A'S IN THE DIVISION SERIES: This is the A's ninth appearance in the Division Series, their first since 2013 against Detroit...have lost each of their last two ALDS appearances and six of eight overall...the two wins were in 1981 against Kansas City and 2006 against Minnesota...both of the wins were sweeps and all six losses have gone the full five games (2000, 01, 02, 03, 12, 13)...have a 19-20 record in the ALDS.

ELIMINATION GAMES: Today, the A's will be facing elimination for the fourth time this postseason and the 11th time in 20 postseason games dating back to 2012...are 5-5 in the previous 10 games, including 3-0 this year to snap a five-game losing streak when facing elimination... are 6-10 when facing elimination dating back to 2000.

COMEBACKS: The A's trailed 7-4 after six innings yesterday but came back to win 9-7...it marked the sec-

ond time in Athletics history the A's won a postseason game when trailing by at least three runs after six innings...the other time was in Game 4 of the 1929 World Series when they trailed the Cubs 8-0 entering the bottom of the seventh and scored 10 times in the seventh to win 10-8...during the regular season this year, the A's led the majors with six wins when trailing after six innings

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit five home runs yesterday to tie the franchise record for home runs in a postseason game (Game 3 of the 1989 World Series)... now have 10 home runs this series, which sets a franchise record for a single postseason series, breaking the mark of nine in the 1989 World Series...the Major League record for home runs in a Division Series is 11 (Seattle, 1995; New York-AL, 1995; Houston, 2004)...have 13 home runs this postseason, which is second only to the 16 they hit in nine postseason games in 1989. have homered in a franchise record tying five straight games (also 1988 ALCS Game 1 to 1988 WS Game 1)...have scored 13 of their 16 runs in the Division Series on home runs (eight solo, one two-run, one three-run).

OAKLANDAYS: Today will be the A's 10th consecutive day game dating back to the Saturday doubleheader against Seattle on Sept. 26...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last time the A's played more than nine consecutive day games was April 23-May 8, 1949 when they played 16 straight...have played day games in each of their six postseason games this year (starting times: 12:08, 12:10, 12:10, 1:08, 1:37, 12:37)...today marks the A's seventh straight postseason day game, which is their longest such streak since playing eight straight from Oct. 20, 1973 (WS G#6) to Oct. 13, 1974 (WS G#2)... played 30 of their 60 regular season games during the day, which was five more than any other team...became the first team other than the Cubs to play at least half their games during the day since the Giants in 1994 (61-of-115, 53.0%)...the last time the A's played at least half of their games during the day was in 1960 when they played 78-of-155 (50.3%).

DOWN 0-2: The A's won Game 3 yesterday after starting a postseason series 0-2 for the ninth time in Athletics history (last: 2012 ALDS)...have never come back to win a series after starting 0-2...were swept six times, went the full five games in the 2012 ALDS and also went five games in the 1988 World Series.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have used 35 different lineups over the last 36 games dating back to Aug. 25 after using 19 different lineups over the first 30 games...the only repeat over the last 35 games was Game 3 of the AL-WCS and Game 1 of the ALDS...have used six different players in the three spot over the last eight games...A's pitchers have allowed more home runs (12) the number of the action and over the last three protocols (12) the sector of the action and sect (13) than walks (12) this postseason and over the last three postseasons (19 home runs, 18 walks)... A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in five of the six games this postseason and are 1-2 with a 5.84 ERA (16 er in 24.2 ip) and .340 (36-for-106) opponents batting average...over the last three years, starters have logged fewer than five innings in seven of eight postseason games and are 1-4 with a 7.16 ERA (22 er in 27.2 ip) and .342 (41for-120) opponents average over that span...the A's are 1-for-12 with runners in scoring position this series, 4-for-26 (.154) this postseason and 4-for-36 (.111) over the last three years.

MORE THAN ONE GAME: Prior to this year, each of the A's previous three postseason appearances were one-game Wild Card appearances, all losses (2014, 18, 19)...today will be the A's seventh game this postseason, which matches their most postseason games in one season over the last 30 years... also had seven in 2006 (swept the ALDS against Minnesota, were swept in the ALCS against Detroit).

NEUTRAL SITE GAMES: This series with the Astros is the A's first postseason series featuring neutral site games...have played 14 neutral site games during the regular season since moving to Oakland in 1968, including six home games in Tokyo (2008, 12 and 19), six home games in Las Vegas (1996) and two road games at County Stadium in Milwaukee against the White Sox (1968 and 69)...are now 6-11 (.353) in neutral site games in Oakland history.

