## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (30-18) VS. COLORADO ROCKIES (21-25)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Split a doubleheader in Seattle yesterday to conclude a seven-day stretch where they played three doubleheaders and 10 games...went 6-4 over that span and are now 8-6 since resuming play Sept. 4 following a positive test for Covid-19...did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games)...are 30-18 (.625) and the 12 games over .500 are one short of the season high of 13 (twice, last: 29-16 on Sept. 12)...have the third best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 43rd consecutive day and are 6½ games ahead of second place Houston...that is ½ game short of the season high of seven on Sept. 11...have not led by more than seven games since Sept. 24, 2013 when they led by 7½ games...have held at least a share of first place for 51 of 53 days this year (43 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)

**MAGIC NUMBERS:** The A's magic number to clinch a playoff spot is five...the magic number to clinch the division is six (A's won the season series with Houston 7-3 and would win the tiebreaker).

**A TALE OF TWO WESTS:** The A's are 6-6 (.500) against the National League West compared to 24-12 (.667) against the American League West...the A's interleague mark is tied for 14th in the majors but their intradivision record (second tiebreaker for playoff seeding) is second best to the White Sox (23-10)...the 12 interleague games are tied for the fewest in the majors...are scheduled to play each of their next eight games against the NL (two at Colorado, three vs. San Francisco in Oakland, three at Los Angeles) before concluding the season with four games against Seattle in Oakland...have a 5.03 ERA (60 er in 107.1 ip) in interleague games compared to 3.15 against the AL...the A's went 11-9 (.550) in interleague play last year, which marked the second consecutive season and 14th time in 23 seasons Oakland finished with a winning record against the NL...are 234-202 (.537) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

**FREQUENT FLIERS:** Today is day three of a three-day stretch where the A's are scheduled to play four games in three different cities in three different time zones...the stretch began Sunday at 1:37 pm CT in Arlington, continued with a 2:10 pm PT doubleheader at Seattle and concludes with tonight's 6:40 pm MT first pitch in Denver...at the scheduled first pitch tonight, the A's will have played three games in 54 hours and 3 minutes.

**SCHEDULE NOTES:** Yesterday, the A's concluded a stretch where they played 10 games over a seven-day span from Sept. 8-14...prior to that, had not played 10 games in seven days since June 16-22, 1966 (also 10 games)...tomorrow, Oakland will finish a stretch where it is scheduled to play 16 games over 13 days (Sept. 4-16), which would be their most games over a 13-day stretch since July 18-30, 1975 (also 16 in 13)...have Thursday off, host San Francisco in three-game series Friday-Sunday and then have their final scheduled off day of the season on Monday...are in a season-ending stretch that began on Sept. 4 where they are scheduled to play 26 games over the final 24 days, which would be their most games over a 24-day stretch since July 21-Aug. 13, 1978 when they had 27 games in 24 days.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .244 (105-for-430) in 14 games since resuming play on Sept. 4 after hitting .224 over the first 34 contests...that has lifted the overall batting average to a season-high tying .230 (also Aug. 16)...have the eighth lowest batting average in the majors and have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...however, rank third in the majors in hit by pitches (34), fourth in walks (197), seventh in triples (9) and tied for ninth in runs (234)...have a .328 on-base percentage, which is .098 points higher than the team batting average...the largest difference in Oakland history is .096 points in 1999...have the sixth most strikeouts (436)...are second in the majors in grand slams (4)...also rank fourth in RBI with the bases loaded (48), tied for fourth in extra base hits (7) and walks (6) and fifth in slugging (.682).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have been successful in 19-of-22 (87.5%) stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors to the Rockies (32-of-36, 88.9%)...A's opponents are 19-for-27 (70.4%), which is tied for 10th lowest in the majors...A's pitchers are tied for fourth in the majors in pickoffs (5).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 3.64 ERA, which is fourth lowest in the majors...also rank fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.301), seventh in OPS (.691) and

eighth in slugging (.390)...have the second fewest hit batters (13), the third fewest walks (131) and are tied for the fifth fewest home runs (53).

