OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-13) VS. SAN DIEGO PADRES (24-17)

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 6, 2020 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:10 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their losing streak at a season-high tying three games yesterday (also July 28-31)...are now 7-7 over the last 14 games and 11-9 over the last 20...are 23-13 (.639) for the season, which is the second best record in the American League (Rays, 27-13), third best in the majors (Dodgers, 30-11) and seventh best in Oakland history after 36 games...it is the best since the 1990 club was 24-12 (won game 37)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 34th consecutive day and are 3½ games ahead of second place Houston...have held at least a share of first place for 42 of 44 days this year (34 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19...did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games), following a positive test for Covid-19.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 6-5 (.545) in interleague play compared to 17-8 (.680) against the American League...the 11 interleague games are tied for fifth fewest in the majors...have a 5.03 ERA (55 er in 98.1 ip) in interleague games compared to 3.00 against the AL...following this three-game series with San Diego, the A's will also host San Francisco (Sept. 18-20) and travel to Colorado (Sept. 15-16) and Los Angeles (Sept. 22-24)...the A's went 11-9 (.550) in interleague play last year, which tied for the 10th best record in the majors...are 234-201 (.538) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

OFFENSE: The A's scored eight runs on 11 hits yesterday after scoring eight runs over the previous four games while hitting .186...are now batting .225 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...went 5-for-11 with runners in scoring position yesterday after going 7-for-38 (.184) over the previous six games...are hitting .223 with RISP for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (Texas, .212)...rank fifth in the majors in hit by pitches (26), tied for fifth in triples (8), eighth in walks (148) and ninth in most strikeouts (355)...have been successful in 16-of-18 (88.9%) stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors.

WITH THE BASES LOADED: The A's have hit three grand slams, which is tied with the Yankees for second most in the majors to the Padres six...hit four grand slams in each of the previous two seasons...are tied for the lead in hit by pitches with the bases loaded (2), rank third in RBI (39) and slugging (.735), fourth in extra base hits (6) and fifth in batting (.353).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 21 runs in the last four games (21 er in 30.0 ip, 6.30 ERA) after yielding 20 runs over the previous eight contests (1.88 ERA)...have a 3.62 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...rank fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.305) and sixth in OPS (.692) and slugging percentage (.388)...have allowed the second fewest home runs (38) and walks (103) and are tied for second in fewest hit batters (10).

STARTING PITCHING: Over the last 15 games dating back to Aug. 16, Sean Manaea and Mike Fiers are a combined 6-0 with a 2.20 ERA (8 er in 32.2 ip) in six starts while the rest of the A's starters are 1-6 with a 7.40 ERA (34 er in 41.1 ip) in nine starts...starters have 177.0 innings pitched in 36 games, an average of 4.92 innings per start...the fewest innings per start in Oakland history is 5.09 in 2018.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed nine errors over the last nine games and now have 19 for the season, which is seventh fewest in the majors...are one of three teams without an error by their outfielders (Diamondbacks, Brewers) and one of two without an error by their first basemen (Astros)...have four errors by their pitchers, two by their catchers and a combined 13 from their second basemen, third basemen and shortstops...have turned just 21 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 15-13 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied for sixth most in the majors but the eight games are tied for sixth fewest...Oakland is one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox, 13-0).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this eight-game homestand against San Diego (0-1) and Houston (five games), which includes one game as the visiting team against the Astros on Tuesday...went 4-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and are 14-5 (.737) in Oak-

land compared to 9-8 (.529) on the road...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1) and Houston (0-2)...it was originally scheduled as a season-long 10-game trip, with one more game in Texas and Houston and a three-game series in Seattle...have a 2.95 ERA (58 er in 177.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 4.46 (71 er in 143.1 ip) on the road...have allowed 14 home runs in 177.0 innings in the Coliseum and 24 in 143.1 innings on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have four walk-off wins, which is tied with the Angels and Blue Jays for the most in the majors...are 5-0 in extra inning games...are tied with the Blue Jays for the most extra inning wins and are tied for sixth in games...had just six extra inning wins all last year...now have a six-game winning streak in extra inning games dating back to Sept. 18, 2019, which is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight...are 7-2 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for the third most last at bat wins in the majors...have 12 come-from-behind wins, which is tied for fourth most...lead the majors in wins when trailing after six (5) and four (9) innings, are tied for the lead when trailing after eight (2) and five (7), and tied for second when trailing after seven (3).

