OAKLAND ATHLETICS (24-14) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (21-20)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 2-2 in four games since resuming play last Friday following a positive test for Covid-19...did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games)...are now 8-8 over the last 16 games and 12-10 over the last 22 after starting the year 12-4...are 24-14 (.632) for the season, which is the fourth best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 36th consecutive day and are 4½ games ahead of second place Houston...the A's largest lead this year is five games on Aug. 9...have held at least a share of first place for 44 of 46 days this year (36 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19...snapped a season-high tying three game losing streak Saturday (also July 28-31).

LET'S PLAY TWO: The A's are scheduled to play their second of five doubleheaders today and will be the visiting team in the first game to make up for the Aug. 30 postponement at Houston...the last time Oakland played five doubleheaders in a season was in 1986...the first DH this year was on Aug. 29 at Houston and the A's were swept (2-4, 3-6)...this is the first time the A's have two doubleheaders against one team in a season since 1990 (Cleveland on July 6 and 18)...this is third twin-bill between Oakland and Houston with the A's recording a sweep on Sept. 9, 2017 in the Coliseum (11-1, 11-4)...that was the A's only doubleheader sweep over the last 22 years...have one sweep, 10 splits and have been swept seven times over that span...today begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play three doubleheaders in three cities over a seven-day span...the 10 games in seven days would be their most over a seven-day span since June 16-22, 1966 (also 10 games).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this eight-game homestand against San Diego (1-2) and Houston (1-0), which includes one game as the visiting team in the first game of the doubleheader today...the series loss to San Diego was the A's first in a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since June 14-16, 2019 against Seattle when they also lost two of three...went 14-0-2 in home series of three or more games in between...went 4-1 on the last homestand and are 15-6 (.714) in Oakland compared to 9-8 (.529) on the road...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1) and Houston (0-2)...leave following the game Thursday for an eight-game road trip to Texas (four games), Seattle (two games) and Colorado (two games)...have a 2.91 ERA (63 er in 195.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 4.46 (71 er in 143.1 ip) on the road...have allowed 15 home runs in 193.0 innings in the Coliseum (0.70 per nine innings) and 24 in 143.1 innings on the road (1.51 per nine innings...are averaging 4.29 runs per game in Oakland (90 r in 21 g), 5.35 (91 r in 17 g) on the road.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .220 (111-for-504) with 63 runs (3.9 per game) and 15 home runs (0.9 per game) over the last 16 games after hitting .230 with 118 runs (5.4 per game) and 35 home runs (1.6 per game) over the first 22 contests...are hitting .226 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...however, rank third in the majors in hit by pitches (28), tied for sixth in triples (8) and eighth in walks (155)...have been successful in 17-of-20 (85.0%) stolen bases attempts, which is the sixth best percentage in the majors...are tied for second in the majors in grand slams (3)...also rank fourth in slugging with the bases loaded (.735) and RBI (39) and fifth in extra base hits (6)...have the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.229)...have struck out 371 times, which is eighth most in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's tossed their second shutout of the season yesterday after allowing 26 runs over the previous five games (6.00 ERA)...now have a 3.56 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the majors...rank fifth in opponents OPS (.687), slugging percentage (.383) and on-base percentage (.304)...have allowed the second fewest home runs (39) and walks (107) and are tied for second in fewest hit batters (11).

STARTING PITCHING: Chris Bassitt tossed 7.0 innings yesterday to match the longest outing by an A's starting pitcher this year...the last time an A's starter pitched more than seven innings was on Sept. 20, 2019 (Fiers, 8.0)...over the last 17 games dating back to Aug. 16, Sean Manaea and Mike Fiers are a combined 6-1 with a 2.63 ERA (11 er in 37.2 ip) in seven starts while the rest of the A's starters are 2-6 with a 6.33 ERA (34 er in 48.1 ip) in 10 starts...starters have 189.0 innings pitched in 38 games, an average of 4.97 innings per start...the fewest innings per start in Oakland history is 5.09 in 2018.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed nine errors over the last 11 games and now have 19 for the season, which is seventh fewest in the

