ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the first four games of this five-game series...this is the 15th five-game series in Oakland history (also had two six-game series)...have never swept a five-game series but have won four games three times, most recently on July 5-8, 1984 at Milwaukee...are 4-3 in seven games since resuming play last Friday following a positive test for Covid-19...did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games)...are 10-9 over the last 19 games and 14-11 over the last 25 after starting the year 12-4...are 26-15 (.634) for the season, which is the second best record in the American League (Rays, 28-15) and third best in the majors (Dodgers, 32-12)...the 11 games over .500 are one short of the season high of 12 (22-10 on Aug. 26)...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 38th consecutive day and are a season-high 5½ games ahead of second place Houston...that is the A's largest lead in the AL West since June 29, 2014 when they also led by 5½ games...have not led by 6½ games since Sept. 25, 2013...have held at least a share of first place for 46 of 48 days this year (38 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third).

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their Major League leading fifth walk-off win of the season last night...are 5-0 in extra inning games and are tied with the Blue Jays and Dodgers for the most extra inning wins...had just six extra inning wins all last year...now have a six-game winning streak in extra inning games dating back to Sept. 18, 2019, which is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight...are 8-3 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for the second most last at bat wins in the majors (Rays, 9)...have 13 come-from-behind wins, which is fifth most...lead the majors in wins when trailing after six innings (6), are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight (2), five (8) and four innings (10) and tied for third in wins trailing after seven (3).

OFFENSE: The A's hit .194 in seven games in July, .231 in 27 games in August and are currently batting .242 (52-for-215) in seven games in September...are hitting .227 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...however, are tied for third in the majors in hit by pitches (29), tied for sixth in triples (8) and rank eighth in walks (167)...have been successful in 17-of-20 (85.0%) stolen bases attempts, which is the sixth best percentage in the majors...are tied for second in the majors in grand slams (3)...also rank fifth in slugging (.714), RBI (39) and extra base hits (6) with the bases loaded...have the lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.224), the third lowest batting average by designated hitters (.181) and the fourth lowest batting average by pinch hitters (.111)...have struck out 391 times, which is eighth most in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.08 ERA (49 er in 143.0 ip) over the last 17 games and now have a 3.54 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the majors...rank fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.301) and fifth in OPS (.683) and slugging percentage (.382)...are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (42), have issued the second fewest walks (114) and have hit the second fewest batters (12)...have the fifth fewest strikeouts (336)...A's starting pitchers have 204.1 innings pitched in 41 games, an average of 4.98 innings per start...the fewest innings per start in Oakland history is 5.09 in 2018.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 10 errors over the last 14 games but have just 20 for the season, which is tied for fifth fewest in the majors...are one of three teams without an error by their outfielders (Diamondbacks, Brewers) and one of two without an error by their first basemen (Astros)...have four errors by their pitchers, two by their catchers and a combined 14 from their second basemen, third basemen and shortstops...have turned just 23 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-3 on this eight-game homestand against San Diego (1-2) and Houston (3-1), which includes a win as the visiting team in the first game of the doubleheader Tuesday...went 4-1 on the last homestand and are 17-7 (.708) in Oakland compared to 9-8 (.529) on the road...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1) and Houston (0-2)...leave following the game today for an eight-game road trip to Texas (four games), Seattle (two games) and Colorado (two games)...have a 2.93 ERA (71 er in 218.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 4.46 (71 er in 143.1 ip) on the road...have allowed

