OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-13) VS. SAN DIEGO PADRES (24-16)

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their losing streak to three games last night...it marks just the third time over the last 137 games the A's have lost three in a row...have not lost more than three straight games since a five-game losing streak from May 28-June 2, 2019...are now 6-7 over the last 13 games and 10-9 over the last 19...are 22-13 (.629) for the season, which is the second best record in the American League (Rays, 27-12) and third best in the majors (Dodgers, 30-10)...it is the A's best record after 35 games since the 2003 club also started the year 22-13...with a win today, the A's would have their best record after 36 games since 1990 (24-12)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 33rd consecutive day and are two games ahead of second place Houston for the second consecutive day...have not led by fewer than two games since Aug. 5 when they had a 1½ game lead (had a ½-game lead on Aug. 4)...have held at least a share of first place for 41 of 43 days this year (33 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19... did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games), following a positive test for Covid-19.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 5-5 (.500) in interleague play compared to 17-8 (.680) against the American League...the 10 interleague games are tied for fourth fewest in the majors...have a 5.14 ERA (51 er in 89.1 ip) in interleague games compared to 3.00 against the AL...following this three-game series with San Diego, the A's will also host San Francisco (Sept. 18-20) and travel to Colorado (Sept. 15-16) and Los Angeles (Sept. 22-24)...the A's went 11-9 (.550) in interleague play last year, which tied for the 10th best record in the majors...are 233-201 (.537) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 14-13 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied for fourth most in the majors and Oakland is one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox. 12-0).

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for the second time this year last night (Aug. 11 at Los Angeles-AL) and are now hitting .186 (21-for-113) with eight runs scored over the last four games...are batting .222 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the majors...have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...however, are tied for fourth in the majors in hit by pitches (25) and rank eighth in walks (144)...have the ninth most strikeouts (345)... have been successful in 15-of-17 (88.2%) stolen base attempts, which is tied with the Yankees for the best percentage in the majors...Matt Chapman and Matt Olson have 10 home runs each and the A's are one of seven teams (Cubs, Dodgers, Orioles, Padres, Reds, White Sox) with at least two players with 10 or more home runs.

WITH THE BASES LOADED: The A's have hit three grand slams, which is tied with the Yankees for second most in the majors to the Padres six...hit four grand slams in each of the previous two seasons...are tied for the lead in hit by pitches with the bases loaded (2), rank third in RBI (39) and slugging (.735), fourth in extra base hits (6) and sixth in hits (12) and batting (.353).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 17 runs in the last three games (17 er in 21.0 ip, 7.29 ERA) after yielding 20 runs over the previous eight contests (1.88 ERA)...have a 3.61 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors... rank fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.305) and sixth in OPS (.690) and slugging percentage (.385)...have allowed the second fewest home runs (37) and walks (102)...A's starting pitchers are 7-7 with a 6.25 ERA (62 er in 89.1 ip) over the last 19 games after going 5-4 with a 3.48 ERA over the first 16 contests.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed eight errors over the last eight games, which has led to five unearned runs...have just 18 errors for the season, which is tied for sixth fewest in the majors...have turned just 21 double plays, which is tied with the Reds and Cardinals for the fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this eight-game homestand against San Diego (0-1) and Houston (five games), which includes one game as the visiting team against the Astros on Tuesday...went 4-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and are 13-5 (.722) in Oakland compared to 9-8 (.529) on the road...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1) and Houston (0-2)...it was originally scheduled as a season-long 10-game trip, with one more game in Texas and Houston and a three-game series in Seattle...have a 2.89 ERA (54 er in 168.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 4.46 (71 er in 143.1 ip) on the road...have allowed 13 home runs in 168.0 innings in the Coliseum and 24 in 143.1 innings on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have four walk-off wins, which is tied with the Blue Jays for the most in the majors...are 5-0 in extra inning games...are tied with the Blue Jays for the most extra inning wins and are tied for sixth in games...had just six extra inning wins all last year...now have a six-game winning streak in extra inning games dating back to Sept. 18, 2019, which is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight...are 7-2 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for the third most last at bat wins in the majors...are 6-4 in one-run games and are tied for seventh in one-run wins...have 12 come-from-behind wins, which is tied for fourth most...lead the majors in wins when trailing after six (5) and four (9) innings, are tied for the lead when trailing after eight (2) and five (7), and tied for second when trailing after seven (3).

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's have four scheduled doubleheaders in the month of September to make up for games lost to Covid-19 and protest...have not played four doubleheaders in a season since 1993...played one doubleheader in August and the five doubleheaders would be the A's most in a season since 1986...yesterday began a season-ending stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 26 games over the final 24 days, which would be their most games over a 24-day stretch since July 21-Aug. 13, 1978 when they had 27 games in 24 days...it also began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 16 games over 13 days through Sept. 16, which would be their most games over a 13-day stretch since July 18-30, 1975 (also 16 in 13)...are scheduled to play three doubleheaders in three cities over a seven-day span from Sept. 8-14 and the 10 games in seven days would be their most since June 16-22, 1966 (also 10 games).

