## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-24) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (27-32)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Were swept in the doubleheader yesterday and have now lost three of the last four games and five of the last seven...were 22-12 (.647) when the season was halted Aug. 30 following a positive test for Covid-19...did not play from Aug. 30 to Sept. 3 (four games) and are 13-12 (.520) since resuming play Sept. 4...are 35-24 (.593) for the season, which is tied for the third best record in the American League and tied for fifth best in the majors...with a win today, would finish with a .600 winning percentage, which would tie for the eighth best record in Oakland history...it would be the best since the 2002 club was 103-59 (.636)...it would be the equivalent of 97.2 wins over a 162-game season...a loss would be the equivalent of a 94.5 win season...finish the season by spending each of the final 56 days in sole possession of first...spent 64 of 66 days this year with at least a share of first place or 97.0% (56 days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...that is the second highest percentage of days with at least a share of first in Oakland history to the 1988 A's (174 of 179 days, 97.2%).

**AMERICAN LEAGUE WEST CHAMPS:** The A's have clinched the American League West for the first time since 2013...enter the final game of the season with a six-game lead over second place Houston...the last time the A's won the West by more than 5½ games was in 1992 when they won by six...have not won by more than six since 1990 when they won by nine...this is the A's third AL West title in the last nine years, their seventh in the last 21 and their 17th overall...only the Braves (20), Yankees (19) and Dodgers (19) have more division titles...this is the A's sixth postseason appearance in the last nine years, their 11th in the last 21 and their 29th overall...join the Astros, Braves, Dodgers and Yankees as the only teams to reach the postseason in each of the last three years (Brewers can also join)...over the last nine years only the Dodgers have more postseason appearances (8) and over the last 21 years only the Yankees (17), Cardinals (13), Braves (12) and Dodgers (12) have more...the 29 all-time postseason appearances are tied with the Cardinals for third most to the Yankees (56) and Dodgers (34).

**PLAYOFF SEEDING:** The A's are currently the number three seed in the American League playoffs and will host one of the four AL Wild Card Series beginning Tuesday...need a win today and a Minnesota loss to earn the number two seed...an A's loss or a Twins win means the A's would face the Astros...if the A's get the number two seed, they would face the third place team from the AL Central (Chicago or Cleveland).

**HALF DAY/HALF NIGHT:** The A's are scheduled to play their 30th day game of the season today, which are the most in the majors ahead of the Angels, who will play their 25th today...are 16-13 (.552) during the day, 19-11 (.633) at night...the last time the A's played at least half of their games during the day was in 1960 when they played 78-of-155 (50.3%)...the last team other than the Cubs to play at least half their games during the day was the Giants in 1994 (61-of-115, 53.0%).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's have lost back-to-back home games for the second time this year (July 28-29 vs. Colorado)...the last time they lost more than two straight at home was May 28-June 14, 2019 when they lost six straight...are 21-10 (.677) at home and with a win today, would finish with the second best home winning percentage in Oakland history to the 2003 A's, who went 57-24 (.704)...finished with a 14-14 (.500) record on the road for their third straight season with at least a .500 record on the road...this is the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have finished .500 or better on the road in at least three straight seasons (1971-75, 1988-90, 2000-02)...have a 3.30 ERA (102 er in 278.0 ip) in Oakland compared to a 4.49 ERA on the road...have yielded 25 home runs in 278.0 innings in the Coliseum (0.81 per nine innings) compared to 44 in 228.1 innings on the road (1.73 per nine innings)...are averaging 4.03 runs per game at home (125 r in 31 g) compared to 5.11 on the road.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's lost their first extra inning game since Sept. 6, 2019 against Detroit in the first game of the doubleheader yesterday...that snapped a seven-game winning streak in extra innings, which was the A's longest such streak since May 11-June 26, 2004 when they also won seven straight...lead the majors in walk-off wins (6) and extra inning wins (6), are tied for second in last at bat wins (10) and tied for seventh in comeback wins (15)...are 7-6 in one run games and the 13 one-run decisions are tied for sec-

