OAKLAND ATHLETICS (33-20) VS. LOS ANGELES DODGERS (38-16)

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 22, 2020 — DODGER STADIUM — 6:40 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last four games and four of the last six and are 33-20 (.623) for the season...that is the third best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...are 13 games over .500, which is one short of the season high of 14 (33-19 on Sept. 19)...have clinched the AL West and will spend each of the final 56 days of the season in sole possession of first...at the end of the season, will have spent 64 of 66 days with at least a share of first place or 97.0%

(56 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...that is the second highest percentage of days with at least a share of first in Oakland history to the 1988 A's (174 of 179 days, 97.2%)...are currently 6½ games ahead of second place Houston in the West, which is ½-game short of the season high of seven...the last time the A's won the West by more than six games was in 1990 when they won by nine...are 11-8 (.579) since resuming play Sept. 4 following a positive test for Covid-19...did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games).

AMERICAN LEAGUE WEST CHAMPS: With a loss by Houston on the A's day off yesterday, Oakland became the first team in the majors to clinch their division...it was the second time in Oakland history the A's clinched the American League West on an off day (1992)...the clinch came with seven games remaining in the season, which is the earliest the A's have clinched the division since 1990 when they did it with eight games remaining...this is the A's first AL West title since 2013...it is their third in the last nine years, their seventh in the last 21 and their 17th overall...this is the A's sixth postseason appearance in the last nine years, their 11th in the last 21 and their 29th overall...join the Dodgers and Yankees as the only teams to reach the postseason in each of the last three years (Braves, Astros and Brewers can also join)...over the last nine years only the Dodgers have more postseason appearances (8) and over the last 21 years only the Yankees (17), Cardinals (13) and Dodgers (12) have more (Braves could also have 12)...the 29 all-time postseason appearances are tied with the Cardinals for third most to the Yankees (56) and Dodgers (34).

PLAYOFF SEEDING: By winning the division, the A's have clinched a top three seed and will host one of the four American League Wild Card Series beginning a week from today...are 33-20, which is one-half game behind the current two seed (Chicago, 34-20) and two games behind the current number one seed (Tampa Bay, 36-19)...the tiebreaker is intradivision record and the A's 24-12 mark is one-half game behind Chicago (25-12) and one game behind Tampa Bay (27-13).

A TALE OF TWO WESTS: The A's are 9-8 (.563) against the National League West compared to 24-12 (.667) against the American League West...conclude interleague play with this three-game series with the Dodgers and then close out the season with a four-game series against the Mariners in Oakland...have a 4.64 ERA (78 er in 151.1 ip) in interleague games compared to 3.15 against the AL...have finished with a winning interleague record in each of the previous two seasons and 14 times in 23 seasons...are 237-204 (.537) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their final road trip of the season tonight, a three-game series against the Dodgers...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Texas (2-2), Seattle (1-1) and Colorado (1-1) and are 6-9 over the last 15 road games after going 7-3 over the first 10...are 13-12 (.520) on the road compared to 20-8 (.714) in Oakland...went 2-1 on the last homestand against San Francisco and are tied for the third best home record in the majors...the best home winning percentage in Oakland history is .704 in 2003 (57-24)...have a 3.05 ERA (86 er in 254.0 ip) in Oakland compared to a 4.38 ERA (99 er in 203.1 ip) on the road...have yielded 21 home runs in 254.0 innings in the Coliseum (0.74 per nine innings) compared to 36 in 203.1 innings on the road (1.59 per nine innings)...are averaging 4.21 runs per game at home (118 r in 28 g) compared to 5.36 on the road (134 r in 25 g).

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to six hits or fewer in seven of the last eight games and are batting .211 (52-for-247) over that span...are hitting .226 for the season, which is sixth lowest in the majors...have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...however, rank third in the majors in hit by pitches (38), tied for sixth in walks (212) and tied for seventh in triples (10)...

have a .323 on-base percentage, which is .097 points higher than the team batting average...the largest difference in Oakland history is .096 points in 1999...have been successful in 23-of-26 (88.5%) stolen base attempts, which is currently the best percentage in Major League history ahead of the 2007 Phillies (138-of-157, 87.9%).

