH: The A's were hit by a pitch three times last night, which was their third game with three or more hit by pitches this year...the Oakland record for most games with three or more hit by pitches in a season is four in 2018... have been hit by a pitch five times in the last three games and 24 times for the season, which is third most in the majors...that has surpassed the season total for seven seasons in Oakland history...A's pitchers have hit just nine batters, which is tied for fifth fewest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's rank second in the majors in walks (132), tied for fourth in triples (7), sixth in runs (156), tied for sixth in home runs (45) and ninth in extra base hits (98)...lead the majors in strikeouts (311) and have the seventh lowest batting average (.226)...have been successful in 15-of-17 (88.2%) stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors to the Phillies (16-for-18, 88.9%)...rank ninth in steals...rank second in the majors with three grand slams (Padres, 6)...are tied for the lead in hits with the bases loaded (12), rank second in RBI (38), slugging (.833) and extra base hits (6) and tied for fifth in batting (.400)...the three grand slams are one short of the A's season total from each of the previous two seasons.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed just 19 runs over the last seven games (15 er in 63.0 ip, 2.14 ERA) and now have a 3.45 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the majors...rank sixth in opponents OPS (.676), slugging (.374) and on-base percentage (.306)...are averaging the fourth fewest pitches per inning (15.9)...A's starting pitchers are 4-2 with a 3.23 ERA (14 er in 39.0 ip) over the last seven games after going 2-2 with a 9.45 ERA over the previous eight contests...overall, starters are tied for fourth in the majors in wins (11) and ranks fifth in innings pitched (155.0)

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors over the last four games, which has led to four unearned runs...have just 15 errors for the season and rank fifth in the majors in fielding percentage (.987)...are tied for fifth in fewest double plays turned (20)...A's outfielders have five assists, which is tied for fifth most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on their longest road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Texas (1-1), Houston (three games) and Seattle (three

