OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-12) VS. SAN DIEGO PADRES (23-16)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's return to action for the first time since last Saturday following a positive test for Covid-19...were swept in a doubleheader at Houston Saturday and are now 6-6 over the last 12 games and 10-8 over the last 18...are 22-12 (.647) for the season, which is the second best record in the American League (Rays, 26-12), third best in the majors (Dodgers (29-10) and tied for sixth best in Oakland history after 34 games...it is the best since the 1990 club started the year 23-11...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 32nd consecutive day and are two games ahead of second place Houston...that is the A's smallest lead since Aug. 5 when they had a 1½ game lead...have held at least a share of first place for 40 of 42 days this year (32 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's have four scheduled doubleheaders in the month of September to make up for games lost to Covid-19 and protest...have not played four doubleheaders in a season since 1993...played one doubleheader in August and the five doubleheaders would be the A's most in a season since 1986...beginning today, are scheduled to play 26 games over the final 24 days, which would be their most games over a 24-day stretch since July 21-Aug. 13, 1978 when they had 27 games in 24 days...today begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 16 games over the next 13 days through Sept. 16, which would be their most games over a 13-day stretch since July 18-30, 1975 (also 16 in 13)...are scheduled to play three doubleheaders in three cities over a seven-day span from Sept. 8-14 and the 10 games in seven days would be their most since June 16-22, 1966 (also 10 games)...for comparison, the only teams with more games remaining to be played are St. Louis (32), Miami (28) and Philadelphia (27)...the Cardinals played eight games in five days from Aug. 15-19 and Los Angeles (Sept. 22-24)...the A's went 11-9 (.550) in interleague play last year, which tied for the 10th best record in the majors...are 233-200 (.538) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 5-4 (.556) in interleague play compared to 17-8 (.680) against the American League...the nine interleague games are tied for second fewest in the majors (Tampa Bay, 7)...following this three-game series with San Diego, the A's will also host San Francisco (Sept. 18-20) and travel to Colorado (Sept. 15-16) and Los Angeles (Sept. 22-24)...the A's went 11-9 (.550) in interleague play last year, which tied for the 10th best record in the majors...are 233-200 (.538) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

WITH THE BASES LOADED: The A's have hit three grand slams, which is tied with the Yankees for second most in the majors to the Padres six...hit four grand slams in each of the previous two seasons...are tied for the lead in hit by pitches with the bases loaded (2), rank third in RBI (39) and slugging (.735), tied for third in extra base hits (6) and tied for fifth in hits (12).

IN AUGUST: The A's went 19-8 (.704) in the month of August, which was the third best record in the majors (Dodgers and Rays, 21-7) and the seventh best August in Oakland history...the wins were the A's most in August since going 21-6 in 2006 and their most in any month since going 19-8 in Sept. 2013...ranked second in the majors in saves (11), fourth in ERA (3.46) and sixth in opponents OPS (.688)...the saves fell one short of the Oakland record for August...had 225 strikeouts, which set an Oakland record for the month of August and was fifth most for any month...on offense, the A's led the majors in hit by pitches (21) and strikeouts (277), tied for fourth in walks (115), tied for fifth in home runs (42), tied for sixth in runs (140), ranked seventh in extra base hits (92) and tied for seventh in triples (5)...the strikeouts are an Athletics record for the month of August and second most for any month (285 in June 2017)...the 21 hit by pitches tied for second most in Athletics history in any month and fell one short of the record (22 in August of 2019)...the 42 home runs are fourth most in Oakland history in August.

OFFENSE: Matt Chapman Matt Olson have 10 home runs each and the A's are one of six teams (Cubs, Dodgers, Padres, Reds, White Sox) with at least two players with 10 or more home runs...are tied for fourth in the majors in hit by pitches (25), tied for sixth in triples (7) and tied for seventh in walks (140)...have the fifth lowest batting average (.224) and the seventh most strikeouts (340)...have been successful in 15-of-17 (88.2%) stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.68 ERA (25 er in 84.0 ip) over the last 10 games and now have a 3.51 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the majors...rank fourth in opponents OPS (.684) and slugging percentage (.379) and fifth in on-base percentage (.300)...A's starting pitchers are 5-5 with a

5.43 ERA (32 er in 53.0 ip) over the last 11 games...overall, starters are tied for eighth in the majors in wins (12).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors over the last seven games, which has led to five unearned runs...have just 16 errors for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the majors...are tied for third in fewest double plays turned (21).