ond fewest in the majors...are 11-4 in two run games and the 15 two-run decisions are second most...lead the majors in wins when trailing after six innings (6), are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight (2), five (8) and four innings (10) and tied for third in wins when trailing after seven innings (3).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .224, which is fifth lowest in the majors...have hit under .232 just once in franchise history (.223 in 1908)...however, rank third in the majors in hit by pitches (38) and seventh in walks (232)...have a .320 on-base percentage, which is .096 points higher than the team batting average...the largest difference in Oakland history is .096 points in 1999...have been successful in 26-of-29 (89.7%) stolen base attempts, which is currently the best percentage in Major League history ahead of the 2007 Phillies (138-of-157, 87.9%).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 4.32 ERA (98 er in 204.0 ip) since play resumed on Sept. 4 after posting a 3.51 ERA over the first 34 games...have a 3.84 ERA overall, which is sixth lowest in the majors...rank sixth in opponents on-base percentage (.303) and 10th in OPS (.699) and in slugging (.396)...are tied for the fewest hit batters (14) and have the third fewest walks (163)...A's starting pitchers are tied for third in the majors in wins (22) and rank seventh in innings pitched (301.0)...however, have tossed seven innings or fewer in all 59 games and have a streak of 67 games of seven innings or fewer dating back to last year...are averaging 5.10 innings per start and the fewest innings per start in Oakland history is 5.09 in 2018.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 24 errors, which is fourth fewest in the majors...have a .988 fielding percentage after setting an Athletics record with a mark of .987 last year...have turned just 33 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors...are averaging 0.56 double plays per game and the lowest mark in Oakland history is 0.68 in 1981.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 25-14 (.641) against the American League West compared to 10-10 (.500) against the National League West...are 10-3 (.769) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 25-21 (.543) when they start a right-hander...the record against lefties is second best in the majors (White Sox, 14-0)...have lost three of their last four games against lefties after winning each of the first nine...have used a different lineup in each of the last 29 games after using 19 different lineups over the first 30 contests...are in a season-ending stretch that began on Sept. 4 where they are scheduled to play 26 games over the final 24 days, which would be their most games over a 24-day stretch since July 21-Aug. 13, 1978 when they had 27 games in 24 days.

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The A's lead the season series 5-4...are 1-2 in Oakland after going 4-2 in Seattle...need a win today to clinch the season series for the second consecutive season...have not won back-to-back season series from the Mariners since winning three straight from 2004-06...have won 15 of their last 24 games but are 61-81 (.430) against Seattle dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 365-305 against the Mariners...that includes 197-136 in Oakland, 167-166 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 91-102 at T-Mobile Park.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Jake Diekman** ranks second in the majors among relievers in ERA (0.44), fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.164) and tied for fifth in opponents batting average (.119)...**Liam Hendriks** ranks second in the majors in saves (14) and has converted each of his last 14 save opportunities since being charged with a blown save on Opening Night...ranks fourth among Major League relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.187) and tied for 10th in strikeouts (37)...**Tommy La Stella** is averaging 18.83 plate appearances per strikeout, which is the best mark in the majors (LeMahieu, NYY 10.10)

