ABOUT THE A'S: Split a four-game series in Texas to start the road trip and are now 7-5 since resuming play Sept. 4 following a positive test for Covid-19...did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games)...are 29-17 (.630) and the 12 games over .500 are one short of the season high of 13 (twice, last: 29-16 on Sept. 12)...have the third best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 42nd consecutive day and are 6½ games ahead of second place Houston...that is ½ game short of the season high of seven on Sept. 11...have not led by more than seven games since Sept. 24, 2013 when they led by 7½ games...are 23-11 (.676) in intradivision play (the second tiebreaker after head-to-head play), which is the best mark in the majors...have held at least a share of first place for 50 of 52 days this year (42 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third).

MAGIC NUMBERS: The A's magic number to clinch a playoff spot is seven...the magic number to clinch the division is also seven (A's won the season series with Houston 7-3 and would win the tiebreaker).

LET'S PLAY TWO...: Today, the A's are scheduled to play their second doubleheader in the last three days, their third in the last seven days and their fourth of the season...have not played four doubleheaders in a season since 1993...today's doubleheader concludes a seven-day stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 10 games in three different cities...the last time the A's played 10 games in seven days was from June 16-22, 1966 when they were the Kansas City A's...have a fifth doubleheader scheduled for Sept. 26 against Seattle in Oakland and have not played five doubleheaders since 1986...this is the first doubleheader between the A's and Mariners since May 7, 2014 at Oakland (L, 4-6 in 10 inn.; W, 2-0)...this will be the eighth doubleheader between the A's and Mariners, the first in Seattle...Oakland has two sweeps (Aug. 3, 1984 and Aug. 6, 1978) and five splits in the first seven...in their first three doubleheaders this year, the A's were swept at Houston on Aug. 29 and split the other two on Sept. 8 vs. Houston and Sept. 12 at Texas...have swept just one doubleheader over the last 22 years (Sept. 9, 2017 vs. Houston) and have one sweep, 12 splits and have been swept seven times over that span.

...BUT JUST SEVEN INNINGS: Since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's have played fewer than nine innings in a game 22 times, including six times this year...are 2-4 in those games this year and 9-12-1 overall...prior to this year, the most recent was on Aug. 27, 2013 at Detroit, a 6-3 A's win that was called with no outs in the top of the sixth...nine pitchers in Oakland history have complete games of fewer than eight innings, but just two over the last 25 years (5.0, Tommy Milone on Aug. 27, 2013 at Detroit; 7.0, Bartolo Colón on April 23, 2013 at Boston).

FREQUENT FLIERS: Today is day two of a three-day stretch where the A's are scheduled to play four games in three different cities in three different time zones...the stretch began yesterday at 1:37 pm CT in Arlington and will conclude tomorrow in Denver when first pitch is scheduled for 6:40 pm MT...that will be four games in three cities in roughly 57 hours.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .238 (88-for-370) with 56 runs scored (4.7 per game) in 12 games since resuming play on Sept. 4...are hitting .227 for the season, which is seventh lowest in the majors...have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...however, rank third in the majors in walks (191) and tied for third in hit by pitches (30)...have a .326 on-base percentage, which is .099 points higher than the team batting average...the largest difference in Oakland history is .096 points in 1999...have the second best stolen base percentage in the majors (19-of-22, 86.4%) and rank seventh in triples (9)...are tied for the seventh most strikeouts (426)...are second in the majors in grand slams (4)...also rank fourth in slugging with the bases loaded (.725), tied for fourth in extra base hits (7) and walks (6) and fifth in RBI (46)...have the third lowest batting average by designated hitters (.182) and pinch hitters (.100) and the fifth lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.232).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.62 ERA, which is fourth lowest in the majors...also rank fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.300), sixth in OPS (.687) and seventh in slugging (.386)...have the second fewest hit batters (12) and the third fewest walks (126) and home runs (50)...have the seventh fewest