majors...are one of three teams without an error by their outfielders (Diamondbacks, Brewers) and one of two without an error by their first basemen (Astros)...have four errors by their pitchers, two by their catchers and a combined 13 from their second basemen, third basemen and shortstops...have turned just 22 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have four walk-off wins, which is tied for the most in the majors...are 5-0 in extra inning games...are tied with the Blue Jays for the most extra inning wins and tied for seventh in games...had just six extra inning wins all last year...now have a six-game winning streak in extra inning games dating back to Sept. 18, 2019, which is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight...are 7-2 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for the third most last at bat wins in the majors...have 12 come-from-behind wins, which is tied for fifth...lead the majors in wins when trailing after six innings (5), are tied for the lead when trailing after eight (2) and four (9), rank second when trailing after five (7) and tied for second when trailing after seven (3).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 16-14 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied for eighth most in the majors but the eight games are tied for fifth fewest...Oakland is one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox, 13-0).

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 6-6 (.500) in interleague play compared to 18-8 (.692) against the American League...are 22-7 when homering, 2-7 when going homerless...are 11-7 (.611) in day games and are tied with the Angels for the most day games in the majors...went 19-8 (.704) in the month of August, which was the third best record in the majors (Dodgers and Rays, 21-7) and the seventh best August in Oakland history...the wins were the A's most in August since going 21-6 in 2006 and their most in any month since going 19-8 in Sept. 2013

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's lead the season series 4-2...are 4-0 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...won the first game of this five-game series last night...this is the A's first series of five or more game since Aug. 15-18, 1996 vs. Baltimore in Oakland (went 2-3)...it is the 17th series of five or more games in Oakland history...have won 10 of their last 16 games from Houston, including seven of the last eight in Oakland...lost the season series last year for the fifth consecutive season as they went 8-11...the eight wins were the A's most against the Astros since 2015 (9-10)...went 4-5 in Oakland and 4-6 in Houston...are 41-60 (.406) against Houston over the last six years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 72-73 all-time, including 39-34 in Oakland and 33-39 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha has a .399 on-base percentage, which ranks sixth among players in the West divisions...has a .397 on-base percentage over the last two years, which is eighth best in the majors...**Jake Diekman** not allowed a run in his 14 appearances (14.0 ip) and now has a career-high 17.2-inning scoreless streak...his 14.0 innings pitched are the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed...**Robbie Grossman** ranks fifth among players in the West divisions in on-base percentage (.400), tied for fifth in doubles (11), triples (2) and hit by pitches (5) and ninth in OPS (.929)...**Liam Hendriks** has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career...is tied for second in the majors in saves (10)...**J.B. Wendelken** has a 10.0-inning scoreless streak...has pitched 78.2 innings in his career and this is his third scoreless streak of 10 or more innings...has two 17.2-inning scoreless streaks.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1916** switch hitter Wally Schang becomes the first American Leaguer to homer from both sides of the plate in the same game...in **1965** Bert Campaneris plays all nine positions in a game against the Angels...the A's lose in 13 innings, 5-3...in **1978** Mike Edwards sets an Oakland record by scoring five runs in the A's 11-4 win at Texas...in **1984** Carney Lansford collects four hits in the A's 9-5 win at Cleveland, including the 1000th hit of his career off Steve Farr...in **1992** Carney Lansford is 5 for 6 with five RBI in the A's 14-2 win at California...in **2002** Barry Zito wins his 20th game as he combines with Jim Mecir and Ricardo Rincon on a three-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Minnesota...Zito would go on to win 23 games and the AL Cy Young.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (2-3, 6.06 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...is 0-2 with a 16.76 ERA (18 er in 9.2 ip) and .404 (19-for-47) opponents batting average in three starts since missing his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness...has tossed fewer than five innings in all three starts...the two-game losing streak matches his career high and it marks the first time he has lost back-to-back decisions since July 29-Aug. 30, 2018...was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA and .175 opponents batting average over his first four starts...allowed no home runs over his first four starts (23.0 ip) and has four over his last three (9.2 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .206 (13-for-63) batting average and .599 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .313 (20-for-64) with a .900 OPS against left-handers...has issued 12 of his 18 walks to lefties...opponents are hitting .194 (13-for-67) with the bases empty. .333 (20-for-60) with three of his four home runs with runners on...has allowed a .157 (11-for-70) average with two strikes and opponents are hitting .170 in that situation in his career...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number eight hitter (0-for-10).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-1 with a 3.05 ERA (7 er in 20.2 ip) and .224 (17-for-76) opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 11.25 ERA (15 er in 12.0 ip) and .314 (16-for-51) opponents average in three starts on the road...has allowed one home run in 20.2 innings in Oakland, three in 12.0 innings on the road.

