## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (0-0) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (0-0)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's open their 54th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the Atlanta Braves (20), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4349-4004 (.521) record over the previous 53 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 121st season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9064-9476 (.489) in their previous 120 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

**DURING THE SPRING:** The A's posted a winning record for the third consecutive spring as they finished 16-10-2...the wins tied with Kansas City, Toronto and Boston for the most in the majors and matched the most by an A's team over the last six springs (also 2017)...compiled a 4.17 ERA, which was the lowest in the Cactus League and fifth lowest in the majors...also had the lowest opponents batting average (.228), on-base percentage (.312) and OPS (.714) in the CL and the third lowest slugging percentage (.402)...had the third fewest walks (90) and the fourth fewest home runs (27) but finished with the third fewest strikeouts (229)...offensively, the A's led the majors in on-base percentage (.357), OPS (.833), runs (161), doubles (67) and sacrifice flies (13)...topped the CL in fewest strikeouts (220), ranked second in batting (.267) and extra base hits (107) and fourth in slugging (.476)...were 9-for-11 (81.8%) in stolen base attempts...had the second fewest steals in the CL but the third best percentage...opponents were successful in just 6-of-17 (35.3%) stolen base attempts, which was the lowest mark in the majors...played all 28 games in Arizona, marking just the second time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981)...in all other springs, played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.

**FOR OPENERS:** The A's have won three of their last four openers and four of the last six...however, are 8-19 dating back to 1994...this marks the 12th consecutive season the A's have been the home team on Opening Day, which includes two openers in Japan (2012 and 2019)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau that will set an American League record for consecutive openers as the home team, breaking the mark of 11 by the A's, Orioles (1996-2006), Rays (2010-20) and Rangers/Senators (1961-71)...the Reds have the longest active streak (31 dating back to 1991) and also hold the Major League, record of 76 (1890-1965)...the A's will face Houston on Opening Day for the first time...that leaves Tampa Bay as the only American League team the A's have not faced in an opener...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 24-29 on Opening Day, including 20-14 in Oakland, 4-11 on the road, 0-3 in Tokyo and 0-1 in Las Vegas...all-time, the Athletics are 56-64 in openers.

**OPENING DAY STARTING LINEUPS:** Six players return from last year's Opening Day starting lineup (Canha, Chapman, Laureano, Murphy, Olson, Pinder)...Matt Olson is scheduled to make his fourth straight start at first base, which ties Jason Giambi and Daric Barton for the second most Opening Day starts at first base in Oakland history...only Mark McGwire, with nine, has more...Matt Chapman is scheduled to make his fourth straight start at third base...only Eric Chavez (10), Sal Bando (9) and Carney Lansford (9) have more Opening Day starts at third in Oakland history...Ramón Laureano is scheduled to become the first Athletic to make three straight Opening Day starts in center field since Mark Kotsay from 2004-06...Jed Lowrie is scheduled to make his sixth Opening Day start with Oakland, his fourth at second base (2016-18)...only Mark Ellis (8) and Dick Green (6) have more Opening Day starts at second base in Oakland history...Lowrie is the last Athletic other than Marcus Semien to start at shortstop (2014)...Chris Bassitt will be the A's 14th different starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas).

**ROSTER NOTES:** The A's open the season with 13 pitchers and 13 position players...this marks the fourth time in the last five years Oakland begins the season with at least 13 pitchers (had 15 on last year's 30-man roster and 12 in 2019 in Japan)...17 players return from last years Opening Day roster (Bassitt, Canha, Chapman, Diekman, Kemp, Laureano, Luzardo, Manaea, Montas, Murphy, Olson, Petit, Pinder, Piscotty, Smith, Trivino, Wendelken), which matches the total from last year when Opening Day rosters were at 30...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning play-

ers from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...four were acquired in a trade (Andrus, Garcia, Irvin, Kolarek), two were signed as free agents (Moreland, Romo), two were signed as free agents to minor league contracts (Guduan, Lowrie) and one was selected in the Rule 5 draft (Tom).

**TENURE:** Of the 26 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only Mark Canha has played for Oakland in each of the previous six seasons...only five players were on each of the previous three Opening Day rosters (Chapman, Olson, Petit, Pinder, Piscotty)...Matt Olson, who was drafted on June 4, 2012, has the longest uninterrupted tenure in the A's organization...he is followed by Chad Pinder, who was drafted on June 6, 2013...Jed Lowrie, who was with Houston in 2015 and New York (NL) in 2019 and 2020, first played for the A's in 2013...his 687 games played with Oakland are second most by an A's player over the previous 10 years (Semien, 773).

**ROOKIE AND VETERANS:** The A's have two rookies on the Opening Day roster (Garcia, Tom) after opening with five last year...six players have six or more years of service: Romo (12 years, 97 days), Lowrie (12 years, 111 days), Andrus (12 years), Moreland (10 years, 67 days), Petit (10 years, 16 days) and Diekman (8 years, 50 days).

