OAKLAND ATHLETICS (34-22) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (25-31)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last four games and are 5-6 over the last 11 contests...are 12-10 (.545) since resuming play Sept. 4 following a positive test for Covid-19...did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games)...are 34-22 (.607) for the season, which is the third best record in the American League and tied for fourth best in the majors...have clinched the AL West and will spend each of the final 56 days of the season in sole possession of first...at the end of the season, will have spent 64 of 66 days with at least a share of first place or 97.0% (56 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...that is the second highest percentage of days with at least a share of first in Oakland history to the 1988 A's (174 of 179 days, 97.2%).

AMERICAN LEAGUE WEST CHAMPS: The A's have clinched the American League West for the first time since 2013...this is their third AL West title in the last nine years, their seventh in the last 21 and their 17th overall...only the Braves (20), Yankees (19) and Dodgers (19) have more division titles...this is the A's sixth postseason appearance in the last nine years, their 11th in the last 21 and their 29th overall...join the Braves, Dodgers and Yankees as the only teams to reach the postseason in each of the last three years (Astros and Brewers can also join)...over the last nine years only the Dodgers have more postseason appearances (8) and over the last 21 years only the Yankees (17), Cardinals (13), Braves (12) and Dodgers (12) have more...the 29 all-time postseason appearances are tied with the Cardinals for third most to the Yankees (56) and Dodgers (34).

PLAYOFF SEEDING: By winning the division, the A's have clinched a top three seed and will host one of the four American League Wild Card Series beginning next Tuesday...with a 34-22 record, are currently the number three seed...are ½ game behind the current number two seed (Minnesota, 35-22) and 2½ games behind the current number one seed (Tampa Bay, 37-20)...with one more loss, the A's will be eliminated from the race for the number one seed (would be guaranteed to lose the third tiebreaker: last 20 intradivision games)...would win tiebreakers over Minnesota and Cleveland.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their final homestand of the season tonight with this four-game series against Seattle...are 20-8 (.714) in Oakland, which is tied for the third best home record in the majors...can finish with the best home winning percentage in Oakland history by winning at least three of the final four games...the current best is 57-24 (.704) in 2003...finished with a 14-14 (.500) record on the road for their third straight season with at least a .500 record on the road...this is the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have finished .500 or better on the road in at least three straight seasons (1971-75, 1988-90, 2000-02)...have a 3.05 ERA (86 er in 254.0 ip) in Oakland compared to a 4.49 ERA on the road...have yielded 21 home runs in 254.0 innings in the Coliseum (0.74 per nine innings) compared to 44 in 228.1 innings on the road (1.73 per nine innings)...are averaging 4.21 runs per game at home (118 r in 28 g) compared to 5.11 on the road...are hitting .222 (195-for-880) in Oakland, .222 on the road.

A TALE OF TWO WESTS: The A's are 24-12 (.667) against the American League West compared to 10-10 (.500) against the National League West...finished with a .500 record or better in interleague play for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...have a 3.15 ERA (107 er in 306.0 ip) against the AL West compared to a 4.75 ERA against the NL West...are 238-206 (.536) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher in three of the final four games of the season...are 9-2 (.818) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 25-20 (.556) when they start a right-hander...the record against lefties is second best in the majors (White Sox, 13-0)...have lost each of their last two games against lefties after winning each of the first nine.

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to six hits or fewer in 10 of the last 11 games and are batting .194 (66-for-341) over that span...are hitting .222 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...however, rank third in the majors in hit by pitches (38) and eighth in walks (221)... have a .318 on-base percentage, which is .096 points higher than the team batting average...the largest dif-