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's have four scheduled doubleheaders in the month of September to make up for games lost to Covid-19 and protest...have not played four doubleheaders in a season since 1993...played one doubleheader in August and the five doubleheaders would be the A's most in a season since 1986...Friday began a season-ending stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 26 games over the final 24 days, which would be their most games over a 24-day stretch since July 21-Aug. 13, 1978 when they had 27 games in 24 days...it also began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 16 games over 13 days through Sept. 16, which would be their most games over a 13-day stretch since July 18-30, 1975 (also 16 in 13)...are scheduled to play three doubleheaders in three cities over a seven-day span from Sept. 8-14 and the 10 games in seven days would be their most since June 16-22, 1966 (also 10 games).

A's vs. PADRES: The A's have split the first two meetings of 2020 after going 4-0 against the Padres in 2018...have won five of the last six games, eight of the last 10, 10 of the last 13 and 13 of the last 17...in 2018, won two games in San Diego on June 19 and 20 and two in Oakland on July 3 and 4...it was the second time the A's swept the season series from the Padres (3-0 in 2000) and the first time they went 4-0 in a season against a National League team...have won four consecutive season series from San Diego and eight of 10 overall...lead the all-time series 24-11 (.686), which is the A's best record against any team...are 12-5 in Oakland and 12-6 in San Diego...including 7-3 at Petco Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha has a .407 on-base percentage, which ranks third among players in the West divisions...has a .399 on-base percentage over the last two years, which is sixth best in the majors...**Jake Diekman** not allowed a run in his 13 appearances (13.0 ip) and now has a career-high 16.2-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year...his 13.0 innings pitched this year are the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed...**Liam Hendriks** has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career...is tied for the Major League lead in saves (10)...leads relievers in the West divisions in strikeouts (25).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1913** Eddie Collins steals home twice in the same game against Boston to tie a major league record...in **1943** Carl Scheib becomes the youngest player to appear in an American League game at the age of 16 years, 248 days...in **1969** the A's play their second 18-inning game in a 14-day span but lose to Minnesota 8-6 after each team scores once in the 16th...in **1976** the A's steal seven bases in a 2-1, 11 inning win at California to run the season total to an American League record 297...Oakland would go on to steal 341 bases to best the AL record of 291 established by Washington in 1913.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (4-1, 4.86 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...the A's are 6-1 (.857) in his starting assignments this year and 36-13 (.735) when he starts in his career...is 3-0 with a 2.60 ERA (5 er in 17.1 ip) and one home run over his last three starts after going 1-1 with a 6.86 ERA and six home runs over his first four starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Picked up his fourth win of the season in his last start, which is tied for fourth most among pitchers in the West divisions...however, has the fifth highest opponents batting average in the majors (.282), the seventh highest on-base percentage (.340) and the ninth highest OPS (.803) and ERA (4.86)...is averaging the second fewest strikeouts per nine innings (5.11) and has the third highest run support (7.78).

