ABOUT THE A'S: Have won five of the last eight games but are 6-6 over the last 12 contests...are 13-10 (.565) since resuming play Sept. 4 following a positive test for Covid-19...did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games)...are 35-22 (.614) for the season, which is the second best record in the American League and third best in the majors...have clinched the AL West and will spend each of the final 56 days of the season in sole possession of first...at the end of the season, will have spent 64 of 66 days with at least a share of first place or 97.0% (56 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third).

AMERICAN LEAGUE WEST CHAMPS: The A's have clinched the American League West for the first time since 2013...this is their third AL West title in the last nine years, their seventh in the last 21 and their 17th overall...only the Braves (20), Yankees (19) and Dodgers (19) have more division titles...this is the A's sixth postseason appearance in the last nine years, their 11th in the last 21 and their 29th overall.

PLAYOFF SEEDING: By winning the division, the A's have clinched a top three seed and will host one of the four American League Wild Card Series beginning next Tuesday...with a 35-22 record, are currently the number two seed...can clinch at least a number two seed with a sweep today or a split and a loss by the Twins...the Rays can clinch the number one seed with a win or an A's loss.

LET'S PLAY TWO...: The A's are scheduled to play their fourth doubleheader in the last 19 days today, their second against Seattle...it is their fifth of the season, which are their most doubleheaders since 1986 when they also had five...this will be the ninth doubleheader between the A's and Mariners...split a twin-bill in Seattle on Sept. 14 of this year (L, 5-6; W, 9-0) and have six splits and two sweeps (Aug. 3, 1984 and Aug. 6, 1978) over the previous eight...in their first four doubleheaders this year, the A's were swept at Houston on Aug. 29 and have split their last three: Sept. 8 vs. Houston, Sept. 12 at Texas, and Sept. 14 at Seattle...have swept just one doubleheader over the last 22 years (Sept. 9, 2017 vs. Houston) and have one sweep, 13 splits and have been swept seven times over that span.

...BUT JUST SEVEN INNINGS: Since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's have played fewer than nine innings in a game 24 times, including eight times this year...are 3-5 in those games this year and 10-13-1 overall...prior to this year, the most recent was on Aug. 27, 2013 at Detroit, a 6-3 A's win that was called with no outs in the top of the sixth...Mike Minor tossed a seven-inning complete game against the Mariners in the second game of the Sept. 14 doubleheader for the 10th complete game of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history...it was the third over the last 25 years (5.0, Tommy Milone on Aug. 27, 2013 at Detroit; 7.0, Bartolo Colón on April 23, 2013 at Boston).

HALF DAY/HALF NIGHT: The A's are scheduled to play their 28th and 29th day games of the season today, which are the most in the majors ahead of the Angels (24)...with a day game scheduled tomorrow, Oakland will play 30 of its 60 games during the day...the last time the A's played at least half of their games during the day was in 1960 when they played 78-of-155 (50.3%)...the last team other the Cubs to play at least half their games during the day was the Giants in 1994 (61-of-115, 53.0%).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their Major League leading sixth walk-off win of the season last night...improved to 6-0 in extra inning games and lead the majors in extra inning wins...are one of four teams that has not lost in extra innings (Padres, Twins, Reds)...now have a seven-game winning streak in extra innings dating back to Sept. 18, 2019...that is the A's longest extra inning win streak since May 11-June 26, 2004 when they also won seven straight...are tied for second in the majors in last at bat wins (10) and tied for seventh in comeback wins (15).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on their final homestand of the season against Seattle...are 21-8 (.724) in Oakland, which is tied for the second best home record in the majors...need two more wins to clinch the best home winning percentage in Oakland history (57-24/.704 in 2003)...finished with a 14-14 (.500) record on the road for their third straight season with at least a .500 record on the road...this is the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have finished .500 or better on the road in at least three straight seasons (1971-75, 1988-90, 2000-02).