**STARTING PITCHING:** The A's had their streak of 172 consecutive games without a complete game snapped yesterday but extended their streak of consecutive games with seven innings or fewer from their starting pitcher to 56...Mike Minor's two-hit shutout in the second game of the doubleheader yesterday was the A's first complete game since Mike Fiers' no-hitter on May 7, 2019...the streak of consecutive games without a complete game was second longest in Athletics history (186, Aug. 20, 2016-Sept. 14, 2017)...starting pitchers have 242.2 innings pitched this year, which is sixth most in the majors...that is an average of 5.06 innings per start and the fewest innings per start in Oakland history is 5.09 in 2018

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have an eight-game errorless streak and have made just one error over the last 12 games...have 20 errors for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the majors...have turned just 28 double plays, which is for the fewest in the majors.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-3 on this eight-game, six-day, three-city road trip to Texas (2-2), Seattle (1-1) and Colorado (two games)...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1) and Houston (0-2) and are 12-11 (.522) on the road...return home following the game tomorrow for a three-game homestand against San Francisco beginning Friday...went 5-3 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-2) and Houston (4-1) and are 18-7 (.720) in Oakland...have a 4.59 ERA (95 er in 186.1 ip) on the road compared to 2.85 in Oakland...have yielded 35 home runs in 186.1 innings on the road (1.69 per nine innings) compared to 18 in 227.0 innings in the Coliseum (0.71 per nine innings)...are averaging 5.65 runs per game on the road (130 r in 23 g) compared to 4.16 in Oakland.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's lost a game started by a left-handed pitcher for the first time this year in the first game of the doubleheader yesterday at Seattle...are now 9-1 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 21-17 when they start a right-hander...the record against lefties is second best in the majors (White Sox, 13-0) and the 10 games are tied for sixth fewest...have faced two left-handed starters over the last four games after facing none over the previous 12 contests.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's lead the majors in walk-off wins (5), are tied for the lead in extra inning wins (5), tied for third in last at bat wins (8) and tied for fifth in comeback wins (14)...are 5-0 in extra inning games and now have a six-game winning streak in extra innings dating back to Sept. 18, 2019...that is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight...also lead the majors in wins when trailing after six innings (6), are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight (2), five (8) and four innings (10) and tied for third in wins when trailing after seven innings (3).

**A's vs. ROCKIES:** The A's are 0-2 after being swept in a two-game series in Oakland, July 28-29...now have a five-game losing streak to the Rockies...last met in 2018 when Colorado swept a three-game series in Denver, July 27-29...the A's trail in the all-time series, 15-18...are 9-7 in Oakland and 6-11 in Denver...have won four of their 10 season series with the Rockies and lost six.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Jake Diekman** has not allowed a run in his 16 appearances (16.0 ip) and now has a career-high 19.2-inning scoreless streak...his 16.0 innings pitched are tied for the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed...**Liam Hendriks** has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career...is tied for the Major League lead in saves (12) and leads relievers in the West divisions in strikeouts (30)...**Tommy La Stella** is averaging 22.75 plate appearances per strikeout for the season, which is nearly double the next closest player (Arenado, COL 11.44)...**Matt Olson** is tied for seventh in the majors in RBI (38) and walks (31) and tied for 10th in home runs (13)

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1931** the A's clinch their third consecutive American League pennant as Eddie Rommel defeats Cleveland, 14-3...it is the ninth and final pennant for manager Connie Mack...in **1971** the A's score twice in the eighth inning to defeat Chicago 3-2 in the first game of a doubleheader, clinching their first AL West title...in **1990** Dennis Eckersley becomes Oakland's all-time saves leader when he saves his 137<sup>th</sup> game as an Athletic, breaking Rollie Fingers record of 136.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (4-2, 4.46 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his team-leading 10th start of the season...is 4-0 with a 1.98 ERA (6 er in 27.1 ip) and .204 (20-for-98) opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA and .364 opponents average over his first four starts...the four-game winning streak is one short of his career high of five (twice, last: Aug. 24, 2018-Sept. 26, 2019).

