OAKLAND ATHLETICS (33-19) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (25-26)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight and four of the last five games to improve to a season-high 14 games over .500 at 33-19 (.635)...that is the third best record in the American League and fourth best in the majors...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 48th consecutive day and are a season-high tying seven games ahead of second place Houston (also Sept. 11 and 19)...have held at least a share of first place for 56 of 58 days this year (47 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...are 11-7 (.611) since resuming play Sept. 4 following a positive test for Covid-19...did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games).

A'S CLINCH PLAYOFF SPOT: The A's clinched their third consecutive playoff appearance in game 51 on Friday...it is their sixth postseason appearance in the last nine years, their 11th in the last 21 and their 29th overall...the only other team that has clinched their third straight postseason berth is the Dodgers (Yankees, Braves, Astros and Brewers can also join)...over the last nine years only the Dodgers have more (8 including this year) and over the last 21 years only the Yankees (16), Cardinals (13) and Dodgers (12) have more (Braves could also have 12)...the 29 postseason appearances are tied with the Cardinals for third most to the Yankees (55) and Dodgers (34).

MAGIC NUMBER FOR THE DIVISION: The A's magic number to clinch the American League West and a top three seed in the playoffs is one over Houston (A's won the season series with Houston 7-3 and would win the tiebreaker)...either an A's win or a Houston loss today would give the A's their first AL West title since 2013...it would be their third in the last nine years, their seventh in the last 21 and their 17th overall...only the Yankees (19), Braves (19) and Dodgers (18) have more division championships...the last time Oakland clinched the West with more than six games remaining in the season was in 1990 when they clinched it with eight games left.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 9-1 (.900) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 24-18 (.571) when they start a right-hander...the record against lefties is second best in the majors (White Sox, 13-0) and the 10 games are tied for third fewest...have faced two left-handed starters over the last eight games after facing none over the previous 12 contests.

A TALE OF TWO WESTS: The A's are 9-7 (.563) against the National League West compared to 24-12 (.667) against the American League West...the A's interleague mark is tied for ninth in the majors...however, their intradivision record (second tiebreaker for playoff seeding) is fourth best and trails the White Sox (25-11) and Rays (27-12) in the AL...after today, the A's conclude interleague play with a three-game series at Los Angeles beginning Tuesday before closing out the regular season with a four-game series against Seattle in Oakland...have a 4.06 ERA (64 er in 142.1 ip) in interleague games compared to 3.15 against the AL...the A's went 11-9 (.550) in interleague play last year, which marked the second consecutive season and 14th time in 23 seasons Oakland finished with a winning record against the NL...are 237-203 (.539) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on this brief three-game homestand against San Francisco...went 5-3 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-2) and Houston (4-1) and are now 20-7 (.741) in Oakland compared to 13-12 (.520) on the road...have the third best home record in the majors...the best home winning percentage in Oakland history is .704 in 2003 (57-24)...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Texas (2-2), Seattle (1-1) and Colorado (1-1)...are 6-9 over the last 15 road games after going 7-3 over the first 10...begin their final road trip of the regular season on Tuesday, a three-game trip to Los Angeles (NL)...have a 2.64 ERA (72 er in 245.0 ip) in Oakland compared to a 4.38 ERA (99 er in 203.1 ip) on the road...have the second lowest home ERA in the majors (Twins, 2.62)...have yielded 18 home runs in 245.0 innings in the Coliseum (0.66 per nine innings) compared to 36 in 203.1 innings on the road (1.59 per nine innings)...are averaging 4.30 runs per game at home (116 r in 27 g) compared to 5.36 on the road (134 r in 25 g).

OFFENSE: The A's have collected exactly six hits in four straight and six of the last seven games (47-for-215, .219) and are now batting .227 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...have hit under .232 just once in franchise

history (.223 in 1908)...however, rank third in the majors in hit by pitches (36), tied for fourth in walks (209) and tied for seventh in triples (10)...have a .324 on-base percentage, which is .097 points higher than the team batting average...the largest difference in Oakland history is .096 points in 1999.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 23-of-26 (88.5%) stolen base attempts, which is currently the best percentage in Major League history ahead of the 2007 Phillies (138-of-157, 87.9%)...A's opponents are 19-for-28 (67.9%), which is seventh lowest in the majors...A's pitchers are tied for fifth in the majors in pickoffs (5).

