OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-10) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (17-14)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight, six of the last eight, 10 of the last 14 and 19 of the last 25...are a season-high 12 games over .500 at 22-10 (.688)...that is the second best record in the majors to the Dodgers (24-9, .727) and tied for third best in Oakland history after 32 games...it is the best since the 1990 club also started the year 22-10...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 25th consecutive day and are 4½ games ahead of second place Houston...the season-high is five games on Aug. 9...have not led by more than five games since June 29, 2014 when they led by 5½ games...have held at least a share of first place for 33 of 35 days this year (25 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19.

IN AUGUST: The A's are 19-6 (.760) in the month of August, which is tied with the Dodgers for the best record in the majors...the 19 wins are the A's most in August since going 21-6 in 2006 and their most in any month since going 19-8 in Sept. 2013...have won 20 games in a month 14 times in Oakland history, most recently in August of 2006...eight of those 20-win months have been in August...are tied with the Rays for the most saves in the majors this month (11), rank fifth in ERA (3.25) and tied for 10th in strikeouts (213)...the 11 saves are one short of the Oakland record for August (12 in 1989, 1992, 2002 and 2006)...the 213 strikeouts are sixth most in August and 10 short of the August record of 223 in 2007...the offense leads the majors in walks (113), hit by pitches (21) and strikeouts (259), ranks second in runs (135), tied for third in triples (5) and tied for fourth in extra base hits (86) and home runs (40)...the 259 strikeouts are an Athletics record for the month of August and fourth most for any month (285 in June 2017, 276 in Sept. 2012, 260 in May 2018)...the 21 hit by pitches are tied for second most in Athletics history in any month and are one short of the record of 22 in August of 2019.

OFFENSE: Wednesday night marked the first time the A's did not collect an extra base hit in a win since Aug. 8, 2018 against the Dodgers...the A's rank second in the majors in walks (138), tied for fourth in triples (7), tied for fifth in runs (159), tied for eighth in home runs (45) and 10th in extra base hits (98)...lead the majors in strikeouts (322) and have the sixth lowest batting average (.223)...have been successful in 15-of-17 (88.2%) stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...are tied for ninth in steals...rank second in the majors with three grand slams (Padres, 6), which is one short of the A's season total from each of the previous two seasons...are tied for the lead in hit by pitches with the bases loaded (2), rank second in RBI (39), hits (12) and extra base hits (6), third in slugging (.735) and tied for fifth in walks (4).

OUCH: The A's have been hit by a pitch in a season-high four consecutive games (six HBP total)...have 25 hit by pitches for the season, which is tied with the Mets for second most in the majors to the Cubs (28)...that has surpassed the season total for seven seasons in Oakland history and has matched the total from an additional season...A's pitchers have hit just nine batters, which is tied for third fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed just 20 runs over the last eight games (15 er in 72.0 ip, 1.88 ERA) and now have a 3.35 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the majors...rank fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.300), sixth in OPS (.667) and slugging (.367) and ninth in batting (.235)...A's starting pitchers are 5-2 with a 2.80 ERA (14 er in 45.0 ip) over the last eight games after going 2-2 with a 9.45 ERA over the previous eight contests...overall, starters are tied for fourth in the majors in innings pitched (161.0) and wins (12).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors over the last five games, which has led to five unearned runs...have just 16 errors for the season and rank sixth in the majors in fielding percentage (.986)...are tied for fifth in fewest double plays turned (20)...A's outfielders have five assists, which is tied for sixth most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on what is now a season-long nine-game road trip to Texas (2-1), Houston (three games) and Seattle (three games)...the trip concludes a stretch that began on Aug. 10 where the A's will now