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1912** Eddie Plank pitches 19 innings but the A's lose to Washington 5-4...in **1914** the A's defeat the St. Louis Browns 6-0 to clinch the American League pennant...in **1970** Reggie Jackson hits his 100th career home run in a 9-4 loss at California...he would go on to hit 563 home runs in his career...in **1989** Mike Moore, Rick Honeycutt and Gene Nelson combine on a four-hit shutout in a 5-0 victory over Texas to clinch the A's second consecutive AL West Championship.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (3-5, 6.32 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and is 1-4 with a 10.88 ERA (29 er in 24.0 ip), .361 (39-for-108) opponents average and 10 home runs in six starts since then...is 3-5 with a 6.32 ERA in 10 starts overall...his ERA is sixth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 45 innings pitched...using the same minimum, he has the seventh highest opponents on-base percentage (.354), the eighth highest OPS (.854) and the ninth highest slugging percentage (.500) and batting average (.282)...has career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and has matched his high in home runs (10)...the A's are 5-5 in his starting assignments...has two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average breaks down to .208 (20-for-96) against right-handed hitters compared to .359 (33-for-92) against left-handers...has surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 14 of his 21 walks to lefties for a 1.102 OPS (.610 against right-handers)...opponents are hitting .325 (27-for-83) with six of his 10 home runs with runners on base, .248 (26-for-105) with the bases empty...has allowed a .147 average with two strikes and has a .167 career opponent average in that situation.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-1 with a 3.16 ERA (9 er in 25.2 ip) and .237 (23-for-97) opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...has surrendered just two home runs in 25.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road...over the last two years, he is 6-1 with a 3.06 ERA and four home runs in 67.2 innings over 12 starts in Oakland, 6-6 with a 4.54 ERA and 14 home runs in 75.1 innings over 14 starts on the road

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Has made seven of his 10 starts during the day, which is third most in the majors...is 2-4 with a 7.31 ERA (26 er in 32.0 ip) during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night...his career numbers are 7-10 with a 5.55 ERA in 30 games during the day, 11-4 with a 3.41 ERA in 39 contests at night.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-2 with a 3.41 ERA (11 er in 29.0 ip) in five starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more.

**THE AMERICAN LEAGUE WEST AND THE REST:** Is 3-2 with a 4.21 ERA (1 er in 36.1 ip) and .246 (35-for-142) opponents batting average in seven starts against American League West competition, 0-3 with a 13.50 ERA and .391 opponents average in three interleague starts...is now 10-5 with a 3.88 ERA in 32 career appearances against AL West competition, 8-9 with a 4.74 ERA in 37 games against all other teams...is 2-4 with a 7.25 ERA in 10 career interleague appearances.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received two runs of support or fewer in eight of his 10 starts...had 10 of his 26 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and has a 4.98 RSA (26 rs in 47.0 ip) for the season...has won both of his starts with support of three or more runs and is now 12-1 in 15 career starts with at least three runs of support.

**2020 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and had a no decision in a 7-3, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (AL)...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the A's 13th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 15 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers)...was just the second foreign-born Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Ariel Prieto, April 2, 1997)...allowed just one run in 4.0 innings...took the loss in his second start on July 29 against Colorado, snapping a career-high five-game winning streak dating back to May 17, 2019...it was his first loss since April 29, 2019 at Boston...then picked up the win in back-to-back starts on Aug. 3 at Seattle and Aug. 8 against Houston for his only winning streak of the season...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings in each start...had season highs in strikeouts (9), pitches (99) and walks (4) in the start against the Mariners...was named AL Player of the Week for the week of Aug. 3-9 after going 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA in two starts...struck out 14, walked four and allowed six hits in 14.0 innings...it was his first career Player of the Week honor...was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA in four starts when he was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness...allowed a career-high nine runs on six hits and four walks in 1.2 innings in his next start on Aug. 18 at Arizona, which was his shortest career outing as a starter...that began a season-ending stretch where he is currently 1-4 with a 10.88 ERA in six starts...yielded a season-high seven hits Aug. 23 against Los Angeles (AL), his first of three games with seven hits...lost his second consecutive decision in the second game of the Aug. 29 doubleheader at Houston, snapping a seven-game winning streak against AL West competition...the two game losing streak matched his career high and it marked the first time he lost back-to-back decisions since July 29-Aug. 30, 2018...then defeated the Astros in his next start in the first game of the Sept. 8 doubleheader in Oakland but

is 0-2 with an 8.68 ERA (9 er in 9.1 ip) over his last two starts...was placed on the paternity list on Sept. 14...was reinstated Sept. 17 and allowed three home runs in a game for the first time in his career in his next start on Sept. 22 at Los Angeles (NL).