HOME AND AWAY: Tonight, the A's begin an eight-game homestand against San Diego (three games) and Houston (five games), which includes one game as the visiting team against the Astros on Tuesday...went 4-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and are 13-4 (.765) in Oakland...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1) and Houston (0-2)...it was originally scheduled as a season-long 10-game trip, with one more game in Texas and Houston and a three-game series in Seattle...are now 9-8 (.529) on the road...have a 2.66 ERA (47 er in 159.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 4.46 (71 er in 143.1 ip) on the road...have allowed 10 home runs in 159.0 innings in the Coliseum and 24 in 143.1 innings on the road.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 14-12 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied for fourth most in the majors and Oakland is one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox, 12-0).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have four walk-off wins, which is tied with the Blue Jays for the most in the majors...are 5-0 in extra inning games...are tied with the Blue Jays for the most extra inning wins and are tied for sixth in games...had just six extra inning wins all last year...now have a six-game winning streak in extra inning games dating back to Sept. 18, 2019, which is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight...are 7-2 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for the third most last at bat wins in the majors...are 6-4 in one-run games and are tied for sixth in one-run wins...have 12 come-from-behind wins, which is tied for third most...lead the majors in wins when trailing after six (5) and four (9) innings, are tied for the lead when trailing after eight (2) and five (7), and tied for second when trailing after seven (3).

A's vs. PADRES: The A's and Padres meet for the first time since 2018 when Oakland went 4-0...won two games in San Diego on June 19 and 20 and two in Oakland on July 3 and 4...it was the second time the A's swept the season series from the Padres (3-0 in 2000) and the first time they went 4-0 in a season against a National League team...have won four consecutive season series from San Diego and eight of 10 overall...have won four straight games, seven of the last eight, nine of the last 11 and 12 of the last 15...lead the all-time series 23-10 (.697), which is the A's best record against any team...are 11-4 in Oakland and 12-6 in San Diego...including 7-3 at Petco Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman ranks fifth in the majors in extra base hits (21)...**Jake Diekmann** not allowed a run in his first 12 appearances (12.0 ip) and now has a career-high 15.2-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year...**Robbie Grossman** ranks eighth in the majors in on-base percentage (.422)...**Liam Hendriks** has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career...is tied for the Major League lead in saves (10)...**Stephen Piscotty** had 26 RBI in August, which were third most in the majors and seventh most in Oakland history in August.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1973** the A's defeat the California Angels 4-3 as Ken Holtzman wins his 20th game en route to a 21-13 season...in **2000** Mike Stanley is a perfect 5-for-5 with five RBI in the A's 10-0 win over Toronto...in **2002** the A's blow an 11-0 lead against Kansas City but Scott Hatteberg hits a pinch-hit "walk-off" home run in the bottom of the ninth inning for a 12-11 win, the A's American League record breaking 20th consecutive victory...in **2019** Sean Murphy homers in his Major League debut, a 4-0 win over Los Angeles (AL), to become the fourth MLB catcher since at least 1901 to homer and catch a shutout in his debut.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesús Luzardo (2-1, 3.74 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth appearance and sixth start of the season...has not allowed a run in three of his seven appearances...made his first two appearances of the season in relief (4.05 ERA) and is 2-1 with a 3.67 ERA (11 er in 27.0 ip) in his five starts since then...is tied for second among Major League rookies with 34 strikeouts (Webb, SF 35) and ranks sixth in innings pitched (33.2)...the A's are 4-1 (.800) in his starting assignments.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 1.90 ERA (5 er in 23.2 ip) in five games, three starts, at home compared to 0-1 with an 8.10 ERA (9 er in 10.0 ip) in two starts on the road...has allowed one home run in 23.2 innings at home, three in 10.0 innings on the road...is now 2-0 with a 1.82 ERA (5 er in 24.2 ip) in six career appearances in the Coliseum, 0-1 with a 4.71 ERA (11 er in 21.0 ip) in seven games on the road.

