ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and three of the last four games after losing three of the previous four...are 10-7 since resuming play Sept. 4 following a positive test for Covid-19...did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games)...are 32-19 (.627) overall, which is the third best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...are a season-high tying 13 games over .500 (third time, last: 29-16 on Sept. 12)...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 47th consecutive day and are a season-high tying seven games ahead of second place Houston (also Sept. 11)...have held at least a share of first place for 55 of 57 days this year (47 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third).

A'S CLINCH PLAYOFF SPOT: With a win last night coupled with a Seattle loss, the A's clinched a postseason berth for the third consecutive season, the sixth time in the last nine years, the 11th time in the last 21 years and the 29th overall...the only other team that has clinched their third straight postseason berth is the Dodgers (Yankees, Braves, Astros and Brewers can also join)...over the last nine years only the Dodgers have more (8 including this year) and over the last 21 years only the Yankees (16), Cardinals (13) and Dodgers (12) have more (Braves could also have 12)...the 29 postseason appearances are tied with the Cardinals for third most to the Yankees (55) and Dodgers (34).

MAGIC NUMBER FOR THE DIVISION: The A's magic number to clinch the American League West and a top three seed in the playoffs is two over Houston (A's won the season series with Houston 7-3 and would win the tiebreaker)...a win today and a Houston loss would give the A's their first AL West title since 2013...it would be their third in the last nine years, their seventh in the last 21 and their 17th overall...only the Yankees (19), Braves (19) and Dodgers (18) have more division championships.

HALF DAY/HALF NIGHT: The A's are scheduled to play their 26th day game of the season today, which is five more than any other team...are scheduled to play four more day games for a total of 30 day games and 30 night games in the 60-game schedule...the last time the A's played at least half of their games during the day was in 1960 when they played 78-of-155 (50.3%) during the day...the last team other than the Cubs to play at least half their games during the day was the Giants in 1994 (61-of-115, 53.0%).

A TALE OF TWO WESTS: The A's are 8-7 (.533) against the National League West compared to 24-12 (.667) against the American League West...the A's interleague mark is tied for 12th in the majors...however, their intradivision record (second tiebreaker for playoff seeding) is fourth best and trails the White Sox (25-11) and Rays (26-12) in the AL...are scheduled to play each of their next five games against the NL (today and tomorrow vs. San Francisco, Tuesday through Thursday at Los Angeles) before concluding the season with four games against Seattle in Oakland...have a 4.32 ERA (64 er in 133.1 ip) in interleague games compared to 3.15 against the AL...the A's went 11-9 (.550) in interleague play last year, which marked the second consecutive season and 14th time in 23 seasons Oakland finished with a winning record against the NL...are 236-203 (.538) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this brief three-game homestand against San Francisco...went 5-3 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-2) and Houston (4-1) and are now 19-7 (.731) in Oakland compared to 13-12 (.520) on the road...have the third best home record in the majors...the best home winning percentage in Oakland history is .704 in 2003 (57-24)...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Texas (2-2), Seattle (1-1) and Colorado (1-1)...are 6-9 over the last 15 road games after going 7-3 over the first 10...begin their final road trip of the regular season on Tuesday, a three-game trip to Los Angeles (NL)...have a 2.75 ERA (72 er in 236.0 ip) in Oakland compared to a 4.38 ERA (99 er in 203.1 ip) on the road...have the second lowest home ERA in the majors...have yielded 18 home runs in 236.0 innings in the Coliseum (0.69 per nine innings) compared to 36 in 203.1 innings on the road (1.59 per nine innings)...are averaging 4.23 runs per game at home (110 r in 26 g) compared to 5.36 on the road (134 r in 25 g).

OFFENSE: The A's have collected exactly six hits in five of the last six games and are now batting .227 for the season, which is sixth lowest in the majors...have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...however, rank third in the majors in hit by pitches (35), fifth in walks (205) and

tied for eighth in triples (9)...have a .324 on-base percentage, which is .097 points higher than the team batting average...the largest difference in Oakland history is .096 points in 1999.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 22-of-25 (88.0%) stolen base attempts, which is currently the best percentage in Major League history ahead of the 2007 Phillies (138-of-157, 87.9%)...A's opponents are 19-for-28 (67.9%), which is seventh lowest in the majors...A's pitchers are tied for fourth in the majors in pickoffs (5).