strikeouts (380)...A's starting pitchers have 230.2 innings pitched, which is 10th most in the majors...that is an average of 5.01 innings per start and the fewest innings per start in Oakland history is 5.09 in 2018.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have a six-game errorless streak and have made just one error over the last 10 games...have 20 errors for the season, which is fourth fewest in the majors...are one of three teams without an error by their outfielders (Diamondbacks, Brewers) and one of two without an error by their first basemen (Astros)...have four errors by their pitchers, two by their catchers and a combined 14 from their second basemen, third basemen and shortstops...have turned just 27 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this eight-game, six-day, three-city road trip to Texas (2-2), Seattle (two games) and Colorado (two games)...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1) and Houston (0-2) and are 11-10 (.524) on the road...went 5-3 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-2) and Houston (4-1) and are 18-7 (.720) in Oakland...have a 4.62 ERA (89 er in 173.1 ip) on the road compared to 2.85 in Oakland...have yielded 32 home runs in 173.1 innings on the road (1.66 per nine innings) compared to 18 in 227.0 innings in the Coliseum (0.71 per nine innings)...are averaging 5.52 runs per game on the road (116 r in 21 g) compared to 4.16 in Oakland.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 9-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 20-17 when they start a right-hander...are one of two teams without a loss to a left-handed starter (White Sox, 13-0)...the nine games against lefties are tied for fourth fewest in the majors...have faced one left-handed starter over the last 14 games, two over the last 19 and four over the last 31.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lead the majors in walk-off wins (5), are tied for the lead in extra inning wins (5), tied for third in last at bat wins (8) and tied for fifth in comeback wins (14)...are 5-0 in extra inning games and now have a six-game winning streak in extra innings dating back to Sept. 18, 2019...that is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight...also lead the majors in wins when trailing after six innings (6), are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight (2), five (8) and four innings (10) and tied for third in wins when trailing after seven innings (3).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lead the season series 3-1 after taking three of four in Oakland from July 31-Aug. 3...went 10-9 against the Mariners last year for their first season series win over Seattle since 2012...went 6-2 in Oakland, 0-2 in Tokyo and 4-5 in Seattle...have won 13 of their last 19 games but are 59-78 (.431) against Seattle dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 363-302 against the Mariners...that includes 196-134 in Oakland, 166-165 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 90-101 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jake Diekman has not allowed a run in his 16 appearances (16.0 ip) and now has a career-high 19.2-inning scoreless streak...his 16.0 innings pitched are the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed...**Liam Hendriks** has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career...is tied for the Major League lead in saves (12) and leads relievers in the West divisions in strikeouts (30)...**Tommy La Stella** has not struck out in his last 46 plate appearances...is averaging 21.63 plate appearances per strikeout for the season, which is nearly double the next closest player (Arenado, COL 11.44)...**Matt Olson** tied for seventh in the majors in RBI (38), tied for ninth in walks (29) and tied for 10th in home runs (13).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1929** the A's clinch the American League pennant with a 5-0 win over the Chicago White Sox...in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a five-hitter in the A's 9-1 victory over Minnesota to win his 20th for the fourth consecutive season...he would go on to win 22 games and combined with Bob Welch to record 49 of the A's 103 victories...in **1995** Mark McGwire hits his 269th career home run off Kansas City's Mark Gubicza, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland career record for home runs...in **1996** Mark McGwire homers in the first inning of both games of a double header at Cleveland, his 49th and 50th of the season, breaking the Oakland record of 49 which he previously held.

TODAY'S GAME 1 STARTING PITCHER: Jesús Luzardo (2-2, 3.97 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 10th appearance and eight start of the season...is 1-2 with a 4.82 ERA (15 er in 28.0 ip) and .270 (30-for-111) opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 1-0 with a 2.60 ERA and .217 opponents batting average over his first four games...has walked two batters or fewer in all nine of his appearances this year and all 13 in his career...leads Major League rookies with 45 strikeouts and ranks second with 45.1 innings pitched...the A's are 5-2 (.714) in his starting assignments.

