ABOUT THE A'S: Split eight games on the last road trip and are 9-7 since resuming play Sept. 4 following a positive test for Covid-19...did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games)...are 31-19 (.620) overall, which is the third best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...are 12 games over .500, which is one short of the season high of 13 (twice, last: 29-16 on Sept. 12)...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 46th consecutive day and are six games ahead of second place Houston...that is one game short of the season high of seven on Sept. 11...have held at least a share of first place for 54 of 56 days this year (46 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third).

MAGIC NUMBERS: The A's magic number to clinch a playoff spot is two...an A's win coupled with a Seattle loss today would clinch the A's third consecutive playoff appearance, their sixth in the last nine years, their 11th in the last 21 and their 29th overall...over the last nine years, only the Dodgers have more than five postseason appearances (8 including this year)...the magic number to clinch the division is four (A's won the season series with Houston 7-3 and would win the tiebreaker).

A TALE OF TWO WESTS: The A's are 7-7 (.500) against the National League West compared to 24-12 (.667) against the American League West...the A's interleague mark is tied for 15th in the majors...however, their intradivision record (second tiebreaker for playoff seeding) is fourth best in the majors and trails the White Sox (25-11) and Rays (25-12) in the AL...are scheduled to play each of their next six games against the NL (three vs. San Francisco in Oakland, three at Los Angeles) before concluding the season with four games against Seattle in Oakland...have a 4.63 ERA (64 er in 124.1 ip) in interleague games compared to 3.15 against the AL...the A's went 11-9 (.550) in interleague play last year, which marked the second consecutive season and 14th time in 23 seasons Oakland finished with a winning record against the NL...are 235-203 (.537) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a brief three-game homestand against San Francisco tonight...went 5-3 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-2) and Houston (4-1) and are now 18-7 (.720) in Oakland compared to 13-12 (.520) on the road...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Texas (2-2), Seattle (1-1) and Colorado (1-1)...are 6-9 over the last 15 road games after going 7-3 over the first 10...have a 2.85 ERA (72 er in 227.0 ip) in Oakland compared to a 4.38 ERA (99 er in 203.1 ip) on the road...have the third lowest home ERA in the majors...have yielded 18 home runs in 227.0 innings in the Coliseum (0.71 per nine innings) compared to 36 in 203.1 innings on the road (1.59 per nine innings)...are averaging 4.16 runs per game at home (104 r in 25 g) compared to 5.36 on the road (134 r in 25 g).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .238 (117-for-492) in 16 games since resuming play on Sept. 4 after hitting .224 over the first 34 contests...are batting .228 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...however, rank third in the majors in hit by pitches (34), fourth in walks (202) and eighth in triples (9)...have a .325 on-base percentage, which is .097 points higher than the team batting average...the largest difference in Oakland history is .096 points in 1999...have the ninth most strikeouts in the majors (448)...rank second in the majors in grand slams (4)...also rank fourth in RBI with the bases loaded (48), tied for fourth in extra base hits (7) and walks (6) and fifth in slugging (.682).

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 22-of-25 (88.0%) stolen base attempts, which is currently the best percentage in Major League history ahead of the 2007 Phillies (138-of-157, 87.9%)...A's opponents are 19-for-28 (67.9%), which is ninth lowest in the majors...A's pitchers are tied for fourth in the majors in pickoffs (5).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed four runs in the last three games and now have a 3.58 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the majors...rank third in opponents on-base percentage (.300), sixth in OPS (.688) and eighth in slugging (.388)...are tied for the fewest hit batters (13), have the second fewest home runs (54) and the third fewest walks (134).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed seven innings or fewer in all 50 games and have a streak of 58 games of seven innings or fewer dating

