OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-14) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (21-19)

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 7, 2020 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:10 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the last five games...are 7-8 over the last 15 games and 11-10 over the last 21 after starting the year 12-4...are 23-14 (.622) for the season, which is the fourth best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 35th consecutive day and are 3½ games ahead of second place Houston...have held at least a share of first place for 43 of 45 days this year (35 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19...snapped a season-high tying three game losing streak Saturday (also July 28-31)...did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games), following a positive test for Covid-19...are 1-2 since returning to action on Friday.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's will play their first of four scheduled September doubleheaders tomorrow to make up for the Aug. 30 postponement at Houston...Oakland will be the visiting team in the first game of the doubleheader...it will be the A's second doubleheader of the season and the first was also against the Astros (Aug. 29)...have not played two doubleheaders against one team in a season since 1990 (Cleveland on July 6 and 18)...have not played five doubleheaders in a season since 1986...this series with Houston is now a five-game series, which is the A's first series of five or more games since Aug. 15-18, 1996 vs. Baltimore in Oakland (went 2-3)...it is the 17th series of five or more games in Oakland history...Friday began a season-ending stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 26 games over the final 24 days, which would be their most games over a 24-day stretch since July 21-Aug. 13, 1978 when they had 27 games in 24 days...it also began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 16 games over 13 days through Sept. 16, which would be their most games over a 13-day stretch since July 18-30, 1975 (also 16 in 13)...are scheduled to play three doubleheaders in three cities over a seven-day span from Sept. 8-14 and the 10 games in seven days would be their most since June 16-22, 1966 (also 10 games)...will play four games in three different cities in three different time zones over a three-day span from Sept. 13-15.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this eight-game homestand against San Diego (1-2) and Houston (five games), which includes one game as the visiting team against the Astros on Tuesday...the series loss to San Diego was the A's first in a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since June 14-16, 2019 against Seattle when they also lost two of three...went 14-0-2 in home series of three or more games in between...went 4-1 on the last homestand and are 14-6 (.700) in Oakland compared to 9-8 (.529) on the road...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1) and Houston (0-2)...leave following the game Thursday for an eight-game road trip to Texas (four games), Seattle (two games) and Colorado (two games)...have a 3.05 ERA (63 er in 186.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 4.46 (71 er in 143.1 ip) on the road...have allowed 15 home runs in 184.0 innings in the Coliseum (0.73 per nine innings) and 24 in 143.1 innings on the road (1.51 per nine innings...are averaging 4.20 runs per game in Oakland (84 r in 20 g), 5.35 (91 r in 17 g) on the road.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .217 (103-for-474) with 57 runs (3.8 per game) and 14 home runs (0.9 per game) over the last 15 games after hitting .230 with 118 runs (5.4 per game) and 35 home runs (1.6 per game) over the first 22 contests...are hitting .225 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...however, are tied for third in the majors in hit by pitches (27) and rank eighth in walks (149)...have the best stolen base percentage (16-for-18, 88.9%) and are tied for sixth in triples (8)...are tied for second in the majors in grand slams (3)...also rank third in slugging with the bases loaded (.735), fourth in RBI (39) and tied for fourth in extra base hits (6)...have the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.221)...have struck out 367 times, which is eighth most in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 26 runs over the last five games (26 er in 39.0 ip, 6.00 ERA), but have a 3.66 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the majors...rank fifth in opponents OPS (.693), slugging percentage (.388) and on-base percentage (.305)...have allowed the second fewest home runs (39) and walks (106) and are tied for second in fewest hit batters (11).

STARTING PITCHING: Over the last 16 games dating back to Aug. 16, Sean Manaea and Mike Fiers are a combined 6-1 with a 2.63 ERA (11 er in 37.2 ip) in seven starts while the rest of the A's starters are 1-6 with a 7.40 ERA (34 er in 41.1 ip) in nine starts...starters have 182.0 innings pitched in 37 games, an average of 4.92 innings per start...the fewest innings per start in Oakland history is 5.09 in 2018.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed nine errors over the last 10 games and now have 19 for the season, which is seventh fewest in the majors...are one of three teams without an error by their outfielders (Diamondbacks, Brewers) and one of two without an error by their first basemen (Astros)...have four errors by their pitchers, two by their catchers and a combined 13 from their second basemen, third basemen and shortstops...have turned just 21 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have four walk-off wins, which is tied for the most in the majors...are 5-0 in extra inning games...are tied with the Blue Jays for the most extra inning wins and rank seventh in games...had just six extra inning wins all last year...now have a six-game winning streak in extra inning games dating back to Sept. 18, 2019, which is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight...are 7-2 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for the third most last at bat wins in the majors...have 12 come-from-behind wins, which is tied for fifth...lead the majors in wins when trailing after six innings (5), are tied for the lead when trailing after eight (2), five (7) and four (9), and tied for second when trailing after seven (3).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 15-14 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied for seventh most in the majors but the eight games are tied for fifth fewest...Oakland is one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox, 13-0).

