ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost each of the first two games and have started the season 0-2 for the second time in the last three years (2019) and the 16th time in Oakland history...have not started the season 0-3 since 1996 and have been 1-2 after three games in eight of the previous 10 seasons...are two games under .500 for the first time since May 20, 2019 when they were 23-25...are two games out of first place in the American League West for the first time since finishing the 2019 season 10 games out...this is the A's 54th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in the previous 53 years in Oakland...only the Atlanta Braves (20), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4349-4004 (.521) record over the previous 53 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 121st season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9064-9476 (.489) in their previous 120 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

THE FIRST 10: The A's begin the season with 10 games in 10 days against two 2020 playoff teams...following this four-game series with the Astros, the A's host a three-game series with the defending World Champion Los Angeles Dodgers before traveling to Houston for a three-game series...then have two off days over a four-day stretch (April 11 and 14)...the April 11 off day is the A's first scheduled Sunday off day since Aug. 26, 2012 following a three-game series at Tampa Bay.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's open the season with 13 pitchers and 13 position players...this marks the fourth time in the last five years Oakland begins the season with at least 13 pitchers (had 15 on last year's 30-man roster and 12 in 2019 in Japan)...17 players return from last years Opening Day roster (Bassitt, Canha, Chapman, Diekman, Kemp, Laureano, Luzardo, Manaea, Montas, Murphy, Olson, Petit, Pinder, Piscotty, Smith, Trivino, Wendelken), which matches the total from last year when Opening Day rosters were at 30...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...four were acquired in a trade (Andrus, Garcia, Irvin, Kolarek), two were signed as free agents (Moreland, Romo), two were signed as free agents to minor league contracts (Guduan, Lowrie) and one was selected in the Rule 5 draft (Tom).

TENURE: Of the 26 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only Mark Canha has played for Oakland in each of the last seven seasons...only five players have been on each of the last four Opening Day rosters (Chapman, Olson, Petit, Pinder, Piscotty)...Matt Olson, who was drafted on June 4, 2012, has the longest uninterrupted tenure in the A's organization...he is followed by Chad Pinder, who was drafted on June 6, 2013...Jed Lowrie, who was with Houston in 2015 and New York (NL) in 2019 and 2020, first played for the A's in 2013...his 687 games played with Oakland are second most by an A's player over the previous 10 years (Semien, 773).

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's have two rookies on the Opening Day roster (Garcia, Tom) after opening with five last year...six players have six or more years of service: Romo (12 years, 97 days), Lowrie (12 years, 111 days), Andrus (12 years), Moreland (10 years, 67 days), Petit (10 years, 16 days) and Diekman (8 years, 50 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 29.92 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)...Jesús Luzardo, who was 23 years and 183 days on April 1, is the youngest...he is followed by Sean Murphy (26 years, 179 days) and Ramón Laureano (26 years, 260 days)...Sergio Romo was the oldest at 38 years, 29 days...he is followed by Jed Lowrie (36 years, 349 days), Yusmeiro Petit (36 years, 130 days) and Mitch Moreland (35 years, 207 days).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's begin the season with two players (Fiers and Rosenthal) on the injured list after starting the 2020 season with just one...have used the IL three times this year as Frankie Montas began the spring on the Covid related IL before he was reinstated March 15...used the IL eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's posted a winning record for the third consecutive spring as they finished 16-10-2...the wins tied with Kansas City, Toronto and Boston for the most in the majors and matched the most by an A's team over the last six springs (also 2017)...compiled a 4.17 ERA, which was the lowest in the Cactus League and fifth lowest in the majors...also had the lowest opponents batting average (.228), on-base percentage (.312) and OPS (.714) in the CL and the third lowest slugging percentage (.402)...had the third fewest walks (90) and the fourth fewest home runs (27) but finished with the third fewest strikeouts (229)...offensively, the A's led the majors in on-base percentage (.357), OPS (.833), runs (161), doubles (67) and sacrifice flies (13)...topped the CL in fewest strikeouts (220), ranked second in batting (.267) and extra base hits (107) and fourth in slugging (.476)...were 9-for-11 (81.8%) in stolen base attempts...had the second fewest steals in the CL but the third best percentage...opponents were successful in just 6-of-17 (35.3%) stolen base attempts, which was the lowest mark in the majors...played all 28 games in Arizona, marking just the second time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981)...in all other springs, played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.

18 DAYS IN FEBRUARY: Of the 26 players on the A's Opening Day roster, seven were added to the A's organization over an 18-day stretch from Feb. 6 to 23...the seven players have a combined total of 67 seasons and 5,298 games in the majors...they have 30 years and 164 games of postseason experience...it began on Feb. 6 when Elvis Andrus and Aramis Garcia were acquired from Texas for Khris Davis, Jonah Heim and Dane Acker...Jed Lowrie was signed to a minor league contract on Feb. 10 and Adam Kolarek was acquired from the Dodgers on Feb. 12 with Cody Thomas for Sheldon Neuse and Gus Varland...Oakland then signed free agents Sergio Romo (Feb. 18), Yusmeiro Petit (Feb. 19) and Mitch Moreland (Feb. 23)...additionally, Mike Fiers, who starts the year on the injured list, was signed on Feb. 16 and Trevor Rosenthal, who is also on the IL, was signed on Feb. 22.

