OAKLAND ATHLETICS (0-3) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (3-0)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost each of the first three games and have started the season 0-3 for the eighth time in Oakland history...the last time was in 1996 when the A's lost two to Toronto and one to Detroit in Las Vegas before defeating the Tigers in the fourth game...have lost more than three straight games to start the season just twice in Oakland history...went 0-5 in 1979 and 1987...have not been swept in a four-game series since July 24-27, 2017 at Toronto and have not been swept in a four-game series in Oakland since June 19-22, 2017 by Houston...are three games under .500 for the first time since May 18, 2019 when they were 22-25...are three games out of first place in the American League West...never trailed by more than one game last year...this is the A's 54th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in the previous 53 years in Oakland...only the Atlanta Braves (20), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4349-4004 (.521) record over the previous 53 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 121st season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pen-nants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9064-9476 (.489) in their previous 120 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

EASTER A's: The A's have a 13-18 record on Easter...that includes 10-13 in Oakland and 3-5 on the road...have a two-game losing streak on Easter with the last game coming on April 21, 2019, a 5-4 loss to Toronto in Oakland...this is the second Easter meeting between the A's and Astros, with the A's winning the other game 4-1 on April 20, 2014 in Oakland...that was the A's last Easter win.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this season-opening seven-game homestand against Houston (0-2) and Los Angeles-NL (three games)...went 22-10 (.688) in Oakland last year, which was the sixth best home record in the majors and the second best home winning percentage in Oakland history... leave following the game Wednesday for their first road trip of the season, a five-game trip to Houston (three games) and Arizona (two games)...were 14-14 (.500) on the road in 2020.

THIS AND THAT: The A's bullpen has allowed 10 runs in the ninth inning over the first three games...allowed just nine runs in the ninth inning all last year...A's starting pitchers are a combined 0-3, marking the third time in Oakland history starters have taken the loss in each of the first three games...the other two times were in 1985 (Codiroli, Krueger, Young) and 1973 (Hunter, Odom, Holtzman)...the A's have allowed at least eight runs in each of the first three games for the fourth time in Athletics history (1927, 1994, 1996)...A's pitchers had an Oakland record tying four wild pitches yesterday (eighth times, previous: Sept. 27, 2019 at Seattle)...the A's begin interleague play tomorrow with a three-game series against Los Angeles (NL)...it marks the second time in Oakland history the A's have faced a National League team in April...the other time was in 2018 when they played the Dodgers on April 10 and 11 in their 12th and 13th games of the season.

THE FIRST 10: The A's begin the season with 10 games in 10 days against two 2020 playoff teams...following this four-game series with the Astros, the A's host a three-game series with the defending World Champion Los Angeles Dodgers before traveling to Houston for a three-game series...then have two off days over a four-day stretch (April 11 and 14)...the April 11 off day is the A's first scheduled Sunday off day since Aug. 26, 2012 following a three-game series at Tampa Bay.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's open the season with 13 pitchers and 13 position players...this marks the fourth time in the last five years Oakland begins the season with at least 13 pitchers (had 15 on last year's 30-man roster and 12 in 2019 in Japan)...17 players return from last years Opening Day roster, which matches the total from last year when Opening Day rosters were at 30...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007.

TENURE: Of the 26 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only Mark Canha has played for Oakland in each of the last seven seasons...only five players have been on each of the last four Opening Day rosters (Chapman, Olson, Petit, Pinder, Piscotty)...Matt Olson, who was drafted on June 4, 2012, has the longest uninterrupted tenure in the A's organization.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's have two rookies on the Opening Day roster (Garcia, Tom) after opening with five last year...six players have six or more

years of service: Romo (12 years, 97 days), Lowrie (12 years, 111 days), Andrus (12 years), Moreland (10 years, 67 days), Petit (10 years, 16 days) and Diekman (8 years, 50 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 29.92 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)... Jesús Luzardo, who was 23 years and 183 days on April 1, is the youngest... Sergio Romo was the oldest at 38 years, 29 days.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's begin the season with two players (Fiers and Rosenthal) on the injured list after starting the 2020 season with just one... have used the IL three times this year as Frankie Montas began the spring on the Covid related IL before he was reinstated March 15...used the IL eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)... used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's posted a winning record for the third consecutive spring as they finished 16-10-2...the wins tied with Kansas City, Toronto and Boston for the most in the majors and matched the most by an A's team over the last six springs (also 2017)...compiled a 4.17 ERA, which was the lowest in the Cactus League and fifth lowest in the majors...also had the lowest opponents batting average (.228), on-base percentage (.312) and OPS (.714) in the CL and the third lowest slugging percentage (.402)...had the third fewest walks (90) and the fourth fewest home runs (27) but finished with the third fewest strikeouts (229)...offensively, the A's led the majors in on-base percentage (.357), OPS (.833), runs (161), doubles (67) and sacrifice flies (13)...topped the CL in fewest strikeouts (220), ranked second in batting (.267) and extra base hits (107) and fourth in slugging (.476)...were 9-for-11 (81.8%) in stolen base attempts...had the second fewest steals in the CL but the third best percentage...opponents were successful in just 6-of-17 (35.3%) stolen base attempts, which was the lowest mark in the majors...played all 28 games in Arizona, marking just the second time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981)... in all other springs, played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.