AT THE COLISEUM: Is 2-0 with a 6.46 ERA (11 er in 15.1 ip) in three starts at home and is now 9-0 with a 2.99 ERA (33 er in 99.1 ip) over his last 16 home starts...has not lost at home since April 20, 2019 vs. Toronto and the home winning streak is tied for ninth longest in Oakland history...it is the longest by a starting pitcher since Mark Mulder had a 10-game streak from July 31, 2002-June 19, 2003...is now 14-1 with a 3.03 ERA (50 er in 148.2) in 25 starts in the Coliseum since he was acquired from Detroit on Aug. 6, 2018...is 15-3 with a 3.34 ERA (66 er in 178.0 ip) and .229 (149-for-650) opponents batting average in 31 career games, including 30 starts, in the Coliseum.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Picked up the win in his only interleague start this year on Aug. 16 at San Francisco (6.2 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...went 2-0 with a 0.61 ERA in two interleague starts last year and is now 3-0 with a 1.38 ERA (4 er in 26.0 ip) in four career interleague starts with the A's...is 4-0 with a 2.52 ERA (11 er in 39.1 ip) over his last seven interleague starts dating back to Aug. 23, 2017...is 8-5 with a 2.80 ERA (39 er in 125.1 ip) and .217 (98-for-451) opponents batting average in 23 career interleague appearances, including 21 starts.

AUGUST AND SEPTEMBER: Went 4-1 with a 4.36 ERA in six starts in the month of August...tied for second in the majors in wins in August...it is the fifth time in his career he has won four games in a month, the fourth time in August (2012, 2014, 2019)...is now 24-10 with a 3.80 ERA in 45 career games in August...has no more than 14 wins in any other month...is 8-14 with a 5.67 ERA (106 er in 168.1 ip) in 36 career appearances in September...the losses are his most in any month and the ERA is second highest to a mark of 5.68 in April.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .175 (10-for-57) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .348 (32-for-92) with six of his seven home runs after that...opponents are hitting .309 (17-for-55) with runners on base but that drops to .194 (6-for-31) with runners in scoring position, including .077 (1-for-13) with RISP and two outs...now has a .188 (76-for-405) career opponents average with RISP and two outs...has yielded a .239 (17-for-71) average against left-handed hitters compared to .321 (25-for-78) against right-handers...has allowed a .333 (13-for-39) average to batters leading off an inning...the opponents number three hitter is 2-for-17 (.118) but the clean-up hitter is 9-for-17 (.529).

BY INNING: Has not allowed a run in the first inning (7.0)...has allowed just one run over the first two innings (1 er in 14.0 ip, 0.64 ERA) and opponents are 7-for-48 (.146) in those two innings...has allowed 20 runs from the third inning on (19 er in 23.0 ip, 7.43 ERA) and opponents are hitting .347 (35-for-101).

WITH THE A'S: Was acquired by Oakland on Aug. 6, 2018 and is 24-7 with a 4.00 ERA (122 er in 274.2 ip) in 50 games, including 49 starts, with the A's...the wins are tied for fifth most in the majors over that span...is 17-2 with a 3.51 ERA (72 er in 184.2 ip) over his last 32 starts dating back to his May 7, 2019 no-hitter against Cincinnati.

2020 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over Los Angeles (AL) **July 26** in Oakland...did not walk or strikeout a batter in 4.0 innings...it was his first career start with no walks and no strikeouts...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 10-inning win at Seattle on **Aug. 1**...allowed a two-run single to Seager in the third inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...picked up his first win of the season in the A's 6-4 victory over Texas **Aug. 6** in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on a hit and a walk over the first four innings and had a 5-0 lead entering the fifth...allowed a RBI single to Tejeda in the fifth, a solo home run to Frazier in the sixth and a two-run home run to Tejeda in the seventh...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on **Aug. 11**...allowed five runs in 3.2 innings, all on home runs in the fourth inning...Bundy, Mayers and Robles combined to shut out the A's on five hits...was the winning pitcher in the A's 15-2 win at San Francisco **Aug. 16**...allowed a Belt solo home run in the second and a Yastrzemski RBI single in the third...won his second consecutive start in the A's 5-3 win over Los Angeles (AL) on **Aug. 21** in Oakland...blanked the Angels on four hits, two walks and a hit batter over the first four innings and had a 3-0 lead before allowing a RBI single to Rendon in the fifth.

LAST START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 3-1 win at Texas on Aug. 26...tossed six innings and allow just one unearned run in the third inning...Choo singled, went to second on a Santana walk, stole third as part of a double steal and then scored on a Murphy throwing error...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced, including each of the last eight.

