## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-15) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (22-21)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Split the doubleheader yesterday and are now 3-3 in six games since resuming play last Friday following a positive test for Covid-19...did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games)...are 9-9 over the last 18 games and 13-11 over the last 24 after starting the year 12-4...are 25-15 (.625) for the season, which is the second best record in the American League (Rays, 28-15) and third best in the majors (Dodgers, 31-12)...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 37th consecutive day and are 4½ games ahead of second place Houston...the A's largest lead this year is five games on Aug. 9...have not led by more than five games since June 29, 2014 when they led by 5½ games...have held at least a share of first place for 45 of 47 days this year (37 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19.

**OFFENSE:** The A's hit .194 in seven games in July, .231 in 27 games in August and are currently batting .255 (47-for-184) in six games in September...are hitting .228 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...however, are tied for third in the majors in hit by pitches (28), tied for sixth in triples (8) and rank eighth in walks (160)...have been successful in 17-of-20 (85.0%) stolen bases attempts, which is the sixth best percentage in the majors...are tied for second in the majors in grand slams (3)...also rank fourth in slugging with the bases loaded (.714) and RBI (39) and fifth in extra base hits (6)...have the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.227), the third lowest batting average by designated hitters (.173) and the fourth lowest batting average by pinch hitters (.111)...have struck out 384 times, which is eighth most in the majors.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 3.16 ERA (47 er in 134.0 ip) over the last 16 games and now have a 3.58 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the majors...rank fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.383) and on-base percentage (.304) and sixth in OPS (.687)...have allowed the fewest home runs (40), issued the second fewest walks (113) and have hit the second fewest batters (12)...have the fifth fewest strikeouts (327).

**STARTING PITCHING:** Over the last 17 games dating back to Aug. 16, Sean Manaea and Mike Fiers are a combined 6-1 with a 2.63 ERA (11 er in 37.2 ip) in seven starts while the rest of the A's starters are 3-6 with a 6.35 ERA (40 er in 56.2 ip) in 12 starts...starters have 197.1 innings pitched in 40 games, an average of 4.93 innings per start...the fewest innings per start in Oakland history is 5.09 in 2018.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 10 errors over the last 13 games but have just 20 for the season, which is tied for sixth fewest in the majors...are one of three teams without an error by their outfielders (Diamondbacks, Brewers) and one of two without an error by their first basemen (Astros)...have four errors by their pitchers, two by their catchers and a combined 14 from their second basemen, third basemen and shortstops...have turned just 23 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-3 on this eight-game homestand against San Diego (1-2) and Houston (2-1), which includes a win as the visiting team in the first game of the doubleheader yesterday...went 4-1 on the last homestand and are 16-7 (.696) in Oakland compared to 9-8 (.529) on the road...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1) and Houston (0-2)...leave following the game tomorrow for an eight-game road trip to Texas (four games), Seattle (two games) and Colorado (two games)...have a 2.97 ERA (69 er in 209.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 4.46 (71 er in 143.1 ip) on the road...have allowed 16 home runs in 209.0 innings in the Coliseum (0.69 per nine innings) and 24 in 143.1 innings on the road (1.51 per nine innings)...are averaging 4.26 runs per game in Oakland (98 r in 23 g), 5.35 (91 r in 17 g) on the road.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's have four walk-off wins, which is tied for the most in the majors...are 5-0 in extra inning games...are tied with the Blue Jays for the most extra inning wins and tied for seventh in games...had just six extra inning wins all last year...now have a six-game winning streak in extra inning games dating back to Sept. 18, 2019, which is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight...are 7-3 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for the third most last at bat wins in the majors...have 12 come-from-behind wins, which is tied for fifth...lead the majors in wins when trailing after four innings (9), are tied for

the lead when trailing after eight (2) and six (5), rank second when trailing after five (7) and tied for third when trailing after seven (3).