18 DAYS IN FEBRUARY: Of the 26 players on the A's Opening Day roster, seven were added to the A's organization over an 18-day stretch from Feb. 6 to 23... the seven players have a combined total of 67 seasons and 5,298 games in the majors...they have 30 years and 164 games of postseason experience... it began on Feb. 6 when Elvis Andrus and Aramis Garcia were acquired from Texas for Khris Davis, Jonah Heim and Dane Acker...Jed Lowrie was signed to a minor league contract on Feb. 10 and Adam Kolarek was acquired from the Dodgers on Feb. 12 with Cody Thomas for Sheldon Neuse and Gus Varland... Oakland then signed free agents Sergio Romo (Feb. 18), Yusmeiro Petit (Feb. 19) and Mitch Moreland (Feb. 23)...additionally, Mike Fiers, who starts the year on the injured list, was signed on Feb. 16 and Trevor Rosenthal, who is also on the IL, was signed on Feb. 22.

A's vs. ASTRO5: The A's have lost the first three meetings of 2021...have been swept by Houston in a four-game series just once, June 19-22, 2017 at Oakland...are scheduled to play the Astros in seven of the first 10 games and six of the final nine but just six of 143 games in between...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their first season series win since going 11-8 in 2014... went 7-1 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...the seven wins at home matched the A's most against the Astros (7-3 in 2013)...then lost to the Astros in the ALDS, 3 games to 1...are now 44-64 (.407) against Houston over the last seven years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 75-77 all-time, including 42-38 in Oakland and 33-39 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha has reached base safely in each of the first three games, all batting leadoff...had never started a game in the leadoff spot prior to this year...has a .393 on-base percentage over the last three years, which is eighth best in the majors...*Mitch Moreland has* started each of the A's first three games at designated hitter...had just 54 career games at DH entering the season...*Matt Olson* has back-to-back multiple hit games (4-for-7, .571) and has reached base safely in all three games.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1974** Reggie Jackson has four hits and a homer as the two-time defending World Champion Oakland A's open their season with a 7-2 victory at Texas...the A's would go on to win their third consecutive World Championship...in **2006** Marco Scutaro has a walk-off RBI single in the ninth inning to lead the A's to a 4-3 win over the Yankees.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (4-3, 4.50 ERA in 2020)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his first start of the season...begins his sixth season in the majors and is on his fourth Opening Day roster (2017-18, 20-21)...started the A's second game of the season in each of his previous three seasons in which he was on the Opening Day roster and was 0-2 with a 4.42 ERA (9 er in 18.1 ip) in those games.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 3-1 with a 5.28 ERA and .250 opponents batting average in four starts this spring...allowed five runs in 3.1 innings for the loss in his last start on Monday against San Francisco after allowing five runs in 12.0 innings over his first three starts, all wins...tied for second in the Cactus League in wins...led the A's in walks (9) and tied for the team lead in wins and starts.

MANAEA vs. HOUSTON: Is 3-5 with a 3.27 ERA (71.2 ip, 64 h, 30 r, 26 er, 21 bb, 62 so, 7 hr) in 13 career regular seasons starts...has received no run support in four of those starts and two runs or fewer eight times...also started Game 2 of the 2020 ALDS and was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss (4.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so). is 1-3 with a 4.42 ERA (19 er in 38.2 ip) in seven starts in Oakland, 2-2 with a 1.91 ERA (7 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts in Houston...was the winning pitcher in his only regular season start last year, a 3-1 A's win in Oakland on Sept. 10 ...

retired each of the first 15 batters he faced before Reddick doubled to lead off the sixth...Diaz singled him to third and Reddick scored when Maldonado grounded into a double play...retired each of the final five batters he faced... then started and lost Game 2 of the ALDS on Oct. 6 at Dodger Stadium, a 5-2 A's loss (4.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so, 2 hr)...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Springer in the third...also allowed a run to score on a Correa ground out in the fourth and a Maldonado solo home run in the fifth.

2020 RECAP: Went 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average...his .427 slugging percentage matched his high...went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his final six starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins tied for fourth most in the majors over that span...went 0-2 with a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents average over his first five starts...tied for the team lead in starts...walked just eight batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 1.33 walks per nine innings...that was the lowest mark of his career and was sixth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...struck out 45 for a career-best 5.63 strikeout-to-walk ratio...had five starts without a walk, five with one and three in his other...has walked just 47 batters in 244.1 innings over the last three years (1.73 per nine innings).

