OAKLAND ATHLETICS (30-19) VS. COLORADO ROCKIES (22-25)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last four games and five of the last seven and are now 8-7 since resuming play Sept. 4 following a positive test for Covid-19...did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games)...are 30-19 (.612) overall, which is the third best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors... are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 44th consecutive day and are 5½ games ahead of second place Houston...have

held at least a share of first place for 52 of 54 days this year (44 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)

MAGIC NUMBERS: The A's magic number to clinch a playoff spot is five...the magic number to clinch the division is six (A's won the season series with Houston 7-3 and would win the tiebreaker).

HALF DAY/HALF NIGHT: The A's are scheduled to play their 25th day game of the season today, which is five more than any other team...are scheduled to play five more day games for a total of 30 day games and 30 night games in the 60-game schedule...the last time the A's played at least half of their games during the day was in 1960 when they played 78-of-155 (50.3%) during the day...the last team other the Cubs to play at least half their games during the day was the Giants in 1994 (61-of-115, 53.0%).

A TALE OF TWO WESTS: The A's are 6-7 (.462) against the National League West compared to 24-12 (.667) against the American League West...the A's interleague mark is ninth worst in the majors but their intradivision record (second tiebreaker for playoff seeding) is second best to the White Sox (24-10)...the 13 interleague games are tied for the fewest in the majors...are scheduled to play each of their seven games against the NL (today at Colora-do, three vs. San Francisco in Oakland, three at Los Angeles) before concluding the season with four games against Seattle in Oakland...have a 4.92 ERA (63 er in 115.1 ip) in interleague games compared to 3.15 against the AL... the A's went 11-9 (.550) in interleague play last year, which marked the second consecutive season and 14th time in 23 seasons Oakland finished with a winning record against the NL...are 234-203 (.535) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

SCHEDULE NOTES: Last night at 9:24 pm MT, the A's concluded a stretch where they played four games in three different cities in three different time zones over a span of 56 hours and 47 minutes...today, the A's are scheduled to finish a stretch of 16 games in 13 days from Sept. 4-16...are 8-7 over the first 15 games...the last time the A's played 16 games in 13 days was July 18-30, 1975...have tomorrow off, are scheduled to play San Francisco from Friday through Sunday and then have their final scheduled off day of the season on Monday...played three doubleheaders and 10 games over a sevenday span from Sept. 8-14 and went 6-4 in those games...it was the first time the A's played 10 games in seven days since June 16-22, 1966...are in a season-ending stretch that began on Sept. 4 where they are scheduled to play 26 games over the final 24 days, which would be their most games over a 24-day stretch since July 21-Aug. 13, 1978 when they had 27 games in 24 days.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .241 (111-for-461) in 15 games since resuming play on Sept. 4 after hitting .224 over the first 34 contests...are batting .229 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...however, rank third in the majors in hit by pitches (34), fourth in walks (198) and seventh in triples (9)...have a .326 on-base percentage, which is .097 points higher than the team batting average...the largest difference in Oakland history is .096 points in 1999... have the eighth most strikeouts in the majors (439)...rank second in the majors in grand slams (4)...also rank fourth in RBI with the bases loaded (48), tied for fourth in extra base hits (7) and walks (6) and fifth in slugging (.682).

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 21-of-24 (87.5%) stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors ahead of the Rockies (32-of-37, 86.5%)...A's opponents are 19-for-28 (6.9%), which is ninth lowest in the majors...A's pitchers are tied for fourth in the majors in pickoffs (5).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.63 ERA, which is fourth lowest in the majors... also rank fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.301), sixth in OPS (.692) and ninth in slugging (.390)...are tied for the fewest hit batters (13), have the third fewest walks (134) and are tied for the fourth fewest home runs (54).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed seven innings or fewer in all 49 games and have a streak of 57 games of seven innings or fewer dating back to last year...however, starting pitchers have 248.0 innings pitched for the season, which is sixth most in the majors...that is an average of 5.06 innings per start and the fewest innings per start in Oakland history is 5.09 in 2018