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 8-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 17-15 when they start a right-hander...are one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox, 13-0)...have not faced a left-handed starter since Aug. 26 at Texas (Allard) and the eight games against lefties are tied for fifth fewest in the majors...have faced just one left-handed starter over the last 13 games and three over the last 25...have just 20 plate appearances against left-handed pitchers over the last eight games (2-for-17, three walks) and are 4-for-46 (.087) against southpaws over the last 10 games.

**WINS AND LOSSES:** The A's are 19-9 (.679) against the American League West and 6-6 (.500) against the National League West...are 23-8 when homering, 2-7 when going homerless...have played two doubleheaders this year and are 1-3 in seven inning games...are 12-8 (.600) in day games and have the most day games in the majors...went 19-8 (.704) in the month of August, which was the third best record in the majors (Dodgers and Rays, 21-7) and the seventh best August in Oakland history...the wins were the A's most in August since going 21-6 in 2006 and their most in any month since going 19-8 in Sept. 2013.

**SCHEDULE NOTES:** The doubleheader yesterday began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play three doubleheaders in three cities over a seven-day span...the 10 games in seven days would be their most over a seven-day span since June 16-22, 1966 (also 10 games)...are scheduled to play five doubleheaders, which would be their most in a season since 1986...the game last Friday began a season-ending stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 26 games over the final 24 days, which would be their most games over a 24-day stretch since July 21-Aug. 13, 1978 when they had 27 games in 24 days...it also began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 16 games over 13 days through Sept. 16, which would be their most games over a 13-day stretch since July 18-30, 1975 (also 16 in 13)...are scheduled to play four games in three different cities in three different time zones over a three-day span from Sept. 13-15.

**A's vs. ASTROS:** The A's lead the season series 5-3 and need to win one of the remaining two games to win their first season series against the Astros since 2014 (11-8)...are 5-1 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...the five wins in Oakland are the A's most since 2015 (5-5)...have won two of the first three games of this five-game series...it is the A's first series of five or more game since Aug. 15-18, 1996 vs. Baltimore in Oakland (went 2-3)...it is the 17th series of five or more games in Oakland history...have won 11 of their last 18 games from Houston, including eight of the last 10 in Oakland...lost the season series last year for the fifth consecutive season as they went 8-11...the eight wins were the A's most against the Astros since 2015 (9-10)...went 4-5 in Oakland and 4-6 in Houston...are 42-61 (.408) against Houston over the last six years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 73-74 all-time, including 40-35 in Oakland and 33-39 in Houston.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Jake Diekman** has not allowed a run in his 15 appearances (15.0 ip) and now has a career-high 18.2-inning scoreless streak...his 15.0 innings pitched are the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed...**Liam Hendriks** has converted each of his last 11 save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career...ranks second in the majors in saves (11) and leads relievers in the West divisions in strikeouts (27)...**Tommy La Stella** has struck out just once in 29 plate appearances with the A's and is averaging 18.25 strikeouts per plate appearance for the season...that is the best mark in the majors by more than six plate appearances (Arenado, COL 12.14).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1945** Dick Fowler no-hits the St. Louis Browns, 1-0...in **1958** Preston Ward hits three consecutive home runs in Kansas City's 8-6 win against Baltimore...in **1985** Jose Canseco hits his first major league home run off the Rangers Jeff Russell in the A's 3-1 loss to Texas...in **1988** Luis Polonia becomes the third player in Oakland history to score five runs in a game in the A's 14-6 win at Kansas City...he is a perfect 5 for 5 on the day and also drives in three runs...in **1990** the A's defeat the New York Yankees 7-3 to complete a sweep of the season series, 12-0...in **1995** Stan Javier ties an Oakland record with a pair of triples in the A's 8-2 win at Chicago.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesús Luzardo (2-2, 4.23 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his ninth appearance and seventh start of the season...is 1-2 with a 5.57 ERA (13 er in 21.0 ip) and .302 (26-for-86) opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 1-0 with a 2.60 ERA and .217 opponents batting average over his first four games... ranks second among Major League rookies with 38 strikeouts (Webb, SF 39) and is sixth with 38.1 innings pitched...the A's are 4-2 (.667) in his starting assignments.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-1 with a 2.86 ERA (9 er in 28.1 ip) in six games, four starts, at home compared to 0-1 with an 8.10 ERA (9 er in 10.0 ip) in two starts on the road...has allowed one home run in 28.1 innings at home, three in 10.0 innings on the road...is now 2-1 with a 2.76 ERA (9 er in 29.1 ip) in seven career appearances in the Coliseum, 0-1 with a 4.71 ERA (11 er in 21.0 ip) in seven games on the road.