ference in Oakland history is .096 points in 1999...have been successful in 26-of-29 (89.7%) stolen base attempts, which is currently the best percentage in Major League history ahead of the 2007 Phillies (138-of-157, 87.9%).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 30 runs in the last four games (29 er in 34.0 ip, 7.68 ERA) after yielding just four runs over the previous five contests (0.86 ERA)...have a 3.7 ERA for the season, which is sixth lowest in the majors...rank seventh in opponents on-base percentage (.303), eighth in OPS (.697) and ninth in slugging (.394)...have allowed 11 home runs in the last four games after yielding just one over the previous five...have surrendered 65 home runs for the season, which is tied for ninth fewest in the majors...are tied for the fewest hit batters (14) and have the third fewest walks (156).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are tied for third in the majors in wins (22) and rank seventh in innings pitched (286.2)...however, have tossed seven innings or fewer in all 56 games and have a streak of 64 games of seven innings or fewer dating back to last year...are averaging 5.12 innings per start and the fewest innings per start in Oakland history is 5.09 in 2018.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 12 errors in the last eight games after making just one over the previous 12...have 23 errors for the season, which is fourth fewest in the majors...have a .988 fielding percentage after setting an Athletics record with a mark of .987 last year...have turned just 32 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors...are averaging 0.57 double plays per game and the lowest mark in Oakland history is 0.68 in 1981.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lead the majors in walk-off wins (5), are tied for the lead in extra inning wins (5), tied for third in last at bat wins (9) and tied for eighth in comeback wins (14)...are 5-0 in extra inning games and now have a six-game winning streak in extra innings dating back to Sept. 18, 2019...that is the A's longest extra inning win streak since June 17-Sept. 22, 2006 when they also won six straight...are 7-6 in one run games and the 13 one-run decisions are tied for fifth fewest in the majors...are 10-4 in two runs and the 14 two-run decisions are tied for second most...lead the majors in wins when trailing after six innings (6), are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight (2), five (8) and four innings (10) and tied for third in wins when trailing after seven innings (3).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have used a different lineup in each of the last 26 games after using 19 different lineups over the first 30 contests...are scheduled to play their fourth doubleheader in the month of September tomorrow...it will be their fifth of the season, which are the A's most doubleheaders in a season since 1986 when they also had five...are in a season-ending stretch that began on Sept. 4 where they are scheduled to play 26 games over the final 24 days, which would be their most games over a 24-day stretch since July 21-Aug. 13, 1978 when they had 27 games in 24 days

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lead the season series 4-2 with all six games coming in Seattle...went 10-9 against the Mariners last year for their first season series win over Seattle since 2012...went 6-2 in Oakland, 0-2 in Tokyo and 4-5 in Seattle...have won 14 of their last 21 games but are 60-79 (.432) against Seattle dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 364-303 against the Mariners...that includes 196-134 in Oakland, 167-166 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 91-102 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jake Diekman ranks third in the majors among relievers in ERA (0.47) and has the seventh lowest opponents slugging percentage (.172)...**Liam Hendriks** ranks second in the majors in saves (14) and has converted each of his last 14 save opportunities since being charged with a blown save on Opening Night...ranks fourth among Major League relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.181) and seventh in ERA (1.17)...**Tommy La Stella** is averaging 17.83 plate appearances per strikeout for the season, which is the best mark in the majors (LeMahieu, NYY 10.10).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire's ninth inning game tying homer breaks Reggie Jackson's Oakland home run record as it is his 48th of the year...he would go on to hit what was then a Major League rookie record 49 home runs...in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a five-hit shutout at Kansas City to win his 22nd game and clinch the A's third consecutive AL West title.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (5-2, 2.57 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Has spent the entire season on the active roster for the first time in his six-year career and is 5-2 with a 2.57 ERA in 10 starts...the ERA is currently the lowest of his career (3.02 in 2018) as is his .298 opponents on-base percentage (.303 in 2019)...has walked 17 batters in 56.0 innings for a career-low 2.73 walks per nine innings (2.94 in 2019)...among pitchers in the West divisions, he ranks second in ERA (Lamet, SD 2.07), tied for fifth in winning percentage (.714), tied for seventh in wins and 10th in opponents batting average (.237)...in the majors, he ranks eighth in ERA...is now 15-7 with a 3.47 ERA (77 er in 200.0 ip) in 38 games, including 35 starts, over the last two years.

