OAKLAND ATHLETICS (34-21) VS. LOS ANGELES DODGERS (39-17)

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 24, 2020 — DODGER STADIUM — 6:40 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last six games and are now 12-9 (.571) since resuming play Sept. 4 following a positive test for Covid-19...did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games)...are 34-21 (.618) for the season, which is the second best record in the American League and third best in the majors...are 13 games over .500, which is one short of the season high of 14 (33-19 on Sept. 19)...have clinched the AL West and will spend each of the final 56 days of the season in sole possession of first...at the end of the season, will have spent 64 of 66 days with at least a share of first place or 97.0% (56 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...that is the second highest percentage of days with at least a share of first in Oakland history to the 1988 A's (174 of 179 days, 97.2%)...are currently 6½ games ahead of second place Houston in the West, which is ½-game short of the season high of seven...the last time the A's won the West by more than six games was in 1990 when they won by nine.

AMERICAN LEAGUE WEST CHAMPS: The A's have clinched the American League West for the first time since 2013...this is their third AL West title in the last nine years, their seventh in the last 21 and their 17th overall...only the Braves (20), Yankees (19) and Dodgers (19) have more division titles...this is the A's sixth postseason appearance in the last nine years, their 11th in the last 21 and their 29th overall...join the Braves, Dodgers and Yankees as the only teams to reach the postseason in each of the last three years (Astros and Brewers can also join)...over the last nine years only the Dodgers have more postseason appearances (8) and over the last 21 years only the Yankees (17), Cardinals (13), Braves (12) and Dodgers (12) have more...the 29 all-time postseason appearances are tied with the Cardinals for third most to the Yankees (56) and Dodgers (34).

PLAYOFF SEEDING: By winning the division, the A's have clinched a top three seed and will host one of the four American League Wild Card Series beginning next Tuesday...with a 34-21 record, are currently the number two seed ahead of Minnesota (35-22) and behind Tampa Bay (37-20)...have clinched a better intradivision record over Minnesota and Cleveland.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 14-13 (.519) on the road and have clinched at least a .500 record on the road for the third consecutive season...this is the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have finished .500 or better on the road in at least three straight seasons (1971-75, 1988-90, 2000-02)...are 1-1 on their final road trip of the season, which consists of this three-game series against the Dodgers...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Texas (2-2), Seattle (1-1) and Colorado (1-1) and are 7-10 over the last 17 road games after going 7-3 over the first 10...return home following the game tonight for the final homestand of the season, a four-game series against Seattle...went 2-1 on the last homestand against San Francisco and are 20-8 (.714) in Oakland, which is tied for the third best home record in the majors...the best home winning percentage in Oakland history is .704 in 2003 (57-24)...have a 3.05 ERA (86 er in 254.0 ip) in Oakland compared to a 4.45 ERA (109 er in 220.1 ip) on the road...have yielded 21 home runs in 254.0 innings in the Coliseum (0.74 per nine innings) compared to 43 in 220.1 innings on the road (1.76 per nine innings)...are averaging 4.21 runs per game at home (118 r in 28 g) compared to 5.26 on the road (142 r in 27 g).

A TALE OF TWO WESTS: The A's are 10-9 (.526) against the National League West compared to 24-12 (.667) against the American League West...conclude interleague play tonight and then close out the season with a four-game series against the Mariners in Oakland...have finished with a winning interleague record in each of the previous two seasons and 14 times in 23 seasons...have seven seasons with a losing record and have finished .500 twice (1998, 2003)...have a 4.70 ERA (88 er in 16.1 ip) in interleague games compared to 3.15 against the AL...are 238-205 (.537) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their ninth last at bat win of the season last night, which is tied for third most in the majors...lead the majors in walk-off wins (5), are tied for the lead in extra inning wins (5) and rank eighth in comeback wins (14)...are 5-0 in extra inning games and now have a six-game winning streak in extra innings dating back to Sept. 18, 2019...that is the A's longest

extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight...also lead the majors in wins when trailing after six innings (6), are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight (2), five (8) and four innings (10) and tied for third in wins when trailing after seven innings (3).