**AMERICAN LEAGUE AND NATIONAL LEAGUE:** Is 1-1 with a 2.21 ERA (5 er in 20.1 ip) in four games against American League teams compared to 1-1 with a 6.50 ERA (13 er in 18.0 ip) in four games against National League teams... the four interleague games are the first of his career and he is 1-1 with a 1.93 ERA (7 er in 32.1 ip) in 10 career games against the AL.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received no run support in three of his six starts...his season RSA of 3.05 is fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 35 or more innings...is 0-2 in four starts with two runs of support or fewer, 2-0 in two starts with three runs of support or more.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed all four of his home runs and issued 12 of his 13 walks to right-handed hitters...has allowed all five of his career home runs and has 14 of his 16 walks against righties...opponents are hitting .342 (13-for-38) with three walks when leading off an inning...has allowed a .321 (9-for-28) average with runners in scoring position, including .462 (6-for-13) with RISP and two outs.

**2020 OUTING-BY-OUTING:** Made his first two appearances of the season in relief (4.05 ERA) and is 2-2 with a 4.26 ERA (15 er in 31.2 ip) in six starts since then...entered the game in the sixth inning in his first outing on **July 25** against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in the A's 4-1 loss...pitched in relief again **July 29** against Colorado in Oakland in a 5-1 A's loss...struck out a five in 3.2 innings and matched his career high in walks (2)...allowed a run in the eighth inning to snap a career-high 12.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2019...had a no decision in his first Major League start, a 5-1 A's win over Texas on **Aug. 4** in Oakland... at the age of 22 years and 309 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to start a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010... tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and matched his high with two walks...recorded his first Major League win in the A's 7-2 victory over Houston on **Aug. 9** in Oakland...at the age of 22 years and 314 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to win a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...allowed a two-run home run to Gurriel in 5.2 innings of work...had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning win at San Francisco **Aug. 14**...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high nine hits in 3.1 innings...walked a career-high tying two and allowed two home runs in a game for the first time in his career...yielded a solo home run to Longoria in the first and a three-run home run to Pence in the third...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win over Arizona on **Aug. 19** in Oakland...struck out a career-high seven in 6.1 scoreless innings...matched his high with two walks...scattered four hits and allowed just two base runners to advance into scoring position... was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 3-2 loss at Texas on **Aug. 24**...struck out a career-high tying seven in a career-high 6.2 innings... had a career-high 96 pitches and walked a career-high tying two for the sixth consecutive game...allowed a two-run single to Frazier in the bottom of the first and a solo home run to Kiner-Falefa in the bottom of the second but then retired 15 of the final 20 batters he faced without allowing a run.

**LAST START:** He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-0 loss to San Diego on Friday in Oakland...retired 12 of the first 13 batters he faced, allowing just a two-out single to Grisham in the third...then allowed four runs in the fifth inning on a two-run double by Grisham, a RBI double by Tatis and a RBI single by Hosmer...was relieved by Wendelken with runners on first and second and one out in the fifth inning with the A's trailing 4-0.

**LUZARDO vs. HOUSTON:** Is 1-0 with a 3.12 ERA (8.2 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 7 so, 2 hr) in two career appearances, one start...the start and win came in his only outing this year, a 7-2 A's win in Oakland on Aug. 9...it was his first Major League win and, at the age of 22 years and 314 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to win a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...blanked the Astros on two hits over the first three innings before allowing a two-run home run to Gurriel in the fourth...those were the only runs he would allow in 5.2 innings...his other outing came in relief in his Major League debut on Sept. 11, 2019 at Houston in a 5-3 A's win (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 2 so)...allowed a solo home run to Maldonado in the sixth inning but then retired each of the final seven batters that he faced.