LAST THREE/FIRST THREE: Has not allowed a run in two of his last three starts and is 3-0 with a 0.46 ERA (1 er in 19.2 ip) over that span...all three starts have come in September and this is the first time he has won three games in a month in his career...went 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA over his first three starts and was 1-2 with a 5.95 ERA in four starts in between (Aug. 12-29).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 0.89 ERA (3 er in 30.1 ip), .209 (24-for-115) opponents batting average and .536 OPS in five starts in Oakland compared to 3-1 with a 4.56 ERA (13 er in 25.2 ip), .270 (27-for-100) opponents average and .683 OPS in five starts on the road...has the lowest home ERA in the majors...has not allowed a home run in 30.1 innings in Oakland and now has an eight-game, 41.0-inning, 170-batter faced homerless streak in the Coliseum...is 9-10 with a 2.53 ERA (51 er in 181.1 ip) in 34 career games in the Coliseum, 10-11 with a 4.63 ERA (108 er in 210.0 ip) in 44 games in all other ballparks...has yielded just 11 home runs in 181.1 career innings in Oakland (0.55 per nine innings).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.41 ERA (5 er in 32.0 ip) in five starts at night compared to 2-2 with a 4.13 ERA (11 er in 24.0 ip) in five starts during the day...his night ERA is the lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 30 innings at night...is now 5-0 with a 2.64 ERA (19 er in 64.2 ip) over his last 12 games, 11 starts, at night dating back to July 19, 2019.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .237 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .236 (29-for-123) with a .633 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .239 (22-for-92) with a .763 OPS against left-handers...yielded four of his six home runs to lefties and has surrendered 18 of his 27 home runs over the last two years to lefties...has walked just one batter to lead off an inning and has held opponents to a .193 (11-for-57) batting average and .220 on-base percentage in that situation...the on-base percentage is fourth lowest in the majors...five of his six home runs have come with the bases empty...has a .256 (11-for-43) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, but that drops to .188 (3-for-16) with RISP and two outs...has a .200 (29-for-145) opponents batting average and two home runs with zero or one out, a .314 (22-for-70) average with four home runs with two outs...has a .122 opponent average with two strikes...has surrendered three of his six home runs to the opponents clean-up hitter.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed six of his 18 runs in the first inning...has a 5.40 ERA (6 er in 10.0 ip) in the first inning, a 1.96 ERA (10 er in 46.0 ip) from the second inning on...is 3-0 with a 2.41 ERA (5 er in 18.2 ip) in three starts following an A's loss and is 8-1 with a 2.59 ERA (22 er in 76.1 ip) in 13 starts over the last two years...has received 35 runs of support in his 10 starts for a run support average of 5.63...now has a 6.51 RSA in 35 starts over the last two years compared to a 2.67 ERA over his first 30 starts of his career...is 15-1 in 25 career starts with three runs of support or more, 4-20 in 40 starts with two runs of support or fewer...is 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA (11 er in 29.2 ip) in five starts on four days rest, 3-1 with a 1.71 ERA (5 er in 26.1 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more...does not have a complete game in 65 career starts, including 60 with the A's...his streak of 60 consecutive starts with no complete games is sixth longest in Athletics history (5th is 64 by Bob Welch)...has allowed one run or fewer in six of his 10 starts...the A's are 7-3 (.700) in his starting assignment this year and 22-13 (.629) over the last two years.

SINCE THE SURGERY: Did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 17-10 with a 3.38 ERA (93 er in 247.2 ip) and is averaging 8.39 strikeouts per nine innings (231 so in 247.2 ip) in 49 games (40 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the season as the A's fourth starter and combined with five A's relievers on a nine-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) on July 27...had a no decision as he tossed four innings...allowed just one run in a season-high 7.0 innings Aug. 7 against Houston but had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win...that gave him one run or fewer in each of his first three starts, to become the first A's pitcher to begin the season in the starting rotation and allow one run or fewer in each of his first three starts since Gio Gonzalez in 2011 (April 3-14)...also walked a season-high three batters (first of four times)...picked up his second win of the season