**IN SEPTEMBER:** Is 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA (2 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts in September...now has an eight-game winning streak in September and has a 1.18 ERA (7 er in 53.1 ip) and .167 (31-for-186) opponents batting average over that stretch, which spans nine starts...has not lost in September since Sept. 12, 2017 at Boston...is now 10-2 with a 1.85 ERA (18 er in 78.2 ip) in 15 career starts in September...the wins are his most in any month and the ERA is his lowest for any month.

**DON'T WALK:** Has not walked a batter in five of his nine starts and has issued more than one free pass just once (three on Aug. 10 at LAA)...has six walks in 42.1 innings and his average of 1.28 walks per nine innings is fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings...has walked just 45 batters in 232.2 innings over the last three years (1.74 per nine innings).

**AMERICAN LEAGUE AND NATIONAL LEAGUE:** Is 2-0 with a 2.35 ERA (4 er in 15.1 ip) in three interleague starts compared to 2-2 with a 5.67 ERA (17 er in 27.0 ip) in six starts against the American League...however, is 5-7 with a 3.96 ERA (40 er in 91.0 ip) in 17 career starts against the National League compared to 34-23 with a 3.80 ERA (188 er in 445.0 ip) in 78 games against the AL.

**THE FIRST THREE INNINGS:** Has allowed seven runs over the first three innings of his starts this year (26.2 ip, 2.36 ERA) and 19 from the fourth inning on (14 er in 15.2 ip, 8.04 ERA)...opponents are 21-for-95 (.221) over innings one through three and 23-for-69 (.333) from the fourth inning on...in 14 starts over the last two seasons, he has a 1.51 ERA (7 er in 41.2 ip) and .196 (28-for-143) opponents batting average over innings 1-3 and a 5.34 ERA (18 er in 30.1 ip) and .264 (32-for-121) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are hitting .214 (24-for-112) with the bases empty compared to .385 (20-for-52) with runners on...they are 13-for-32 (.406) with runners in scoring position after going 0-for-15 with RISP last year...has a .200 (16-for-80) opponents average the first time through the lineup. .333 (28-for-84) after that...has allowed four home runs, three of which are solo shots...six of the seven home runs he allowed over the last two years have come with the bases empty

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 3-0 with a 4.13 ERA (13 er in 28.1 ip) in six starts on four days rest compared to 1-2 with a 5.14 ERA (8 er in 14.0 ip) in three starts on five days rest or more.

**2020 START-BY-START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) **July 25** in Oakland...it was his first loss since Aug. 19, 2018 against Houston and it snapped a career-high tying five-game winning streak...allowed an Upton homer with two outs in the fourth and three more runs in the fifth on a Simmons RBI double and a Fletcher two-run double...he dropped his second consecutive decision in the A's 5-3 loss at Seattle **July 31**...retired each of the first nine batters before allowing three runs (two earned) in the fourth inning on a Seager two-run double and an error...had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over Texas on **Aug. 5** in Oakland...allowed a first pitch home run to Choo to start the game but then retired nine of the next 11 hitters...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed three runs in the fourth...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 10-9 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **Aug. 10**...tossed 2.2 innings, which was his shortest outing since Aug. 7, 2018 against the Dodgers when he also pitched 2.2 innings...allowed a three-run home run to Rendon in the first and a RBI single to Upton in the bottom of the third...had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 7-6 win at San Francisco **Aug. 15**...retired eight of the first nine batters before allowing three runs in the fourth inning on a Slater walk, a Solano single and a Yas-trzesmki triple and error...then retired each of the final six batters he faced...picked up his first win of the season in the A's 5-1 victory over Arizona **Aug. 20** in Oakland...blanked the Diamondbacks on three hits over the first four innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Escobar in the fifth...won his second consecutive start in the A's 10-3 win at Texas on **Aug. 25**...allowed a run in the second inning on a Kiner-Falefa RBI single but the A's scored once in the third, twice in the fourth and two more times in the fifth to give him a 5-1 lead...allowed two unearned runs in the bottom of the fifth and left after five innings with a 5-3 lead...won his third consecutive start in the A's 8-4 win over San Diego on **Sept. 5** in Oakland...had a 4-0 lead when Hosmer grounded into a force out with the bases loaded in the third inning...retired eight of the final nine batters he faced and was relieved by Petit to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 4-1.