PITCHING: The A's have tossed shutouts in back-to-back games for the first time since Sept. 18-20 of last year and now have a 24.0-inning scoreless streak...have three shutouts in the last five games, four in the last 15 and five for the season...are tied for fifth in the majors in shutouts and have the third lowest ERA (3.43)...rank third in opponents on-base percentage (.297), fourth in OPS (.677) and fifth in slugging (.380)...have allowed the fewest home runs (54), are tied for the fewest hit batters (13) and have issued the third fewest walks (139)...A's starting pitchers are 10-5 with a 3.53 ERA (39 er in 99.1 ip) in 18 games since play resumed on Sept. 4 after going 12-10 with a 4.84 ERA over the first 34 games.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just three errors in their last 16 games and have 22 for the season, which is fourth fewest in the majors...have a .988 fielding percentage after setting an Athletics record with a mark of .987 last year...have turned just 29 double plays, which is tied with the Reds for the fewest in the majors...are averaging 0.56 double plays per game and the lowest mark in Oakland history is 0.68 in 1981.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lead the majors in walk-off wins (5), are tied for the lead in extra inning wins (5), tied for fourth in last at bat wins (8) and tied for sixth in comeback wins (14)...are 5-0 in extra inning games and now have a six-game winning streak in extra innings dating back to Sept. 18, 2019...that is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight.

A'S vs. GIANTS: The A's have won the season series as they are 5-0 entering the final game today...have gone undefeated in a season series of six or more games four times in Oakland history (12-0 vs. NYY in 1990, 7-0 vs. DET in 2018, 7-0 vs. TOR in 2018, 7-0 vs. BAL in 2004)...Oakland's best record against the Giants is 5-1 in 2007...have won the first two games in Oakland after sweeping a three-game series in San Francisco, Aug. 14-16...it was their first three-game sweep of the Giants since June 17-19, 2011 in Oakland and their first three-game sweep in San Francisco since June 13-15, 2008...have outscored the Giants 42-16, which are their most runs against San Francisco in a season (37 in 2005)...have 11 home runs, which are also their most (10 in 1999)...in 24 seasons of interleague play, the A's have won nine season series, lost five and split 10...are 69-60 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 38-26 in Oakland and 31-34 in San Francisco...are 27-31 at Oracle Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jake Diekman has not allowed a run in his 18 appearances (18.1 ip) and now has a career-high 22.0-inning scoreless streak...in Major League history, the only pitcher to finish a season with more innings pitched without allowing a run is Tyler Olson, who had 20.0 scoreless innings for Cleveland in 2017...**Liam Hendriks** is tied for the Major League lead in saves (13) and has converted each of his last 13 save opportunities since being charged with a blown save on Opening Night...**Tommy La Stella** has hit safely in each of his last eight games (11-for-30, .367), which is one short of the longest hitting streak of his career (9, June 1-9, 2019)...has a career-high 17-game reaching base streak.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1902** the A's clinch their first American League Pennant...in **1975** Vida Blue wins 20 games for the third time in his career as he pitches eight innings in the A's 16-4 win at Kansas City...he would go on to win each of his final two starts to finish at 22-11...in **1991** Rickey Henderson walks for the 776th time in an A's uniform, breaking Sal Bando's Oakland career record...Henderson would finish his A's career with 1227 walks...in **2018** the A's defeated the Los Angeles Angels, 21-3...Marcus Semien has five RBI, Stephen Piscotty drives in four and eight players score two or more runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Minor (1-5, 5.40 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 11th appearance and 10th start of the season...it will be his fourth appearance and third start with the A's... was acquired from Texas on Aug. 31 with cash for two players to be named later and international slot money...is 1-0 with a 4.76 ERA (6 er in 11.1 ip) and .184 (7-for-38) opponents batting average in three games, two starts, with Oakland after going 0-5 with a 5.60 ERA and .248 opponents average in seven starts for the Rangers...his teams are 3-6 (.333) in his starts, including 1-1 (.500) with the A's.

