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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (33-21) VS. LOS ANGELES DODGERS (39-16)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight after winning three in a row and are 4-5 over the last nine games...are 11-9 (.550) since resuming play Sept. 4 following a positive test for Covid-19...did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games)...are 33-21 (.611) for the season, which is the third best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...have clinched the AL West and will spend each of the final 56 days of the season in sole possession of first...at the end of the season, will have spent 64 of 66 days with at least a share of first place or 97.0% (56 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...that is the second highest percentage of days with at least a share of first in Oakland history to the 1988 A's (174 of 179 days, 97.2%).

AMERICAN LEAGUE WEST CHAMPS: The A's have clinched the American League West for the first time since 2013...this is their third AL West title in the last nine years, their seventh in the last 21 and their 17th overall...only the Braves (20), Yankees (19) and Dodgers (19) have more division titles...this is the A's sixth postseason appearance in the last nine years, their 11th in the last 21 and their 29th overall...join the Braves, Dodgers and Yankees as the only teams to reach the postseason in each of the last three years (Astros and Brewers can also join)...over the last nine years only the Dodgers have more postseason appearances (8) and over the last 21 years only the Yankees (17), Cardinals (13), Braves (12) and Dodgers (12) have more...the 29 all-time postseason appearances are tied with the Cardinals for third most to the Yankees (56) and Dodgers (34).

PLAYOFF SEEDING: By winning the division, the A's have clinched a top three seed and will host one of the four American League Wild Card Series beginning next Tuesday...are 33-21, which is one-half game behind the current two seed (Chicago, 34-21) and two games behind the current number one seed (Tampa Bay, 36-20)...the tiebreaker is intradivision record and the A's 24-12 mark is in a virtual tie with Chicago (25-13) and one game behind Tampa Bay (27-13)...the Rays have completed intradivision play and the White Sox have two games remaining with Cleveland today and tomorrow.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 9-2 (.818) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 24-19 (.558) when they start a right-hander...the record against lefties is second best in the majors (White Sox, 13-0) and the 11 games are tied for fourth fewest...have lost each of their last two games against lefties after winning each of the first nine.

A TALE OF TWO WESTS: The A's are 9-9 (.500) against the National League West compared to 24-12 (.667) against the American League West...conclude interleague play with this three-game series with the Dodgers and then close out the season with a four-game series against the Mariners in Oakland...have a 4.74 ERA (84 er in 159.1 ip) in interleague games compared to 3.15 against the AL...have finished with a winning interleague record in each of the previous two seasons and 14 times in 23 seasons...are 237-205 (.536) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on their final road trip of the season, which consists of this three-game series against the Dodgers...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Texas (2-2), Seattle (1-1) and Colorado (1-1) and are 6-10 over the last 16 road games after going 7-3 over the first 10...are 13-13 (.500) on the road compared to 20-8 (.714) in Oakland...return home following the game tomorrow for their final homestand, a four-game series against Seattle...went 2-1 on the last homestand against San Francisco and are tied for the third best home record in the majors...the best home winning percentage in Oakland history is .704 in 2003 (57-24)...have a 3.05 ERA (86 er in 254.0 ip) in Oakland compared to a 4.47 ERA (105 er in 211.1 ip) on the road...have yielded 21 home runs in 254.0 innings in the Coliseum (0.74 per nine innings) compared to 40 in 211.1 innings on the road (1.70 per nine innings)...are averaging 4.21 runs per game at home (118 r in 28 g) compared to 5.23 on the road (136 r in 26 g).

