OAKLAND ATHLETICS (0-1) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (1-0)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's opened their 54th season in Oakland last night with an 8-1 loss...it marks the third time in the last six years the A's have lost on Opening Day...have not won the second game of the season since 2014... started the year 1-1 last year and 0-2 in 2019...have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in the previous 53 years in Oakland...only the Atlanta Braves (20), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4349-4004 (.521) record over the previous 53 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 121st season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9064-9476 (.489) in their previous 120 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's posted a winning record for the third consecutive spring as they finished 16-10-2...the wins tied with Kansas City, Toronto and Boston for the most in the majors and matched the most by an A's team over the last six springs (also 2017)...compiled a 4.17 ERA, which was the lowest in the Cactus League and fifth lowest in the majors...also had the lowest opponents batting average (.228), on-base percentage (.312) and OPS (.714) in the CL and the third lowest slugging percentage (.402)...had the third fewest walks (90) and the fourth fewest home runs (27) but finished with the third fewest strikeouts (229)...offensively, the A's led the majors in on-base percentage (.357), OPS (.833), runs (161), doubles (67) and sacrifice flies (13)...topped the CL in fewest strikeouts (220), ranked second in batting (.267) and extra base hits (107) and fourth in slugging (.476)...were 9-for-11 (81.8%) in stolen base attempts...had the second fewest steals in the CL but the third best percentage...opponents were successful in just 6-of-17 (35.3%) stolen base attempts, which was the lowest mark in the majors...played all 28 games in Arizona, marking just the second time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981)... in all other springs, played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.

FOR OPENERS: With the 8-1 loss last night, the A's are now 4-3 over their last seven openers but are 8-20 dating back to 1994...this marked the 12th consecutive season the A's have been the home team on Opening Day, which includes two openers in Japan (2012 and 2019)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau that sets an American League record for consecutive openers as the home team, breaking the mark of 11 by the A's, Orioles (1996-2006), Rays (2010-20) and Rangers/Senators (1961-71)...the Reds have the longest active streak (31 dating back to 1991) and also hold the Major League, record of 76 (1890-1965)...faced Houston on Opening Day for the first time, leaving Tampa Bay as the only American League team the A's have not faced in an opener...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 24-30 on Opening Day, including 20-15 in Oakland, 4-11 on the road, 0-3 in Tokyo and 0-1 in Las Vegas...all-time, the Athletics are 56-65 in openers.

THE FIRST 10: The A's begin the season with 10 games in 10 days against two 2020 playoff teams...following this four-game series with the Astros, the A's host a three-game series with the defending World Champion Los Angeles Dodgers before traveling to Houston for a three-game series...then have two off days over a four-day stretch (April 11 and 14)...the April 11 off day is the A's first scheduled Sunday off day since Aug. 26, 2012 following a three-game series at Tampa Bay

ROSTER NOTES: The A's open the season with 13 pitchers and 13 position players...this marks the fourth time in the last five years Oakland begins the season with at least 13 pitchers (had 15 on last year's 30-man roster and 12 in 2019 in Japan)...17 players return from last years Opening Day roster (Bassitt, Canha, Chapman, Diekman, Kemp, Laureano, Luzardo, Manaea, Montas, Murphy, Olson, Petit, Pinder, Piscotty, Smith, Trivino, Wendelken), which matches the total from last year when Opening Day rosters were at 30...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...four were acquired in a trade (Andrus, Garcia, Irvin, Kolarek), two were signed as free agents (Moreland, Romo), two were signed as free agents to minor league contracts (Guduan, Lowrie) and one was selected in the Rule 5 draft (Tom).

TENURE: Of the 26 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only Mark Canha has played for Oakland in each of the last seven seasons...only five players have been on each of the last four Opening Day rosters (Chapman, Olson, Petit, Pinder, Piscotty)...Matt Olson, who was drafted on June 4, 2012, has the longest uninterrupted tenure in the A's organization...he is followed by Chad Pinder, who was drafted on June 6, 2013...Jed Lowrie, who was with Houston in 2015 and New York (NL) in 2019 and 2020, first played for the A's in 2013... his 687 games played with Oakland are second most by an A's player over the previous 10 years (Semien, 773).

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's have two rookies on the Opening Day roster (Garcia, Tom) after opening with five last year...six players have six or more years of service: Romo (12 years, 97 days), Lowrie (12 years, 111 days), Andrus (12 years), Moreland (10 years, 67 days), Petit (10 years, 16 days) and Diekman (8 years, 50 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 29.92 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)... Jesús Luzardo, who was 23 years and 183 days on April 1, is the youngest. he is followed by Sean Murphy (26 years, 179 days) and Ramón Laureano (26 years, 260 days)...Sergio Romo was the oldest at 38 years, 29 days...he is followed by Jed Lowrie (36 years, 349 days), Yusmeiro Petit (36 years, 130 days) and Mitch Moreland (35 years, 207 days).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's begin the season with two players (Fiers and Rosenthal) on the injured list after starting the 2020 season with just one... have used the IL three times this year as Frankie Montas began the spring on the Covid related IL before he was reinstated March 15...used the IL eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)... used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

NUMBER CHANGE: Cole Irvin will switch to #19.