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss at Los Angeles (NL) on Tuesday...allowed three home runs in a game for the first time in his career...Oakland scored once in the first but he allowed a RBI single to Seager in the bottom of the first...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Muncy in the third...yielded solo home runs to Taylor and Pollock in the fourth and was relieved by McFarland to start the fifth with the A's trailing 5-2.

**MONTAS vs. SEATTLE:** Is 2-1 with a 3.47 ERA (23.1 ip, 20 h, 12 r, 9 er, 8 bb, 29 so, 2 hr) in six career appearances, including three starts...is 1-0 with a 1.00 ERA (1 er in 9.0 ip) in two games at Seattle and 1-1 with a 5.02 ERA (8 er in 14.1 ip) in four games in Oakland...was the

**2019 RECAP:** Went 9-2 with a 2.63 ERA in 16 starts in a season shortened due to an 80-game suspension for violating Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...his ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.230), on-base percentage (.282) and OPS (.646)...had career highs in wins, starts, strikeouts (103) and innings (96.0)...averaged 2.16 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.48 was a career high...surrendered eight home runs (0.75 per nine innings)...his 2.63 ERA was third lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 90 innings...using the same minimum, he ranked fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings, fifth in opponents OPS, sixth in slugging percentage (.364), ninth in on-base percentage and 10th in strikeout-to-walk ratio...averaged 9.66 strikeouts per nine innings, which was second highest in Oakland history (Gio Gonzalez, 9.94 in 2009) and third highest in Athletics history (Wes Stock, 9.77 in 1964) among pitchers with 90 or more innings...his 4.48 strikeout-to-walk ratio was fourth highest in Oakland history...had a .229 opponents batting average and .647 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .231 with a .645 OPS against left-handers.

Saves/Opportunities: 17-for-21 (81.0%)

- The A's bullpen is 3-3 with four saves, two blown saves and a 4.48 ERA (35 er in 70.1 ip) since play resumed on Sept. 4...was 10-2 with 13 saves, two blown saves and a 1.87 ERA over the first 34 games.
- Leads the majors with a 2.76 ERA...have not finished with an ERA under 2.90 since 1990 when the pen posted an Oakland record 2.35 ERA.
- Has the second lowest opponents OPS (.622), batting average (.210), slugging percentage (.340) and on-base percentage (.282) in the majors.
- Has converted 17-of-21 (81.0%) save opportunities...ranks third in the majors in save percentage and tied for fifth in saves.
- Has the fewest losses in the majors (5), ranks second in fewest home runs (23) and third in fewest walks (77).
- First batters faced are 30-for-163 (.184) with 13 walks, five doubles and five home runs...has the lowest opponents OPS (.550) and on-base percentage (.243) against first batters in the majors, the second lowest batting average and fifth lowest slugging percentage (.307).

- Allowed his first run of the season Wednesday night at Los Angeles (NL) when Seager homered with one out in the sixth...it was the first run he allowed since Sept. 14, 2019 at Texas and it snapped a career-high 22.0-inning scoreless streak, which was the longest by an A's reliever since Sean Doolittle had a 26.1 inning streak from April 29-June 27, 2014...his season-opening 18.1-inning scoreless streak tied for second longest in Oakland history by a player on the Opening Day roster.
- The home run was his first June 21, 2019 against Minnesota (Sano), a streak of 57 games, 48.1 innings and 214 batters faced without allowing a home run.
- Now has a 0.44 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors among relievers (Williams, MIL 0.33).
- The home run Wednesday was his first extra base hit allowed and opponents are 8-for-67 (.119)...his .164 opponents slugging percentage is fourth lowest in the majors and his batting average is tied for fifth...however, has issued 12 walks for a .253 on-base percentage.