AMERICAN LEAGUE AND NATIONAL LEAGUE: Is 1-1 with a 2.30 ERA (7 er in 27.1 ip) in five games against American League teams compared to 1-1 with a 6.50 ERA (13 er in 18.0 ip) in four games against National League teams...the four interleague games are the first of his career...is 1-1 with a 2.06 ERA (9 er in 39.1 ip) in 11 career games against the AL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed all six of his home runs and issued 13 of his 14 walks to right-handed hitters...has allowed all seven of his career home runs and has 15 of his 17 walks against righties...opponents are hitting .311 (14-for-45) with three walks when leading off an inning...has allowed a .300 (9-for-30) average with runners in scoring position, including .429 (6-for-14) with RISP and two outs.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in three of his seven starts...his season RSA of 2.98 is fourth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings...is 1-2 in five starts with two runs of support or fewer, 2-0 in two starts with three runs of support or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 2.80 ERA (11 er in 35.1 ip) in seven games, five starts, at home compared to 0-1 with an 8.10 ERA (9 er in 10.0 ip) in two starts on the road...has allowed three home runs in 35.1 innings at home, three in 10.0 innings on the road...is now 2-1 with a 2.72 ERA (11 er in 36.1 ip) in eight career appearances in the Coliseum, 0-1 with a 4.71 ERA (11 er in 21.0 ip) in seven games on the road.

2020 OUTING-BY-OUTING: Made his first two appearances of the season in relief (4.05 ERA) and is 2-2 with a 3.96 ERA (17 er in 38.2 ip) in seven starts since then...entered the game in the sixth inning in his first outing on **July 25** against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in the A's 4-1 loss...pitched in relief again **July 29** against Colorado in Oakland in a 5-1 A's loss...struck out a five in 3.2 innings and matched his career high in walks (2)...allowed a run in the eighth inning to snap a career-high 12.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2019...had a no decision in his first Major League start, a 5-1 A's win over Texas on **Aug. 4** in Oakland...at the age of 22 years and 309 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to start a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and matched his high with two walks...recorded his first Major League win in the A's 7-2 victory over Houston on **Aug. 9** in Oakland...at the age of 22 years and 314 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to win a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...allowed a two-run home run to Gurriel in 5.2 innings of work...had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning win at San Francisco **Aug. 14**...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high nine hits in 3.1 innings...walked a career-high tying two and allowed two home runs in a game for the first time in his career...yielded a solo home run to Longoria in the first and a three-run home run to Pence in the third...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win over Arizona on **Aug. 19** in Oakland...struck out a career-high seven in 6.1 scoreless innings...matched his high with two walks...scattered four hits and allowed just two base runners to advance into scoring position...was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 3-2 loss at Texas on **Aug. 24**...struck out a career-high tying seven and walked a career-high tying two for the sixth consecutive game...allowed a two-run single to Frazier in the bottom of the first and a solo home run to Kiner-Falefa in the bottom of the second but then retired 15 of the final 20 batters he faced without allowing a run...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-0 loss to San Diego on **Sept. 9** in Oakland...retired 12 of the first 13 batters he faced but then allowed four runs in the fifth inning on a two-run double by Grisham, a RBI double by Tatis and a RBI single by Hosmer.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 victory over Houston last Wednesday in Oakland...tossed a career-high 100 pitches in a career-high 7.0 innings...matched his best with seven strikeouts...allowed a home run to Springer to start the game before retiring seven straight...set down 10 of the final 11 hitters, with the one exception being a Gurriel solo home run in the sixth.

LUZARDO vs. SEATTLE: Is 0-0 with a save and a 0.00 ERA (4.0 ip, 1 h, 0 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 6 so, 0 hr) in two career appearances, both in relief last year at Seattle...the first outing came on Sept. 26 in the A's 3-1 win (2.0 ip, 3 so)...retired the side in order in the seventh and eighth inning...then pitched the final two innings of the A's 1-0 win on Sept. 28 for his second career save (2.0 ip, 1 h, 3 so)...allowed a Murphy single and a Moore hit by pitch in the ninth inning.