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to six hits or fewer in eight of the last nine games and are batting .204 (57-for-280) over that span...are hitting .224 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...however, rank third in the majors in hit by pitches (38), seventh in walks (215) and tied for seventh in triples (10)...have a .322 on-base percentage, which is .098 points higher than the team batting average...the largest difference in Oakland history is .096 points in 1999.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 21 runs and 26 hits in the last two games after allowing four runs and 28 hits over the previous five contests...now have a 3.69 ERA for the season, which is sixth lowest in the majors...rank seventh in opponents on-base percentage (.303) and 10th in OPS (.695) and slugging (.392)...allowed a season-high tying four home runs last night for the third time this year and all three games have come in Southern California (Aug. 10 and 11 at the Angels)...have allowed 61 home runs for the season, which is tied for fifth fewest in the majors...have the fewest hit batters (13) and the third fewest walks (151).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers rank third in the majors in wins (22) and eighth in innings pitched (275.2)...however, have tossed seven innings or fewer in all 54 games and have a streak of 62 games of seven innings or fewer dating back to last year...are averaging 5.10 innings per start and the fewest innings per start in Oakland history is 5.09 in 2018.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in the last six games after making just one over the previous 12...have 23 errors for the season, which is fourth fewest in the majors...have a .988 fielding percentage after setting an Athletics record with a mark of .987 last year...have turned just 32 double plays, which is tied with the Reds for the fewest in the majors...are averaging 0.59 double plays per game and the lowest mark in Oakland history is 0.68 in 1981.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 24-of-27 (88.9%) stolen base attempts, which is currently the best percentage in Major League history ahead of the 2007 Phillies (138-of-157, 87.9%)...opponents are 20-for-29 (69.0%), which is tied for eighth lowest in the majors...A's pitchers are tied for fifth in the majors in pickoffs (5).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have used a different lineup in each of the last 24 games after using 19 different lineups over the first 30 contests...lead the majors in walk-off wins (5), are tied for the lead in extra inning wins (5), tied for fourth in last at bat wins (8) and rank eighth in comeback wins (14)...are 5-0 in extra inning games and now have a six-game winning streak in extra innings dating back to Sept. 18, 2019...that is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight...are in a season-ending stretch that began on Sept. 4 where they are scheduled to play 26 games over the final 24 days, which would be their most games over a 24-day stretch since July 21-Aug. 13, 1978 when they had 27 games in 24 days

A's vs. DODGERS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2020 last night...last met in 2018 when the two clubs spit four games...split two games in Los Angeles from April 10-11 and two in Oakland from Aug. 7-8...have won two season series and split one over the previous eight years and are 8-4 over that span...have won six season series, lost three and split one and are 21-13 (.618) all-time against the Dodgers during the regular season...that is the best record by any team against the Dodgers (White Sox, 14-11, .560)...are 15-3 in Oakland and 6-10 in Los Angeles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jake Diekman has not allowed a run in his 18 appearances (18.1 ip) and now has a career-high 22.0-inning scoreless streak...in Major League history, the only pitcher to finish a season with more innings pitched without allowing a run is Tyler Olson, who had 20.0 scoreless innings for Cleveland in 2017...**Liam Hendriks** ranks second in the majors in saves (13) and has converted each of his last 13 save opportunities since being charged with a blown save on Opening Night...**Tommy La Stella** has struck out just twice in 89 plate appearances with the A's and nine times for the season...his average of 22.89 plate appearances per strikeout is more than double the next closest player in the majors (LeMahieu, NYY 10.16).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1950** the A's score 12 runs in the sixth inning of a 16-5 win over Washington...**Joe Astroth** has a grand slam and six RBI in the inning...in **1973** **Vida Blue** wins his 20th as the A's win at Chicago 10-5 to clinch their third consecutive AL Western Division title...in **1988** **Jose Canseco** steals his 40th base of the season in the A's 9-8, 14-inning win at Milwaukee...he becomes the charter member of baseball's 40/40 club, hitting 42 home runs and stealing 40 bases...in **2001** **Mark Mulder** wins his 20th game and the A's clinch their first ever AL Wild Card with a 7-4 win at Seattle...in **2003** the A's clinch their third AL West title in four years and the 13th in Oakland history as they defeat Texas, 4-3 in 10 innings.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (4-3, 4.50 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 10 starts...the ERA is currently the highest of his career (4.37 in 2017) as is his .273 opponents batting average (.268 in 2017)...is 4-1 with a 2.25 ERA (7 er in 28.0 ip) and .231 (24-for-104) opponents batting average over his last five starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins are tied for second most in the majors over that span...went 0-2 with a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents average over his first five starts...is tied for the team lead in starts.