18 DAYS IN FEBRUARY: Of the 26 players on the A's Opening Day roster, seven were added to the A's organization over an 18-day stretch from Feb. 6 to 23... the seven players have a combined total of 67 seasons and 5,298 games in the majors...they have 30 years and 164 games of postseason experience... it began on Feb. 6 when Elvis Andrus and Aramis Garcia were acquired from Texas for Khris Davis, Jonah Heim and Dane Acker...Jed Lowrie was signed to a minor league contract on Feb. 10 and Adam Kolarek was acquired from the Dodgers on Feb. 12 with Cody Thomas for Sheldon Neuse and Gus Varland... Oakland then signed free agents Sergio Romo (Feb. 18), Yusmeiro Petit (Feb. 19) and Mitch Moreland (Feb. 23)...additionally, Mike Fiers, who starts the year on the injured list, was signed on Feb. 16 and Trevor Rosenthal, who is also on the IL, was signed on Feb. 22.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2021 season...Elvis Andrus is signed through 2022 with a vesting option for 2023 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023... Jake Diekman has a club option for 2022.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2021 last night...are scheduled to play the Astros in seven of the first 10 games and six of the final nine but just six of 143 games in between...won the season series last year, 7-3... it was their first season series win since going 11-8 in 2014...went 7-1 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...the seven wins at home matched the A's most against the Astros (7-3 in 2013)...then lost to the Astros in the ALDS, 3 games to 1...have won 13 of the last 19 games, including 10 of the last 13 in Oakland...are now 44-62 (.415) against Houston over the last seven years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 75-75 all-time, including 42-36 in Oakland and 33-39 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jake Diekman walked the first batter he faced during the spring but then retired each of the final 18 batters he faced...has a 16-game, 15.1-inning scoreless streak against the Astros during the regular season... Matt Oison had 18 RBI this spring, which were the most by an Athletic since Eric Chavez had 18 in 2006.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 2002 Carlos Pena hits the game ending home run in the bottom of the ninth inning as the A's defeat Texas, 3-2 and start the season 2-0 for the first time since 1993...in 2019 Matt Chapman became the first player in Athletics history to homer in the first inning of a 1-0 win as Mike Fiers and three Oakland relievers combine to shut out Boston.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesús Luzardo (3-2, 4.12 ERA in 2020)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his first start of the season...is in his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...begins the season in starting rotation for the first time in his career as his first two outings last year came in relief.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 1-1 with a 4.22 ERA in three starts this spring... also pitched in simulated games, most recently on Sunday...allowed a .205 opponents batting average but issued four walks in 10.2 innings...did not allow a run in two of his three starts...is now 4-1 with a 1.82 ERA (7 er in 34.2 ip) and .195 (24-for-123) opponents batting average in 13 career spring training appearances (10 starts).

LUZARDO vs. HOUSTON: Is 1-0 with a 2.87 ERA (15.2 ip, 10 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 14 so, 4 hr) in three career regular season appearances, including two starts... also started Game 3 of the 2020 ALDS at Los Angeles (NL) and had a no deci-

sion in the A's 9-7 win (4.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...was 1-0 with a 2.84 ERA (12.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 12 so, 3 hr) in two regular season starts last year... the win came in a 7-2 A's win in Oakland on Aug. 9...it was his first Major League win and, at the age of 22 years and 314 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to win a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...blanked the Astros on two hits over the first three innings before allowing a two-run home run to Gurriel in the fourth...those were the only runs he would allow in 5.2 innings...then had a no decision in the A's 3-2 victory in Oakland on Sept. 9...tossed a career-high 100 pitches in a career-high 7.0 innings...matched his best with seven strikeouts...allowed a home run to Springer to start the game before retiring seven straight...set down 10 of the final 11 hitters, with the one exception being a Gurriel solo home run in the sixth.

2020 RECAP: Went 3-2 with a 4.12 ERA in 12 games, including nine starts, in his rookie campaign...ranked second among Major League rookies in strikeouts (59) and innings pitched (59.0), tied for fifth in games and tied for ninth in wins and games started...walked just 17 batters in 59.0 innings (2.59 per nine innings) and now has 20 walks in 71.0 career innings (2.54 per nine innings)...walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 12 appearances in 2020 and 17 of 18 in his career...however, surrendered nine home runs, which tied for fifth most among ML rookies.

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: Had a .257 opponents batting average, which broke down to .256 (45-for-176) against right-handed hitters compared to .260 (13-for-50) against left-handers...surrendered eight of his nine home runs and issued 15 of his 17 walks to righties...has allowed nine of his 10 career home runs and has 17 of his 20 walks against righties...six of his nine home runs were solo shots...his opponents average increased to .317 with runners in scoring position, including .421 with RISP and two outs... opponents hit .322 when leading off an inning but he walked just three... has walked just four batters to lead off an inning in his career...had a .228 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .280 with six of his nine home runs after that...now has a .204 career opponents average the first time through the lineup.