THE AMERICAN LEAGUE WEST AND THE REST: Was the losing pitcher in his last start on Aug. 29 at Houston, which snapped a seven-game winning streak against American League West competition...it was his first loss against a divisional foe since April 5, 2019 at Houston...is now 2-1 with a 3.81 ERA (11 er in 26.0 ip) in five starts against AL West teams compared to 0-2 with a 14.85 ERA (11 er in 6.2 ip) in two starts against the NL West...is 9-4 with a 3.76 ERA (49 er in 117.1 ip) in 30 games against the AL West in his career, compared to 8-8 with a 4.52 ERA (62 er in 123.1 ip) in 36 career games against non AL West teams...is 2-3 with a 6.75 ERA (24 er in 32.0 ip) in nine career inter-league appearances, including six starts.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in six of his seven starts...received 10 of his 19 runs of support this year in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle...over the last two years, he has received two runs of support or fewer in 13 of his 23 starts and seven runs or more seven times...in his career, he is 11-1 in 14 starts when three runs of support or more.

THIS AND THAT: Has a 8.69 ERA (19 er in 19.2 ip) over the first three innings of a game, 2.08 (3 er in 13.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...opponents are hitting .301 (25-for-83) with all four of his home runs and 13 of his 18 walks over the first three innings, .182 (8-for-44) after that...is 2-1 with a 2.66 ERA (7 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts on four days rest compared to 0-2 with a 15.00 ERA (15 er in 9.0 ip) in three starts on five days rest or more...was named American League Player of the Week for the week of Aug. 3-9 after going 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA in two starts...struck out 14, walked four and allowed six hits in 14.0 innings...it was his first career Player of the Week honor...is 16-9 with a 3.35 ERA (72 er in 193.2 ip) in 36 games, 34 starts, over the last three years after going 1-3 with a 6.32 ERA in 30 games, two starts, over his first two seasons...the A's are 4-3 (.571) in his starting assignments this year and 23-11 (.676) in his career.

2020 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-3, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) on Opening Day, **July 24** in Oakland...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the A's 13th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 15 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers)...was just the second foreign-born Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Ariel Prieto, April 2, 1997)...scattered two hits, a walk and hit a batter over the first three innings before allowing his only run in the fourth inning on a Goodwin RBI single...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Colorado **July 29** in Oakland...it was his first loss since April 29, 2019 at Boston and it snapped a five-game winning streak dating back to May 17, 2019...allowed a RBI single to Wolters in the second inning and a sacrifice fly to Hampson in the fourth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-1 victory at Seattle on **Aug. 3**...allowed a RBI double to Seager in the third inning but that would be the only run he would allow in seven innings of work...won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-1 win over Houston **Aug. 8** in Oakland...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits, his fewest hits allowed in a start of more than four innings in his career...retired the first four batters, allowed a double to Gurriel in the fourth, retired the next eight batters, allowed a single to Gurriel in the fifth and then retired the final nine batters...was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss at Arizona on **Aug. 18**...allowed a career-high nine runs on six hits and four walks in 1.2 innings...it was the shortest start of his career...allowed five runs in the first inning, including a three-run home run by Ahmed, and four more in the second...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) **Aug. 23** in Oakland...allowed a three-run home run to

Ohtani in the third and a RBI single to Goodwin in the fifth...left trailing 4-2 but Oakland scored twice in the sixth to get him off the hook.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss at Houston on Aug. 29 in the second game of a doubleheader...allowed a bases loaded triple to Tucker in the first inning and a two-run home run to Springer in the second...retired seven of the final eight batters he faced before he was relieved by Wendelken with one out and a runner on first in the fourth.