Aug. 12 at Los Angeles (AL), despite surrendering a season-high four runs in 5.2 innings...it extended his winning streak to a career-high five games dating back to Aug. 11, 2019...posted a 3.32 ERA and .228 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 13 games (10 starts)...the winning streak was snapped Aug. 22 against Los Angeles (AL) when he tossed a season-high 105 pitches...lost his next start on Aug. 29 at Houston when he tossed a career-low tying 3.0 innings (third time, last: Sept. 13, 2019 at Texas)...finished August 2-2 with a 4.18 ERA in six starts but is 3-0 with a 0.46 ERA (1 er in 19.2 ip) in three starts in September...it is the first time in his career he has won more than two games in a month...combined with Diekmann and Trivino on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Houston on Sept. 7...pitched a season-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed all seven of the hits...struck out a season-high eight in 6.0 innings a 10-1 win in the second game of the doubleheader at Texas on Sept. 12...allowed just one run but yielded a season-high eight hits.

LAST START: He combined with Petit, Wendelken and Weems on a three-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over San Francisco a week ago today in Oakland...tossed 6.2 innings and allowed all three hits...also walked three but allowed just three base runners as far as second base.

BASSITT vs. SEATTLE: Is 1-4 with a 4.17 ERA (41.0 ip, 36 h, 21 r, 19 er, 23 bb, 27 so, 2 hr) in nine career appearances, including seven starts...is 1-2 with a 4.55 ERA (15 er in 29.2 ip) in seven games in Seattle and 0-2 with a 3.97 ERA (5 er in 11.1 ip) in two starts in Oakland...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 3-2 A's win at Seattle on Aug. 2... allowed a RBI single to Vogelbach in the first inning but then blanked the Mariners on two hits over his final 4.2 innings...retired 10 straight at one point...Oakland scored three times in the fifth to take a 3-1 lead and he was relieved by McFarland with two outs in the sixth...was 0-2 with a 7.36 ERA (11.0 ip, 12 h, 10 r, 9 er, 6 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in three games, including two starts, last year.

2019 RECAP: Saw the most extensive action of his five-year career, going 10-5 with a 3.81 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 28 games, including 25 starts...had career highs in every category except losses as he was 4-14 in 40 games over his first four years...had career lows in opponents on-base percentage (.303) and fewest walks per nine innings (2.94)...led the A's with 141 strikeouts, which were the most by an Oakland pitcher since Sonny Gray had 169 in 2015...tied an Oakland record and tied for third in the American League with 13 hit batters...went 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .179 opponents average over his first five starts through May 16 and 3-3 with a 6.00 ERA and .249 opponents average over his next nine starts leading into the All-Star Break...then went 5-1 with a 3.26 ERA in 14 games after the break...his post-break ERA was seventh lowest in the AL among pitchers with 60 or more innings...began the season with 25 starts and concluded the year with three relief appearances...held left-handed hitters to a .209 batting average, which was sixth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 140 or more innings...was 5-1 with a 2.65 ERA in 10 starts following an A's loss.

- The A's bullpen is 2-2 with four saves, two blown saves and a 4.01 ERA (27 er in 60.2 ip) since play resumed on Sept. 4...was 10-2 with 13 saves, two blown saves and a 1.87 ERA over the first 34 games.
- Leads the majors with a 2.53 ERA...the last American League team to finish with an ERA under 2.55 is the 1990 A's...had an Oakland record 2.35 ERA that year.
- Has the lowest opponents batting average in the majors (.208) and the second lowest OPS (.605), slugging percentage (.326) and on-base percentage (.279).
- Has converted 17-of-21 (84.2%) save opportunities...ranks third in the majors in save percentage and tied for third in saves.
- Has the fewest losses in the majors (4), ranks second in fewest home runs (19) and third in fewest walks (72).
- First batters faced are 28-for-154 (.182) with 13 walks, four doubles and four home runs...has the lowest opponents OPS (.536) and on-base percentage (.244) against first batters in the majors, the second lowest batting average (.182) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.292).
- Has allowed 18-of-62 (29.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the eighth lowest percentage in the majors.