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 6-6 (.500) in interleague play compared to 17-8 (.680) against the American League...are 21-7 when homering, 2-7 when going homerless...are 11-7 (.611) in day games and are tied with the Angels for the most day games in the majors...went 19-8 (.704) in the month of August, which was the third best record in the majors (Dodgers and Rays, 21-7) and the seventh best August in Oakland history...the wins were the A's most in August since going 21-6 in 2006 and their most in any month since going 19-8 in Sept. 2013

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's lead the season series 3-2...lost both games in Houston on Aug. 29 after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland, Aug. 7-9...it was the A's first sweep of the Astros since Sept. 8-10, 2017 when they swept a four-game series in Oakland...have won nine of their last 15 games from Houston, including six of the last seven in Oakland...lost the season series last year for the fifth consecutive season as they went 8-11...the eight wins were the A's most against the Astros since 2015 (9-10)...went 4-5 in Oakland and 4-6 in Houston...are 40-60 (.392) against Houston over the last six years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 71-73 all-time, including 38-34 in Oakland and 33-39 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha a .403 on-base percentage, which ranks fourth among players in the West divisions...has a .398 on-base percentage over the last two years, which is eighth best in the majors...**Jake Diekman** not allowed a run in his 13 appearances (13.0 ip) and now has a career-high 16.2-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year...his 13.0 innings pitched this year are the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed...**Robbie Grossman** ranks third among players in the West divisions in on-base percentage (.405), tied for fourth in hit by pitches (5), tied for fifth in doubles (11) and triples (2), ninth in OPS (.946) and 10th in slugging (.541)...**Liam Hendriks** has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career...is tied for second in the majors in saves (10)...leads relievers in the West divisions in strikeouts (25)...**J.B. Wendelken** has a 10.0-inning scoreless streak...has pitched 78.2 innings in his career and this is his third scoreless streak of 10 or more innings...has two 17.2-inning scoreless streaks.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1984** the A's tie a then club record by using 22 players in a game but lose 13-2 at Cleveland...only Mike Davis, who started the game in right and moved to center, played the entire game...in **2005** the A's scored five times in the bottom of the ninth to defeat Seattle 8-7, marking the first time in Oakland history the A's have come back from a four-run deficit entering the final bat and won...Nick Swisher walks with the bases loaded to force in the winning run...in **2019**, A's pitchers strike out 19 batters in a 10-2 win over Detroit to set a franchise record for strikeouts in a nine-inning game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (2-2, 3.72 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...is 1-2 with a 5.95 ERA (13 er in 19.2 ip) over his last five starts after going 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA over his first three starts...has allowed six hits or fewer in all seven starts and opponents are batting .234 (33-for-141)...the A's are 4-3 (.571) in his starting assignment this year and 19-13 (.594) over the last two years.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-1 with a 1.62 ERA (3 er in 16.2 ip) in three starts in Oakland compared to 2-1 with a 5.49 ERA (12 er in 19.2 ip) in four starts on the road...has allowed all five of his home runs on the road...is now 7-10 with a 2.74 ERA (51 er in 167.2 ip) in 32 career games in the Coliseum, 9-11 with a 4.72 ERA (107 er in 204.0 ip) in 43 games in all other ballparks...has yielded just 11 home runs in 167.2 career innings in Oakland (0.59 per nine innings).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-2 with a 4.13 ERA (11 er in 24.0 ip) in five starts during the day, 0-0 with a 2.92 ERA (4 er in 12.1 ip) in two starts at night...is now 9-3 with a 3.38 ERA (33 er in 88.0 ip) in 17 day games dating back to May 16, 2019 after going 0-9 with a 4.06 ERA over his first 17 career games during the day.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has walked just one batter to lead off an inning and opponents are hitting .243 (9-for-37) in that situation...four of the five home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...four have come with two outs.

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Took the loss on Aug. 22 against Los Angeles (AL), which was his first loss since July 24, 2019 at Houston...it snapped a career-high five-game winning streak dating back to Aug. 11, 2019...had a 3.46 ERA and .229 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 14 games, including 11 starts...walked just 15 (2.08 per nine innings) while striking out 62 (8.58 per nine innings) in 65.0 innings.

SINCE THE SURGERY: Did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 14-10 with a 3.63 ERA (92 er in 228.0 ip) and is averaging 8.37 strikeouts per nine innings (212 so in 228.0 ip) in 46 games (38 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