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Was 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA and .143 opponents batting average in three starts this spring (8.1 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 13 so)...struck out 13 batters and walked just one in 8.1 innings...did not pitch in either of the two July exhibition games against San Francisco.

**2019 RECAP:** Had his season interrupted twice by a strained left shoulder but, after going 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games (nine starts) with three minor league teams, he was selected by Oakland on Sept. 9 after Las Vegas concluded its season...had no decisions, two saves, a 1.50 ERA and .119 opponents batting average in six relief appearances in his Major League debut...struck out 16 batters in 12.0 innings (12.00 per nine innings) and walked just three for a .196 on-base percentage...allowed two doubles and one home run for a .238 slugging percentage...left-handed hitters were 1-for-14 (.071) with no extra base hits, one walk and a .205 OPS...right-handed hitters batted .143 (4-for-28) with a .547 OPS...opponents hit .138 with his lone home run with the bases empty, .077 with runners on...they were 1-for-8 (.125) with runners in scoring position... allowed a .095 average with two strikes...did not inherit any runners and first batters faced were 1-for-5 (.200) with a walk.

**2019 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP:** Was a non-roster invitee with the A's during the spring and had a 0.93 ERA in four games before he was shut down with a supraspinatus muscle strain...was assigned to Single-A Stockton June 11 and appeared in two games with the Ports and three with Las Vegas before going on the injured list July 4...made one rehab start with the AZL A's Green before he was reinstated from the IL Aug. 10 and sent to Stockton...moved back to Las Vegas Aug. 15...combined to strike out 57 batters in 43.0 minor league innings (11.93 per nine innings)...walked just eight (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.13...his opponents batting average broke down to .132 (5-for-38) against left-handed hitters compared to .248 (31-for-125) with all four of his home runs against right-handers...had a .379 OPS against lefties, .675 against righties...all four of the home runs were solo shots... yielded a .132 average with runners in scoring position...tossed fewer than five innings in nine of his 11 appearances, but logged at least two innings each time...surrendered one run or fewer eight times...had more strikeouts than innings pitched seven times.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
<b>LHP Sean Manaea (3-2, 5.09 ERA):</b> Is scheduled to make his team-leading ninth start of the season...is 3-0 with a 2.21 ERA and .237 opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA and .364 opponents average over his first four starts...has not walked a batter in four of his seven starts and has issued just six free passes in 35.1 innings...his average of 1.53 walks per nine innings is ninth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 35 or more innings...has a 2.66 ERA and .244 opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 10.03 ERA and .375 opponents average from the fourth inning on...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-4 A's win over San Diego on Saturday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 2-5 with a 3.48 ERA (64.2 ip, 62 h, 29 r, 25 er, 21 bb, 58 so, 7 hr) in 12 career starts against Houston...has not faced the Astros since Aug. 19, 2018, a 9-4 A's loss in Oakland (4.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 0 bb, 5 so).

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 1.62 ERA (9 er in 50.0 ip) over the last 15 games...now has a 2.09 ERA for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors by nearly half a run (Dodgers, 2.55)...the lowest ERA by the bullpen in Oakland history is 2.35 in 1990.
- Has the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.269), ranks second in OPS (.591) and slugging percentage (.321) and third in batting average (.208).
- Has converted 14-of-16 (87.5%) save opportunities...ranks second in the majors in save percentage and tied for third in saves.
- Has the fewest losses in the majors (3) and ranks second in fewest walks (49) and fewest home runs (14).
- First batters faced are 22-for-122 (.180) with eight walks, four doubles and three home runs...has the lowest opponents on-base percentage against first batters in the majors (.229), ranks third in OPS (.516) and batting average and fifth in slugging percentage (.287).