AL AND NL: Is 1-1 with a 2.21 ERA (5 er in 20.1 ip) in four games against American League teams compared to 1-0 with a 6.08 ERA (9 er in 13.1 ip) in three games against National League teams...the three interleague games are the first of his career and he is 1-1 with a 1.93 ERA (7 er in 32.1 ip) in 10 career games against the AL.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed all four of his home runs and issued 12 of his 13 walks to right-handed hitters...has allowed all five of his career home runs and has 14 of his 16 walks against righties...has allowed a .217 (5-for-23) average with runners in scoring position this year and .194 (6-for-31) in his career...opponents are hitting .356 (12-for-33) with three walks (.417 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has received no run support in two of his five starts, both no decisions.

IN RELIEF: Made his first appearance of 2020 on July 25 against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland...entered the game to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 4-0 and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings...pitched in relief again July 29 against Colorado in Oakland in a 5-1 A's loss...struck out a five in 3.2 innings and matched his career high in walks (2)...allowed a run in the eighth inning to snap a career-high 12.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2019.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his first Major League start, a 5-1 A's win over Texas on Aug. 4 in Oakland...at the age of 22 years and 309 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to start a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and matched his high with two walks...retired each of the first six batters and allowed just two base runners into scoring position...was relieved by Petit to start the sixth inning with the score tied 0-0.

SECOND START: He recorded his first Major League win in the A's 7-2 victory over Houston on Aug. 9 in Oakland...at the age of 22 years and 314 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to win a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...blanked the Astros on two hits over the first three innings before allowing a two-run home run to Gurriel in the fourth...those were the only runs he would allow in 5.2 innings.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning win at San Francisco Aug. 14...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high nine hits in 3.1 innings...walked a career-high tying two and allowed two home runs in a game for the first time in his career...yielded a solo home run to Longoria in the first and a three-run home run to Pence in the third...also allowed a two-run single to Longoria in the fourth and was relieved by Wendelken with runners on first and second and one out in the fourth and the A's trailing 6-0.

FOURTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win over Arizona Aug. 19 in Oakland...struck out a career-high seven in 6.1 scoreless innings...matched his high with two walks...scattered four hits and allowed just two base runners to advance into scoring position...retired the side in order just once (second inning).

LAST START: He was the was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 3-2 loss at Texas on Aug. 24...struck out a career-high tying seven in a career-high 6.2 innings...had a career-high 96 pitches and walked a career-high tying two for the sixth consecutive game...Oakland scored a run in the first and he allowed a two-run single to Frazier in the bottom of the first...the A's tied the game with a run in the second but he allowed a solo home run to Kiner-Falefa in the bottom of the second...then retired 15 of the final 20 batters he faced without allowing a run.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA and .143 opponents batting average in three starts this spring (8.1 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 13 so)...struck out 13 batters and walked just one in 8.1 innings...did not pitch in either of the two July exhibition games against San Francisco.

2019 RECAP: Had his season interrupted twice by a strained left shoulder but, after going 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games (nine starts) with three minor league teams, he was selected by Oakland on Sept. 9 after Las Vegas concluded its season...had no decisions, two saves, a 1.50 ERA and .119 opponents batting average in six relief appearances in his Major League debut...struck out 16 batters in 12.0 innings (12.00 per nine innings) and walked just three for a .196 on-base percentage...allowed two doubles and one home run for a .238 slugging percentage...left-handed hitters were 1-for-14 (.071) with no extra base hits, one walk and a .205 OPS...right-handed hitters batted .143 (4-for-28) with a .547 OPS...opponents hit .138 with his lone home run with the bases empty, .077 with runners on...they were 1-for-8 (.125) with runners in scoring position...allowed a .095 average with two strikes...did not inherit any runners and first batters faced were 1-for-5 (.200) with a walk.