NUMBER CHANGE: Cole Irvin will switch to #19.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2021 season...Elvis Andrus is signed through 2022 with a vesting option for 2023 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023...Jake Diekman has a club option for 2022.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's have lost the first two meetings of 2021...are scheduled to play the Astros in seven of the first 10 games and six of the final nine but just six of 143 games in between...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their first season series win since going 11-8 in 2014...went 7-1 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...the seven wins at home matched the A's most against the Astros (7-3 in 2013)...then lost to the Astros in the ALDS, 3 games to 1...have won 13 of the last 20 games, including 10 of the last 14 in Oakland...are now 44-63 (.411) against Houston over the last seven years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 75-76 all-time, including 42-37 in Oakland and 33-39 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha was hit by a pitch for the 54th time in his career last night, which ties Tejada for fifth most in Oakland history (Giambi and Henderson are tied for third with 55)...**Jake Diekman** allowed three runs in his 2021 debut last night after surrendering just two runs in 21 games and 21.1 innings all last year...**Jed Lowrie** singled in the fourth inning last night for his first hit since Sept. 29, 2018 at Los Angeles (AL)...**Chad Pinder** hit his fourth career pinch hit home run last night, which is tied for fifth most in Oakland history...the record is 5 (Burroughs, McGwire, Steinbach, Aldrete).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1984** the A's trail 5-2 entering the bottom of the ninth on opening night against Milwaukee but score four times to defeat the Brewers 6-5...**Davey Lopes** starts the comeback with a leadoff home run and the other three runs score on a sacrifice fly, a fielder's choice and an error...in **1987** the A's acquire Dennis Eckersley from the Chicago Cubs...the future Hall of Famer would move into the closers role later that year and would go on to save a franchise record 320 games for the A's...in **2000** Jason Giambi becomes the first player in Oakland history to hit two home runs on Opening Day and the A's hit four home runs total but lose to Detroit, 7-4...in **2017** Khris Davis becomes the second player in Oakland history to hit two home runs on Opening Day...he also singles and ties an Oakland Opening Day record with nine total bases.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (0-1, 17.18 ERA in 2020)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his first start of the season...it is the 20th appearance and fourth start of his career...his first three starts were the first three appearances of his career with the last coming on May 22, 2019 at Chicago (NL), a loss (4.2 ip, 7 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...begins his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...was the Phillies fifth round selection in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft and made his Major League debut with Philadelphia in 2019...was traded to the A's for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in five spring appearances, including three starts...walked just three batters in 18.0 innings and struck out 18...10 of the strikeouts came in his final start on March 26 at Los Angeles (NL)...those were the most in a single game by an A's pitcher in the MLB Spring Training database, which dates back to 2006...finished the spring with an 11.0-inning scoreless streak...allowed one run twice and no runs three times...tied for the team-lead in innings pitched.

2020 RECAP: Had two stints with Philadelphia and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...allowed a .438 (7-for-16) average against right-handed hitters compared to .800 (4-for-5) against left-handers...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA in four spring training appearances...was optioned to Lehigh Valley March 26 but was recalled on July 23 and was on the Phillies Opening Day roster...made his 2020 debut on July 26 against Miami and allowed four runs on five hits in an inning of relief and was the losing pitcher in an 11-6 decision...tossed a scoreless inning of relief Aug. 9 against Atlanta but was optioned to Philadelphia's alternate site on Aug. 9...was recalled for a second time Aug. 20, pitched the next day at Atlanta (1.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so) and was optioned Aug. 22...did not pitch the remainder of the season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (4-3, 4.50 ERA in 2020): Is scheduled to make his first start of the season...begins his sixth season in the majors and is on his fourth Opening Day roster (2017-18, 20-21)...started the A's second game of the season in each of his previous three seasons in which he was on the Opening Day roster...went 3-1 with a 5.28 ERA and .250 opponents batting average in four starts this spring...tied for second in the Cactus League in wins...is 3-5 with a 3.27 ERA (71.2 ip, 64 h, 30 r, 26 er, 21 bb, 62 so, 7 hr) in 13 career regular seasons starts against Houston...also started Game 2 of the 2020 ALDS and was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss (4.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only regular season start last year, a 3-1 A's win in Oakland on Sept. 10 (7.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 4 so)...was 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts last year...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average.

- Begins his 10th season in the majors and is on his seventh Opening Day roster (2014-16, 18-21).
- Struck out his 500th career batter (Yordan Alvarez) on April 2.
- Walked the first batter he faced during the spring but then retired each of the final 18 batters he faced...opponents went 0-for-18 in his six appearances and he did not allow a run in 6.0 innings.
- Allowed three runs (two earned) to Houston on April 2, snapping a 16-game, 15.1-inning scoreless streak against the Astros (April 13, 2018-Sept. 10, 2020)...did not allow a run in five regular season games against Houston last year (5.0 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 3 so)...faced Houston three times in the ALDS last year (3.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 1 hr).
- Did not allow a run during the day last year and now has a 14-game, 11.2-inning scoreless streak in day games.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

- Was signed to a minor league contract Dec. 4 and was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas yesterday.
- Begins his fourth season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...spent the first three seasons of his career with Houston (2017-19)...was originally signed by the Astros as a non-drafted free agent on Sept. 22, 2009 and spent the first 10 seasons of his professional career in the Astros farm system before signing a minor league deal with the Dodgers last year.
- Compiled a 0.96 ERA in nine relief appearances this spring...opponents were 3-for-29 (.103) with one walk in 9.1 innings...did not allow a run over his first eight outings (8.1 ip).
- Faced the Astros April 1 for the first time in his career.

Last Year: Was a non-roster invitee with the Los Angeles Dodgers and had a loss and a 3.00 ERA in six spring training appearances...was not added to the Dodgers 60-man player pool and did not pitch in 2020.

- Logged a 9.53 ERA and .393 opponents batting average in six spring training appearances...allowed at least one hit in each appearance.
- Faced Houston three times during the regular season last year and did not allow a run (2.0 ip, 2 h, 3 bb 2 so)...then yielded four runs on four hits and a walk while striking out two in 2.0 innings over three appearances against the Astros in the ALDS.

Last Year: Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.