PITCHING: The A's allowed a season-high 14 runs on Sunday against San Francisco after shutting out the Giants in back-to-back games on Friday and Saturday...also had seasons highs in hits (15), walks (8) and strikeouts (14) on Sunday...now have a 3.64 ERA for the season, which is sixth lowest in the majors...rank sixth in opponents on-base percentage (.301) and eighth in OPS (.687) and slugging (.385)...are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (57) and fewest hit batters (13) and have issued the third fewest walks (147).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 10-6 with a 3.88 ERA (45 er in 104.1 ip) in 19 games since play resumed on Sept. 4 after going 12-10 with a 4.84 ERA over the first 34 games...starters rank third in the majors in wins (22) and eighth in innings pitched (271.2)...however, have tossed seven innings or fewer in all 53 games and have a streak of 61 games of seven innings or fewer dating back to last year.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just three errors in their last 17 games and have 22 for the season, which is fourth fewest in the majors...have a .988 fielding percentage after setting an Athletics record with a mark of .987 last year...have turned just 29 double plays, which is tied with the Reds for the fewest in the majors...are averaging 0.55 double plays per game and the lowest mark in Oakland history is 0.68 in 1981.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are in a season-ending stretch that began on Sept. 4 where they are scheduled to play 26 games over the final 24 days, which would be their most games over a 24-day stretch since July 21-Aug. 13, 1978 when they had 27 games in 24 days...are 9-2 (.818) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 24-18 (.571) when they start a right-hander...the record against lefties is second best in the majors (White Sox, 13-0)...lead the majors in walk-off wins (5), are tied for the lead in extra inning wins (5), tied for fourth in last at bat wins (8) and rank eighth in comeback wins (14)...are 5-0 in extra inning games and now have a six-game winning streak in extra innings dating back to Sept. 18, 2019...that is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight.

A's vs. DODGERS: The A's and Dodgers meet for the first time since 2018 when the two clubs spit four games...split two games in Los Angeles from April 10-11 and two in Oakland from Aug. 7-8...have won two season series and split one over the previous eight years and are 8-3 over that span...have won six season series, lost three and split one and are 21-12 (.636) all-time against the Dodgers during the regular season...that is the best record by any team against the Dodgers (White Sox, 14-11, .560)...are 15-3 in Oakland and 6-9 in Los Angeles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jake Diekman has not allowed a run in his 18 appearances (18.1 ip) and now has a career-high 22.0-inning scoreless streak...in Major League history, the only pitcher to finish a season with more innings pitched without allowing a run is Tyler Olson, who had 20.0 scoreless innings for Cleveland in 2017...**Liam Hendriks** ranks second in the majors in saves (13) and has converted each of his last 13 save opportunities since being charged with a blown save on Opening Night...**Tommy La Stella** has struck out just twice in 85 plate appearances with the A's and nine times for the season...his average 22.44 plate appearances per strikeout is more than double the next closes player in the majors (LeMahieu, NYY 10.44).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1912** Eddie Collins steals six bases in a game for the second time in 11 days, an American League record that still stands today...in **1913** 19-year old Herb Pennock and Eddie Plank combine to blank Detroit 1-0 to clinch the AL pennant...in **1970** Joe Rudi has five hits in five at bats, including a pair of doubles, but the A's lose to Minnesota, 5-3...in **1989** Dave Stewart pitches seven innings in the A's 5-2 win at Minnesota to win his 20th game of the season and the 100th of his career...it is his third consecutive 20 win season with the A's...in **1996** Mark McGwire ties a major league record by homering twice in the 5th inning of the A's 13-11 win at Seattle...the second homer is a grand slam and his 52nd and final of the season.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (3-4, 5.86 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season, his first since going on the paternity list on Sept. 14...is 1-3 with a 10.80 ERA (24 er in 20.0 ip) and .356 (32-for-90) opponents batting average in five starts since missing his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness...was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA and .175 opponents batting average over his first four starts...allowed no home runs over his first four starts (23.0 ip) and has seven over his last five (20.0 ip)...has matched his career high in losses (4) and earned runs (28) and his 20 walks are three short of his high of 23 from last year.