back to last year...however, have 254.0 innings pitched for the season, which is seventh most in the majors...that is an average of 5.08 innings per start and the fewest innings per start in Oakland history is 5.09 in 2018.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in their last nine games and have 21 for the season, which is fourth fewest in the majors...have a .988 fielding percentage after setting an Athletics record with a mark of .987 last year...have turned just 28 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors...are averaging 0.56 double plays per game and the lowest mark in Oakland history is 0.68 in 1981.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 9-1 (.900) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 22-18 (.550) when they start a right-hander...the record against lefties is second best in the majors (White Sox, 13-0) and the 10 games are tied for sixth fewest...have faced two left-handed starters over the last six games after facing none over the previous 12 contests.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lead the majors in walk-off wins (5), are tied for the lead in extra inning wins (5), tied for third in last at bat wins (8) and tied for fifth in comeback wins (14)...are 5-0 in extra inning games and now have a six-game winning streak in extra innings dating back to Sept. 18, 2019...that is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight...also lead the majors in wins when trailing after six innings (6), are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight (2), five (8) and four innings (10) and tied for third in wins when trailing after seven innings (3).

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's had the day off yesterday after playing 16 games in 13 days from Sept. 4-16...went 9-7 over that stretch, which marked the first time the A's played 16 games in 13 days since July 18-30, 1975...are 1-4 following a day off and have another day off on Monday...played three double-headers and 10 games over a seven-day span from Sept. 8-14 and went 6-4 in those games...it was the first time the A's played 10 games in seven days since June 16-22, 1966...played four games in three different cities in three different time zones over a span of 56 hours and 47 minutes from Sept. 13-15 and lost three of those four games...are in a season-ending stretch that began on Sept. 4 where they are scheduled to play 26 games over the final 24 days, which would be their most games over a 24-day stretch since July 21-Aug. 13, 1978 when they had 27 games in 24 days.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's lead the season series 3-0 after sweeping a three-game series in San Francisco, Aug. 14-16...it was their first three-game sweep of the Giants since June 17-19, 2011 in Oakland and their first three-game sweep in San Francisco since June 13-15, 2008...went 1-3 against the Giants last year for their first season series loss to San Francisco since 2015 (1-5)...lost both games in Oakland and split two games in San Francisco...over the previous 23 seasons of interleague play, the A's have won eight season series, lost five and split 10...are 67-60 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 36-26 in Oakland and 31-34 in San Francisco...are 27-31 at Oracle Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jake Diekman has not allowed a run in his 17 appearances (17.1 ip) and now has a career-high 21.0-inning scoreless streak...his 17.1 innings pitched are the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed...**Liam Hendriks** leads the majors with 13 saves and has converted each of his last 13 save opportunities since being charged with a blown save on Opening Night...**Tommy La Stella** has not struck out in his last 63 plate appearances and is averaging 23.75 plate appearances per strikeout for the season, which is more than double the next closest player (Arenado, COL 10.83).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1930** the A's clinch their second consecutive American League Championship with a 14-10 win over Chicago...in **1982** the A's strand a club record 17 baserunners in a nine inning game but come back to defeat Chicago 5-4 in the second game of a doubleheader...in **2000** Jason Giambi breaks Jose Canseco's single season RBI record as he drives in two runs in the A's 12-3 win at Baltimore...Giambi would go on to finish the season with 137 RBI...in **2002** Billy Koch saves his 40th game in the A's 7-4 win over Anaheim to become the first pitcher in major league history with 40 saves and 10 wins in the same season.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (4-2, 2.92 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...is 2-0 with a 0.69 ERA (1 er in 13.0 ip) over his last two starts...went 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA over his first three starts and was 1-2 with a 5.95 ERA in four starts in between (Aug. 12-29)...has a 2.92 ERA overall, which is fifth lowest among pitchers in the West divisions...the lowest ERA of his career is 3.02 in 2018 (47.2 innings)...the A's are 6-3 (.667) in his starting assignment this year and 21-13 (.617) over the last two years.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-1 with a 1.14 ERA (3 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland compared to 3-1 with a 4.56 ERA (13 er in 25.2 ip) in five starts on the road...has allowed all six of his home runs on the road...is now 8-10 with a 2.63 ERA (51 er in 174.2 ip) in 33 career games in the Coliseum, 10-11 with a 4.63 ERA (108 er in 210.0 ip) in 44 games in all other ballparks...has yielded just 11 home runs in 174.2 career innings in Oakland (0.57 per nine innings).

