OAKLAND ATHLETICS (3-5-1) VS. MILWAUKEE BREWERS (6-3)

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 10, 2021 – HOHOKAM PARK – 1:05 P.M. MST A'S CAST ON IHEART RADIO

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 1-4-1 over the last six games after starting the spring 2-1...are 3-5-1 (.389) overall, which is tied for the third lowest winning percentage in the Cactus League...lead the majors in hit by pitches (9)...are tied for fourth in the CL in stolen bases (7) and have the fourth lowest batting average (.242)...the pitching staff has the second fewest strikeouts in the CL (56) and has allowed the fourth most home runs (14)...the defense has the fourth fewest double plays turned in the CL (5)...this is the A's 53rd Spring Training in Arizona, their seventh since returning to Mesa in 2015 after a 36-year absence...after training in Bradenton, Florida in 1968, the A's came west to Arizona in 1969 and trained in Mesa from 1969-78...moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and then spent 33 seasons at Phoenix Municipal Stadium from 1982-2014...are scheduled to play 28 games this spring, which would be the A's most since 2018 when they had 32...all 28 games will be in Arizona, which marks just the second time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981)...in all other springs, have played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla...went 13-10 (.565) last spring, which marked the A's second consecutive spring with a winning record after three straight losing springs...started the spring 0-5, won 13 of the final 16 games in Arizona and then went 0-2 against San Francisco in July...led the majors with 102 walks and 13 sacrifice flies and topped the Cactus League with a .352 on-base percentage...also ranked third in the CL in doubles (45), fourth in runs (132), tied for fourth in triples (6) and fifth in hits (201)...the pitching staff had the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.286) and fifth highest ERA (5.39), but tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (23)...defensively, tied for third in the CL in double plays turned (21) and ranked fifth in fielding percentage (.982).

A's vs. BREWERS: This is the second and final meeting between the A's and Brewers this spring...the A's won the first game at Maryvale on Mar. 2, 2-1... split two games last spring, both in Mesa, with the A's losing 14-4 on Feb. 24 and winning 11-3 on March 8.

SPRING RULES: The A's and Brewers are scheduled to play seven innings today...Spring Training games through March 13 may be shortened to five-inning games or seven-inning games...games from March 14 through the end of the spring may be shortened to seven innings...for games through March 13, defensive managers will be allowed to end an inning prior to three outs following any completed plate appearance, provided the pitcher has thrown at least 20 pitches...Rule 5.10 (three batter minimum) will be enforced beginning March 14.

IN CAMP: The A's have 65 players in camp, which includes 40 players on the 40-man roster, 24 non-roster invitees and one on the Covid-19 related injured list...the breakdown includes 36 pitchers, seven catchers, 12 infielders and 10 outfielders.

COACHING STAFF: Bob Melvin returns for his 11th season as manager of the A's in 2021, which are the second most seasons in Athletics history to Connie Mack's 50 years at the helm from 1901-50...under Melvin's guidance, the A's have made six postseason appearances and he has won two American League Manager of the Year awards...no other active manager has a longer uninterrupted tenure with their current team...returning to his coaching staff are first base coach Mike Aldrete, bench coach Ryan Christenson, hitting coach Darren Bush, pitching coach Scott Emerson, bullpen coach Marcus Jensen and assistant hitting coach Eric Martins...also returning is Mark Kotsay, who moves from quality control coach to third base coach.

18 DAYS IN FEBRUARY: Over an 18-day stretch from Feb. 6 to 23, the A's added eight players to their 40-man roster and two more to their list of non-roster invitees...the 10 players have a combined total of 85 seasons and 5,887 games in the majors...they have 37 years and 193 games of postseason experience...it began on Feb. 6 when Elvis Andrus and Aramis Garcia were acquired from Texas for Khris Davis, Jonah Heim and Dane Acker...Jed Lowrie was signed to a minor league contract on Feb. 10 and Adam Kolarek and non-roster invitee Cody Thomas were acquired from the Dodgers on Feb. 12 for Sheldon Neuse and Gus Varland...Oakland then signed free agents Mike Fiers (Feb. 16), Sergio Romo (Feb. 18), Yusmeiro Petit (Feb. 19), Trevor Rosenthal (Feb. 22) an Mitch Moreland (Feb. 23).