games)...the trip concludes a stretch that began on Aug. 10 where the A's are scheduled to play 18 of 23 games on the road...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), San Francisco (3-0) and Arizona (0-2) and are 8-6 (.571) on the road...went 4-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and are 13-4 (.765) at home, which is the third best home record in the majors...have a 2.66 ERA at home compared to 4.49 (61 er in 122.1 ip) on the road...have allowed 10 home runs in 159.0 innings in the Coliseum and 21 in 122.1 innings on the road...had their home winning streak snapped at nine games last Saturday, which tied for the sixth longest home winning streak in Oakland history.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-0 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and are tied for third in games...had just six extra inning wins all last year...now have a six-game winning streak in extra inning games dating back to Sept. 18, 2019, which is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight…are 7-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Rays for the most last at bat wins in the majors and are tied for the second most games...are 6-4 in one-run games...are tied for third in one-run wins and tied for fifth in one-run decisions...have 11 come-from-behind wins, which is tied for third most...lead the majors in wins when trailing after six (5) and four (8) innings, are tied for the lead when trailing after eight (2) and five (6) and tied for second when trailing after seven (3)...lead the majors in walk-off wins (4).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 16-6 (.727) against the American League compared to 5-4 (.556) in interleague play...are 20-5 when homering, 1-5 when going homerless...are 12-2 when scoring first, which is the second best record in the majors (Tigers, 8-1)...are 10-4 (.714) in day games and are tied with the Angels for the most day games in the majors...are 18-7 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 where they are scheduled to have just one day off in 31 days...have two players on the injured list (Puk, Smith) and have used the IL four times this year... are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 4-1...have split the first two games in Arlington after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland Aug. 4-6... after this four-game series, will return to Texas for a three-game series Sept. 11-13...have won 11 of the last 13 games and are 26-8 over the last 34 contests...have won five of the last six games and 11 of the last 15 in Texas...have won seven of the last eight and 25 of the last 31 in Oakland...have won each of the previous three season series and are 41-21 (.661) against the Rangers over the last four years...are 382-374 all-time against the Texas Rangers... that breaks down to 203-176 in Oakland and 179-198 in Texas...went 111-109 at Globe Life Park, which was the second best record by a visiting American League team (Yankees, 57-48, .543)...have an all-time record of 479-456 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is tied for second in the majors in extra base hits (20), tied for fourth in triples (2), ranks eighth in total bases (70) and tied for 10th in home runs (9)...Jake Diekman not allowed a run in his first 11 appearances (11.0 ip) and now has a career-high tying 14.2-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year...*Robbie Grossman* is tied for third among players in West divisions in triples (2) and hit by pitches (4), ranks fourth in on-base percentage (.416) and eighth in OPS (.966)...*Liam Hendriks* has converted each of his last nine save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career...lead the majors in saves (9) and is tied for fourth in games pitched (15)... Matt Olson tied for third in the majors in walks (22) and tied for sixth in home runs (10)... Stephen Piscotty is tied for the Major League lead in RBI in August (25)...they are the most by an Athletic in August since Miguel Tejada also had 25 in 2003.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1916 Joe Bush no-hits Cleveland 5-0 in Philadelphia after lasting just three innings against Cleveland a day earlier...in 1926 the A's have walk-off wins in both games of a doubleheader against St. Louis, winning 8-6 in 11 innings in the first game and 4-3 in 12 innings in the second game...Al Simmons combines for five hits and four RBI, including a walk-off home run in game one...in 1973 Ken Holtzman tosses a four-hit shutout to improve to 19-11 in the A's 1-0 win over New York...Vic Davalillo's pinch hit RBI single in the eighth inning drives in the only run of the game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (3-1, 5.81 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...the A's are 5-1 (.833) in his starting assignments this year and 35-13 (.729) when he starts in his career...made three of his first six starts against the Angels and was 1-1 with an 8.31 ERA...is 2-0 with a 4.00 ERA (8 er in 18.0 ip) in his other three starts...is in his 10th season in the majors and is with his fourth team... has pitched for Milwaukee (2011-15), Houston (2015-17), Detroit (2018) and Oakland (2018-present)...is on his sixth Opening Day roster (2013, 15-17, 19-20)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has three wins, which is tied for third most among pitchers in the West divisions...however, has the second highest opponents OPS in the majors (.868), the third highest batting average (.305) and onbase percentage (.360) and the fifth highest ERA (5.81) and slugging percentage (.508)...is averaging the fewest strikeouts per nine innings (4.06) and has the third highest run support (8.71).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .184 (9-for-49) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .380 (30-for-79) with six of his seven home runs after that...opponents are hitting .340 (17-for-50) with runners on base but that drops to .231 (6-for-26) with runners in scoring position, including .100 (1-for-10) with RISP and two outs...now has a .189 (76-for-402) career opponents average with RISP and two outs...has allowed a 394 (13-for-33) average to batters leading off an inning...the opponents number three hitter is 1-for-14 (.071) but the clean-up hitter is 9-for-15 (.600).

BY INNING: Has not allowed a run in the first inning (6.0)...has allowed just one run over the first two innings (1 er in 12.0 ip, 0.75 ERA) and opponents are 6-for-41 (.146) in those two innings...has allowed 19 runs from the third inning on (19.0 ip, 9.00 ERA) and opponents are hitting .379 (33-for-87)

THE AMERICAN LEAGUE WEST: Is 2-1 with a 6.48 ERA (18 er in 25.0 ip) in five starts against American League West teams compared to 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (2 er in 6.0 ip) in one start against the National League West...is now 16-16 with a 5.62 ERA (196 er in 314.1 ip) in 60 career appearances against the AL West, 56-44 with a 3.46 ERA (307 er in 799.1 ip) in 151 games against all other opponents.

AT THE COLISEUM: Is 2-0 with a 6.46 ERA (11 er in 15.1 ip) in three starts at home and is now 9-0 with a 2.99 ERA (33 er in 99.1 ip) over his last 16 home starts...has not lost at home since April 20, 2019 vs. Toronto and the home winning streak is tied for ninth longest in Oakland history...it is the longest by a starting pitcher since Mark Mulder had a 10-game streak from July 31, 2002-June 19, 2003...is now 14-1 with a 3.03 ERA (50 er in 148.2) in 25 starts in the Coliseum since he was acquired from Detroit on Aug. 6, 2018...is 15-3 with a 3.34 ERA (66 er in 178.0 ip) and .229 (149-for-650) opponents batting average in 31 career games, including 30 starts, in the Coliseum.