**THE YOUNG AND THE OLD:** The average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 29.92 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)...Jesús Luzardo, who is 23 years and 183 days, is the youngest...he is followed by Sean Murphy (26 years, 179 days) and Ramón Laureano (26 years, 260 days)...Sergio Romo is the oldest at 38 years, 29 days...he is followed by Jed Lowrie (36 years, 349 days), Yusmeiro Petit (36 years, 130 days) and Mitch Moreland (35 years, 207 days).

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's begin the season with two players (Fiers and Rosenthal) on the injured list after starting the 2020 season with just one...have used the IL three times this year as Frankie Montas began the spring on the Covid related IL before he was reinstated March 15...used the IL eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

**NUMBER CHANGE:** Cole Irvin will switch to #19.

**18 DAYS IN FEBRUARY:** Of the 26 players on the A's Opening Day roster, seven were added to the A's organization over an 18-day stretch from Feb. 6 to 23...the seven players have a combined total of 67 seasons and 5,298 games in the majors...they have 30 years and 164 games of postseason experience...it began on Feb. 6 when Elvis Andrus and Aramis Garcia were acquired from Texas for Khris Davis, Jonah Heim and Dane Acker...Jed Lowrie was signed to a minor league contract on Feb. 10 and Adam Kolarek was acquired from the Dodgers on Feb. 12 with Cody Thomas for Sheldon Neuse and Gus Varland...Oakland then signed free agents Sergio Romo (Feb. 18), Yusmeiro Petit (Feb. 19) and Mitch Moreland (Feb. 23)...additionally, Mike Fiers, who starts the year on the injured list, was signed on Feb. 16 and Trevor Rosenthal, who is also on the IL, was signed on Feb. 22.

**A's vs. ASTROS:** The A's won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their first season series win since going 11-8 in 2014...went 7-1 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...the seven wins at home matched the A's most against the Astros (7-3 in 2013)...then lost to the Astros in the ALDS, 3 games to 1...have won 13 of the last 18 games, including 10 of the last 12 in Oakland...are now 44-61 (.419) against Houston over the previous six years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 75-74 all-time, including 42-35 in Oakland and 33-39 in Houston.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Elvis Andrus** is scheduled to make his 13th consecutive Opening Day start at shortstop...will become the 27th shortstop in Major League history with 13 or more Opening Day starts...**Jake Diekman** walked the first batter he faced during the spring but then retired each of the final 18 batters he faced...**Matt Olson** had 18 RBI this spring, which were the most by an Athletic since Eric Chavez had 18 in 2006...is tied for fourth in Oakland history in Opening Day home runs (2) and tied for seventh in RBI (5).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1996** the A's play on April 1 for the first time in Oakland history and lose to Toronto, 9-6 in Las Vegas...the A's play their first homestand in Las Vegas as the Coliseum was not ready after renovations to the stadium...in **2003** Tim Hudson and Ricardo Rincon combine on a five-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over Seattle, the first Opening Day shutout in Oakland history...Erubiel Durazo sets an Oakland Opening Day record with five RBI.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (5-2, 2.29 ERA in 2020)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his first career Opening Day start...will become the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas)...is in his seventh season in the majors and is on his third Opening Day roster (2016, 2020)...did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 17-10 with a 3.29 ERA (93 er in 254.2 ip) and is averaging 8.38 strikeouts per nine innings (237 so in 254.2 ip) in 50 games (41 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Went 2-1 with a 0.72 ERA, .207 opponents batting average and .512 OPS in five starts in Oakland last year compared to 3-1 with a 4.56 ERA, .270 opponents average and .683 OPS in five starts on the road...his home ERA was second lowest in the majors (Keller, KC 0.27) and second lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 30 innings (Treinen, 0.63 in 2018)...did not allow a home run in 37.1 innings in Oakland and now has a nine-game, 48.0-inning, 195-batter faced homerless streak in the Coliseum...is 9-10 with a 2.44 ERA (51 er in 188.1 ip) in 35 career games in the Coliseum, 10-11 with a 4.63 ERA (108 er in 210.0 ip) in 44 games in all other ballparks...has yielded just 11 home runs in 188.1 career innings in Oakland (0.53 per nine innings).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Went 3-0 with a 1.15 ERA in six starts at night last year compared to 2-2 with a 4.13 ERA in five starts during the day...his night ERA was the lowest in the majors and in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 30 innings at night...is now 5-0 with a 2.39 ERA (19 er in 71.2 ip) over his last 13 games, 12 starts, at night dating back to July 19, 2019.

**SCORELESS STREAKS:** Did not allow a run over his final two regular season starts last year and has a 13.2-inning scoreless streak...the longest scoreless streak of his career is 18.0 innings (July 30 to Aug. 9, 2015)...closed out the 2020 campaign with a 24.1-inning scoreless streak at home (regular season).

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Was 2-0 with a 1.74 ERA in three spring training starts...also pitched in simulated games, most recently last Friday...allowed a .179 opponents batting average and issued just two walks in 10.1 innings...struck out 12.