2019 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Was a non-roster invitee with the A's during the spring and had a 0.93 ERA in four games before he was shut down with a supraspinatus muscle strain...was assigned to Single-A Stockton June 11 and appeared in two games with the Ports and three with Las Vegas before going on the injured list July 4...made one rehab start with the AZL A's Green before he was reinstated from the IL Aug. 10 and sent to Stockton...moved back to Las Vegas Aug. 15...combined to strike out 57 batters in 43.0 minor league innings (11.93 per nine innings)...walked just eight (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.13...his opponents batting average broke down to .132 (5-for-38) against left-handed hitters compared to .248 (31-for-125) with all four of his home runs against right-handers...had a .379 OPS against lefties, .675 against righties...all four of the home runs were solo shots...yielded a .132 average with runners in scoring position...tossed fewer than five innings in nine of his 11 appearances, but logged at least two innings each time...surrendered one run or fewer eight times...had more strikeouts than innings pitched seven times.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (2-2, 5.64 ERA): Is 2-0 with a 2.35 ERA and .246 opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA and .364 opponents average over his first four starts...has not walked a batter in four of his six starts and has issued just five free passes in 30.1 innings (1.48 per nine innings)...has allowed six runs over the first four innings of his starts this year (2.61 ERA) and 18 from the fourth inning on (12.10 ERA)...opponents are 17-for-73 (.233) over innings one through three and 21-for-50 (.420) from the fourth inning on...is 1-0 with a 2.61 ERA in two interleague starts compared to 1-2 with a 7.20 ERA in five starts against the American League...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 10-3 A's win at Texas on August 25 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 3 so)...had a no decision in his only career start against San Diego, a 4-2 A's win in Oakland on July 4, 2018 (7.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 1 so).

- The A's bullpen allowed a run in the sixth inning of the second game of the double-header last Saturday at Houston, snapping its scoreless streak at an Oakland record 30.0 innings...broke the previous mark of 29.2 from July 28-Aug. 9, 2014... it was the fifth longest streak in Athletics history and the longest the record streak of 44.0 from Sept. 3-20, 1966.
- Has allowed one run or fewer in 16 of the last 17 games (10 er in 63.1 ip, 1.42 ERA) and has a Major League low 1.87 ERA for the season...the lowest ERA by the bullpen in Oakland history is 2.35 in 1990.
- Has the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.267) and ranks second in OPS (.559), batting average (.201) and slugging percentage (.292).
- Has converted 13-of-15 (86.7%) save opportunities...ranks third in the majors in saves and save percentage.
- Has the fewest losses in the majors (2), ranks second in fewest home runs (9) and fewest walks (44) and tied for 10th in wins (10).
- First batters faced are 19-for-104 (.183) with seven walks, three doubles and a home run...has the lowest opponents on-base percentage against first batters in the majors (.232), ranks second in OPS (.473) and slugging percentage (.240) and sixth in batting average.
- Has allowed 10-of-42 (23.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the sixth lowest percentage in the majors.

- Has not allowed a run in his first 12 appearances (12.0 ip) and now has a career-high 15.2-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year (previous: 14.2, May 11-June 18, 2016)...last allowed a run on Sept. 14, 2019 at Texas...his 12.0 innings pitched this year are the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed.
- Opponents are 5-for-40 (.125) but he has issued nine walks.
- Has not allowed an extra base hit and his .125 opponents slugging percentage is tied for fifth lowest in the majors among relievers.
- Has allowed a .188 (3-for-16) average with the bases empty, .083 (2-for-24) with runners on.
- Last faced the Padres on Sept. 29, 2018 at San Diego while pitching for Arizona (0.1 ip, 1 h, 0 so).

Last Year: Began the season with Kansas City and was 0-6 with a 4.75 ERA in 48 relief appearances when he was traded to Oakland on July 27...went 1-1 with a 4.43 ERA in 28 games with the A's and had a 4.65 ERA in a career-high 76 relief appearances overall.

- Was named American League Reliever of the Month for July-August on Wednesday...it was the second time he earned the honor (June, 2019)...went 2-0 with 10 saves, a 1.10 ERA and .143 opponents batting average in 16 games.
- Has not allowed a run over his last eight games (8.0 ip) and opponents are 1-for-25 (.040) with a walk over that span.
- Has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career (previous: 8, June 22-July 20, 2019 and Aug. 1-29, 2019)...also has two wins over that 15-game stretch and has not allowed a run 14 times (15.1 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 21 so, 0.59 ERA).
- Is tied for the Major League lead in saves (10)...has 23 strikeouts, which is tied for the most among relievers in the West divisions.
- Has allowed a .094 (3-for-32) batting average, no extra base hits and a .215 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .208 (5-for-24) with a .644 OPS against left-handers.