IN AUGUST: The A's went 19-8 (.704) in the month of August, which was the third best record in the majors (Dodgers and Rays, 21-7) and the seventh best August in Oakland history...the wins were the A's most in August since going 21-6 in 2006 and their most in any month since going 19-8 in Sept. 2013...ranked second in the majors in saves (11), fourth in ERA (3.46) and sixth in opponents OPS (.688)...the saves fell one short of the Oakland record for August...had 225 strikeouts, which set an Oakland record for the month of August and was fifth most for any month...on offense, the A's led the majors in hit by pitches (21) and strikeouts (277), tied for fourth in walks (115), tied for fifth in home runs (42), tied for sixth in runs (140), ranked seventh in extra base hits (92) and tied for seventh in triples (5)...the strikeouts are an Athletics record for the month of August and second most for any month (285 in June 2017)...the 21 hit by pitches tied for second most in Athletics history in any month and fell one short of the record (22 in August of 2019)... the 42 home runs are fourth most in Oakland history in August.

A's vs. PADRES: The A's lost the first meeting of 2020 last night after going 4-0 against the Padres in 2018...that snapped a four-game winning streak against San Diego...however, have won seven of the last nine games, nine of the last 12 and 12 of the last 16...in 2018, won two games in San Diego on June 19 and 20 and two in Oakland on July 3 and 4...it was the second time the A's swept the season series from the Padres (3-0 in 2000) and the first time they went 4-0 in a season

against a National League team...have won four consecutive season series from San Diego and eight of 10 overall...lead the all-time series 23-11 (.676), which is the A's best record against any team...are 11-5 in Oakland and 12-6 in San Diego...including 7-3 at Petco Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is tied for fifth in the majors in extra base hits (21)...Jake Diekman not allowed a run in his first 12 appearances (12.0 ip) and now has a career-high 15.2-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year...Liam Hendriks has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career...is tied for the Major League lead in saves (10).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1931 George Earnshaw tosses a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win the first game of a doubleheader at Boston...in 1951 Ferris Fain goes 5 for 5 in the second game of a doubleheader against Washington...in 1973 Catfish Hunter improves his record to 18-3 as the A's defeat the California Angels 11-6...it is Hunter's club record 13th consecutive win...he finishes the season 21-5, an .808 winning percentage.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (2-2, 5.64 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his team-leading eighth start of the season...is 2-0 with a 2.35 ERA (4 er in 15.1 ip) and .246 (14-for-57) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA and .364 opponents average over his first four starts...has not walked a batter in four of his six starts and has issued just five free passes in 30.1 innings (1.48 per nine innings)...has walked just 44 batters in 220.2 innings over the last three years (1.79 per nine innings).

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Has allowed six runs over the first four innings of his starts this year (20.2 ip, 2.61 ERA) and 18 from the fourth inning on (13 er in 9.2 ip, 12.10 ERA)...opponents are 17-for-73 (.233) over innings one through three and 21-for-50 (.420) from the fourth inning on...in 12 starts over the last two seasons, he has a 1.51 ERA (6 er in 35.2 ip) and .198 (24-for-121) opponents batting average over innings 1-3 and a 6.29 ERA (17 er in 24.1 ip) and .294 (30-for-102) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.61 ERA (3 er in 10.1 ip) in two interleague starts compared to 1-2 with a 7.20 ERA (19 er in 30.1 ip) in five starts against the American League...however, is 4-7 with a 4.08 ERA (39 er in 86.0 ip) in 16 career starts against the National League compared to 33-23 with a 3.84 ERA (187 er in 438.0 ip) in 77 games against the American League.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are hitting .259 (21-for-81) with the bases empty compared to .405 (17-for-42) with runners on...they are 11-for-24 (.458) with runners in scoring position after going 0-for-15 with RISP last year...has a .210 (13-for-62) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .410 (25-for-61) after that...has allowed four home runs, three of which are solo shots...six of the seven home runs he allowed over the last two years have come with the bases empty...opponents are batting .313 (10-for-32) when leading off an inning.