DON'T WALK: Has walked just seven batters in 48.0 innings, an average of 1.31 walks per nine innings...that is the lowest mark of his career (1.79 in 2018) and is fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 45 or more innings pitched...has 41 strikeouts for a career-best 5.86 strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.29 in 2019), which ranks 10th in the majors using the 45.0-inning minimum...has five starts without a walk, four with one and three in his other...has walked just 46 batters in 238.1 innings over the last three years (1.74 per nine innings).

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Has allowed seven runs over the first three innings of his starts (29.2 ip, 2.12 ERA) and 22 from the fourth inning on (17 er in 18.1 ip, 8.35 ERA)...opponents are 23-for-106 (.217) over innings one through three and 28-for-81 (.346) from the fourth inning on...in 15 starts over the last two seasons, he has a 1.41 ERA (7 er in 44.2 ip) and .195 (30-for-154) opponents batting average over innings 1-3 and a 5.73 ERA (21 er in 33.0 ip) and .278 (37-for-133) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

LEFT AND RIGHT: His .273 opponents batting average breaks down to .209 (9-for-43) against left-handed hitters compared to .292 (42-for-144) against right-handers...has issued six of seven walks and surrendered four of his five home runs to right-handers...now has a .216 career opponents average with a .586 OPS against lefties, .256 with a .736 OPS against righties...has surrendered 58 of his 67 career home runs to righties.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in four starts during the day, 2-2 with a 5.47 ERA (16 er in 26.1 ip) and .336 (37-for-110) opponent average in six starts at night...is now 18-5 with a 3.22 ERA and .212 opponents batting average in 36 career day games compared to 21-26 with a 4.24 ERA and .269 opponents average in 60 career starts at night.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 3.91 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland, to 1-2 with a 5.16 ERA (13 er in 22.2 ip) and .315 (29-for-92) opponents average in five starts on the road...is now 21-13 in his career in the Coliseum compared to 18-18 on the road

AMERICAN LEAGUE AND NATIONAL LEAGUE: Is 2-1 with a 3.00 ERA (7 er in 21.0 ip) in four interleague starts compared to 2-2 with a 5.67 ERA (17 er in 27.0 ip) in six starts against the American League...however, is 5-8 with a 4.00 ERA (43 er in 96.2 ip) in 18 career starts against the National League compared to 34-23 with a 3.80 ERA in 78 games against the AL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .191 (17-for-89) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .347 (34-for-98) with six of his seven walks after that...has a .300 (15-for-50) batting average against batters leading off an inning but has issued just one walk...has yielded a .220 (28-for-127) average with the bases empty, .383 (23-for-60) with runners on...opponents are hitting .395 (15-for-38) with runners in scoring position and are 7-for-14 (.500) with RISP and two outs...entered the season with a .227 career opponents average with RISP, including .199 with RISP and two outs...opponents are hitting .329 with three of his five home runs with no outs, .236 with one or two out...has a .247 opponents average and three of his five home runs with two strikes.

THIS AND THAT: Has been charged with five unearned runs, which is tied for sixth most in the majors...has tossed fewer than six innings in nine of his 10 starts...is 0-3 in four starts with two runs of support or fewer, 4-0 in six starts with three or more...is now 4-29 in 47 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 35-2 in 48 starts with support of three or more...the A's are 6-4 (.600) in his starting assignments and are 10-5 (.667) over the last two years.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the season as the A's number two starter and took the loss in each of his first two starts, going 0-2 with a 7.00 ERA in July...his first loss on July 25 against Los Angeles (AL) was his first since Aug. 19, 2018 against Houston and it snapped a career-high tying five-game winning streak...lost again on July 31 at Seattle when he allowed a season-high five runs in 4.1 innings...it was the first time he lost consecutive decisions since May 25-30, 2018...then went 2-0 with a 5.06 ERA in five starts in August...walked three batters Aug. 10 at Los Angeles (AL), his only outing with more than one walk...also allowed a season-high seven hits in a season-low 2.2 innings in that contest...had his third straight no decision on Aug. 15 at San Francisco, giving him and 0-2 record, a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents batting average over his first five starts...then won each of his next four starts from Aug. 20-Sept. 10...allowed one earned run in each start and compiled a 1.61