2020 START-BY-START: He combined with five A's relievers on a nine-hit shut-out in the A's 3-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) **July 27** in Oakland...had a no decision as he tossed four innings...allowed five of the hits and walked a batter but ended up stranding five base runners (also had a GIDP)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-2 win at Seattle **Aug. 2**...allowed a RBI single to Vogelbach in the first inning but then blanked the Mariners on two hits over his final 4.2 innings...retired 10 straight at one point...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 13-inning win over Houston **Aug. 7** in Oakland...allowed just one run, giving him one run or fewer in each of his first three starts, to become the first A's pitcher to begin the season in the starting rotation and allow one run or fewer in each of his first three starts since Gio Gonzalez in 2011 (April 3-14)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) **Aug. 12**...allowed a solo home run to Trout in the first and a La Stella RBI single and a Trout sacrifice fly in the third...had a 5-3 lead when he allowed a two-out home run to Rendon in the sixth...was relieved by Diekmann following the home run...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss at Arizona on **Aug. 17**...allowed a solo home run to Peralta in the third and two more runs in the sixth on an Escobar RBI fielders choice and a Kelly RBI single...left trailing 3-0 but the A's scored once in the seventh and twice in the eighth to get him off the hook...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on **Aug. 22** in Oakland...allowed a run to score on a fielders choice in the first inning and then allowed three runs, one earned, in the second, including a Trout two-run double.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-2 loss in the first game of a doubleheader on Aug. 29 at Houston...tossed 3.0 innings, which matched the shortest start of his career (third time, last: Sept. 13, 2019 at Texas)...allowed a three-run home run to Tucker in the first inning...the A's scored once in the fourth but he allowed a leadoff home run to Reddick in the bottom of the fourth...was relieved by Trivino with runners on first and second and no outs in the fourth.

BASSITT vs. HOUSTON: Is 2-2 with a 4.09 ERA (44.0 ip, 38 h, 22 r, 20 er, 15 bb, 31 so, 7 hr) in eight career appearances, including seven starts...is 1-2 with a 7.07 ERA (11 er in 14.0 ip) in three starts in Houston and 1-0 with a 2.70 ERA (9 er in 30.0 ip) in five games in Oakland...is 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (10.0 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 5 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year...the no decision

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 2-1 with a 3.46 ERA (13.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 7 bb, 10 so, 2 hr) in five games, including three starts, this spring...tied for fourth in the Cactus League in wins...allowed a .190 opponents batting average but issued seven walks in 13.0 innings...pitched four innings of relief July 21 at San Francisco.

2019 RECAP: Saw the most extensive action of his five-year career, going 10-5 with a 3.81 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 28 games, including 25 starts...had career highs in every category except losses as he was 4-14 in 40 games over his first four years...had career lows in opponents on-base percentage (.303) and fewest walks per nine innings (2.94)...led the A's with 141 strikeouts, which were the most by an Oakland pitcher since Sonny Gray had 169 in 2015...tied an Oakland record and tied for third in the American League with 13 hit batters...shares the record with Barry Zito, who did it three times (2001, 2005 and 2006)...went 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .179 opponents average over his first five starts through May 16 and 3-3 with a 6.00 ERA and .249 opponents average over his next nine starts leading into the All-Star Break...then went 5-1 with a 3.26 ERA in 14 games after the break...his post-break ERA was seventh lowest in the AL among pitchers with 60 or more innings...began the season with 25 starts and concluded the year with three relief appearances...held left-handed hitters to a .209 batting average, which was sixth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 140 or more innings...however, surrendered 14 of his 21 home runs and issued 29 of his 47 walks to lefties...received two runs of support or fewer in 13 of his 25 starts and went 2-5 in those games...was 8-0 in 12 starts with support of three runs or more...has received two runs of support or fewer in 40 of his 60 career starts and is 4-20 in those games...is 12-1 in 22 career starts with run support of three runs or more...was 5-1 with a 2.65 ERA in 10 starts following an A's loss...turned three double plays, which tied for third among AL pitchers...opponents were successful in 10-of-12 (83.3%) stolen base attempts off him.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (2-3, 6.06 ERA): Is 0-2 with a 16.76 ERA and .404 opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA and .175 opponents batting average over his first four starts...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's loss in the first game of the doubleheader on Aug. 29 at Houston (3.1 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...is 3-3 with a 4.63 ERA in eight career appearances, including six starts, against Houston.
LHP Mike Minor (0-5, 5.94 ERA): Was acquired from Texas on Aug. 31 with cash for two players to be named later and international slot money...pitched in relief in his A's debut on Friday against San Diego (1.0 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 hr) after going 0-5 with a 5.60 ERA in seven starts for the Rangers...including a no decision in his final start on Aug. 28 against Los Angeles-NL (6.0 ip, 4 h, 3 bb, 6 so)...is 3-4 with a 4.54 ERA in 15 career appearances, including 12 starts, against Houston.

- The A's bullpen has allowed nine runs in the last four games (15.0 ip, 5.40 ERA) to snap an Oakland record 30.0 inning scoreless streak...broke the previous mark of 29.2 from July 28-Aug. 9, 2014...it was the fifth longest streak in Athletics history and the longest since the record streak of 44.0 from Sept. 3-20, 1966.
- Has a 2.20 ERA for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (2.51)...the lowest ERA by the bullpen in Oakland history is 2.35 in 1990.
- Has the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.270), ranks second in OPS (.597) and third in slugging percentage (.327) and batting average (.210).
- Has converted 13-of-15 (86.7%) save opportunities...is tied for second in the majors in save percentage and tied for fifth in saves.
- Has the fewest losses in the majors (2), ranks second in fewest walks (45) and tied for second in fewest home runs (14).
- First batters faced are 21-for-115 (.183) with seven walks, three doubles and three home runs...has the lowest opponents on-base percentage against first batters in the majors (.228), ranks third in OPS (.514), fourth in batting average and fifth in slugging percentage (.287).
- Has allowed 11-of-45 (22.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the majors.