2020 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) July 25 in Oakland...it was his first loss since Aug. 19, 2018 against Houston and it snapped a career-high tying five-game winning streak...allowed an Upton homer with two outs in the fourth and three more runs in the fifth on a Simmons RBI double and a Fletcher two-run double...he dropped his second consecutive decision in the A's 5-3 loss at Seattle July 31...retired each of the first nine batters before allowing three runs (two earned) in the fourth inning on a Seager two-run double and an error...had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over Texas on Aug. 5 in Oakland...allowed a first pitch home run to Choo to start the game but then retired nine of the next 11 hitters...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed three runs in the fourth... had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 10-9 loss at Los Angeles (AL) Aug. 10...tossed 2.2 innings, which was his shortest outing since Aug. 7, 2018 against the Dodgers when he also pitched 2.2 innings...allowed a three-run home run to Rendon in the first and a RBI single to Upton in the bottom of the third...had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 7-6 win at San Francisco Aug. 15...retired eight of the first nine batters before allowing three runs in the fourth inning on a Slater walk, a Solano single and a Yastrzesmki triple and error...then retired each of the final six batters he faced... picked up his first win of the season in the A's 5-1 victory over Arizona Aug. 20 in Oakland...blanked the Diamondbacks on three hits over the first four innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Escobar in the fifth.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 10-3 win at Texas on Aug. 25...allowed a run in the second inning on a Kiner-Falefa RBI single but the A's scored once in the third, twice in the fourth and two more times in the fifth to give him a 5-1 lead...allowed two unearned runs in the bottom of the fifth when a Semien error preceded a two-run single by Solak...was relieved by McFarland to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 5-3.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-2 with a 10.66 ERA (12.2 ip, 18 h, 15 r, 15 er, 0 bb, 14 so, 3 hr) in four games this spring, all starts...led the A's and tied for eighth in the Cactus League in strikeouts (14)...did not walk a batter in 12.2 innings...allowed a .321 (18-for-56) opponents batting average...yielded at least two runs in each of his assignments...made one start in July on the 20th vs. San Francisco (5.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 so).

2019 RECAP: Began the season on the 60-day injured list as he continued his recovery from Sept. 19, 2018 surgery on his left shoulder...went 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts before he was reinstated from the IL Sept. 1...made five starts with Oakland and was 4-0 with a 1.21 ERA and .160 opponents batting average...the ERA was second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched (Yates SD, 1.19) and fifth lowest in Oakland history...using the same minimum, the batting average was third lowest in the majors and sixth lowest in Oakland history...allowed two runs or fewer in all five starts, including one run or fewer four times, and four hits or fewer four times...struck out 30 batters in 29.2 innings and walked just seven (2.12 per nine innings)...had a .229 opponents on-base percentage and .280 slugging percentage.

MORE FROM 2019: His opponents batting average broke down to .129 (8-for-62) against right-handed hitters compared to .211 (8-for-38) against left-handers...however, issued six of his seven walks to righties...yielded two of his three home runs to righties and has surrendered 57 of his 66 career homers to right-handers...now has a .218 opponents batting average and .596 OPS in his career against lefties, .257 with a .741 OPS against righties...was 2-0 with a 0.50 ERA in three starts during the day, 2-0 with a 2.31 ERA in two starts at night...is now 16-5 with a 3.32 ERA (74 er in 200.1 ip) in 34 career day games, 21-25 with a 4.23 ERA (152 er in 323.2 ip) in 59 starts at night... went 4-0 in four starts with three runs of support or more...is now 4-28 in 46 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 33-2 in 46 starts with support of three runs or more.

2019 IN MINORS: Started his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton July 8 and was 0-1 with a 9.72 ERA in three starts when he was transferred to Triple-A Las Vegas July 23...went 0-1 with a 6.10 ERA in two starts with the Aviators before his rehab assignment was halted on Aug. 2 due to a strained right oblique...returned to action Aug. 13 and went 3-0 with a 1.53 ERA over his final three starts...was 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts overall...struck out 53 batters in 36.1 innings (13.13 per nine innings) and walked 10 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.3.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Mike Fiers (4-1, 4.86 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...the A's are 6-1 (.857) in his starting assignments this year and 36-13 (.735) when he starts in his career...is 3-0 with a 2.60 ERA and one home run over his last three starts after going 1-1 with a 6.86 ERA and six home runs over his first four starts...is 9-0 with a 2.99 ERA over his last 16 home starts and the home winning streak is tied for ninth longest in Oakland history...it is the longest by a starting pitcher since Mark Mulder had a 10-game streak from July 31, 2002-June 19, 2003...went 4-1 with a 4.36 ERA in six starts in the month of August...it is the fifth time in his career he has won four games in a month, the fourth time in August...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's win at Texas on Aug. 26 (6.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 0 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against San Diego, a 4-2 decision at Milwaukee on June 9, 2012 (6.0 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 6 so).

- The A's bullpen has allowed four runs in the last two games to snap an Oakland record 30.0 inning scoreless streak...broke the previous mark of 29.2 from July 28-Aug. 9, 2014...it was the fifth longest streak in Athletics history and the longest since the record streak of 44.0 from Sept. 3-20, 1966
- Has allowed one run or fewer in 16 of the last 18 games (13 er in 67.2 ip, 1.73 ERA) and has a Major League low 2.00 ERA for the season...the lowest ERA by the bullpen in Oakland history is 2.35 in 1990.
- Has the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.266) and ranks second in OPS (.576), batting average (.203) and slugging percentage (.310).
- Has converted 13-of-15 (86.7%) save opportunities...ranks third in the majors in save percentage and fourth in saves.
- Has the fewest losses in the majors (2), ranks second in fewest walks (44) and tied for second in fewest home runs (12).
- First batters faced are 20-for-108 (.185) with seven walks, three doubles and two home runs...has the lowest opponents on-base percentage against first batters in the majors (.233), ranks second in OPS (.501), third in slugging percentage (.269) and fifth in batting average.
- Has allowed 10-of-44 (22.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the majors.