2019 RECAP: Was 15-4 with a 3.90 ERA in 33 starts in his first full season with the A's...ranked third in the American League in winning percentage (.789), sixth in opponents batting average (.243), tied for eighth in wins and 10th in OPS (.712) and on-base percentage (.304)...also tied for third in wild pitches (13) and tied for fifth in games started...had career highs in wins, games (33), games started, innings pitched (184.2) and winning percentage...led the A's in wins, starts, innings pitched, runs (82), walks (53) and home runs (30)...became the first A's pitcher to win 15 games since Scott Kazmir had 15 in 2014 and the first to make 33 starts since Sonny Gray had 33 in 2014...his innings pitched were the most by an A's pitcher over the last three years...his .789 winning percentage was fourth best in Oakland history among pitchers with 15 or more decisions...his 30 home runs tied for 10th most in a season in Oakland history...struck out 126 batters, an average of 6.14 per nine innings...that was the third-lowest mark in the AL...had the fifth-lowest strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.38)...went 2-3 with a 6.81 ERA, .297 opponents batting average and .854 OPS over his first eight starts, 10-0 with a 2.12 ERA, .199 opponents average and .572 OPS over his next 17 starts from May 7-Aug. 9 and 3-1 with a 6.27 ERA, .304 opponents average and .940 OPS over his final eight starts...left with the lead in eight of his no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...has left with the lead in 12 of his 49 career starts with the A's only to have the bullpen blow the save...compiled an 11-1 record and a 3.21 ERA in 17 starts on five days rest and is now 14-1 with a 3.12 ERA (48 er in 138.1 ip) in 23 starts on five days rest in his A's career.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Frankie Montas (2-3, 6.06 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...is 0-2 with a 16.76 ERA and .404 opponents batting average in three starts since missing his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness...allowed just four runs in 23.0 innings (1.57 ERA) over his first four starts and was 2-1...has allowed a .206 batting average and .599 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .313 with a .900 OPS against left-handers...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's loss in the second game of the doubleheader on Aug. 29 at Houston (3.1 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...the loss snapped a seven-game winning streak against American League West competition...is 3-3 with a 4.63 ERA (35.0 ip, 37 h, 20 r, 18 er, 14 bb, 26 so, 4 hr) in eight career appearances, including six starts, against Houston...is 1-1 with a 4.35 ERA (10.1 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 10 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year.

- The A's bullpen has allowed seven runs in the last three games to snap an Oakland record 30.0 inning scoreless streak...broke the previous mark of 29.2 from July 28-Aug. 9, 2014...it was the fifth longest streak in Athletics history and the longest since the record streak of 44.0 from Sept. 3-20, 1966.
- Has a 2.13 ERA for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (2.42)...the lowest ERA by the bullpen in Oakland history is 2.35 in 1990.
- Has the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.269) and ranks second in OPS (.593) and slugging percentage (.324) and third in batting average (.209).
- Has converted 13-of-15 (86.7%) save opportunities...ranks third in the majors in save percentage and tied for fourth in saves.
- Has the fewest losses in the majors (2), ranks second in fewest walks (44) and tied for second in fewest home runs (12).
- First batters faced are 20-for-112 (.179) with seven walks, three doubles and two home runs...has the lowest opponents on-base percentage against first batters in the majors (.225), ranks second in OPS (.484), third in slugging percentage (.259) and fourth in batting average.
- Has allowed 10-of-44 (22.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the third lowest percentage in the majors.

- Has not allowed a run in his 13 appearances (13.0 ip) and now has a career-high 16.2-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year (previous: 14.2, May 11-June 18, 2016)...last allowed a run on Sept. 14, 2019 at Texas...his 13.0 innings pitched this year are the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed.
- Opponents are 6-for-44 (.136) but he has issued nine walks.
- Has not allowed an extra base hit and his .136 opponents slugging percentage is seventh lowest in the majors among relievers.
- Has allowed a .211 (4-for-19) average with the bases empty, .080 (2-for-25) with runners on.