play 17 of 22 games on the road...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), San Francisco (3-0) and Arizona (0-2) and are 9-6 (.600) on the road...went 4-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and are 13-4 (.765) at home, which is the third best home record in the majors...have a 2.66 ERA at home compared to 4.18 (61 er in 131.1 ip) on the road...have allowed 10 home runs in 159.0 innings in the Coliseum and 21 in 131.1 innings on the road.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 14-10 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied for the most in the majors and Oakland is one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox, 8-0).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-0 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and are tied for third in games...had just six extra inning wins all last year...now have a six-game winning streak in extra inning games dating back to Sept. 18, 2019, which is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight...are 7-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for the second most last at bat wins in the majors (Rays, 8) and are tied for the third most games...are 6-4 in one-run games...are tied for fourth in one-run wins and tied for eighth in one-run decisions...have 12 come-from-behind wins, which is third most...lead the majors in wins when trailing after six (5), five (7) and four (9) innings, are tied for the lead when trailing after eight (2) and tied for second when trailing after seven (3)...lead the majors in walk-off wins (4).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 17-6 (.739) against the American League compared to 5-4 (.556) in interleague play...are 20-5 when homering, 2-5 when going homerless...are 12-2 when scoring first, which is the second best record in the majors (Tigers, 8-1)...are 10-4 (.714) in day games and are tied with the Angels for the most day games in the majors...have two players on the injured list (Puk, Smith) and have used the IL four times this year...are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's lead the season series 3-0 after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland, Aug. 7-9...it was the A's first sweep of the Astros since Sept. 8-10, 2017 when they swept a four-game series in Oakland...the two clubs meet once more after this three-game series, a four-game series in Oakland, Sept. 7-10...have now won nine of their last 11 games from Houston, including six of the last seven in Oakland...have won three straight at Minute Maid Park after losing seven of the previous eight...lost the season series last year for the fifth consecutive season as they went 8-11...the eight wins were the A's most against the Astros since 2015 (9-10)...went 4-5 in Oakland and 4-6 in Houston...are 40-58 (.408) against Houston over the last six years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 71-71 all-time, including 38-34 in Oakland and 33-37 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is tied for second in the majors in extra base hits (20), tied for fourth in triples (2), tied for seventh in go-ahead RBI (6) and tied for 10th in total bases (70)...**Jake Diekman** not allowed a run in his first 12 appearances (12.0 ip) and now has a career-high 15.2-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year...**Robbie Grossman** is tied for fourth in the majors in triples (2), tied for sixth in hit by pitches (5) and ranks ninth in on-base percentage (.427)...**Liam Hendriks** has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career...lead the majors in saves (10) and is tied for third in games pitched (16)...**Matt Olson** is tied for fifth in the majors in walks (22) and tied for eighth in home runs (10)...**Stephen Piscotty** has 26 RBI in 22 games in August...the RBI are his most ever in a month and rank second in the majors (Abreu, CWS 27)...they are seventh most in Oakland history in August and are the most since Eric Chavez had 30 in 2002.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1938** the A's sweep a doubleheader from Chicago on Connie Mack Day at Shibe Park, their seventh consecutive twin bill in eight days...in **1974** the A's win at Milwaukee 3-1 as Catfish Hunter wins his 20th game of the season, his fourth consecutive 20-win season...he would go on to win 25 games, an Oakland record which stood until 1990 when Bob Welch won 27...in **2002** the A's defeat Kansas City 7-1 to extend their winning streak to an Oakland record 15, breaking the mark of 14 set in 1988...the streak would reach a then-AL record 20 before coming to an end.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (2-1, 2.97 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...is 1-1 with a 4.86 ERA (9 er in 16.2 ip) over his last three starts after going 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA over his first three starts...has allowed six hits or fewer in all six starts and opponents are batting .214 (27-for-126)...the A's are 4-2 (.667) in his starting assignment this year and 19-12 (.613) over the last two years...begins his sixth season in the majors and is on his second Opening Day roster...his other was in 2016 with Oakland.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has walked just one batter to lead off an inning and opponents are hitting .212 (7-for-33) in that situation...has held left-handed hitters to a .190 (11-for-58) batting average and now has a .205 (69-for-336) average against lefties over the last two years...all three of the home runs he has allowed have been solo shots.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-1 with a 1.62 ERA (3 er in 16.2 ip) in three starts in Oakland compared to 2-0 with a 4.32 ERA (8 er in 16.2 ip) in three starts on the road...has allowed all three of his home runs on the road...is now 7-10 with a 2.74 ERA (51 er in 167.2 ip) in 32 career games in the Coliseum, 9-10 with a 4.62 ERA (103 er in 201.0 ip) in 42 games in all other ballparks...has yielded just 11 home runs in 167.2 career innings in Oakland (0.59 per nine innings).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.00 ERA (7 er in 21.0 ip) in four starts during the day, 0-0 with a 2.92 ERA (4 er in 12.1 ip) in two starts at night...is now 9-2 with a 3.07 ERA (29 er in 85.0 ip) in 16 day games dating back to May 16, 2019 after going 0-9 with a 4.06 ERA over his first 17 career games during the day.

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Was the losing pitcher in his last start, which was his first loss since July 24, 2019 at Houston...it snapped a career-high five-game winning streak dating back to Aug. 11, 2019...had a 3.46 ERA and .229 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 14 games, including 11 starts...walked just 15 (2.08 per nine innings) while striking out 62 (8.58 per nine innings) in 65.0 innings.

SINCE THE SURGERY: Did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 14-9 with a 3.52 ERA (88 er in 225.0 ip) and is averaging 8.40 strikeouts per nine innings (210 so in 225.0 ip) in 45 games (37 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

2020 START-BY-START: He combined with five A's relievers on a nine-hit shut-out in the A's 3-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) **July 27** in Oakland...had a no decision as he tossed four innings...allowed five of the hits and walked a batter but ended up stranding five base runners (also had a GIDP)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-2 win at Seattle **Aug. 2**...allowed a RBI single to Vogelbach in the first inning but then blanked the Mariners on two hits over his final 4.2 innings...retired 10 straight at one point...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 13-inning win over Houston **Aug. 7** in Oakland...allowed just one run, giving him one run or fewer in each of his first three starts, to become the first A's pitcher to begin the season in the starting rotation and allow one run or fewer in each of his first three starts since Gio Gonzalez in 2011 (April 3-14)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) **Aug. 12**...allowed a solo home run to Trout in the first and a La Stella RBI single and a Trout sacrifice fly in the third...had a 5-3 lead when he allowed a two-out home run to Rendon in the sixth...was relieved by Diekmann following the home run...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss at Arizona on **Aug. 17**...allowed a solo home run to Peralta in the third and two more runs in the sixth on an Escobar RBI fielders choice and a Kelly RBI single...left trailing 3-0 but the A's scored once in the seventh and twice in the eighth to get him off the hook.

