MOST WINS

A'S IN THE DIVISION SERIES: This is the A's ninth appearance in the Division Series, their first since 2013 against Detroit...have lost each of their last two ALDS appearances and six of eight overall...the two wins were in 1981 against Kansas City and 2006 against Minnesota...both of the wins were sweeps and all six losses have gone the full five games (2000, 01, 02, 03, 12, 13)...have an 18-20 record in the ALDS.

DOWN 0-2: The A's have started a postseason series 0-2 for the ninth time in Athletics history (last: 2012 ALDS)...have never come back to win a series after starting 0-2 and have been swept six times...the last time the A's were swept in a postseason series of more than one game was the 2006 ALCS against $\,$ Detroit (0-4)...have lost three straight games during the regular season just three times over the last 162 games dating back to June 4, 2019.

ELIMINATION GAMES: Today, the A's will be facing elimination for the 10th time in 19 postseason games dating back to 2012...are 4-5 in the previous nine games, including wins in back-to-back games in the 2020 ALWCS against Chicago after losing the first game...that snapped a five-game losing streak when facing elimination...are 5-10 when facing elimination dating back to 2000.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in four of the five games this postseason and are 1-2 with a 5.31 ERA (12 er in 20.1 ip) and .344 (31-for-90) opponents batting average...have allowed seven home runs but have walked just three in 20.1 innings...over the last three years, starters have logged fewer than five innings in six of seven postseason games and are 1-4 with a 6.94 ERA (18 er in 23.1 ip), .346 (36for-104) opponents average, 11 home runs and four walks in 23.1 innings.

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .206 (32-for-155) with 19 runs scored in five postseason games (3.8 runs per game)...did not have an at bat with runners in scoring position yesterday and are 3-for-20 (.150) with RISP...are now batting .204 (45-for-221) with 22 runs in seven postseason games over the last three years (3.1 runs per game), including .100 (3-for-30) with RISP.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have used 34 different lineups over the last 35 games dating back to Aug. 25 after using 19 different lineups over the first 30 games...the only repeat over the last 35 games was Game 3 of the ALWCS and Game 1 of the ALDS...have used six different players in the three spot over the last seven games...A's pitchers have allowed more home runs than walks in three of the five postseason games this year and have a total of 11 home runs and nine walks in 45.0 innings...have yielded 17 home runs and walked just 15 in 62.0 innings in seven games over the last three years...the A's bullpen has a win, a loss, two saves, a blown save and a 3.65 ERA (10 er in 24.2 ip) this postseason...is 5-4 with six saves, three blown saves and a 4.13 ERA (45 er in 98.0 ip) in 30 games dating back to Sept. 4...including the regular season, the A's are 12-4 (.750) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 26-23 (.531) when they start a

MORE THAN ONE GAME: Prior to this year, each of the A's previous three postseason appearances were one-game Wild Card appearances, all losses (2014, 18, 19)...today will be the A's sixth game this postseason, which marks just the second time over the last 28 years the A's have played more than five postseason games in a season...the other time came in 2006 when they had seven (swept the ALDS against Minnesota, were swept in the ALCS against Detroit).

OAKLANDAYS: The A's have played day games in each of their five postseason games this year (starting times: 12:08, 12:10, 12:10, 1:08, 1:37)...today marks the A's sixth straight postseason day game, which is their longest such streak since playing eight straight from Oct. 20, 1973 (WS G#6) to Oct. 13, 1974 (WS G#2)...closed out the regular season with three consecutive day games and today is the A's ninth straight day game, which is their longest streak at any point since 1973 when their final two regular season games and first seven postseason games were day games (credit: Elias)...played 30 of their 60 regular season games during the day, which was five more than any other team...became the first team other than the Cubs to play at least half their games during the day since the Giants in 1994 (61-of-115, 53.0%)... the last time the A's played at least half of their games during the day was in 1960 when they played 78-of-155 (50.3%).

NEUTRAL SITE GAMES: This series with the Astros is the A's first postseason series featuring neutral site games...have played 14 neutral site games during the regular season since moving to Oakland in 1968, including six home games in Tokyo (2008, 12 and 19), six home games in Las Vegas (1996) and two road games at County Stadium in Milwaukee against the White Sox (1968 and 69)...are now 5-11 (.313) in neutral site games in Oakland history.