MONTAS vs. HOUSTON: Is 3-3 with a 4.63 ERA (35.0 ip, 37 h, 20 r, 18 er, 14 bb, 26 so, 4 hr) in eight career appearances, including six starts...is 1-2 with a 5.87 ERA (10 er in 15.1 ip) in four games at Minute Maid Park and 2-1 with a 3.66 ERA (8 er in 19.2 ip) in four games in the Coliseum...is 1-1 with a 4.35 ERA (10.1 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 10 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year...the win came in a 3-1 A's victory in Oakland on Aug. 8...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits, his fewest hits allowed in a start of more than four innings in his career...retired the first four batters, allowed a double to Gurriel in the fourth, retired the next eight batters, allowed a single to Gurriel in the fifth and then retired the final nine batters...then took the loss in a 6-3 decision at Houston in the second game of the Aug. 29 doubleheader (see last start).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-0 and did not allow an earned run in three starts (5.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...opponents went 4-for-22 (.182) and he walked just one batter in 5.2 innings...his final outing came on Mar. 8 against Milwaukee in Mesa...is now 3-0 with a 0.42 ERA in eight games, five starts, over the last two springs

2019 RECAP: Went 9-2 with a 2.63 ERA in 16 starts in a season shortened due to an 80-game suspension for violating Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...his ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.230), on-base percentage (.282) and OPS (.646)...had career highs in wins, starts, strikeouts (103), innings (96.0), hits (84), runs (35), walks (23) and hit batters (4) and matched his high in earned runs (28) and wild pitches (4)...averaged 2.16 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.48 was a career high...surrendered eight home runs (0.75 per nine innings)...his 2.63 ERA was third lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 90 innings...using the same minimum, he ranked fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings, fifth in opponents OPS, sixth in slugging percentage (.364), ninth in on-base percentage and 10th in strikeout-to-walk ratio...averaged 9.66 strikeouts per nine innings, which was second highest in Oakland history (Gio Gonzalez, 9.94 in 2009) and third highest in Athletics history (Wes Stock, 9.77 in 1964) among pitchers with 90 or more innings...his 4.48 strikeout-to-walk ratio was fourth highest in Oakland history...had a .229 opponents batting average and .647 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .231 (46-for-199) with a .645 OPS against left-handers.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Minor (0-5, 5.94 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth appearance and eighth start of the season...it will be his second appearance and first start with the A's... was acquired from Texas on Aug. 31 with cash for two players to be named later and international slot money...pitched in relief in his A's debut on Friday against San Diego (1.0 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 hr) after going 0-5 with a 5.60 ERA in seven starts for the Rangers...Texas was 2-5 (.286) in games in which he started.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for third in the majors in losses (5) and tied for ninth in most home runs (9)...has a 5.94 ERA, which is sixth highest in the majors among pitchers with 35 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he has the third lowest run support (2.72)...has received two runs of support or fewer in six of his seven starts and just 11 runs of support total.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has started his season 0-5 for the first time in his career...the five-game losing streak is tied for the longest in the majors this year and is one short of his career high of six (Sept. 6, 2013 to May 7, 2014).

BALLPARKS: Was 0-2 with a 3.38 ERA (7 er in 18.2 ip) in four starts at home for Texas...is 0-3 with an 8.66 ERA (17 er in 17.2 ip) in four games in all other ballparks...allowed two home runs in 18.2 innings at Globe Life Field and has seven in 17.2 innings in all other parks...is 0-1 with a 10.50 ERA (7 er in 6.0 ip) and three home runs allowed in 6.0 innings over two games in the Coliseum...is 1-4 with a 6.93 ERA (19 er in 24.2 ip) in seven career appearances, including four starts, in Oakland.