**BASSITT vs. HOUSTON:** Is 3-2 with a 3.53 ERA (51.0 ip, 45 h, 22 r, 20 er, 15 bb, 35 so, 7 hr) in nine career appearances, including eight starts, during the regular season...also had a no decision in Game 1 of the 2020 ALDS against Houston at Dodger Stadium, a 10-5 A's loss (4.0 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 so)...is 1-2 with a 7.07 ERA (11 er in 14.0 ip) in three starts in Houston and 2-0 with a 2.19 ERA (9 er in 37.0 ip) in six games in Oakland...went 1-1 with a 2.65 ERA (17.0 ip, 16 h, 5 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in three regular season starts last year...the no decision came in the A's 3-2 win 10 innings on Aug. 7 in Oakland...retired seven of the first eight batters before a Maldonado walk, a wild pitch and a Tucker RBI double gave the Astros their first run...that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work and he was relieved by Soria to start the eighth with the scored tied 1-1...then took the loss on Aug. 29 at Houston in a 4-2 decision in the first game of a doubleheader...tossed 3.0 innings, which matched the shortest start of his career (third time, last: Sept. 13, 2019 at Texas)...allowed a three-run home run to Tucker in the first inning...the A's scored once in the fourth but he allowed a leadoff home run to Reddick in the bottom of the fourth...was relieved by Trivino with runners on first and second and no outs in the fourth...then combined with Diekman and Trivino on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win in Oakland on Sept. 7...tossed seven of the innings and allowed seven hits...did not walk a batter and struck out four...allowed just three base runners to advance to scoring position, all after two were out.

**2020 RECAP:** Spent the entire season on the active roster for the first time in his six-year career and went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions (Lamet, SD 2.09) and sixth in the majors...it was fifth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts...also tied for fifth in the West divisions in winning percentage (.714), ranked seventh in opponents OPS (.659), batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.371), tied for seventh in wins and eighth in on-base percentage (.288)...had career lows in ERA and opponents on-base percentage...walked 17 batters in 63.0 innings for a career-low 2.43 walks per nine innings...struck out 55 for a career-best 3.24 strikeout-to-walk ratio...led the A's in innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...received five votes (two third, one fourth, two fifth) in American League Cy Young balloting...went 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA over his first three starts, 1-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his next four starts from Aug. 12-29 and 3-0 with a 0.34 ERA over his final four starts.

**2020 OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .233 opponents batting average, which broke down to .223 (31-for-139) with a .590 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .248 (25-for-101) with a .755 OPS against left-handers...yielded four of his six home runs to lefties and has surrendered 18 of his 27 home runs over the previous two years to lefties...walked just one batter to lead off an inning and held opponents to a .203 (13-for-64) batting average and .227 on-base percentage in that situation...the on-base percentage was sixth lowest in the majors...five of his six home runs came with the bases empty...had a .244 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .176 with RISP and two outs...had a .204 opponents batting average and two home runs with zero or one out, a .295 average with four home runs with two outs...had a .130 opponent average with two strikes...surrendered three of his six home runs to the opponent's clean-up hitter.

**2020 RUN SUPPORT:** Received 35 runs of support in his 11 starts for a run support average of 5.00...now has a 6.28 RSA in 36 starts over the previous two years compared to a 2.67 ERA over his first 30 starts of his career...is 15-1 in 25 career starts with three runs of support or more, 4-20 in 41 starts with two runs of support or fewer.

**2020 THIS AND THAT:** Allowed six of his 18 runs in the first inning...had a 4.91 ERA in the first inning, a 1.73 ERA from the second inning on...was 3-0 with a 1.75 ERA in four starts following an A's loss and is 8-1 with a 2.38 ERA (22 er in 83.1 ip) in 14 starts following a loss over the previous two years...went 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA in six starts on five days rest or more...does not have a complete game in 66 career starts, including 61 with the A's...his streak of 61 consecutive starts with no complete games is fourth longest in Athletics history (3rd is 64 by Bob Welch)...allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 11 starts, including no runs four times...the A's went 8-3 (.727) in his starting assignments and are 23-13 (.639) over the previous two years...is now 15-7 with a 3.35 ERA in 39 games, including 36 starts, over the previous two years

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHERS
<b>LHP Jesús Luzardo (3-2, 4.12 ERA in 2020):</b> Is in his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...begins the season in starting rotation for the first time in his career as his first two outings last year came in relief...was 1-1 with a 4.22 ERA in three starts this spring...allowed a .205 opponents batting average but issued four walks in 10.2 innings...did not allow a run in two of his three starts...pitched in a simulated game in his last outing on Sunday...is 1-0 with a 2.87 ERA (15.2 ip, 10 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 14 so, 4 hr) in three career regular season appearances, including two starts, against Houston...also started Game 3 of the 2020 ALDS at Los Angeles (NL) and had a no decision in the A's 9-7 win (4.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...went 3-2 with a 4.12 ERA in 12 games, including nine starts, in his rookie campaign last year...ranked second among Major League rookies in strikeouts (59) and innings pitched (59.0).

- Walked the first batter he faced during the spring but then retired each of the final 18 batters he faced...opponents went 0-for-18 in his six appearances and he did not allow a run in 6.0 innings.