DODGER STADIUM: The A's have played six games at Dodger Stadium this year and have allowed 16 home runs in 52.0 innings (2.77 per nine innings)... have hit 13 home runs but are batting .204 (39-for-191)...have played seven postseason games at Dodger Stadium, including these three against Houston plus four against the Dodgers in the World Series (1974 and 1988)...split Games 1 and 2 in 1974 and lost Games 1 and 2 in 1988...are 7-11 (.389) at Dodger Stadium during the regular season and 9-16 (.360) overall.

GO THE DISTANCE: Each of the A's previous six postseason series (including three one-game Wild Card games) have ended with a winner-take-all game. snapped a Major League record nine-game losing streak in winner-take-all postseason games with a win over Chicago in the ALWCS this year...it was the A's first victory in a winner-take-all postseason game since Game 7 of the 1973 World Series, a 5-2 win over New York...10 of the A's previous 12 postseason series have gone the distance.

POSTSEASON STRUGGLES: The win over Chicago in the ALWCS was just the A's second in their last 14 postseason series (also 2006 ALDS against Minnesota)...have lost 15 of their last 17 postseason games with a chance to clinch the series (includes one-game wild card games)...won 11 of their first 15 postseason series in Oakland through the 1990 ALCS.

POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE: With appearances by T.J. McFarland and Jordan Weems in Game 1 on Monday, 27 of the 28 players on the A's Division Series roster have now appeared in a postseason game...the exception is Jonah Heim...six players have played for the A's in each of the last three postseasons (Canha, Davis, Hendriks, Laureano, Olson, Semien)...La Stella has the most postseason experience as this is his fifth year (has played 18 games)... Soria (13 games), Diekman (12 games) and Hendriks (8 games) have played in four postseasons.

A's vs. ASTROS: This series is the first postseason meeting between the A's and Astros...Oakland won the season series during the regular season this year for the first time since 2014 as they went 7-3 (.700)...that was the A's best record against Houston since going 15-4 (.789) in 2013...went 7-1 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...were originally scheduled to play three games in Houston but the final game was postponed following an A's positive Covid-19 test and made up as a doubleheader in the Coliseum on Sept. 8...the seven home wins matched the A's most against the Astros (2013)...have won 13 of their last 18 regular season games against Houston dating back to Aug. 15, 2019...the A's won each of the first four season series (31-13) but lost five straight from 2015-19 (37-58)...are 75-74 all-time during the regular season, including 42-35 in Oakland and 33-39 in Houston.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1930 the A's win their second consecutive World Championship as George Earnshaw defeats the Cardinals, 7-1...in 1972 John "Blue Moon" Odom tosses a three-hit shutout as the A's defeat the Detroit Tigers 5-0 in Game 2 of the ALCS...Bert Campaneris has three hits in a series the A's would win 3-2 prior to defeating Cincinnati for the first World Champion ship in Oakland...in 1974 Vida Blue tosses a two-hit shutout as the A's win game three of the ALCS at Baltimore, 1-0...Blue does not walk a batter and strikes out seven...the A's score their only run in the fourth inning on a Sal Bando homer...in 1989 the A's clinch their second straight AL pennant with a 4-3 win at Toronto...Dave Stewart picks up his second win of the series and Dennis Eckersley records his third save.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: FRANKIE MONTAS (1-0, 4.50 ERA IN POSTSEASON)

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POSTSEASON: Is scheduled to make his second appearance and first start of his postseason career...made his postseason debut in relief in Game 3 of the ALWCS against Chicago and was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-4 win... pitched the fourth and fifth inning and allowed one run...is on a postseason roster for the first time in 2020.

TRENDING: Has a 1.13 ERA (8.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 15 so) over his last two appearances this year after going 1-4 with a 10.88 ERA over his previous six starts...has lost each of his last four starts on the road and is 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA (24 er in 21.1 ip) and .330 (30-for-91) opponents average in five starts away from the Coliseum...surrendered eight home runs in 21.1 innings on the road...made eight of his 11 regular season starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...including his one postseason relief appearance, he is 3-4 with a 6.08 ERA (27 er in 40.0 ip) during the day...five of his 11 starts this year have been fewer than five innings.

LAST APPEARANCE: He was the winning pitcher in relief in Game 3 of the ALWCS a week ago today in Oakland, a 6-4 win over Chicago...entered the game to start the fourth inning with the A's trailing 3-0...retired the side in order in the fourth and Oakland scored four times in the bottom of the fourth to take a 4-3 lead...he allowed the game-tying RBI single to Mazara in the fifth but the A's scored twice in the bottom of the fifth to take the lead for good...was relieved by Wendelken to start the sixth.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win over Seattle on Sept. 27 in Oakland...struck out a career-high 13 batters on a career-high 113 pitches in 6.0 innings...allowed single runs in each of the first two innings but both were unearned...France had a RBI single in the first and Crawford an RBI single in the second...was relieved by Petit to start the seventh with the scored tied 2-2.