ERA and .210 opponents average during the winning streak, which fell one short of his career high of five...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings Sept. 10 against Houston...retired each of the first 15 batters he faced before Reddick doubled to lead off the sixth...struck out a season-high seven batters on a season-high 89 pitches on Sept. 15 at Colorado but was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss...it snapped his four-game winning streak and it also snapped an eight-game winning streak in the month of September...it was his first September loss since Sept. 12, 2017 at Boston...is 2-1 with a 2.55 ERA (5 er in 17.2 ip) and .203 (13-for-64) opponents batting average in three starts in September...is now 10-3 with a 2.03 ERA (21 er in 93.1 ip) in 16 career starts in September...the wins are his most for any month and his ERA is his lowest.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Colorado on Sept. 15...blanked the Rockies on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Diaz in the fifth...also surrendered a sacrifice fly to Fuentes in sixth...Senzatela tossed a complete game six-hitter for Colorado.

2019 RECAP: Began the season on the 60-day injured list as he continued his recovery from Sept. 19, 2018 surgery on his left shoulder...went 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts before he was reinstated from the IL Sept. 1...made five starts with Oakland and was 4-0 with a 1.21 ERA and .160 opponents batting average...the ERA was second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched (Yates SD, 1.19) and fifth lowest in Oakland history...using the same minimum, the batting average was third lowest in the majors and sixth lowest in Oakland history...allowed two runs or fewer in all five starts, including one run or fewer four times, and four hits or fewer four times...struck out 30 batters in 29.2 innings and walked just seven (2.12 per nine innings)...had a .229 opponents on-base percentage and .280 slugging percentage.

RHP Mike Fiers (6-2, 4.67 ERA): Is 5-1 with a 3.41 ERA and two home runs over his last six starts after going 1-1 with a 6.86 ERA and six home runs over his first four starts...is 6-2 with a 4.67 ERA in 10 starts overall and is now 26-8 with a 4.01 ERA in 53 games, including 52 starts, as an Athletic...is tied for seventh in the majors in wins this year and his 26 wins dating back to Aug. 6, 2018 are tied for fourth in the majors over that span...has a 0.90 ERA and .145 opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game, a 6.88 ERA and .340 opponents average from the third inning on...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's win at Colorado a week ago today (6.0 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 so)...i 4-1 with a 2.00 ERA (36.0 ip, 19 h, 8 r, 8 er, 9 bb, 35 so, 3 hr) in six career appearances, including five starts, against the Dodgers...had a no decision in his last start, which was his A's debut on Aug. 8, 2018, a 3-2 Oakland win (5.1 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 8 so).

- Leads the majors with a 2.42 ERA, which is nearly a half a run lower than the next closest team (Dodgers, 2.82)...the last Major League team with an ERA lower than 2.46 from its bullpen is the 1990 A's...compiled an Oakland record 2.35 ERA that year.
- Has the lowest opponents OPS (.602) and slugging percentage (.323) in the majors and the second lowest batting average (.208) and on-base percentage (.279).
- Has converted 16-of-19 (84.2%) save opportunities...is tied for second in the majors in save percentage and tied for third in saves.
- Has the fewest losses in the majors (4), ranks second in fewest home runs (18) and third in fewest walks (69).
- First batters faced are 27-for-150 (.180) with 13 walks, four doubles and four home runs...has the lowest opponents OPS (.531) and on-base percentage (.244) against first batters in the majors, the second lowest batting average (.180) and third lowest slugging percentage (.287).
- Has allowed 18-of-62 (29.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the eighth lowest percentage in the majors.

- Has not allowed a run in his 18 appearances (18.1 ip) and now has a career-high 22.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year (previous: 14.2, May 11-June 18, 2016)...last allowed a run on Sept. 14, 2019 at Texas...his 18.1 innings pitched this year are the most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed...in Major League history, the only pitcher to finish a season with more innings pitched without allowing a run is Tyler Olson, who had 20.0 scoreless innings for Cleveland in 2017.
- Opponents are 7-for-60 (.117) with no extra base hits but he has issued 11 walks...has the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the majors among relievers (.117), the sixth lowest OPS (.370) and the seventh lowest batting average.