18 home runs in 218.0 innings in the Coliseum (0.74 per nine innings) and 24 in 143.1 innings on the road (1.51 per nine innings)...are averaging 4.21 runs per game in Oakland (101 r in 24 g), 5.35 (91 r in 17 g) on the road.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 18-15 when they start a right-hander...are one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox, 13-0)...have not faced a left-handed starter since Aug. 26 at Texas (Allard) and the eight games against lefties are tied for fifth fewest in the majors...have faced just one left-handed starter over the last 14 games and three over the last 26...have just 22 plate appearances against left-handed pitchers over the last eight games (2-for-19, three walks) and are 4-for-48 (.083) against southpaws over the last 11 games.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 12-8 (.600) in day games and have the most day games in the majors...are 20-9 (.689) against the American League West and 6-6 (.500) against the National League West...are 23-8 when homering, 3-7 when going homerless...have played two doubleheaders this year and are 1-3 in seven inning games...went 19-8 (.704) in the month of August, which was the third best record in the majors (Dodgers and Rays, 21-7) and the seventh best August in Oakland history...the wins were the A's most in August since going 21-6 in 2006 and their most in any month since going 19-8 in Sept. 2013.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The doubleheader on Tuesday began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play three doubleheaders in three cities over a seven-day span...the 10 games in seven days would be their most over a seven-day span since June 16-22, 1966 (also 10 games)...are scheduled to play five doubleheaders, which would be their most in a season since 1986...the game last Friday began a season-ending stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 26 games over the final 24 days, which would be their most games over a 24-day stretch since July 21-Aug. 13, 1978 when they had 27 games in 24 days...it also began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 16 games over 13 days through Sept. 16, which would be their most games over a 13-day stretch since July 18-30, 1975 (also 16 in 13)...are scheduled to play four games in three different cities in three different time zones over a three-day span from Sept. 13-15.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's have won the season series for the first time since 2014 as they are 6-3 with one game remaining...went 11-8 in 2014...are 6-1 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...the six wins in Oakland are the A's most since 2014 (6-3)...their most is seven in 2013...have won 12 of the last 17 games, including nine of the last 11 in Oakland...lost the season series last year for the fifth consecutive season as they went 8-11...the eight wins were the A's most against the Astros since 2015 (9-10)...are 43-61 (.413) against Houston over the last six years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 74-74 all-time, including 41-35 in Oakland and 33-39 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jake Diekman has not allowed a run in his 15 appearances (15.0 ip) and now has a career-high 18.2-inning scoreless streak...his 15.0 innings pitched are the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed...**Liam Hendriks** has converted each of his last 11 save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career...ranks second in the majors in saves (11) and leads relievers in the West divisions in strikeouts (29)...**Tommy La Stella** has struck out just once in 34 plate appearances with the A's and is averaging 18.88 strikeouts per plate appearance for the season...that is the best mark in the majors by more than six plate appearances (Arenado, COL 12.43)

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1948** Barney McCosky collects seven hits in a doubleheader sweep at Washington...he goes 4-for-4 in a 9-6 win in game one and collects three hits in four at bats in a 3-0 win in the night cap...in **1961** Dick Howser is a perfect 5-for-5 in the A's 13-1 win over Minnesota in the first game of a doubleheader...In **1976** Vida Blue strikes out Danny Thompson of Texas for his 1140th as an Athletic, breaking Catfish Hunter's Oakland record...he would go on to strike out 1315 batters in his A's career which is still an Oakland record...in **2019** the A's set an Oakland record for total bases in a game (46) and tie the record for hits in a nine-inning game (25) in a 21-7 win at Houston.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (3-2, 5.09 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his team-leading ninth start of the season...is 3-0 with a 2.21 ERA (5 er in 20.1 ip) and .237 (18-for-76) opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA and .364 opponents average over his first four starts...has not walked a batter in four of his seven starts and has issued just six free passes in 35.1 innings...his average of 1.53 walks per nine innings is sixth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 35 or more innings...has walked just 45 batters in 225.2 innings over the last three years (1.79 per nine innings).