DODGER STADIUM: The A's have played five games at Dodger Stadium this year and have allowed 14 home runs in 43.0 innings (2.93 per nine innings)... have hit eight home runs but are batting .179 (28-for-156)...have played six postseason games at Dodger Stadium, including these two against Houston plus four against the Dodgers in the World Series (1974 and 1988)...split Games 1 and 2 in 1974 and lost Games 1 and 2 in 1988...are 7-11 (.389) at Dodger Stadium during the regular season and 8-16 (.333) overall.

GO THE DISTANCE: Each of the A's previous six postseason series (including three one-game Wild Card games) have ended with a winner-take-all game. snapped a Major League record nine-game losing streak in winner-take-all postseason games with a win over Chicago in the ALWCS this year...it was the A's first victory in a winner-take-all postseason game since Game 7 of the 1973 World Series, a 5-2 win over New York...10 of the A's previous 12 postseason series have gone the distance.

POSTSEASON STRUGGLES: The win over Chicago in the ALWCS was just the A's second in their last 14 postseason series (also 2006 ALDS against Minnesota)...have lost 15 of their last 17 postseason games with a chance to clinch the series (includes one-game wild card games)...won 11 of their first 15 postseason series in Oakland through the 1990 ALCS.

POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE: With appearances by T.J. McFarland and Jordan Weems in Game 1 on Monday, 27 of the 28 players on the A's Division Series roster have now appeared in a postseason game...the exception is Jonah Heim...six players have played for the A's in each of the last three postseasons (Canha, Davis, Hendriks, Laureano, Olson, Semien)...La Stella has the most postseason experience as this is his fifth year (has played 17 games).. Soria (13 games), Diekman (11 games) and Hendriks (7 games) have played in four postseasons.

A's vs. ASTROS: This series is the first postseason meeting between the A's and Astros...Oakland won the season series during the regular season this year for the first time since 2014 as they went 7-3 (.700)...that was the A's best record against Houston since going 15-4 (.789) in 2013...went 7-1 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...were originally scheduled to play three games in Houston but the final game was postponed following an A's positive Covid-19 test and made up as a doubleheader in the Coliseum on Sept. 8...the seven home wins matched the A's most against the Astros (2013)...have won 13 of their last 18 regular season games against Houston dating back to Aug. 15, 2019...the A's won each of the first four season series (31-13) but lost five straight from 2015-19 (37-58)...are 75-74 all-time during the regular season, including 42-35 in Oakland and 33-39 in Houston.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1972 the A's go into the bottom of the 11th inning of Game 1 of ALCS trailing 2-1 but score twice to defeat the Detroit Tigers 3-2...a pinch hit single by Gonzalo Marquez drove in the tying run and Gene Tenace scored the winning run on a throwing error on the play...in 1973 Sal Bando homers twice in Game 2 of the ALCS as the A's defeat Baltimore 6-3 to even the series at one game each...Bert Campaneris has a homer and two singles and steals two bases...in 1989 Rickey Henderson homers twice and drives in four runs and Jose Canseco homers into the fifth deck at the SkyDome as the A's defeat Toronto 6-5 in Game 4 of the ALCS...in 1992 Harold Baines homers in the ninth inning to give the A's a 4-3 win over Toronto in Game 1 of the ALCS...Baines has three hits and the A's score all their runs on homers as Mark McGwire and Terry Steinbach also homer.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: JESÚS LUZARDO (0-1, 8.10 ERA IN POSTSEASON)

POSTSEASON: Is scheduled to make his second appearance and start of the postseason...it is the third postseason outing of his career as he pitched in relief in the Wild Card game last year...is 0-1 with a 4.26 ERA (3 er in 6.1 ip) in his two career postseason appearances...joins Jarrod Parker (2012) and Sonny Gray (2013) as the only rookie pitchers in Athletics history to make two postseason starts...his first start came in Game 1 of the ALWCS against Chicago and it was one day before his 23rd birthday, which made him the third youngest pitcher to start a postseason game in Oakland history and the eighth youngest in Athletics history...made his postseason debut last year in the Wild Card game against Tampa Bay and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings of relief (1 h, 2 bb, 4 so)...that appearance came two days after his 22nd birthday, making him the second-youngest pitcher in Oakland postseason history...Rich Harden had two outings in 2003, with the youngest coming at 21 years and 305 days.