THE AMERICAN LEAGUE WEST AND THE REST: Is 3-2 with a 4.21 ERA (17 er in 36.1 ip) in seven starts against American League West teams compared to 0-2 with a 14.85 ERA (11 er in 6.2 ip) in two starts against the NL West...his loss on Aug. 29 at Houston snapped a seven-game winning streak against AL West competition...is now 10-5 with a 3.88 ERA (56 er in 127.2 ip) in 32 games against the AL West in his career, compared to 8-8 with a 4.52 ERA (62 er in 123.1 ip) in 36 career games against non AL West teams...is 2-3 with a 6.75 ERA (24 er in 32.0 ip) in nine career interleague appearances, including six starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .195 (17-for-87) batting average and .536 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .349 (29-for-83) with a 1.072 OPS against left-handers...has allowed five of his seven home runs and issued 13 of his 20 walks to lefties...opponents are hitting .237 (22-for-93) with the bases empty, .312 (24-for-77) with five of his seven home runs with runners on...has allowed a .141 (13-for-92) average with two strikes and opponents are hitting .167 in that situation in his career...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number eight hitter (0-for-14).

THE FIRST TWO INNINGS: Has allowed 16 of his 28 runs this year in the first two innings of the game (16 er in 17.2 ip, 8.15 ERA)...opponents are a combined 25-for-77 (.325) in the first and second innings...has a 4.26 ERA (12 er in 25.1 ip) and .226 (21-for-93) opponents average from the third inning on.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.16 ERA (9 er in 25.2 ip) and .237 (23-for-97) opponents batting average in five starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 9.87 ERA (19 er in 17.1 ip) and .315 (23-for-73) opponents average in four starts on the road...has allowed two home runs in 25.2 innings in Oakland, five in 17.1 innings on the road...is now 6-1 with a 3.06 ERA (23 er in 67.2 ip) in 12 starts in the Coliseum over the last two years.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on eight days rest today...is 2-2 with a 3.41 ERA (11 er in 29.0 ip) in five starts on four days rest compared to 1-2 with a 10.93 ERA (17 er in 14.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in seven of his nine starts...received 10 of his 24 runs of support this year in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle...over the last two years, he has received two runs of support or fewer in 14 of his 25 starts and seven runs or more seven times...in his career, he is 12-1 in 15 starts when three runs of support or more.

THIS AND THAT: Was placed on the paternity list on Sept. 14 and was reinstated Sept. 17...was named American League Player of the Week for the week of Aug. 3-9 after going 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA in two starts...struck out 14, walked four and allowed six hits in 14.0 innings...it was his first career Player of the Week honor...is 17-10 with a 3.44 ERA (78 er in 204.0 ip) in 38 games, 36 starts, over the last three years after going 1-3 with a 6.32 ERA in 30 games, two starts, over his first two seasons...the A's are 5-4 (.556) in his starting assignments this year and 24-12 (.667) in his career.

2020 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-3, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) on Opening Day, **July 24** in Oakland...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the A's 13th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 15 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers)...was just the second foreign-born Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Ariel Prieto, April 2, 1997)...scattered two hits, a walk and hit a batter over the first three innings before allowing his only run in the fourth inning on a Goodwin RBI single...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Colorado **July 29** in Oakland...it was his first loss since April 29, 2019 at Boston and it snapped a five-game winning streak dating back to May 17, 2019...allowed a RBI single to Wolters in the second inning and a sacrifice fly to Hampson in the fourth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-1 victory at Seattle on **Aug. 3**...allowed a RBI double to Seager in the third inning but that would be the only run he would allow in seven innings of work...won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-1 win over Houston **Aug. 8** in Oakland...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits, his fewest hits allowed in a start of more than four innings in his career...retired the first four batters, allowed a double to Gurriel in the fourth, retired the next eight batters, allowed a single to Gurriel in the fifth and then retired the final nine batters...was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss at Arizona on **Aug. 18**...allowed a career-high nine runs on six hits and four walks in 1.2 innings...it was the shortest start of his career...al-

lowed five runs in the first inning, including a three-run home run by Ahmed, and four more in the second... had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) **Aug. 23** in Oakland...allowed a three-run home run to Ohtani in the third and a RBI single to Goodwin in the fifth...left trailing 4-2 but Oakland scored twice in the sixth to get him off the hook...lost his second consecutive decision in the A's 6-3 loss in the second game of the **Aug. 29** doubleheader at Houston...the two-game losing streak matched his career high and it marked the first time he lost back-to-back decisions since July 29-Aug. 30, 2018...allowed a bases loaded triple to Tucker in the first inning and a two-run home run to Springer in the second...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Houston in the first game of a doubleheader on **Sept. 8** in Oakland when the A's were the visiting team...shut out the Astros on four hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Brantley in the bottom of the fifth.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss at Texas on Sept. 13... Oakland scored a run in the first and he allowed a solo home run to Dietrich in the second...Tejeda followed with a double but he then retired 12 of the next 13 batters...the scored was tied 1-1 when he allowed a three-run home run to Odor in the sixth for the loss.