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Has allowed seven runs over the first three innings of his starts this year (23.2 ip, 2.66 ERA) and 18 from the fourth inning on (13 er in 11.2 ip, 10.03 ERA)...opponents are 21-for-86 (.244) over innings one through three and 21-for-56 (.375) from the fourth inning on...in 13 starts over the last two seasons, he has a 1.63 ERA (7 er in 38.2 ip) and .209 (28-for-134) opponents batting average over innings 1-3 and a 5.81 ERA (17 er in 26.1 ip) and .278 (30-for-108) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are hitting .250 (23-for-92) with the bases empty compared to .380 (19-for-50) with runners on...they are 12-for-30 (.400) with runners in scoring position after going 0-for-15 with RISP last year...has a .225 (16-for-71) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .366 (26-for-71) after that...has allowed four home runs, three of which are solo shots...six of the seven home runs he allowed over the last two years have come with the bases empty

AMERICAN LEAGUE AND NATIONAL LEAGUE: Is 2-0 with a 2.35 ERA (4 er in 15.1 ip) in three interleague starts compared to 1-2 with a 7.20 ERA (19 er in 30.1 ip) in five starts against the American League...however, is 5-7 with a 3.96 ERA (40 er in 91.0 ip) in 17 career starts against the National League compared to 33-23 with a 3.84 ERA (187 er in 438.0 ip) in 77 games against the American League.

2020 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) **July 25** in Oakland...it was his first loss since Aug. 19, 2018 against Houston and it snapped a career-high tying five-game winning streak...allowed an Upton homer with two outs in the fourth and three more runs in the fifth on a Simmons RBI double and a Fletcher two-run double...he dropped his second consecutive decision in the A's 5-3 loss at Seattle **July 31**...retired each of the first nine batters before allowing three runs (two earned) in the fourth inning on a Seager two-run double and an error...had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over Texas on **Aug. 5** in Oakland...allowed a first pitch home run to Choo to start the game but then retired nine of the next 11 hitters...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed three runs in the fourth...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 10-9 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **Aug. 10**...tossed 2.2 innings, which was his shortest outing since Aug. 7, 2018 against the Dodgers when he also pitched 2.2 innings...allowed a three-run home run to Rendon in the first and a RBI single to Upton in the bottom of the third...had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 7-6 win at San Francisco **Aug. 15**...retired eight of the first nine batters before allowing three runs in the fourth inning on a Slater walk, a Solano single and a Yas-trzsmki triple and error...then retired each of the final six batters he faced...picked up his first win of the season in the A's 5-1 victory over Arizona **Aug. 20** in Oakland...blanked the Diamondbacks on three hits over the first four innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Escobar in the fifth...won his second consecutive start in the A's 10-3 win at Texas on **Aug. 25**...allowed a run in the second inning on a Kiner-Falefa RBI single but the A's scored once in the third, twice in the fourth and two more times in the fifth to give him a 5-1 lead...allowed two unearned runs in the bottom of the fifth and left after five innings with a 5-3 lead.

LAST START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 8-4 win over San Diego last Saturday in Oakland...allowed just one earned for the third consecutive start...had a 4-0 lead when Hosmer grounded into a force out with the bases loaded in the third inning...retired eight of the final nine batters he faced and was relieved by Petit to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 4-1.

MANAEA vs. HOUSTON: Is 2-5 with a 3.48 ERA (64.2 ip, 62 h, 29 r, 25 er, 21 bb, 58 so, 7 hr) in 12 career starts...has received no run support in four of those starts and two runs or fewer eight times...is 0-3 with a 5.12 ERA (18 er in 31.2 ip) in six starts in Oakland, 2-2 with a 1.91 ERA (7 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts in Houston...has not faced the Astros since Aug. 19, 2018, a 9-4 A's loss in Oakland...the A's scored twice in the first but he allowed four runs in the third inning on a Bregman RBI single and a Gurriel three-run home run...the A's tied the game with two runs in the bottom of the third but he allowed a solo home run to Gattis in the fourth and a RBI single to Springer in the fifth...allowed six runs in 4.0 innings.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-2 with a 10.66 ERA (12.2 ip, 18 h, 15 r, 15 er, 0 bb, 14 so, 3 hr) in four games this spring, all starts...led the A's and tied for eighth in the Cactus League in strikeouts (14)...did not walk a batter in 12.2 innings...allowed a .321 (18-for-56) opponents batting average...yielded at least two runs in each of his assignments...made one start in July on the 20th vs. San Francisco (5.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 so).