**LAST START:** He won his fourth consecutive start in the A's 3-1 win over Houston last Thursday in Oakland...allowed one earned run for the fourth consecutive start...retired each of the first 15 batters he faced before Reddick doubled to lead off the sixth...Diaz singled him to third and Reddick scored when Maldonado grounded into a double play...retired each of the final five batters he faced.

**2019 RECAP:** Began the season on the 60-day injured list as he continued his recovery from Sept. 19, 2018 surgery on his left shoulder...went 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts before he was reinstated from the IL Sept. 1...made five starts with Oakland and was 4-0 with a 1.21 ERA and .160 opponents batting average...the ERA was second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched (Yates SD, 1.19) and fifth lowest in Oakland history...using the same minimum, the batting average was third lowest in the majors and sixth lowest in Oakland history...allowed two runs or fewer in all five starts, including one run or fewer four times, and four hits or fewer four times...struck out 30 batters in 29.2 innings and walked just seven (2.12 per nine innings)...had a .229 opponents on-base percentage and .280 slugging percentage.

**2019 IN MINORS:** Started his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton July 8 and was 0-1 with a 9.72 ERA in three starts when he was transferred to Triple-A Las Vegas July 23...went 0-1 with a 6.10 ERA in two starts with the Aviators before his rehab assignment was halted on Aug. 2 due to a strained right oblique...returned to action Aug. 13 and went 3-0 with a 1.53 ERA over his final three starts...was 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts overall...struck out 53 batters in 36.1 innings (13.13 per nine innings) and walked 10 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.3.

<b>RHP Mike Fiers (5-2, 5.06 ERA):</b> Is 4-1 with a 3.82 ERA and two home runs allowed over his last five starts after going 1-1 with a 6.86 ERA and six home runs over his first four starts...the A's are 7-2 (.778) in his starting assignments this year and 37-14 (.725) when he starts in his career...has a 1.00 ERA and .159 opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game, a 7.50 ERA and .336 opponents average from the third inning on...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 10-6 A's win at Texas last Friday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...is 0-1 with a 24.00 ERA (3.0 ip, 11 h, 8 r, 8 er, 1 bb, 3 so, 0 hr) in two career appearances, one start, against Colorado...last faced the Rockies on Aug. 13, 2012 at Colorado when he started and took the loss in a 9-6 Milwaukee loss (2.0 ip, 9 h, 8 r, 8 er, 1 so)...is 1-1 with a 4.09 ERA in two interleague starts this year and is now 3-1 with a 2.03 ERA in five career interleague starts with the A's.

- Lead the majors with a 2.21 ERA, which is more than half a run lower than the next closest team (Dodgers, 2.77)...the lowest ERA's by a bullpen since 1920 are 1.75 by the Cardinals in 1942, 2.14 by the White Sox in 1967, 2.16 by the Dodgers in 1968 and 2.25 by the Pirates in 1972...the lowest by the A's is 2.35 in 1990.
- Has the lowest opponents OPS (.583), batting average (.201), slugging percentage (.316) and on-base percentage (.267) in the majors.
- Has converted 15-of-18 (83.3%) save opportunities...is tied for second in the majors in save percentage and tied for fourth in saves.
- Has the fewest losses in the majors (4) and ranks second in fewest walks (57) and fewest home runs (16).
- First batters faced are 23-for-135 (.170) with 11 walks, four doubles and three home runs...has the lowest opponents OPS (.498) and on-base percentage (.231) against first batters in the majors and the second lowest batting average and slugging percentage (.267).

- Leads the majors in go-ahead home runs (7) and is tied for second in go-ahead RBI (10).
- Each of his last five home runs have come with runners on base and he is tied for third in the majors in home runs with runners on (8).
- Is the only Athletic to play in all 48 games and is tied for fifth in the majors in games played.
- His 372 total chances are the most in the majors among first basemen with no errors (Gurriel, HOU 367)...ranks second in defensive runs saved (5).