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's had their eight-game errorless streak snapped last night...have made two errors over the last 13 games and 21 for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors...have turned just 28 double plays, which is tied with the Reds for the fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-4 on this eight-game, six-day, three-city road trip to Texas (2-2), Seattle (1-1) and Colorado (0-1)...went 2-3 on the last road trip and are now 5-9 over the last 14 road games after going 7-3 over the first 10...are 12-12 (.500) on the road compared to 18-7 (.720) in Oakland... return home following the game today for a three-game homestand against San Francisco beginning Friday...went 5-3 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-2) and Houston (4-1)...have a 4.54 ERA (98 er in 194.1 ip) on the road compared to 2.85 in Oakland...have yielded 36 home runs in 194.1 innings on the road (1.67 per nine innings) compared to 18 in 227.0 innings in the Coliseum (0.71 per nine innings)...are averaging 5.46 runs per game on the road (131 r in 24 g) compared to 4.16 in Oakland.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's lost a game started by a left-handed pitcher for the first time this year in the first game of the doubleheader Monday at Seattle... are now 9-1 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 21-18 when they start a right-hander...the record against lefties is second best in the majors (White Sox, 13-0) and the 10 games are tied for seventh fewest...have faced two left-handed starters over the last five games after facing none over the previous 12 contests.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lead the majors in walk-off wins (5), are tied for the lead in extra inning wins (5), tied for third in last at bat wins (8) and tied for fifth in comeback wins (14)...are 5-0 in extra inning games and now have a six-game winning streak in extra innings dating back to Sept. 18, 2019...that is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight...also lead the majors in wins when trailing after six innings (6), are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight (2), five (8) and four innings (10) and tied for third in wins when trailing after seven innings (3).

A's vs. ROCKIES: The A's have lost their second consecutive season series to the Rockies as they are 0-3 entering the final meeting today...have now lost seven of their 11 season series to Colorado...lost the first game in Denver last night after being swept in a two-game series in Oakland, July 28-29... now have a six-game losing streak to the Rockies...last met in 2018 when Colorado swept a three-game series in Denver, July 27-29...the A's trail in the all-time series, 15-19...are 9-7 in Oakland and 6-12 in Denver

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jake Diekman has not allowed a run in his 16 appearances (16.0 ip) and now has a career-high 19.2-inning scoreless streak...his 16.0 innings pitched are tied for the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed...*Liam Hendriks* has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career...is tied for the Major League lead in saves (12) and ranks second among relievers in the West divisions in strikeouts (30)...*Tommy La Stella* has not struck out in his last 59 plate appearances and has fanned just once in 69 plate appearances with the A's...is averaging 23.25 plate appearances per strikeout for the season, which is more than double the next closest player (Arenado, COL 10.39)...*Matt Olson* ranks eighth in the majors in walks (31), tied for eighth in RBI (38) and tied for 10th in home runs (13).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1934** Sugar Cain and Johnny Marcus toss complete games as the A's sweep a doubleheader at St. Louis 2-1 and 2-0...in **1947** the A's score all seven of their runs with two outs in the bottom of the seventh inning to defeat Cleveland 7-3 in the second game of a doubleheader...in **1980** Mike Norris goes the distance in the A's 4-2, 11 inning win at Texas...Oakland scores two in the ninth and two in the 11th as Norris wins his 20th game of the season.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (5-2, 5.06 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...is 4-1 with a 3.82 ERA (12 er in 28.1 ip) and two home runs allowed over his last five starts after going 1-1 with a 6.86 ERA and six home runs over his first four starts...the A's are 7-2 (.778) in his starting assignments this year and 37-14 (.725) when he starts in his career.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has five wins, which is tied for fourth most among pitchers in the West divisions...however, based on a minimum of 45 innings pitched, he has the seventh highest ERA in the majors (5.06), the eighth highest opponents on-base percentage (.338) and batting average (.277) and the ninth highest OPS (.788) and slugging percentage (.450)...is averaging the fourth fewest strikeouts per nine innings (5.63) and has the highest run support (8.06).

AUGUST AND SEPTEMBER: Is 1-1 with a 5.73 ERA (7 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts in September after going 4-1 with a 4.36 ERA in six starts in the month of August...tied for second in the majors in wins in August...it is the fifth time in his career he has won four games in a month, the fourth time in August (2012, 2014, 2019)...is now 24-10 with a 3.80 ERA in 45 career games in August...has no more than 14 wins in any other month...is 9-15 with a 5.67 ERA (113 er in 179.1 ip) in 38 career appearances in September...the losses are his most in any month and the ERA is second highest to a mark of 5.68 in April.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-1 with a 4.09 ERA (11.0 ip, 12 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 8 so) in two interleague starts...went 2-0 with a 0.61 ERA in two interleague starts last year and is now 3-1 with a 2.03 ERA (7 er in 31.0 ip) in five career interleague starts with the A's...is 8-6 with a 2.90 ERA (42 er in 130.1 ip) and .219 (103-for-470) opponents batting average in 24 career interleague appearances, including 22 starts.