2019 RECAP: Began the season on the 60-day injured list as he continued his recovery from Sept. 19, 2018 surgery on his left shoulder...went 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts before he was reinstated from the IL Sept. 1...made five starts with Oakland and was 4-0 with a 1.21 ERA and .160 opponents batting average...the ERA was second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched (Yates SD, 1.19) and fifth lowest in Oakland history...using the same minimum, the batting average was third lowest in the majors and sixth lowest in Oakland history...allowed two runs or fewer in all five starts, including one run or fewer four times, and four hits or fewer four times...struck out 30 batters in 29.2 innings and walked just seven (2.12 per nine innings)...had a .229 opponents on-base percentage and .280 slugging percentage.

2019 IN MINORS: Started his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton July 8 and was 0-1 with a 9.72 ERA in three starts when he was transferred to Triple-A Las Vegas July 23...went 0-1 with a 6.10 ERA in two starts with the Aviators before his rehab assignment was halted on Aug. 2 due to a strained right oblique...returned to action Aug. 13 and went 3-0 with a 1.53 ERA over his final three starts...was 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts overall...struck out 53 batters in 36.1 innings (3.13 per nine innings) and walked 10 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.3.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Mike Fiers (4-2, 4.93 ERA): Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...is 3-1 with a 3.22 ERA and one home run allowed over his last four starts after going 1-1 with a 6.86 ERA and six home runs over his first four starts...the A's are 6-2 (.750) in his starting assignments this year and 36-14 (.720) when he starts in his career...took the loss in his first start in September after going 4-1 with a 4.36 ERA in six starts in the month of August...is 24-10 with a 3.80 ERA in 45 career games in August and 8-15 with a 5.66 ERA in 37 career appearances in September...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-3 A's loss to San Diego last Sunday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...is 6-3 with a 5.36 ERA (82.1 ip, 79 h, 50 r, 49 er, 24 bb, 74 so, 19 hr) in 15 career appearances, including 14 starts, against Texas...is 6-0 with a 3.18 ERA over his last nine starts...is 2-0 with a 3.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 10 h, 5 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 1.58 ERA (9 er in 52.0 ip) over the last 16 games...now has a 2.05 ERA for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors by nearly half a run (Dodgers, 2.49)...the lowest ERA by the bullpen in Oakland history is 2.35 in 1990.
- Has the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.267), ranks second in OPS (.585) and slugging percentage (.318) and third in batting average (.206).
- Has converted 14-of-16 (87.5%) save opportunities...ranks second in the majors in save percentage and tied for third in saves.
- Has the fewest losses in the majors (3) and ranks second in fewest walks (49) and fewest home runs (14).
- First batters faced are 22-for-124 (.177) with eight walks, four doubles and three home runs...has the lowest opponents on-base percentage against first batters in the majors (.226), ranks second in OPS (.508), third in batting average and fourth in slugging percentage (.282).

- Has not allowed a run in his 15 appearances (15.0 ip) and now has a career-high 18.2-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year (previous: 14.2, May 11-June 18, 2016)...last allowed a run on Sept. 14, 2019 at Texas...his 15.0 innings pitched this year are the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed...the most innings pitched in a season in Major League history without allowing a run is 20.0 by Tyler Olson for Cleveland in 2017.
- Opponents are 6-for-49 (.122) but he has issued 10 walks...has not allowed an extra base hit and his .122 opponents slugging percentage is fourth lowest in the majors among relievers.
- Has allowed a .182 (4-for-22) average with the bases empty, .074 (2-for-27) with runners on.