2019 RECAP: Went 9-2 with a 2.63 ERA in 16 starts in a season shortened due to an 80-game suspension for violating Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...his ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.230), on-base percentage (.282) and OPS (.646)...had career highs in wins, starts, strikeouts (103) and innings (96.0)...averaged 2.16 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.48 was a career high...surrendered eight home runs (0.75 per nine innings)...his 2.63 ERA was third lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 90 innings...using the same minimum, he ranked fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings, fifth in opponents OPS, sixth in slugging percentage (.364), ninth in on-base percentage and 10th in strikeout-to-walk ratio...averaged 9.66 strikeouts per nine innings, which was second highest in Oakland history (Gio Gonzalez, 9.94 in 2009) and third highest in Athletics history (Wes Stock, 9.77 in 1964) among pitchers with 90 or more innings...his 4.48 strikeout-to-walk ratio was fourth highest in Oakland history...had a .229 opponents batting average and .647 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .231 with a .645 OPS against left-handers.

LHP Sean Manaea (4-3, 4.50 ERA): Is 4-1 with a 2.25 ERA and .231 opponents batting average over his last five starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins are tied for second most in the majors over that span...went 0-2 with a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents average over his first five starts...has walked just seven batters in 48.0 innings, an average of 1.31 walks per nine innings...that is fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 45 or more innings pitched...has allowed seven runs over the first three innings of his starts (2.12 ERA) and 22 from the fourth inning on (8.35 ERA)...has a .209 average against left-handed hitters compared to .292 against right-handers...has issued six of seven walks and surrendered four of his five home runs to right-handers...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's loss at Colorado last Tuesday (5.2 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...is 0-2 with a 5.87 ERA (7.2 ip, 12 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 6 so, 2 hr) in two career starts against the Dodgers, both in 2018.

- The A's bullpen allowed a season-high eight runs on a season-high 11 hits on Sunday against San Francisco after yielding just seven runs (1.57 ERA) on 15 hits (.133 batting average) over the previous 14 games...the eight runs were the most allowed by the pen since Aug. 24, 2019 when they also allowed eight against San Francisco.
- Is now 1-2 with three saves, a blown save and a 3.91 ERA (22 er in 50.2 ip) since play resumed on Sept. 4...was 10-2 with a 1.87 ERA over the first 34 games.
- Leads the majors with a 2.42 ERA, which is nearly a half a run lower than the next closest team (Dodgers, 2.86)...the last Major League team with an ERA lower than 2.46 from its bullpen is the 1990 A's...compiled an Oakland record 2.35 ERA that year.
- Has the lowest opponents OPS (.594), batting average (.207), slugging percentage (.318) and on-base percentage (.276) in the majors.
- Has converted 16-of-19 (84.2%) save opportunities...is tied for second in the majors in save percentage and tied for third in saves.
- Has the fewest losses in the majors (4), ranks second in fewest home runs (17) and tied for second in fewest walks (66).
- First batters faced are 26-for-147 (.168) with 13 walks, four doubles and three home runs...has the lowest opponents OPS (.508), slugging percentage (.265) and on-base percentage (.242) against first batters in the majors and the second lowest batting average.
- Has allowed 18-of-61 (29.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the 10th lowest percentage in the majors.

- Has not allowed a run in his 18 appearances (18.1 ip) and now has a career-high 22.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year (previous: 14.2, May 11-June 18, 2016)...last allowed a run on Sept. 14, 2019 at Texas...his 18.1 innings pitched this year are the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed...in Major League history, the only pitcher to finish a season with more innings pitched without allowing a run is Tyler Olson, who had 20.0 scoreless innings for Cleveland in 2017.
- Opponents are 7-for-60 (.117) with no extra base hits but he has issued 11 walks...has the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the majors among relievers (.117), the seventh lowest OPS (.370) and the eighth lowest batting average.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .081 (3-for-37) batting average and .252 OPS...left-handers are batting .174 (4-for-23) with seven of his 11 walks and a .541 OPS.
- Has allowed a .161 (5-for-31) average with the bases empty, .069 (2-for-29) with runners on.
- Is tied for the most holds in the majors (12) after tying for the lead last year (31).
- Has not surrendered a home run since June 21, 2019 against Minnesota (Sano), a streak of 57 games, 48.1 innings and 213 batters faced without allowing a home run.