2019 RECAP: Had his season interrupted twice by a strained left shoulder but, after going 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games (nine starts) with three minor league teams, he was selected by Oakland on Sept. 9 after Las Vegas concluded its season...had no decisions, two saves, a 1.50 ERA and .119 opponents batting average in six relief appearances in his Major League debut...struck out 16 batters in 12.0 innings (12.00 per nine innings) and walked just three for a .196 on-base percentage...allowed two doubles and one home run for a .238 slugging percentage...left-handed hitters were 1-for-14 (.071) with no extra base hits, one walk and a .205 OPS...right-handed hitters batted .143 (4-for-28) with a .547 OPS...opponents hit .138 with his lone home run with the bases empty, .077 with runners on...they were 1-for-8 (.125) with runners in scoring position...allowed a .095 average with two strikes...did not inherit any runners and first batters faced were 1-for-5 (.200) with a walk.

2019 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Was a non-roster invitee with the A's during the spring and had a 0.93 ERA in four games before he was shut down with a supraspinatus muscle strain...was assigned to Single-A Stockton June 11 and appeared in two games with the Ports and three with Las Vegas before going on the injured list July 4...made one rehab start with the AZL A's Green before he was reinstated from the IL Aug. 10 and sent to Stockton...moved back to Las Vegas Aug. 15...combined to strike out 57 batters in 43.0 minor league innings (11.93 per nine innings)...walked just eight (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.13...his opponents batting average broke down to .132 (5-for-38) against left-handed hitters compared to .248 (31-for-125) with all four of his home runs against right-handers...had a .379 OPS against lefties, .675 against righties...all four of the home runs were solo shots...yielded a .132 average with runners in scoring position...tossed fewer than five innings in nine of his 11 appearances, but logged at least two innings each time...surrendered one run or fewer eight times...had more strikeouts than innings pitched seven times.

TODAY'S GAME 2 STARTING PITCHER: Mike Minor (0-5, 6.35 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 10th appearance and ninth start of the season...it will be his third appearance and second start with the A's... was acquired from Texas on Aug. 31 with cash for two players to be named later and international slot money...is 0-0 with a 12.46 ERA (4.1 ip, 5 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 2 hr) in two games, one start, with Oakland after going 0-5 with a 5.60 ERA in seven starts for the Rangers...his teams are 2-6 (.250) in his starts, including 0-1 with the A's.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has started his season 0-5 for the first time in his career...the five-game losing streak is tied for second longest in the majors this year and is one short of his career high of six (Sept. 6, 2013 to May 7, 2014)...his five losses are tied for fifth in the majors.

BALLPARKS: Was 0-2 with a 3.38 ERA (7 er in 18.2 ip) in four starts at home for Texas...is 0-3 with a 9.00 ERA (21 er in 21.0 ip) in five games in all other ballparks...allowed two home runs in 18.2 innings at Globe Life Field and has seven in 21.0 innings in all other parks...is 0-1 with a 10.61 ERA (11 er in 9.1 ip) and three home runs allowed in 9.1 innings over three games in the Coliseum...is 1-4 with a 7.39 ERA (23 er in 28.0 ip) in eight career appearances, including five starts, in Oakland.

THIS AND THAT: Has a 3.00 ERA (8 er in 24.0 ip) over innings one through three...has yielded 12 of his 29 runs in the fourth inning (11 er in 7.0 ip, 14.14 ERA) and has a 11.49 ERA (20 er in 15.2 ip) from the fourth inning on...has allowed eight of his nine home runs and issued 12 of his 15 walks to right-handed hitters...has received two runs of support or fewer in six of his eight starts and just 15 runs of support total (3.40 RSA)...is 0-1 with a 3.72 ERA (8 er in 19.1 ip) in four starts on four days rest or fewer compared to 0-4 with an 8.38 ERA (18 er in 19.1 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.