THE FIRST TWO INNINGS: Has allowed one run in the first inning and one in the second and has a 1.00 ERA (2 er in 18.0 ip) and .159 (10-for-63) opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game...has a 7.50 ERA (25 er in 30.0 ip) and .336 (43-for-128) opponents average from the third inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .189 (14-for-74) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .333 (39-for-117) with seven of his eight home runs after that...has allowed a .205 (8-for-39) average with runners in scoring position, including .063 (1-for-16) with RISP and two outs...now has a .186 (76-for-408) career opponents average with RISP and two outs...has allowed a .352 (25-for-71) average and six of his eight home runs with no outs, .258 (16-for-62) with one out and .207 (12-for-58) with two outs...opponents are batting .320 (16-for-50) when leading off an inning but he has walked just two...the opponents number three hitter is 3-for-23 (.130) but the clean-up hitter is 10-for-21 (.476).

AT THE COLISEUM: Took the loss in his last home start on Sept. 6 against San Diego in Oakland, snapping a nine-game home winning streak...that tied for the ninth longest home winning streak in Oakland history and was the longest by a starting pitcher since Mark Mulder had a 10-game streak from July 31, 2002-June 19, 2003...it was his first loss at home since April 20, 2019 vs. Toronto and he compiled a 2.99 ERA and .227 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned 16 starts from May 7, 2019 to Aug. 21, 2020...is now 14-2 with a 3.10 ERA (53 er in 153.2) in 26 starts in the Coliseum since he was acquired from Detroit on Aug. 6, 2018...is 15-4 with a 3.39 ERA (69 er in 183.0 ip) and .230 (154-for-669) opponents batting average in 32 career games, including 31 starts, in the Coliseum.

WITH THE A'S: Was acquired by Oakland on Aug. 6, 2018 and is 25-8 with a 4.06 ERA (129 er in 285.2 ip) in 52 games, including 51 starts, with the A's... the wins are tied for fourth most in the majors over that span...is 18-3 with a 3.64 ERA (79 er in 195.2 ip) over his last 34 starts dating back to his May 7, 2019 no-hitter against Cincinnati.

2020 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over Los Angeles (AL) **July 26** in Oakland...did not walk or strikeout a batter in 4.0 innings... it was his first career start with no walks and no strikeouts...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 10-inning win at Seattle on **Aug. 1**... allowed a two-run single to Seager in the third inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...picked up his first win of the season in the A's 6-4 victory over Texas **Aug. 6** in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on a hit and a walk over the first four innings and had a 5-0 lead entering the fifth...allowed a two-run home run to Tejeda in the seventh... was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on **Aug. 11**...allowed five runs in 3.2 innings, all on home runs in the fourth inning...was the winning pitcher in the A's 15-2 win at San Francisco **Aug. 16**...allowed a Belt solo home run in the second and a Yastrzemski RBI single in the third...won his second consecutive start in the A's 5-3 win over Los Angeles (AL) **on Aug. 21** in Oakland...blanked the Angels on four hits, two walks and a hit batter over

the first four innings and had a 3-0 lead before allowing a RBI single to Rendon in the fifth...won his third consecutive start in the A's 3-1 win at Texas on *Aug. 26*...tossed six innings and allow just one unearned run in the third inning...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced, including each of the last eight...had his three-game winning streak snapped in the A's 5-3 loss to San Diego on *Sept. 6* in Oakland...allowed two runs in the third on a Hosmer RBI single and a Machado sacrifice fly, and a RBI double to Croneworth in the fourth...was relieved by McFarland to start the sixth with the A's trailing 3-2.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-6 win at Texas last Friday...Oakland scored four times in the top of the first and he allowed a run in the bottom of the first when Taveras singled, went to second on a ground out, stole third and scored on a Solak ground out...had a 9-1 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Andrus in the seventh...walked the next two batters and was relieved by Wendelken, who allowed both runners to score.