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to six hits or fewer in nine of the last 10 games and are batting .202 (63-for-312) over that span...are hitting .224 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...however, rank third in the majors in hit by pitches (38), tied for seventh in walks (218) and tied for eighth in triples (10)...have a .320 on-base percentage, which is .096 points higher than the team batting average...the largest difference in Oakland history is .096 points in 1999...have been successful in 25-of-28 (89.3%) stolen base attempts, which is currently the best percentage in Major League history ahead of the 2007 Phillies (138-of-157, 87.9%).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 25 runs in the last three games after yielding just four runs over the previous five contests...now have a 3.70 ERA for the season, which is sixth lowest in the majors...rank sixth in opponents on-base percentage (.302), ninth in OPS (.696) and 10th in slugging (.393)...have allowed 10 home runs in the last three games after yielding just one over the previous five...have surrendered 64 home runs for the season, which is tied for ninth fewest in the majors...have the fewest hit batters (13) and the third fewest walks (152).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are tied for third in the majors in wins (22) and rank eighth in innings pitched (281.2)...however, have tossed seven innings or fewer in all 55 games and have a streak of 63 games of seven innings or fewer dating back to last year...are averaging 5.12 innings per start and the fewest innings per start in Oakland history is 5.09 in 2018.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in the last seven games after making just one over the previous 12...have 23 errors for the season, which is fourth fewest in the majors...have a .988 fielding percentage after setting an Athletics record with a mark of .987 last year...have turned just 32 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors...are averaging 0.58 double plays per game and the lowest mark in Oakland history is 0.68 in 1981.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 9-2 (.818) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 25-19 (.568) when they start a right-hander...the record against lefties is second best in the majors (White Sox, 13-0) and the 11 games are tied for fourth fewest...have lost each of their last two games against lefties after winning each of the first nine.

A's vs. DODGERS: The A's have split the first two meetings of 2020...last met in 2018 when the two clubs spit four games...split two games in Los Angeles from April 10-11 and two in Oakland from Aug. 7-8...have won two season series and split one over the last nine years and are 9-4 over that span...have won six season series, lost three and split one and are 22-13 (.629) all-time against the Dodgers during the regular season...that is the best record by any team against the Dodgers (White Sox, 14-11, .560)...are 16-3 in Oakland and 6-10 in Los Angeles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jake Diekman had his scoreless streak snapped last night at a career-high 22.0-innings dating back to last year...ranks fourth in the majors among relievers in ERA (0.47)...**Liam Hendriks** is tied for the Major League lead in saves (14) and has converted each of his last 14 save opportunities since being charged with a blown save on Opening Night...**Tommy La Stella** is averaging 21.00 plate appearances per strikeout, which is more than double the next closest player in the majors (LeMahieu, NY 10.37)

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1975** Vida Blue wins his 21st game and Reggie Jackson hits two home runs as the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 13-2 to clinch their fifth consecutive AL West title...in **1988** Dave Stewart strikes out 11 in the A's 5-2 win at Milwaukee to win his 20th game of the season...in **2000** Jason Giambi hits the 5000th home run in Oakland history, a two-run shot in the sixth inning of a 3-2 A's loss at Seattle.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (6-2, 4.67 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Has won a team-leading six games and ranks among the Major League leaders in wins since he was acquired by the A's after the 2018 trading deadline...is 6-2 with a 4.67 ERA in 10 starts this year and is now 26-8 with a 4.01 ERA (130 er in 291.2 ip) in 53 games, including 52 starts, as an Athletic...is tied for seventh in the majors in wins this year and tied for 10th in winning percentage...his 26 wins dating back to Aug. 6, 2018 are tied for fourth in the majors over that span...his .765 winning percentage in two-plus seasons with Oakland is the best in Athletics history among pitchers with 30 or more decisions...is leading the A's in wins for the second consecutive season (had 15 last year) and is scheduled to make his 11th start today, which will tie Manaea for the team lead...the A's are 8-2 (.800) in his starting assignments this year and 38-14 (.731) when he starts in his career...went 1-1 with a 6.86 ERA and six home runs allowed over his first four starts but is 5-1 with a 3.41 ERA (13 er in 34.1 ip) and two home runs in six starts since then...has 34 strikeouts in 54.0 innings and his average of 5.67 strikeouts per nine is a career-low (6.04 in 2013) and fourth lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .278 opponents batting average breaks down to .252 (28-for-111) with a .725 OPS against left-handed hitters compared to .305 (32-for-105) with an .812 OPS against right-handers...has issued 10 of his 15 walks to lefties...has held the opposition to a .191 (9-for-47) batting average with runners in scoring position, including .053 (1-for-19) with RISP and two outs...now has a .185 (76-for-411) opponents average with RISP and two outs in his career...has a .193 (16-for-83) opponents batting average and one home run allowed the first time through the lineup, .331 (44-for-133) with seven home runs after that...opponents are hitting .321 (18-for-56) when leading off an inning but he has walked just two...has allowed a .342 (27-for-79) average and six of his eight home runs with no outs, .288 (21-for-73) with one out and .188 (12-for-64) with two outs...the opponents number three hitter is 3-for-26 (.115) but the clean-up hitter is 11-for-24 (.458).