GO THE DISTANCE*: Tossed a two-hit shutout in his last start in the second game of the doubleheader last Monday at Seattle...it was a seven-inning complete game, which marks the 10th time in Oakland history a pitcher had a complete game of fewer than eight innings...it's just the third time it has happened over the last 25 years (5.0, Tommy Milone on Aug. 27, 2013 at Detroit; 7.0, Bartolo Colón on April 23, 2013 at Boston)...it is the fourth shutout of fewer than nine innings along with Colon, Vida Blue (6.0 ip, April 9, 1971 vs. Kansas City) and Chuck Dobson (5.1 ip, June 11, 1968 at Cleveland)...it was his fourth career complete game (last: June 26, 2019 at Detroit) and his second shutout (April 16, 2019 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...the two hits were his fewest in a complete games (previous: 3, April 16, 2019 vs. Los Angeles-AL).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 0-3 with a 6.33 ERA (16 er in 21.1 ip) in five games, four starts, in interleague play compared to 1-2 with a 4.62 ERA (13 er in 25.1 ip) in five starts against American League West competition...is now 6-15 with a 3.94 ERA (78 er in 178.0 ip) in 37 career interleague appearances, including 27 starts.

BALLPARKS: Was 0-2 with a 3.38 ERA (7 er in 18.2 ip) in four starts at home for Texas...is 1-3 with a 6.75 ERA (21 er in 28.0 ip) in six games in all other ballparks...allowed two home runs in 18.2 innings at Globe Life Field and has seven in 28.0 innings in all other parks...is 0-1 with a 10.61 ERA (11 er in 9.1 ip) and three home runs allowed in 9.1 innings over three games in the Coliseum...is 1-4 with a 7.39 ERA (23 er in 28.0 ip) in eight career appearances, including five starts, in Oakland.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Picked up the win in his last start after starting the season 0-5 for the first time in his career...the five-game losing streak is tied for second longest in the majors this year and fell one short of his career high of six (Sept. 6, 2013 to May 7, 2014)...his five losses are tied for eighth most in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: Has a 2.67 ERA (8 er in 27.0 ip) over innings one through three...has yielded 12 of his 29 runs in the fourth inning (11 er in 8.0 ip, 12.38 ERA) and has a 9.15 ERA (20 er in 19.2 ip) from the fourth inning on...has allowed eight of his nine home runs and issued 14 of his 17 walks to right-handed hitters...opponents are hitting .302 (13-for-43) with five walks (.375 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...received nine runs of support in his last start after receiving just 15 run of support over his first eight starts...has received two runs of support or fewer in six of his nine...is 0-1 with a 3.72 ERA (8 er in 19.1 ip) in four starts on four days rest or fewer compared to 1-4 with an 6.16 ERA (18 er in 26.1 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

2020 GAME-BY-GAME: Started the Rangers second game of the season on **July 25** against Colorado and was the losing pitcher in the Rangers 3-2 loss... blanked the Rockies on one hit over the first three innings before allowing two runs, one earned, in the fourth...left after five innings trailing 2-1...lost his second consecutive start in a 9-2 decision at San Francisco on **July 31**... had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a Ruf RBI single in the second and a 2-1 lead when he allowed a three-run home run to Flores in the fifth...also allowed two runs in the sixth...lost his third consecutive start in a 6-4 loss in Oakland on **Aug. 6**...allowed a solo home run to Olson in the second and four more runs in the fourth, including a two-run single by Davis...struck out Ramón Laureano in the fifth inning for the 1,000th strikeout of his career...had his first no decision in the Rangers 4-2 win over Seattle on **Aug. 11**...did not allow a run in 4.0 innings and left with a 4-0 lead...allowed just one hit but walked three...fell to 0-4 on the season in a 6-4 loss to San Diego on **Aug. 18**...allowed a grand slam to Myers in the first and a two-run home run to Profar in the fourth...was relieved by Gibaut with two outs in the fourth and the Rangers trailing 6-0...was charged with his fifth loss in a 4-1 loss at Seattle on **Aug. 23**...allowed a solo home run to Lewis in the first, a solo home run to Nola in the second and a two-run home run to Haggerty in the fifth... left after six innings trailing 4-1...had a no decision in his final start with the Rangers, a 6-2 win over Los Angeles (NL) on **Aug. 28** in Texas...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and had a 2-0 lead when he was relieved by Rodriguez to start the seventh...Rodriguez allowed two runs for the blown save and the Rangers scored four times in the bottom of the seventh for the win...made his A's debut in relief on **Sept. 4** in a 7-0 loss to San Diego in Oakland...pitched the seventh inning and allowed a home run to each of the first two batters he faced (Tatis and Machado)...the last pitcher to do that in his A's debut was Wilmer Font on April 28, 2018...then retired each of the next three batters...it