INTERLEAGUE: Had a no decision in his only interleague start this year on Aug. 17 at Arizona (5.1 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...is now 0-3 with a 3.46 ERA (21 er in 54.2 ip) in 10 career interleague starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has walked just one batter to lead off an inning and opponents are hitting .220 (11-for-50) in that situation...five of the six home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...four have been hit by left-handed hitters...has a .221 (29-for-131) opponents batting average with zero or one out, a .311 (19-for-61) average and four of his six home runs with two outs...has yielded a .143 average with two strikes.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed six of his 18 runs in the first inning...has a 6.00 ERA (6 er in 9.0 ip) in the first inning, a 2.23 ERA (10 er in 40.1 ip) from the second inning on...received 10 run of support in his last start after getting seven runs of support total over his previous four starts...has received two runs of support or fewer in 40 of his 64 career starts and is 4-20 in those games...is 14-1 in 24 career starts with run support of three runs or more...does not have a complete game in 64 career starts, including 59 with the A's...his streak of 59 consecutive starts with no complete games is sixth longest in Athletics history (5th is 64 by Bob Welch).

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Took the loss on Aug. 22 against Los Angeles (AL), which was his first loss since July 24, 2019 at Houston...it snapped a career-high five-game winning streak dating back to Aug. 11, 2019...had a 3.46 ERA and .229 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 14 games, including 11 starts...walked just 15 (2.08 per nine innings) while striking out 62 (8.58 per nine innings) in 65.0 innings.

SINCE THE SURGERY: Did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 16-10 with a 3.47 ERA (93 er in 241.0 ip) and is averaging 8.37 strikeouts per nine innings (224 so in 241.0 ip) in 48 games (39 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

2020 START-BY-START: He combined with five A's relievers on a nine-hit shut-out in the A's 3-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) **July 27** in Oakland...had a no decision as he tossed four innings...allowed five of the hits and walked a batter but ended up stranding five base runners (also had a GDP)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-2 win at Seattle **Aug. 2**...allowed a RBI single to Vogelbach in the first inning but then blanked the Mariners on two hits over his final 4.2 innings...retired 10 straight at one point...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 13-inning win over Houston **Aug. 7** in Oakland...allowed just one run, giving him one run or fewer in each of his first three starts, to become the first A's pitcher to begin the season in the starting rotation and allow one run or fewer in each of his first three starts since Gio Gonzalez in 2011 (April 3-14)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) **Aug. 12**...allowed a solo home run to Trout in the first and a La Stella RBI single and a Trout sacrifice fly in the third...had a 5-3 lead when he allowed a two-out home run to Rendon in the sixth...was relieved by Diekman following the home run...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss at Arizona on **Aug. 17**...allowed a solo home run to Peralta in the third and two more runs in the sixth on an Escobar RBI fielders choice and a Kelly RBI single...left trailing 3-0 but the A's scored once in the seventh and twice in the eighth to get him off the hook...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on **Aug. 22** in Oakland...allowed a run to score on a fielders choice in the first inning and then allowed three runs, one earned, in the second, including a Trout two-run double...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-2 loss in the first game of a doubleheader on **Aug. 29** at Houston...tossed 3.0 innings, which matched the shortest start of his career (third time, last: Sept. 13, 2019 at Texas)...allowed a three-run home run to Tucker in the first inning and a leadoff home run to Reddick in the fourth...combined with Diekman and Trivino on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Houston on **Sept. 7** in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed seven hits...did not walk a batter and struck out four.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 10-1 win at Texas in the first game of the doubleheader last Saturday...blanked the Rangers

on six hits and two walks over the first five innings to extend his scoreless streak to 12.0 innings...then allowed his only run in six innings of work on a Gallo solo home run in the sixth.

BASSITT vs. SAN FRANCISCO: Is 0-1 with a 3.09 ERA (11.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 0 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in two career starts...had a no decision in his last start, a 10-5 A's loss on Aug. 24, 2019 in Oakland...shut out the Giants on one hit over the first

four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he surrendered a two-out solo home run to Crawford in the fifth inning...also allowed a RBI single to Longoria in the sixth and was relieved by Diekman with two outs in the sixth and the score tied 2-2...took the loss in his other start, a 2-1 A's loss at San Francisco on July 25, 2015...allowed a solo home run to Bumgarner in the third inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the fourth...allowed a RBI single to Duffy in the sixth inning for the loss.