PITCHING: The A's had their second shutout in the last four games last night, their third in the last 14 and their fourth of the season...are tied for ninth in the majors in shutouts but have the third lowest ERA (3.50)...rank third in opponents on-base percentage (.299), fifth in OPS (.682) and eighth in slugging (.383)...have allowed the fewest home runs (54), are tied for the fewest hit batters (13) and have issued the third fewest walks (139)...A's starting pitchers are 9-5 with a 3.76 ERA (39 er in 93.1 ip) since play resumed on Sept. 4 after going 12-10 with a 4.84 ERA over the first 34 games.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in their last 10 games and have 21 for the season, which is fourth fewest in the majors...have a .988 fielding percentage after setting an Athletics record with a mark of .987 last year...have turned just 28 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors...are averaging 0.55 double plays per game and the lowest mark in Oakland history is 0.68 in 1981.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 9-1 (.900) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 23-18 (.561) when they start a right-hander...the record against lefties is second best in the majors (White Sox, 13-0) and the 10 games are tied for fourth fewest...have faced two left-handed starters over the last seven games after facing none over the previous 12 contests.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lead the majors in walk-off wins (5), are tied for the lead in extra inning wins (5), tied for third in last at bat wins (8) and tied for sixth in comeback wins (14)...are 5-0 in extra inning games and now have a six-game winning streak in extra innings dating back to Sept. 18, 2019...that is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight.

A'S vs. GIANTS: The A's have won the season series as they are 4-0 with two games remaining...have won more than four games against San Francisco just once (5-1 in 2007)...won the first game in Oakland last night after sweeping a three-game series in San Francisco, Aug. 14-16...it was their first three-game sweep of the Giants since June 17-19, 2011 in Oakland and their first three-game sweep in San Francisco since June 13-15, 2008...have outscored the Giants 36-16 and their most runs in a season against San Francisco is 37 in 2005...have hit 10 home runs, which matches their most (1999)...in 24 seasons of interleague play, the A's have won nine season series, lost five and split 10...are 68-60 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 37-26 in Oakland and 31-34 in San Francisco...are 27-31 at Oracle Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jake Diekman has not allowed a run in his 17 appearances (17.1 ip) and now has a career-high 21.0-inning scoreless streak...his 17.1 innings pitched are the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed...**Liam Hendriks** is tied for the Major League lead in saves (13) and has converted each of his last 13 save opportunities since being charged with a blown save on Opening Night...**Tommy La Stella** has not struck out in his last 67 plate appearances and is averaging 24.25 plate appearances per strikeout for the season, which is more than double the next closest player (Arenado, COL 10.42).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1931** Lefty Grove wins his 30th game in a 2-1 win over Chicago...in **1954** the Philadelphia A's play the Yankees in their last game at Connie Mack Stadium...in **1972** Dick Williams uses a club record 30 players and 10 pinch hitters in the A's 8-7, 15 inning loss to Chicago...in **1974** Reggie Jackson collects three hits, including the 1000th of his career, in a 4-3 loss at Kansas City...in **1988** Dave Stewart wins his 19th as the A's defeat the Minnesota Twins 5-3 to clinch their seventh AL West championship...in **2017** Matt Olson ties a Major League rookie record by homering in his fifth consecutive game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesús Luzardo (2-2, 4.32 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 11th appearance and ninth start of the season...is 1-2 with a 5.23 ERA (19 er in 32.0 ip), .280 (37-for-132) opponents batting average and eight home runs allowed over his last six starts after going 1-0 with a 2.60 ERA, .217 opponents batting average and one home run over his first four games...has walked two batters or fewer in all 10 of his appearances this year and all 14 in his career...is tied with Singer (KC) for the lead among Major League rookies in strikeouts (52) and ranks second in innings pitched (50.0)...the A's are 5-3 (.625) in his starting assignments.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 2.80 ERA (11 er in 35.1 ip) and .214 (27-for-126) opponents batting average in seven games, five starts, at home compared to 0-1 with a 7.98 ERA (13 er in 14.2 ip) and .348 (23-for-66) opponents average in three starts on the road...has allowed three home runs in 35.1 innings at home, six in 14.2 innings on the road...is now 2-1 with a 2.72 ERA (11 er in 36.1 ip) in eight career appearances in the Coliseum, 0-1 with a 5.26 ERA (15 er in 25.2 ip) in eight games on the road.