WITH THE A'S: Was acquired by Oakland on Aug. 6, 2018 and is 23-7 with a 4.09 ERA (122 er in 268.2 ip) in 49 games, including 48 starts, with the A's... the wins are tied for fourth most in the American League over that span.

2020 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over Los Angeles (AL) July 26 in Oakland...did not walk or strikeout a batter in 4.0 innings... it was his first career start with no walks and no strikeouts...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 10-inning win at Seattle on Aug. 1...allowed a two-run single to Seager in the third inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...picked up his first win of the season in the A's 6-4 victory over Texas Aug. 6 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on a hit and a walk over the first four innings and had a 5-0 lead entering the fifth...allowed a RBI single to Tejeda in the fifth, a solo home run to Frazier in the sixth and a two-run home run to Tejeda in the seventh...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on Aug. 11 ... allowed five runs in 3.2 innings, all on home runs in the fourth inning...Bundy, Mayers and Robles combined to shut out the A's on five hits...was the winning pitcher in the A's 15-2 win at San Francisco Aug. 16...allowed a Belt solo home run in the second and a Yastrzemski RBI single in the third.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 5-3 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Friday in Oakland...blanked the Angels on four hits, two walks and a hit batter over the first four innings and had a 3-0 lead before allowing a RBI single to Rendon in the fifth...had a 5-1 lead when he was relieved by Wendelken with one out in the sixth inning and runners on first and second...Wendelken allowed both runs to score.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 1-3 with a 5.51 ERA in five starts during the spring (16.1 ip, 13 h, 11 r, 10 er, 6 bb, 12 so, 4 hr)...however, held the opposition to a .210 batting average...the five starts tied for the most in the majors...his 16.1 innings pitched led the Cactus League and ranked fifth in the majors...is now 7-11 with a 5.96 ERA (77 er in 116.1 ip) in 43 games, including 31 starts, in his career during the spring.

2019 RECAP: Was 15-4 with a 3.90 ERA in 33 starts in his first full season with the A's...ranked third in the American League in winning percentage (.789), sixth in opponents batting average (.243), tied for eighth in wins and 10th in OPS (.712) and on-base percentage (.304)...also tied for third in wild pitches (13) and tied for fifth in games started...had career highs in wins, games (33), games started, innings pitched (184.2) and winning percentage...led the A's in wins, starts, innings pitched, runs (82), walks (53) and home runs (30)... became the first A's pitcher to win 15 games since Scott Kazmir had 15 in 2014 and the first to make 33 starts since Sonny Gray had 33 in 2014...his innings pitched were the most by an A's pitcher over the last three years...his .789 winning percentage was fourth best in Oakland history among pitchers with 15 or more decisions...his 30 home runs tied for 10th most in a season in Oakland history...struck out 126 batters, an average of 6.14 per nine innings...that was the third-lowest mark in the AL...had the fifth-lowest strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.38)...went 2-3 with a 6.81 ERA, .297 opponents batting average and .854 OPS over his first eight starts, 10-0 with a 2.12 ERA, .199 opponents average and .572 OPS over his next 17 starts from May 7-Aug. 9 and 3-1 with a 6.27 ERA, .304 opponents average and .940 OPS over his final eight starts...left with the lead in eight of his no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...has left with the lead in 12 of his 48 career starts with the A's only to have the bullpen blow the save...compiled an 11-1 record and a 3.21 ERA in 17 starts on five days rest and is now 14-1 with a 3.12 ERA (48 er in 138.1 ip) in 23 starts on five days rest in his A's career.

RHP Chris Bassitt (2-1, 2.97 ERA): Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...is 1-1 with a 4.86 ERA over his last three starts after going 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA over his first three starts...has allowed six hits or fewer in all six starts and opponents are batting .214...has walked just one batter to lead off an inning and opponents are hitting .212 in that situation...has held left-handed hitters to a .190 batting average...all three of the home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday in Oakland (5.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...the loss was his first since July 24, 2019 at Houston and it snapped a career-high five-game winning streak...is 1-2 with a 5.84 ERA (24.2 ip, 23 h, 17 r, 16 er, 11 bb, 28 so, 3 hr) in eight career appearances, including four starts, against Texas...went 1-1 with a 4.58 ERA (17.2 ip, 13 h, 10 r, 9 er, 7 bb, 22 so) in five games, including three starts last year.