was his first relief appearance since Sept. 30, 2017 with Kansas City against Arizona (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his 67th career relief appearance, 65 of which came with the Royals in 2017...had a no decision in his first start as an Athletic, a 5-4 loss to Houston in the second game of the doubleheader on **Sept. 8** in Oakland...had 4-0 lead when he hit Correa with the bases loaded in the fourth...was relieved by Petit with one out in the fourth, the bases loaded and the A's leading 4-1...Petit allowed all three runs to score.

LAST START: He tossed a two-hit, seven-inning complete game shutout in the A's 9-0 win at Seattle last Monday in the second game of the doubleheader...walked two batters and struck out a season-high eight...faced two batters over the minimum as Walton singled and was picked off in the third inning and White walked and was erased on a double play in the fifth...allowed just one base runner to advance into scoring position, a Lewis one-out double in the seventh.

MINOR vs. SAN FRANCISCO: Is 3-2 with a 3.27 ERA (44.0 ip, 37 h, 17 r, 16 er, 9 bb, 41 so, 4 hr) in eight career appearances, including seven starts...is 1-1 with a 2.63 ERA (7 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts in his home ballparks and 2-1 with a 4.05 ERA (9 er in 20.0 ip) in four games at Oracle Park...had a loss in his only start this year, a 9-2 Texas loss on July 31 at San Francisco...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a Ruf RBI single in the second inning...had a 2-1 lead when surrendered a three-run home run to Flores in the fifth...then allowed two more runs in the sixth on a Tromp RBI double and a Dubon RBI single.

2019 RECAP: Was a first-time All-Star and posted the best year of his career en route to earning Rangers Pitcher of the Year honors from the Dallas-Fort Worth chapter of the BBWAA...was 14-10 with a 3.59 ERA in 32 starts...recorded career highs in wins, innings (208.1) and strikeouts (200) in his second year with the Rangers...ranked among the American League leaders in complete games (t-3, 2), innings (t-4th, 208.1), ERA (6th, 3.59), opponents OPS (7th, .704), opponents batting average (8th, .244), opponents slugging percentage (9th, .395) and strikeouts (200)...opponents hit .214 with runners in scoring position, which was third lowest in the AL...is just the fifth pitcher in Rangers history to post back-to-back seasons of 28 or more starts, an ERA under 4.20, and a WHIP of less than 1.240...that list includes three Hall of Famers, and the other is in the Rangers Hall of Fame: Ferguson Jenkins in 1974-75, Gaylord Perry in 1976-77, Charlie Hough in 1985-86, and Nolan Ryan in 1989-90...his 365.1 innings pitched from 2018-19 are seventh most in the American League...finished second among league qualifiers in pitches per game (104.9)...his 23 GDP induced were second in the AL...the Rangers went 17-15 in his 32 starts.

- The A's bullpen is 1-2 with three saves, a blown save and a 2.70 ERA (14 er in 46.2 ip) since play resumed on Sept. 4...was 10-2 with a 1.87 ERA over the first 34 games.
- Leads the majors with a 2.08 ERA, which is more than half a run lower than the next closest team (Dodgers, 2.74) and more than a run lower than the third place team (Braves, 3.39)...the lowest ERA by an Oakland bullpen is 2.35 in 1990.
- Has the lowest opponents OPS (.570), batting average (.197), slugging percentage (.306) and on-base percentage (.264) in the majors.
- Has converted 16-of-19 (84.2%) save opportunities...ranks second in the majors in save percentage and tied for third in saves.
- Has the fewest losses in the majors (4) and ranks second in fewest walks (61) and fewest home runs (16).
- First batters faced are 24-for-143 (.168) with 13 walks, four doubles and three home runs...has the lowest opponents OPS (.494), slugging percentage (.259) and on-base percentage (.236) against first batters in the majors and the second lowest batting average.
- Has allowed 16-of-59 (27.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the majors.