AMERICAN LEAGUE AND NATIONAL LEAGUE: Is 1-1 with a 3.09 ERA (11 er in 32.0 ip) in six games against American League teams compared to 1-1 with a 6.50 ERA (13 er in 18.0 ip) in four games against National League teams...the four interleague games are the first of his career...is 1-1 with a 2.66 ERA (13 er in 44.0 ip) in 12 career games against the AL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed eight of his nine home runs and issued 13 of his 14 walks to right-handed hitters...has allowed nine of his 10 career home runs and has 15 of his 17 walks against righties...opponents are hitting .300 (15-for-50) with three walks when leading off an inning...has allowed a .438 (7-for-16) average with runners in scoring position and two outs.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in three of his eight starts...his season RSA of 3.60 is ninth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings...is 1-2 in five starts with two runs of support or fewer, 2-0 in three starts with three runs of support or more.

2020 OUTING-BY-OUTING: Made his first two appearances of the season in relief (4.05 ERA) and is 2-2 with a 4.36 ERA (21 er in 43.1 ip) in eight starts since then...entered the game in the sixth inning in his first outing on **July 25** against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in the A's 4-1 loss...pitched in relief again **July 29** against Colorado in Oakland in a 5-1 A's loss...struck out a five in 3.2 innings and matched his career high in walks (2)...allowed a run in the eighth inning to snap a career-high 12.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2019...had a no decision in his first Major League start, a 5-1 A's win over Texas on **Aug. 4** in Oakland...at the age of 22 years and 309 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to start a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and matched his high with two walks...recorded his first Major League win in the A's 7-2 victory over Houston on **Aug. 9** in Oakland...at the age of 22 years and 314 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to win a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...allowed a two-run home run to Gurriel in 5.2 innings of work...had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning win at San Francisco **Aug. 14**...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high nine hits in 3.1 innings...walked a career-high tying two...yielded a solo home run to Longoria in the first and a three-run home run to Pence in the third...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win over Arizona on **Aug. 19** in Oakland...struck out a career-high seven in 6.1 scoreless innings...matched his high with two walks...scattered four hits and allowed just two base runners to advance into scoring position...was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 3-2 loss at Texas on **Aug. 24**...struck out a career-high tying seven and walked a career-high tying two for the sixth consecutive game...allowed a two-run single to Frazier in the bottom of the first and a solo home run to Kiner-Falefa in the bottom of the second but then retired 15 of the final 20 batters he faced without allowing a run...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-0 loss to San Diego on **Sept. 9** in Oakland...retired 12 of the first 13 batters he faced but then allowed four runs in the fifth inning on a two-run double by Grisham, a RBI double by Tatis and a RBI single by Hosmer...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 victory over Houston on **Sept. 9** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 100 pitches in a career-high 7.0 innings...matched his best with seven strikeouts...allowed a home run to Springer to start the game before retiring seven straight...set down 10 of the final 11 hitters, with the one exception being a Gurriel solo home run in the sixth.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-5 loss in the first game of the doubleheader last Monday at Seattle...struck out a career-high tying seven batters for the fourth time in his last five starts but allowed a career-high three home runs...blanked the Mariners on two hits over the first three innings and had a 5-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Torrens in the fourth...also yielded three runs in the fifth on a solo home run by Marmolejos and a two-run home run by Lewis...was relieved by Petit with two outs in the fifth and the A's leading 5-4.

a no decision in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 8-7, 10-inning win at San Francisco on Aug. 14, 2020...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high nine hits in 3.1 innings...walked a career-high tying two...yielded a solo home run to Longoria in the first and a three-run home run to Pence in the third...also allowed a two-run single to Longoria in the fourth and was relieved by Wendelken with runners on first and second and one out in the fourth and the A's trailing 6-0.

