OAKLAND ATHLETICS (11-9-2) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (8-10-5)

A'S CAST ON IHEART RADIO — MLB NETWORK (LIVE)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 4-1-1 over the last six games and 11-9-2 for the spring...the pitching staff has the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the Cactus League (.312), the second lowest batting average (.232), the third lowest OPS (.741), the fifth lowest slugging percentage (.429) and the fifth lowest ERA (4.52)...is tied for the second fewest walks (67) but has the second fewest strikeouts (172)...on offense, the A's lead the CL in doubles (51) and fewest strikeouts (166), rank third in extra base hits (80) and tied for fifth in hit by pitches (13)...stole six bases over the first four games but have just two since then and have the second fewest stolen bases in the CL (8)...have the fourth lowest batting average (.252)...this is the A's 53rd Spring Training in Arizona, their seventh since returning to Mesa in 2015 after a 36-year absence...after training in Bradenton, Florida in 1968, the A's came west to Arizona in 1969 and trained in Mesa from 1969-78...moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and then spent 33 seasons at Phoenix Municipal Stadium from 1982-2014...are scheduled to play 28 games this spring, which would be the A's most since 2018 when they had 32...all 28 games will be in Arizona, which marks just the second time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981)...in all other springs, have played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla...went 13-10 (.565) last spring, which marked the A's second consecutive spring with a winning record after three straight losing springs.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: This is the second of two meetings between the A's and White Sox this spring...Oakland lost the first game in Mesa on March 14, 1-0...the A's won the only meeting last year at Glendale on March 3, 6-5...are 8-3-1 over the last 12 games.

SPRING RULES: The A's started the spring with 11 straight seven-inning games but have played nine innings in 10 of the last 11 contests...remaining spring training games may only be shortened to seven innings instead of the previous minimum of five...additionally, defensive managers will no longer be allowed to end an inning prior to three outs and Rule 5.10 (three batter minimum) will be enforced.

IN CAMP: After optioning Austin Allen this morning, the A's now have 37 players remaining in camp...that includes 30 players on the 40-man roster, which is at 39, and seven non-roster invitees...the breakdown includes 18 pitchers, four catchers, nine infielders and six outfielders.

18 DAYS IN FEBRUARY: Over an 18-day stretch from Feb. 6 to 23, the A's added eight players to their 40-man roster and two more to their list of non-roster invitees...the 10 players have a combined total of 85 seasons and 5,887 games in the majors...they have 37 years and 193 games of postseason experience...it began on Feb. 6 when Elvis Andrus and Aramis Garcia were acquired from Texas for Khris Davis, Jonah Heim and Dane Acker...Jed Lowrie was signed to a minor league contract on Feb. 10 and Adam Kolarek and non-roster invitee Cody Thomas were acquired from the Dodgers on Feb. 12 for Sheldon Neuse and Gus Varland...Oakland then signed free agents Mike Fiers (Feb. 16), Sergio Romo (Feb. 18), Yusmeiro Petit (Feb. 19), Trevor Rosenthal (Feb. 22) and Mitch Moreland (Feb. 23).

NON-ROSTER INVITEES: The A's have seven non-roster invitees remaining in Major League camp...the players include LHP Reyman Guduan, RHP Deollis Guerra, IF Pete Kozma, IF Jed Lowrie, C Francisco Peña, C Carlos Pérez and OF Cody Thomas...all but Thomas have Major League service time.

MINOR LEAGUE MINI CAMP: The A's began the spring with 10 players in minor league mini camp, including right-handed pitchers Jeff Criswell (#79), Eric Mariñez (#84), Colin Peluse (#86), Zach Jackson (#93), Bryce Conley (#94) and Matt Milburn (#95), catchers Drew Millas (#83) and Collin Theroux (#92) and infielders Logan Davidson (#85) and Edwin Díaz (#82).

HOW THE A'S WERE BUILT: Of the 30 players on the active 40-man roster, eight were drafted by the A's (Brown, 19th in 2015; Chapman, 1st in 2014; Jefferies, competitive balance round A in 2016; Murphy, 3rd in 2016; Olson, compensation following 1st round in 2012; Pinder, competitive balance round B in 2013; Puk, 1st in 2016; Trivino, 11th in 2013) and one was selected in the Rule 5 draft (Tom)...four were signed as free agents (Moreland, Petit, Romo, Rosenthal) and the other 17 were all acquired in trades (including Fiers, who re-signed as a free agent).

COACHING STAFF: Bob Melvin returns for his 11th season as manager of the A's in 2021, which are the second most seasons in Athletics history to Connie Mack's 50 years at the helm from 1901-50...under Melvin's guidance, the A's have made six postseason appearances and he has won two American League Manager of the Year awards...no other active manager has a longer uninterrupted tenure with their current team...returning to his coaching staff are first base coach Mike Aldrete, bench coach Ryan Christenson, hitting coach Darren Bush, pitching coach Scott Emerson, bullpen coach Marcus Jensen and assistant hitting coach Eric Martins...also returning is Mark Kotzay, who moves from quality control coach to third base coach.

SPRING TRAINING MEDIA INFORMATION: The Hohokam Press Box will be open to the media for all home games...due to social distancing guidelines, space is very limited...there will also be a small handful of outdoor tabletop

space designated for media, a safe distance away from fans...the A's clubhouse will not be open to members of the media...all interviews will take place via Zoom...there will be no media field access during both workouts and games during 2021 Spring Training...TV camera crews and still photographers with proper credentials must stay in assigned areas at all times...no roving is permitted...credentials must be requested through MLB's credentialing website at credentials.mlb.com...media members who have a BBWAA credential still need to apply through MLB's credential portal to ensure there is enough space...credentials can be picked up at the Will Call window at the main box office and are available one hour prior to first pitch...the A's provide complimentary parking to media members in the Center Street Lot (Lot D) located behind home plate and to the right as you enter the parking lot at the home plate entrance...lunch is available for \$8 to media members with proper credentials in the landing area at the top of Section 209...all transactions at Hohokam Stadium will be cashless in 2021.

A's SPRING BROADCASTS: All A's Spring Training games will stream live on A's Cast on iHeart Radio...weekend home games will also air on Bloomberg 960 AM and the A's radio network...Ken Korach, Vince Cotroneo and Ray Fosse will call the action at home and Dom Cotroneo will handle duties for most road games...NBCSCA has one remaining TV game: March 27 against Texas...Glen Kuiper and Fosse will team up for the that telecast...NBCSBA (Giants) will broadcast the March 28 game at San Francisco...two remaining games are scheduled to air on MLB Network: today against the White Sox (live) and Friday against the Dodgers (delayed to 8:00 PM MST).