2020 HOME AND AWAY: Went 3-1 with a 2.40 ERA, .215 opponents batting average and .595 OPS in eight games, six starts, at home compared to 0-1 with an 8.15 ERA, .338 opponents average and 1.032 OPS in four games, three starts, on the road...allowed three home runs in 41.1 innings at home, six in 17.2 innings on the road...is now 3-1 with a 2.34 ERA (11 er in 42.1 ip) in nine career appearances in the Coliseum, 0-1 with a 5.65 ERA (18 er in 28.2 ip) in nine games on the road.

2020 BY INNING: Allowed 12 of his 27 runs in the fourth and fifth innings... had a 2.67 ERA over the first three innings of a game and a 6.89 ERA in the fourth and fifth...had a 3.86 ERA from the sixth inning on, which includes his relief appearances.

2020 STARTING AND RELIEVING: Pitched in relief in his first two appearances of the season, made nine consecutive starts from Aug. 4 to Sept. 19 and then pitched in relief in his final outing...was 3-2 with a 3.83 ERA in his nine starts, 0-0 with a 5.59 ERA in three relief appearances ...the A's were 6-3 (.667) in his starting assignments...first batters faced were 2-for-3 (.667) with a double in his three relief appearances.

2020 RUN SUPPORT: Received no run support in three of his starts and had two runs of support or fewer in six of his nine starts...had 22 runs of support in 12 games and 59.0 innings overall...his season run support average of 3.36 was ninth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched.

2020 AMERICAN LEAGUE AND NATIONAL LEAGUE: Was 1-1 with a 3.09 ERA in six games against the American League West compared to 2-1 with a 5.33 ERA in six games against National League West...the six interleague games are the first of his career...is 1-1 with a 2.66 ERA (13 er in 44.0 ip) in 12 career games against the AL.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the season pitching out of the bullpen and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in his first outing on July 25 against Los Angeles (AL)... tossed 3.2 innings in his next relief appearance on July 29 against Colorado.. did not allow a run in the sixth or seventh inning before yielding a RBI double to Blackmon in the eighth...that snapped his scoreless streak at a career-high 12.0 innings dating back to Sept. 21, 2019...made his first Major League start Aug. 4 against Texas...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits and two walks, but had a no decision in the A's 5-1 win...at the age of 22 years and 309 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to start a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...recorded his first big league win in his second start, a 7-2 A's win over Houston on Aug. 9...at the age of 22 years and 314 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to win a game since Anderson in that Oct. 2, 2010 game...allowed a two-run home run to Gurriel in 5.2 innings of work...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high nine hits in 3.1 innings at San Francisco on Aug. 14 but had a no decision in the A's 8-7 win in 10 innings...it was the shortest start of his career...struck out a career-high seven batters in 6.1 scoreless innings against Arizona on Aug. 19 for his second win...it was his first of five games with seven strikeouts...was charged with the first two losses of his career in backto-back starts on Aug. 24 at Texas and Sept. 4 against San Diego...tossed a career-high 100 pitches in a career-high 7.0 innings against Houston Sept. 9...allowed just two runs but had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win...allowed a career-high three home runs in the first game of the Sept. 14 doubleheader at Seattle...combined with Diekman, Soria and Trivino on a six-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over San Francisco in his final start on Sept. 19 against San Francisco...then pitched in relief of Mike Fiers on Sept. 24 at Los Angeles (NL) to provide rotation flexibility for the postseason...walked three batters in 3.0 innings of relief, which was the first time he issued more than two free passes in a game...did not strike out a batter for the first time in his career...was 0-1 with a 8.22 ERA in two postseason starts...joins Jarrod Parker (2012) and Sonny Gray (2013) as the only rookie pitchers in Athletics history to make two postseason starts...allowed four home runs, which ties the Athletics record for a single postseason (fifth time, last: Dave Stewart, 1989)... started Game 1 of the ALWCS against Chicago on Sept. 29 and was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss (3.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 5 so, 2 hr)...the start came one day before his 23rd birthday, making him eighth youngest pitcher in Athletics history to start a postseason game...was the youngest since Barry Zito started Game 4 of the 2000 ALDS at the age of 22 years, 147 days...then had a no decision in the A's 9-7 win over Houston in Game 3 of the ALDS on Oct. 7 at Dodger Stadium (4.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 2 hr).

LHP Cole Irvin (0-1, 17.18 ERA in 2020): Is scheduled to make his first start of the season...it is the 20th appearance and fourth start of his career...his first three starts were the first three appearances of his career with the last coming on May 22, 2019 at Chicago (NL), a loss (4.2 ip, 7 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...begins his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...went 1-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in five spring appearances, including three starts...walked just three batters in 18.0 innings and struck out 18...finished the spring with an 11.0-inning scoreless streak...allowed one run twice and no runs three times...has never faced the Astros in his career...had two stints with Philadelphia last year and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...was traded to the A's for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021.