2019 RECAP: Was 15-4 with a 3.90 ERA in 33 starts in his first full season with the A's...ranked third in the American League in winning percentage (.789), sixth in opponents batting average (.243), tied for eighth in wins and 10th in OPS (.712) and on-base percentage (.304)...had career highs in wins, games (33), games started, innings pitched (184.2) and winning percentage...led the A's in wins, starts and innings pitched...became the first A's pitcher to win 15 games since Scott Kazmir had 15 in 2014 and the first to make 33 starts since Sonny Gray had 33 in 2014...his innings pitched were the most by an A's pitcher over the last three years...his .789 winning percentage was fourth best in Oakland history among pitchers with 15 or more decisions...his 30 home runs tied for 10th most in a season in Oakland history...struck out 126 batters, an average of 6.14 per nine innings...that was the third-lowest mark in the AL...had the fifth-lowest strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.38).

- The A's bullpen is 1-2 with two saves, a blown save and a 3.29 ERA (14 er in 38.1 ip) since play resumed on Sept. 4.
- Lead the majors with a 2.18 ERA, which is more than half a run lower than the next closest team (Dodgers, 2.75)...the lowest ERA's by a bullpen since 1920 are 1.75 by the Cardinals in 1942, 2.14 by the White Sox in 1967, 2.16 by the Dodgers in 1968 and 2.25 by the Pirates in 1972...the lowest by the A's is 2.35 in 1990.
- Has the lowest opponents OPS (.583), batting average (.201), slugging percentage (.314) and on-base percentage (.268) in the majors
- Has converted 15-of-18 (83.3%) save opportunities... is tied for second in the majors in save percentage and tied for fourth in saves.
- Has the fewest losses in the majors (4) and ranks second in fewest walks (59) and fewest home runs (16).
- First batters faced are 23-for-136 (.169) with 12 walks, four doubles and three home runs...has the lowest opponents OPS (.500) and on-base per-centage (.235) against first batters in the majors and the second lowest batting average and slugging percentage (.265).

- Has not allowed a run in his 16 appearances (16.0 ip) and now has a career-high 19.2-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year (previous: 14.2, May 11-June 18, 2016)...last allowed a run on Sept. 14, 2019 at Texas...his 16.0 innings pitched this year are tied for the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed (Pomeranz, SD)...the only pitchers in Major League history to have more innings in a season without allowing a run are Tyler Olson (20.0 ip, CLE 2017) and Karl Spooner (18.0 ip. BRO in 1954).
- Opponents are 6-for-52 (.115) with no extra base hits but he has issued 11 walks...has the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the majors among relievers (.115) and the ninth lowest batting average.
- Has allowed a .167 (4-for-24) average with the bases empty, .071 (2-for-28) with runners on
- Has not surrendered a home run since June 21, 2019 against Minnesota (Sano), a streak of 55 games, 46.0 innings and 205 batter faced without allowing a home run.
- Has not faced the Rockies since Sept. 23, 2018 (1.0 ip, 2 so)...has a 10.67 ERA (17 er in 14.1 ip) in 21 career appearances against Colorado, including 11.74 (10 er in 7.2 ip) in 10 games at Coors Field.

Last Year: Began the season with Kansas City and was 0-6 with a 4.75 ERA in 48 relief appearances when he was traded to Oakland on July 27...went 1-1 with a 4.43 ERA in 28 games with the A's and had a 4.65 ERA in a career-high 76 relief appearances overall.

- Has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities, which is the longest such streak of his career (previous: 8, June 22-July 20, 2019 and Aug. 1-29, 2019)...also has three wins over that 19-game stretch and has not allowed a run 17 times (19.1 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 28 so, 0.93 ERA).
- Is tied for the Major League lead with 12 saves (Hand, CLE)...has the fourth lowest opponents on-base percentage among relievers (.189), is tied for eighth in wins (3) and ranks 10th in strikeouts (30)...his strikeouts are sec-ond most among relievers in the West divisions.
- Has not allowed a run in six games (6.0 ip) on the road and opponents are 1-for-19 (.053) with a walk...has a 1.88 ERA and .196 opponents batting average in 14 games in the Coliseum.
- Has allowed a .122 (5-for-41) batting average and a .286 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .207 (6-for-29) with a .603 OPS against left-handers.
- Opponents are hitting .069 (2-for-29) with runners on base, .220 (9-for-41) with the bases empty.
- The Rockies are the only team he has never faced in his career.