TRENDING: Is 1-3 with a 4.84 ERA (19 er in 35.1 ip) in seven games, including six starts, dating back to Aug. 24 after going 2-0 with a 3.67 ERA over his first six games, including four starts...allowed two home runs in the ALWCS, both to right-handed hitters...has surrendered 10 of his 11 home runs this year and 11 of 12 in his career to righties...is 0-1 with an 8.15 ERA (16 er in 17.2 ip), .338 (26-for-77) opponents average, 1.032 OPS and six home runs in 17.2 innings in four games, three starts, on the road this year...has walked two batters or fewer in 12 of his 13 appearances this year and 19 of 20 in his career...has walked just 17 batters in 62.1 innings this year (2.48 per nine innings) and 22 in 77.1 career innings (2.56 per nine innings).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in Game 1 of the ALWCS against Chicago on Sept. 29 in Oakland, a 4-1 A's loss...allowed a solo home run to Engel in the second and a two-run home run to Abreu in the third...was relieved by Wendelken after allowing a one-out double to Engel in the fourth...left trailing 3-0 as Giolito retired each of the first 18 Athletics.

so, 3 hr) in two starts this year...the win came in a 7-2 A's win in Oakland on Aug. 9...it was his first Major League win and, at the age of 22 years and 314 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to win a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...blanked the Astros on two hits over the first three innings before allowing a two-run home run to Gurriel in the fourth...those were the only runs he would allow in 5.2 innings...then had a no decision in the A's 3-2 victory in Oakland on Sept. 9...tossed a career-high 100 pitches in a career-high 7.0 innings...matched his best with seven strikeouts...allowed a home run to Springer to start the game before retiring seven straight...set down 10 of the final 11 hitters, with the one exception being a Gurriel solo home run in the sixth...his other outing came in relief in his Major League debut on Sept. 11, 2019 at Houston in a 5-3 A's win (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 2 so)...allowed a solo home run to Maldonado in the sixth inning but then retired each of the final seven batters that he faced.

- Pitched in each of the A's first four games this postseason...has not allowed a run (2.1 ip) and opponents are 1-for-8 (.125)...however, has walked two batters in 2.1 innings and allowed 2-of-6 (33.3%) inherited runners to score...has now pitched in five of the A's six postseason games over the last two years.
- Made his seventh career Division Series appearance in Game 1, which also includes four games in 2015 and two in 2016, both with Texas against Toronto (7.2 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 6 so, 1 hr, 4.70 ERA).
- Has a save and a 3.72 ERA (9.2 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in 11 career postseason appearances.
- Has not allowed an earned run in 24 of his 25 games this year...has a 0.38 ERA (1 er in 23.2 ip) and .115 (9-for-78) opponents batting average but has walked 14 in 23.2 innings.

- Has made 19 career regular season relief appearances and is 1-3 with a 5.40 ERA...his last came on Sept. 28, 2018 at Los Angeles (AL) in relief of opener Lou Trivino (3.1 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 so, 2 hr).
- Did not face the Astros this year...is 1-3 with a 7.46 ERA (41.0 ip, 55 h, 34 r, 34 er, 11 bb, 30 so, 18 hr) in eight career starts against Houston.
- Is 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0 ip, 10 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in two career starts in Dodger Stadium.

- Has one career ALDS appearance and it came for Toronto in Game 2 in 2015 against Texas (0.1 ip, 1 h).
- Has a 6.52 ERA (9.2 ip, 11 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 12 so, 2 hr) in seven career post-season appearances.
- Has allowed five runs in his last three appearances this year (4.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 9 so, 11.25 ERA) after allowing just three runs on 12 hits over his first 23 games (1.13 ERA).