HOME AND AWAY: Went 2-1 with a 6.20 ERA in four starts in Oakland and is currently 4-1 with a 3.74 ERA (14 er in 33.2 ip) in six starts on the road...is tied for the third most road wins in the majors...since joining the A's on Aug. 6, 2018, he is 14-2 with a 3.10 ERA and .226 opponents batting average in 26 starts in the Coliseum compared to 12-6 with a 5.02 ERA (77 er in 138.0 ip) and .270 (144-for-534) opponent average in 27 games at all other ballparks...is 15-4 with a 3.39 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 32 career games, including 31 starts, in the Coliseum...the 15 wins are his most in any ballpark.

THE FIRST TWO INNINGS: Has allowed one run in the first inning and one in the second and has a 0.90 ERA (2 er in 20.0 ip) and .145 (10-for-69) opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game...has yielded 10 of his 29 runs in the third inning and has a 6.88 ERA (26 er in 34.0 ip) and .340 (50-for-147) opponents average from the third inning on.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY AND THE AMERICAN LEAGUE WEST: Is 2-1 with a 3.18 ERA (6 er in 17.0 ip) in three interleague starts compared to 4-1 with a 5.35 ERA in seven starts against the American League West...is now 4-1 with a 1.95 ERA (8 er in 37.0 ip) in six career interleague starts with the A's and is 9-6 with a 2.84 ERA (43 er in 136.1 ip) and .222 (110-for-495) opponents average in 25 career interleague appearances...is 18-16 with a 5.52 ERA (200 er in 326.1 ip) in 62 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 57-45 with a 3.45 ERA (311 er in 810.1 ip) in 153 games against all other opponents.

THIS AND THAT: Has a run support average of 7.67 (46 rs in 54.0 ip), which is third highest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings...has induced just one double play and his average of 0.17 GDP per nine innings is fourth lowest...has tossed six innings or fewer in all 10 of his starts and has struck out four or fewer eight times.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS: Started the A's third game of the season on July 26 against Los Angeles (AL) and had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win...did not walk or strikeout a batter in 4.0 innings...it was his first career start with no walks and no strikeouts...allowed a season-high seven hits (first of six times)...tossed a season-high 6.0 innings in his second start on Aug. 1 at Seattle, a no decision in a 3-2 A's win...it was his first of six starts of 6.0 innings...had season-highs in runs (5) and home runs (3) and a season-low in innings pitched (3.2) on Aug. 11 at Los Angeles (AL) for his first loss...that gave him a 1-1 record and a 6.86 ERA over his first four starts...then won each of his next three starts from Aug. 16-26 (2.60 ERA)...walked a season-high three batters Aug. 21 against Los Angeles (AL)...struck out a season-high seven Aug. 26 at Texas...finished August 4-1 with a 4.36 ERA in six starts...tied for second in the majors in wins in August...it is the fifth time in his career he has won four games in a month, the fourth time in August (2012, 2014, 2019)...is now 24-10 with a 3.80 ERA in 45 career games in August...has no more than 14

wins in any other month...had his three-game winning streak snapped in the A's 5-3 loss to San Diego on Sept. 6...it also snapped a nine-game home winning streak, which tied for ninth longest in Oakland history...it was the longest by a starting pitcher since Mark Mulder had a 10-game streak from July 31, 2002-June 19, 2003...it was his first loss at home since April 20, 2019 vs. Toronto and he compiled a 2.99 ERA and .227 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned 16 starts from May 7, 2019 to Aug. 21, 2020...then won each of his next two starts (3.75 ERA)...tossed a season-high 100 pitches Sept. 11 at Texas.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win at Colorado on Sept. 16...retired each of the first seven batters he faced and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three straight singles to McMahon, Wolters and Tapia (RBI) in the third...that was the only run he would allow in six innings and the A's scored twice in the sixth for the win.