2019 RECAP: Had his season interrupted twice by a strained left shoulder but, after going 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games (nine starts) with three minor league teams, he was selected by Oakland on Sept. 9 after Las Vegas concluded its season...had no decisions, two saves, a 1.50 ERA and .119 opponents batting average in six relief appearances in his Major League debut...struck out 16 batters in 12.0 innings (12.00 per nine innings) and walked just three for a .196 on-base percentage...allowed two doubles and one home run for a .238 slugging percentage...left-handed hitters were 1-for-14 (.071) with no extra base hits, one walk and a .205 OPS...right-handed hitters batted .143 (4-for-28) with a .547 OPS...opponents hit .138 with his lone home run with the bases empty, .077 with runners on...they were 1-for-8 (.125) with runners in scoring position...allowed a .095 average with two strikes...did not inherit any runners and first batters faced were 1-for-5 (.200) with a walk.

2019 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Was a non-roster invitee with the A's during the spring and had a 0.93 ERA in four games before he was shut down with a supraspinatus muscle strain...was assigned to Single-A Stockton June 11 and appeared in two games with the Ports and three with Las Vegas before going on the injured list July 4...made one rehab start with the AZL A's Green before he was reinstated from the IL Aug. 10 and sent to Stockton...moved back to Las Vegas Aug. 15...combined to strike out 57 batters in 43.0 minor league innings (11.93 per nine innings)...walked just eight (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.13...his opponents batting average broke down to .132 (5-for-38) against left-handed hitters compared to .248 (31-for-125) with all four of his home runs against right-handers...had a .379 OPS against lefties, .675 against righties...all four of the home runs were solo shots...yielded a .132 average with runners in scoring position...tossed fewer than five innings in nine of his 11 appearances, but logged at least two innings each time...surrendered one run or fewer eight times...had more strikeouts than innings pitched seven times.

LHP Mike Minor (1-5, 5.40 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 11th appearance and 10th start of the season...it will be his fourth appearance and third start with the A's...was acquired from Texas on Aug. 31 with cash for two players to be named later and international slot money...is 1-0 with a 4.76 ERA and .184 opponents batting average in three games, two starts, with Oakland after going 0-5 with a 5.60 ERA and .248 opponents average in seven starts for the Rangers...tossed a two-hit shutout in his last start, a 9-0 A's win in seven innings in the second game of the doubleheader on Monday at Seattle (7.0 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 7 so)...is 3-2 with a 3.27 ERA (44.0 ip, 37 h, 17 r, 16 er, 9 bb, 41 so, 4 hr) in eight career appearances, including seven starts, against San Francisco...had a loss in his only start this year, a 9-2 Texas loss on July 31 at San Francisco (5.2 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...is 0-3 with a 6.33 ERA in five games, four starts, in interleague play.

- The A's bullpen is 1-2 with three saves, a blown save and a 2.89 ERA (14 er in 43.2 ip) since play resumed on Sept. 4...was 10-2 with a 1.87 ERA over the first 34 games.
- Leads the majors with a 2.12 ERA, which is more than half a run lower than the next closest team (Dodgers, 2.77) and more than a run lower than the third place team (Braves, 3.28)...the lowest ERA's by a bullpen since 1920 are 1.75 by the Cardinals in 1942, 2.14 by the White Sox in 1967, 2.16 by the Dodgers in 1968 and 2.25 by the Pirates in 1972...the lowest by the A's is 2.35 in 1990.
- Has the lowest opponents OPS (.575), batting average (.198), slugging percentage (.309) and on-base percentage (.266) in the majors.
- Has converted 16-of-19 (84.2%) save opportunities...ranks second in the majors in save percentage and tied for third in saves.
- Has the fewest losses in the majors (4) and ranks second in fewest walks (61) and fewest home runs (16).
- First batters faced are 23-for-140 (.164) with 13 walks, four doubles and three home runs...has the lowest opponents OPS (.491) and on-base percentage (.234) against first batters in the majors and the second lowest batting average and slugging percentage (.257).
- Has allowed 16-of-59 (27.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the majors.

- Has not allowed a run in his 17 appearances (17.1 ip) and now has a career-high 21.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year (previous: 14.2, May 11-June 18, 2016)...last allowed a run on Sept. 14, 2019 at Texas...his 17.1 innings pitched this year are the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed...the only pitchers in Major League history to have more innings in a season without allowing a run are Tyler Olson (20.0 ip, CLE 2017) and Karl Spooner (18.0 ip, BRO in 1954).