NON-ROSTER INVITEES: The A's have 24 non-roster invitees in Major League camp...the players include RHP Domingo Acevedo, IF Nick Allen, RHP Cristian Alvarado, RHP Argenis Angulo, RHP Paul Blackburn, RHP Matt Blackham, RHP Ben Bracewell, RHP Parker Dunshee, RHP Montana Du Rapau, LHP Reymin Guduan, RHP Deollis Guerra, RHP Brian Howard, IF Pete Kozma, IF Jed Lowrie, C Kyle McCann, C Francisco Peña, C Carlos Pérez, OF Buddy Reed, RHP Brian Schlitter, IF Frank Schwindel, C Tyler Soderstrom, RHP Trey Supak, OF Cody Thomas and IF Jacob Wilson...11 of the 24 non-roster players have Major League service time (Blackburn, Du Rapau, Guduan, Guerra, Kozma, Lowrie, Peña, Pérez, Schlitter, Schwindel, Supak).

MINOR LEAGUE MINI CAMP: In addition to the 65 players in Major League camp, the A's also have 10 players in minor league mini camp, including right-handed pitchers Jeff Criswell (#79), Eric Mariñez (#84), Colin Peluse

(#86), Zach Jackson (#93), Bryce Conley (#94) and Matt Milburn (#95), catchers Drew Millas (#83) and Collin Theroux (#92) and infielders Logan Davidson (#85) and Edwin Díaz (#82).

A's TOP PROSPECTS: Seven of the A's top 10 prospects according to Baseball America are in major league camp this spring: Tyler Soderstrom (#1), A.J. Puk (#2), Daulton Jefferies (#3), Nick Allen (#6), Luis Barrera (#7), Greg Deichman (#9) and James Kaprielian (#10)...the others are Robert Puason (#4), Logan Davidson (#5) and Jonah Heim (#8), who was traded in the Andrus deal.

SPRING TRAINING MEDIA INFORMATION: The Hohokam Press Box will be open to the media for all home games...due to social distancing guidelines, space is very limited...there will also be a small handful of outdoor tabletop space designated for media, a safe distance away from fans...the A's clubhouse will not be open to members of the media...all interviews will take place via Zoom...there will be no media field access during both workouts and games during 2021 Spring Training...TV camera crews and still photographers with proper credentials must stay in assigned areas at all times...no roving is permitted...credentials must be requested through MLB's credentialing website at credentials.mlb.com...media members who have a BBWAA credential still need to apply through MLB's credential portal to ensure there is enough space...credentials can be picked up at the Will Call window at the main box office and are available one hour prior to first pitch...the A's provide complimentary parking to media members in the Center Street Lot (Lot D) located behind home plate and to the right as you enter the parking lot at the home plate entrance...lunch is available for \$8 to media members with proper credentials in the landing area at the top of Section 209...all transactions at Hohokam Stadium will be cashless in 2021.

A's SPRING BROADCASTS: All A's Spring Training games will stream live on A's Cast on iHeart Radio...weekend home games will also air on Bloomberg 960 AM and the A's radio network...Ken Korach, Vince Cotroneo and Ray Fosse will call the action at home and Dom Cotroneo will handle duties for most road games...the NBCSCA television schedule will be announced shortly... four remaining games are scheduled to be aired on MLB Network: March 18 against the Padres (delayed to 11:00 PM MST), March 20 against the Angels (delayed to 8:00 PM MST), March 24 against the White Sox (live) and March 26 against the Dodgers (delayed to 8:00 PM MST).