start, which was his A's debut on Aug. 8, 2018, a 3-2 Oakland win...retired each of the first 12 batters he faced, eight by strikeout, before Grandal homered to lead off the fifth inning...was relieved by Trivino with one out in the sixth inning and a runner on second with the A's leading 2-1...Trivino then allowed a run in the seventh inning for the blown save...tossed a no-hitter against the Dodgers on Aug. 21, 2015 in a 3-0 win for Houston...walked three and struck 10 out on a career-high 134 pitches...retired 21 straight batters following a third inning walk to Joc Pederson.

2019 RECAP: Was 15-4 with a 3.90 ERA in 33 starts in his first full season with the A's...ranked third in the American League in winning percentage (.789), sixth in opponents batting average (.243), tied for eighth in wins and 10th in OPS (.712) and on-base percentage (.304)...had career highs in wins, games (33), games started, innings pitched (184.2) and winning percentage...led the A's in wins, starts and innings pitched...became the first A's pitcher to win 15 games since Scott Kazmir had 15 in 2014 and the first to make 33 starts since Sonny Gray had 33 in 2014...his innings pitched were the most by an A's pitcher over the last three years...his .789 winning percentage was fourth best in Oakland history among pitchers with 15 or more decisions...his 30 home runs tied for 10th most in a season in Oakland history...struck out 126 batters, an average of 6.14 per nine innings...that was the third-lowest mark in the AL...had the fifth-lowest strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.38).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Chris Bassitt (5-2, 2.57 ERA): Has not allowed a run in two of his last three starts and is 3-0 with a 0.46 ERA over that span...all three starts have come in September and this is the first time he has won three games in a month in his career...went 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA over his first three starts and was 1-2 with a 5.95 ERA in four starts in between (Aug. 12-29)...among pitchers in the West divisions, he ranks third in ERA (2.57), tied for sixth in winning percentage (.714), tied for seventh in wins (5), and ninth in opponents batting average (.237)...in the majors, he ranks 10th in ERA...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-0 A's win over San Francisco last Friday in Oakland (6.2 ip, 3 h, 3 bb, 7 so)...is 1-4 with a 4.17 ERA (41.0 ip, 36 h, 21 r, 19 er, 23 bb, 27 so, 2 hr) in nine career appearances, including seven starts, against Seattle...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 3-2 A's win at Seattle on Aug. 2 (5.2 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 7 so).

- The A's bullpen is 2-2 with four saves, two blown saves and a 3.75 ERA (24 er in 57.2 ip) since play resumed on Sept. 4...was 10-2 with 13 saves, two blown saves and a 1.87 ERA over the first 34 games.
- Leads the majors with a 2.43 ERA, which is nearly a half a run lower than the next closest team (Dodgers, 2.83)...the last Major League team with an ERA lower than 2.46 from its bullpen is the 1990 A's...compiled an Oakland record 2.35 ERA that year.
- Has the lowest opponents OPS (.600), batting average (.207) and slugging percentage (.324) in the majors and the second lowest on-base percentage (.276).
- Has converted 17-of-21 (84.2%) save opportunities...ranks third in the majors in save percentage and tied for third in saves.
- Has the fewest losses in the majors (4), ranks second in fewest home runs (19) and third in fewest walks (69).
- First batters faced are 27-for-153 (.176) with 13 walks, four doubles and four home runs...has the lowest opponents OPS (.521) and on-base percentage (.240) against first batters in the majors and the second lowest batting average (.176) and slugging percentage (.281).
- Has allowed 18-of-62 (29.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the seventh lowest percentage in the majors.