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to six hits or fewer in 10 of the last 12 games and are batting .199 (75-for-376) over that span...are hitting .222 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...however, rank third in the majors in hit by pitches (38) and eighth in walks (226)...have a .319 on-base percentage, which is .097 points higher than the team batting average...the largest difference in Oakland history is .096 points in 1999...have been successful in 26-of-29 (89.7%) stolen base attempts, which is currently the best percentage in Major League history ahead of the 2007 Phillies (138-of-157, 87.9%).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.66 ERA, which is fifth lowest in the majors...rank fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.301), seventh in OPS (.691) and eighth in slugging (.390)...are tied for the fewest hit batters (14), have the third fewest walks (157) and are tied for the fourth fewest home runs (65)...A's starting pitchers are tied for third in the majors in wins (22) and rank seventh in innings pitched (293.2)...however, have tossed seven innings or fewer in all 57 games and have a streak of 65 games of seven innings or fewer dating back to last year...are averaging 5.15 innings per start and the fewest innings per start in Oakland history is 5.09 in 2018.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just four errors in the last 21 games and have 23 for the season, which is fourth fewest in the majors...have a .988 fielding percentage after setting an Athletics record with a mark of .987 last year...have turned just 33 double plays, which is tied with the Reds for the fewest in the majors...are averaging 0.58 double plays per game and the lowest mark in Oakland history is 0.68 in 1981.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 25-12 (.676) against the American League West compared to 10-10 (.500) against the National League West...are 10-2 (.833) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 25-20 (.556) when they start a right-hander...the record against lefties is second best in the majors (White Sox, 13-0)...have used a different lineup in each of the last 27 games after using 19 different lineups over the first 30 contests...are in a season-ending stretch that began on Sept. 4 where they are scheduled to play 26 games over the final 24 days, which would be their most games over a 24-day stretch since July 21-Aug. 13, 1978 when they had 27 games in 24 days.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lead the season series 5-2...won the first game in Oakland last night after going 4-2 in Seattle...need one more win to clinch the season series for the second consecutive season...have not won back-to-back season series from the Mariners since winning three straight from 2004-06...have won 15 of their last 22 games but are 61-79 (.436) against Seattle dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 365-303 against the Mariners...that includes 197-134 in Oakland, 167-166 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 91-102 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jake Diekman ranks second in the majors among relievers in ERA (0.44), fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.164) and tied for fifth in opponents batting average (.119)...**Liam Hendriks** ranks second in the majors in saves (14) and has converted each of his last 14 save opportunities since being charged with a blown save on Opening Night...**Tommy La Stella** is averaging 18.25 plate appearances per strikeout for the season, which is the best mark in the majors (LeMahieu, NYY 10.05).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1954** the Philadelphia Athletics play at New York in their last game ever and defeat the Yankees, 8-6...in **1971** Vida Blue strikes out four Milwaukee Brewers in his final start of the season to bring his season total to 301...he joins Rube Waddell, who struck out 302 batters in 1903 and 349 the following season, as the only two Athletic pitchers to fan 300 in a single season...in **1974** Jim Hunter tosses a seven-hitter to defeat the Minnesota Twins 2-1...it is his 25th win, which establishes an Oakland record, and is also his fourth straight 20-win season...in **1996** Terry Steinbach hits an inside the park home run in the A's 7-5 win over Seattle in the Coliseum...the home run ties Carlton Fisk's record for most home runs by an American League catcher, a record Steinbach would later break...in **2002** the A's clinch their second AL West title in the last three years and win their 100th game of the season with a 5-3, 10 inning win at Seattle...Miguel Tejada collects his 200th hit of the season in that game to become the first Oakland player to reach the 200 plateau.

TODAY'S GAME 1 STARTING PITCHER: Mike Minor (1-6, 5.92 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was 0-5 with a 5.60 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in seven starts with Texas when he was traded to the A's on Aug. 31 with cash for two players to be named later (minor league INF Dustin Harris and minor league OF Marcus Smith on Sept. 18) and international slot money... is 1-1 with a 6.61 ERA and .193 opponents batting average in four games, including three starts, with the A's...is 1-6 with a 5.92 ERA and .232 opponents average in 11 games overall...is tied for the third lowest winning percentage in the majors (.143) and tied for fifth in losses...will finish with a losing record for just the second time in his nine-year career (6-12 in 2014)...based on a minimum of 50 innings pitched, his ERA is fifth highest in the majors...has 55 strikeouts and 20 walks in 51.2 innings...his average of 9.58 strikeouts per nine innings is the second best mark of his career (10.20 in 2017) while his 3.48 walks per nine innings are the highest (3.27 in 2011).

OPPONENTS BATTING AVERAGE: His opponents batting average breaks down to .214 (12-for-56) against left-handed hitters compared to .239 (34-for-142) against right-handers...has yielded 10 of his 11 home runs to righties...seven of the 11 home runs have come the first time through the lineup...five have come with two strikes...has allowed a .244 average with runners in scoring position...has a .293 average with no outs, a .203 average with one out and .186 with two outs...over the last three years, his numbers are .291, .230 and .185...the opponents clean-up hitter is 3-for-25 (.120) and the six hitter is 1-for-21 (.048).