LAST START: He was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday in Oakland...allowed a run to score on a fielders choice in the first inning and then allowed three runs, one earned, in the second...one of the runs scored on a Matt Chapman error and Trout added a two-run double...retired 10 of the last 12 batters he faced and left after 5.2 innings trailing 4-3.

BASSITT vs. HOUSTON: Is 2-1 with a 3.51 ERA (41.0 ip, 32 h, 18 r, 16 er, 12 bb, 29 so, 5 hr) in seven career appearances, including six starts...is 1-1 with a 5.73 ERA (7 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts in Houston and 1-0 with a 2.70 ERA (9 er in 30.0 ip) in five games in Oakland...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 3-2 A's win in 10 innings on Aug. 7 in Oakland...retired seven of the first eight batters before a Maldonado walk, a wild pitch and a Tucker RBI double gave the Astros their first run...that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work and he was relieved by Soria to start the eighth with the score tied 1-1...went 1-1 with a 5.00 ERA (18.0 ip, 19 h, 10 r, 10 er, 3 bb, 12 so, 3 hr) in three starts last year.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 2-1 with a 3.46 ERA (13.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 7 bb, 10 so, 2 hr) in five games, including three starts, this spring...tied for fourth in the Cactus League in wins...allowed a .190 opponents batting average but issued seven walks in 13.0 innings...pitched four innings of relief July 21 at San Francisco.

2019 RECAP: Saw the most extensive action of his five-year career, going 10-5 with a 3.81 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 28 games, including 25 starts...had career highs in every category except losses as he was 4-14 in 40 games over his first four years...had career lows in opponents on-base percentage (.303) and fewest walks per nine innings (2.94)...led the A's with 141 strikeouts, which were the most by an Oakland pitcher since Sonny Gray had 169 in 2015...tied an Oakland record and tied for third in the American League with 13 hit batters...shares the record with Barry Zito, who did it three times (2001, 2005 and 2006)...went 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .179 opponents average over his first five starts through May 16 and 3-3 with a 6.00 ERA and .249 opponents average over his next nine starts leading into the All-Star Break...then went 5-1 with a 3.26 ERA in 14 games after the break...his post-break ERA was seventh lowest in the AL among pitchers with 60 or more innings...began the season with 25 starts and concluded the year with three relief appearances...held left-handed hitters to a .209 batting average, which was sixth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 140 or more innings...however, surrendered 14 of his 21 home runs and issued 29 of his 47 walks to lefties...received two runs of support or fewer in 13 of his 25 starts and went 2-5 in those games...was 8-0 in 12 starts with support of three runs or more...has received two runs of support or fewer in 39 of his 59 career starts and is 4-19 in those games...is 12-1 in 22 career starts with run support of three runs or more...was 5-1 with a 2.65 ERA in 10 starts following an A's loss...turned three double plays, which tied for third among AL pitchers...opponents were successful in 10-of-12 (83.3%) stolen base attempts off him.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (2-2, 5.22 ERA): Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...is 0-1 with an 18.47 ERA in two starts since missing his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness...allowed just four runs in 23.0 innings (1.57 ERA) over his first four starts and was 2-1...has allowed a .189 batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .293 against left-handers...has issued 12 of his 16 walks to lefties...is 2-0 with a 2.38 ERA in four starts against American League West teams compared to 0-2 with a 14.85 ERA in two starts against the National League...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's win in 10 innings last Sunday in Oakland (4.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...is 3-2 with a 3.69 ERA (31.2 ip, 31 h, 15 r, 13 er, 12 bb, 21 so, 3 hr) in seven career appearances, including five starts, against Houston...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 3-1 A's win in Oakland on Aug. 8 (7.0 ip, 2 h, 5 so).

- The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in the last seven games (24.1 ip) and has a 25.1-inning scoreless streak, which is tied for the fourth longest streak in Oakland history.
- Has allowed one run or fewer in 14 of the last 15 games (9 er in 57.2 ip, 1.40 ERA) and has a Major League low 1.88 ERA for the season...the lowest ERA by the bullpen in Oakland history is 2.35 in 1990.
- Ranks second in the majors in opponents OPS (.554), on-base percentage (.263) and slugging percentage (.291) and third in batting average (.195).
- Has converted 13-of-15 (86.7%) save opportunities...is tied for the most saves in the majors and ranks fifth in save percentage.
- Is tied for the fewest losses in the majors (2), tied for second in fewest home runs (9), tied for fifth in wins (10), ranks eighth in fewest walks (43) and ninth in strikeouts (137).
- First batters faced are 18-for-99 (.182) with seven walks, three doubles and a home run...rank second in the majors in opponents OPS (.476) and slugging percentage (.242) against first batters, fourth in on-base percentage (.234) and eighth in batting average.
- Has allowed 10-of-39 (25.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the seventh lowest percentage in the majors.