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year...the first win came in a 3-1 A's victory in Oakland on Aug. 8...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits, his fewest hits allowed in a start of more than four innings in his career...retired the first four batters, allowed a double to Gurriel in the fourth, retired the next eight batters, allowed a single to Gurriel in the fifth and then retired the final nine batters... then took the loss in a 6-3 decision at Houston in the second game of the Aug. 29 doubleheader...allowed a bases loaded triple to Tucker in the first inning and a two-run home run to Springer in the second...retired seven of the final eight batters he faced before he was relieved by Wendelken with one out and a runner on first in the fourth...picked up the win in the A's 4-2 win in the first game of the Sept. 8 doubleheader in Oakland when the A's were the visiting team...shut out the Astros on four hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Brantley in the bottom of the fifth...Oakland came back with two in the top of the sixth and he was relieved by Diekman to start the bottom of the sixth withe A's leading 4-2.

- Has pitched in five games, which match the most by an A's pitcher in the postseason over the last 31 years (Petit this year, Street in 2006, Eckersley in 1990)...the last time an A's pitcher had more than five games in a postseason was in 1989 when Eckersley and Honeycutt had six each.
- Has not surrendered a run this postseason (3.2 ip) but has allowed 3-of-8 (37.5%) inherited runners to score...opponents are 2-for-13 (.154) but he has walked two.
- Has pitched in six of the A's seven postseason games over the last two years and has a 3.27 ERA (4 er in 11.0 ip) in 12 career postseason appearances...has a 4.00 ERA (4 er in 9.0 ip) in eight Division Series appearances.
- Has not allowed an earned run in 25 of his 26 games this year...has a 0.36 ERA (1 er in 25.0 ip) and .120 (10-for-83) opponents batting average but has walked 14 in 25.0 innings.
- Has faced Houston seven times this year and has not allowed a run (7.0 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 5 so)...has not yielded a run in his last 18 games against the Astros dating back to April 13, 2018 (17.1 ip, 8 h, 6 bb, 15 so) and has allowed 2-of-7 (28.6%) inherited runners to score over that span...has a 0.79 ERA (3 er in 34.0 ip) in 40 career appearances against Houston.
- Was credited with the save in Game 2 of the ALWCS...has seven career saves during the regular season with the last coming on June 20, 2018 for Texas at Kansas Citv

- Has one other postseason appearance and it came in relief in Game 5 of the 2015 ALDS for Houston at Kansas City (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er).
- Has made 19 career regular season relief appearances and is 1-3 with a 5.40 ERA...his last came on Sept. 28, 2018 at Los Angeles (AL) in relief of opener Lou Trivino (3.1 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 so, 2 hr).
- Did not face the Astros this year...is 1-3 with a 7.46 ERA (41.0 ip, 55 h, 34 r, 34 er, 11 bb, 30 so, 18 hr) in eight career starts against Houston.
- Is 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0 ip, 10 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in two career starts in Dodger Stadium.

- Tossed 3.0 scoreless innings yesterday to close out the game and pick up the win...is the third reliever in A's postseason history to pitch at least the final three innings of a game and collect the win (Fingers, 3.0 ip in Game 1 of the 1972 ALCS; Walberg, 5.1 ip in Game 5 of the 1929 World Series).
- Yesterday was his first outing of 3.0 or more innings in a game (regular season or postseason) since Game 4 of the 2015 ALCS when he tossed 4.1 innings.
- Has pitched in three games this postseason and has not allowed a run in his last two (4.0 ip, 2 h, 7 so)...has 17 outs, 12 by strikeout...is the first reliever in A's history with three consecutive postseason games with three or more strikeouts.
- Has pitched in five of the A's eight postseason games over the last three years and is 1-1 with a save and a 4.97 ERA (7 er in 12.2 ip) in eight career postseason appearances...has not allowed a run in two career Division Series outings (3.1 ip, 2 h, 4 so).
- Has allowed five runs in his last four appearances this year (7.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 13 so, 6.43 ERA) after allowing just three runs on 12 hits over his first 23 games (1.13 ERA).
- Has two wins and has converted all three of his save opportunities in six appearances against Houston this year (8.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 12 so)...has a 0.98 ERA (2 er in 18.1 ip) and has converted all six save opportunities in 14 games against the Astros over the last three years.