BY INNING: Has allowed just 10 runs over innings one through three for a 3.00 ERA (10 er in 30.0 ip)...has surrendered 14 of his 35 runs in the fourth inning (13 er in 9.0 ip, 13.00 ERA) and has a 10.67 ERA (24 er in 21.2 ip) from the fourth inning on...over the last two years, he has a 2.64 ERA (37 er in 126.0 ip) in innings one through three and a 5.37 ERA (80 er in 134.0 ip) from the fourth inning on

BY BALLPARK: Went 0-2 with a 3.38 ERA in four starts at home for Texas and allowed just two home runs in 18.2 innings...is 1-4 with a 7.36 ERA (27 er in 33.0 ip) in seven games in all other ballparks where he has allowed nine home runs in 33.0 innings...is 0-2 with a 10.67 ERA (17 er in 14.1 ip) in four games, three starts, at the Coliseum, which includes one start as a Ranger... is now 1-5 with a 7.91 ERA (29 er in 33.0 ip) and .227 (27-for-119) opponents batting average in nine career appearances in the Coliseum

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-5 with a 6.69 ERA (26 er in 35.0 ip) in seven starts during the day, 0-1 with a 4.32 ERA in four games at night...leads the majors in losses during the day and is tied for second in games started

AMERICAN LEAGUE AND NATIONAL LEAGUE: Is 1-2 with a 4.62 ERA (13 er in 25.1 ip) in five starts against the American League West compared to 0-4 with a 7.18 ERA in six interleague games...is now 6-16 with a 4.13 ERA in 38 career interleague appearances.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the season as the Rangers number two starter and took the loss in each of his first three starts...including July 31 at San Francisco when he allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high nine hits... also allowed six runs on Aug. 18 against San Diego and Sept. 20 against San Francisco and had nine hits on Aug. 18...struck out Ramón Laureano in the fifth inning on Aug. 6 at Oakland for the 1,000th strikeout of his career... tossed 4.0 scoreless innings Aug. 11 against Seattle but walked a season-high three batters, his first of three games with three walks...fell to 0-5 in a 4-1 loss at Seattle on Aug. 23...it marked the first time in his career he started the season 0-5 and the five game losing streak tied for fourth longest in the majors this year...compiled a 6.75 ERA and .261 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned six starts and fell one short of the longest losing streak of his career (6, Sept. 6, 2013 to May 7, 2014)...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his final start as a Ranger on Aug. 28 against Los Angeles (NL) but had a no decision in a 6-2 win... had a 2-0 lead when he was relieved by Rodriguez to start the seventh...Rodriguez allowed two runs for the blown save and the Rangers scored four times in the bottom of the seventh for the win...made his A's debut in relief on Sept. 4 in a 7-0 loss to San Diego... pitched the seventh inning and allowed a home run to each of the first two batters he faced (Tatis and Machado)...the last pitcher to do that in his A's debut was Wilmer Font on April 28, 2018...then retired each of the next three batters...it was his first relief appearance since Sept. 30, 2017 with Kansas City against Arizona (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his 67th career relief appearance, 65 of which came with the Royals in 2017...made his first start as an Athletic on Sept. 8 against Houston and yielded four runs in 3.1 innings, which was his shortest outing as a starter since July 15, 2018 at Baltimore (2.2 ip)...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss...struck out a season-high eight batters in back-to-back starts on Sept. 14 at Seattle and Sept. 20 against San Francisco...tossed a two-hit shutout in the game against the Mariners, a 9-0 A's win in the second game of the doubleheader...logged a season-high 102 pitches in a season-high 7.0 innings to mark the 10th time in Oakland history a pitcher had a complete game of fewer than eight innings...it's just the third time it has happened over the last 25 years (5.0, Tommy Milone on Aug.

27, 2013 at Detroit; 7.0, Bartolo Colón on April 23, 2013 at Boston)...it is the fourth shutout of fewer than nine innings along with Colon, Vida Blue (6.0 ip, April 9, 1971 vs. Kansas City) and Chuck Dobson (5.1 ip, June 11, 1968 at Cleveland)...it was his fourth career complete game, his second shutout and his low-hit complete game.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 14-2 loss to San Francisco last Sunday in Oakland...matched his season-highs in strikeouts (8) and runs (6)... retired each of the first seven batters before walking Basabe and allowing a two-run home run to Tromp in the third...also yielded a two-run home run to Ruf in the fourth and walked Belt and Ruf to start the sixth...was relieved by Wendelken with the A's trailing 4-0 and he allowed both inherited runners to score.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Frankie Montas (3-5, 6.32 ERA): Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and is 1-4 with a 10.88 ERA, .361 opponents average and 10 home runs in six starts since then...is 2-1 with a 3.16 ERA and .237 opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season, his eighth in a day game... was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-2 A's loss at Los Angeles (NL) on Tuesday (4.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...is 2-1 with a 3.47 ERA (23.1 ip, 20 h, 12 r, 9 er, 8 bb, 29 so, 2 hr) in six career appearances, including three starts, against Seattle...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, an 11-1 A's victory at Seattle on Aug. 3 (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 9 so).

TODAY'S GAME 2 STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (2020 debut)