2019 RECAP: Saw the most extensive action of his five-year career, going 10-5 with a 3.81 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 28 games, including 25 starts...had career highs in every category except losses as he was 4-14 in 40 games over his first four years...had career lows in opponents on-base percentage (.303) and fewest walks per nine innings (2.94)...led the A's with 141 strikeouts, which were the most by an Oakland pitcher since Sonny Gray had 169 in 2015...tied an Oakland record and tied for third in the American League with 13 hit batters...shares the record with Barry Zito, who did it three times (2001, 2005 and 2006)...went 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .179 opponents average over his first five starts through May 16 and 3-3 with a 6.00 ERA and .249 opponents average over his next nine starts leading into the All-Star Break...then went 5-1 with a 3.26 ERA in 14 games after the break...his post-break ERA was seventh lowest in the AL among pitchers with 60 or more innings...began the season with 25 starts and concluded the year with three relief appearances...held left-handed hitters to a .209 batting average, which was sixth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 140 or more innings...however, surrendered 14 of his 21 home runs and issued 29 of his 47 walks to lefties...was 5-1 with a 2.65 ERA in 10 starts following an A's loss...turned three double plays, which tied for third among AL pitchers...opponents were successful in 10-of-12 (83.3%) stolen base attempts off him.

- The A's bullpen is 1-2 with three saves, a blown save and a 3.05 ERA (14 er in 41.1 ip) since play resumed on Sept. 4...was 10-2 with a 1.87 ERA over the first 34 games.
- Lead the majors with a 2.14 ERA, which is more than half a run lower than the next closest team (Dodgers, 2.73)...the lowest ERA's by a bullpen since 1920 are 1.75 by the Cardinals in 1942, 2.14 by the White Sox in 1967, 2.16 by the Dodgers in 1968 and 2.25 by the Pirates in 1972...the lowest by the A's is 2.35 in 1990.
- Has the lowest opponents OPS (.579), batting average (.200), slugging percentage (.312) and on-base percentage (.267) in the majors.
- Has converted 16-of-19 (84.2%) save opportunities...ranks second in the majors in save percentage and tied for second in saves.
- Has the fewest losses in the majors (4) and ranks second in fewest walks (59) and fewest home runs (16).
- First batters faced are 23-for-138 (.167) with 12 walks, four doubles and three home runs...has the lowest opponents OPS (.493) and on-base percentage (.232) against first batters in the majors and the second lowest batting average and slugging percentage (.261).
- Has allowed 16-of-57 (28.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the eighth lowest percentage in the majors.

- Has not allowed a run in his 17 appearances (17.1 ip) and now has a career-high 21.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year (previous: 14.2, May 11-June 18, 2016)...last allowed a run on Sept. 14, 2019 at Texas...his 17.1 innings pitched this year are the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed...the only pitchers in Major League history to have more innings in a season without allowing a run are Tyler Olson (20.0 ip, CLE 2017) and Karl Spooner (18.0 ip, BRO in 1954).
- Opponents are 7-for-57 (.123) with no extra base hits but he has issued 11 walks...has the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the majors among relievers (.123), the seventh lowest OPS (.388) and the ninth lowest batting average.
- Has held left-handed hitters to a .088 (3-for-34) batting average and .272 OPS.
- Has allowed a .179 (5-for-28) average with the bases empty, .069 (2-for-29) with runners on.
- Has not surrendered a home run since June 21, 2019 against Minnesota (Sano), a streak of 56 games, 47.1 innings and 210 batter faced without allowing a home run.
- Did not face the Giants earlier this year...had a loss in three outings last year (2.0 ip, 1 h, 3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 1 so).

Last Year: Began the season with Kansas City and was 0-6 with a 4.75 ERA in 48 relief appearances when he was traded to Oakland on July 27...went 1-1 with a 4.43 ERA in 28 games with the A's and had a 4.65 ERA in a career-high 76 relief appearances overall.