2020 THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Had a 2.56 ERA and .233 opponents batting average over the first three innings of his starts compared to a 7.59 ERA and .319 opponents average from the fourth inning on...in 16 starts over the last previous seasons, he has a 1.70 ERA and .208 opponents batting average over innings 1-3 and a 5.50 ERA and .266 opponents average from the fourth inning on

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: His .270 opponents batting average broke down to .250 (13-for-52) against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (44-for-159) against right-handers...issued seven of eight walks to righties ...had a .204 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .327 with seven of his eight walks after that...had a .281 batting average against batters leading off an inning but issued just one walk (.293 on-base percent-

age)...yielded a .222 average with the bases empty, .373 with runners on. opponents hit .375 with runners in scoring position and were 7-for-15 (.467) with RISP and two outs...entered the season with a .227 career opponents average with RISP, including .199 with RISP and two outs...allowed a .248 $\operatorname{op-}$ ponents average and four of his seven home runs with two strikes.

2020 NIGHT AND DAY: Went 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in four starts during the day, 2-2 with a 5.29 ERA and .321 opponent average in seven starts at night ... is now 18-5 with a 3.22 ERA and .212 opponents batting average in 36 career day games compared to 21-26 with a 4.24 ERA and .268 opponents average in 61 career starts at night.

2020 HOME AND AWAY: Was 3-1 with a 3.91 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland, 1-2 with a 5.02 ERA and .302 opponents average in five starts on the road... is now 21-13 in his career in the Coliseum compared to 18-18 on the road.

2020 AL AND NL: Was 2-1 with a 3.33 ERA in five interleague starts compared to 2-2 with a 5.67 ERA in six starts against the American League...however, is 5-8 with a 4.03 ERA in 19 career starts against the National League compared to 34-23 with a 3.80 ERA in 78 games against the AL

2020 THIS AND THAT: Was charged with five unearned runs, which tied for eighth most in the majors...tossed fewer than six innings in nine of his 11 starts...was 0-3 in four starts with two runs of support or fewer, 4-0 in seven starts with three or more...is now 4-29 in 47 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 35-2 in 49 starts with support of three or more ... the A's were 7-4 (.636) in his starting assignments and are 11-5 (.688) over the previous two years.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the season as the A's number two starter and took the loss in each of his first two starts, going 0-2 with a 7.00 ERA in July. his first loss on July 25 against Los Angeles (AL) was his first since Aug. 19, 2018 against Houston and it snapped a career-high tying five-game winning streak...lost again on July 31 at Seattle when he allowed a season-high five runs in 4.1 innings...it was the first time he lost consecutive decisions since May 25-30, 2018. then went 2-0 with a 5.06 ERA in five starts in August... walked three batters Aug. 10 at Los Angeles (AL), his only outing with more than one walk...also allowed a season-high seven hits in a season-low 2.2 innings in that contest...had his third straight no decision on Aug. 15 at San Francisco, giving him an 0-2 record, a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents batting average over his first five starts...then won each of his next four starts from Aug. 20-Sept. 10...allowed one earned run in each start and compiled a 1.61 ERA and .210 opponents average during the winning streak, which fell one short of his career high of five...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings Sept. 10 against Houston ... retired each of the first 15 batters he faced before Reddick doubled to lead off the sixth...struck out a season-high seven batters on Sept. 15 at Colorado but was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss...it snapped his four-game winning streak and it also snapped an eight-game winning streak in the month of September...it was his first September loss since Sept. 12, 2017 at Boston...tossed a season-high 91 pitches in his final start on Sept. 23 at Los Angeles (NL)...went 2-1 with a 3.04 ERA and .216 opponents batting average in four starts in September and is now 10-3 with a 2.17 ERA (24 er in 99.1 ip) in 17 career starts in September...the wins are his most for any month and his ERA is his lowest...was on the A's roster for the American League Wild Card Series but did not pitch...started and lost Game 2 of the ALDS against Houston on Oct. 6 at Dodger Stadium (4.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so, 2 hr).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (3-5, 5.60 ERA in 2020): Begins his sixth season in the majors and is on his fourth Opening Day roster (2017, 19-21) ... went 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA and .290 opponents batting average in three Spring Training starts...left his final start on March 25 against Seattle with a cuticle tear on his right middle finger...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against Los Angeles (NL), a start in the A's 7-2 loss last year at Dodger Stadium on Sept. 22 (4.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...went 2-1 with a 4.11 ERA in three regular season starts last year...was off to a strong start last year as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA and .175 opponents batting average over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA and .321 opponents average over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall.

- Walked the first batter he faced during the spring but then retired each of the final 18 batters he faced...opponents went 0-for-18 in his six appearances and he did not allow a run in 6.0 innings.
- Allowed three runs (two earned) to Houston on April 2, snapping a 16game, 15.1-inning scoreless streak against the Astros (April 13, 2018-Sept. 10, 2020)...did not allow a run in five regular season games against Houston last year (5.0 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 3 so)...faced Houston three times in the ALDS last year (3.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 1 hr).
- Did not allow a run during the day last year and now has a 14-game, 11.2-inning scoreless streak in day games

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

- Was signed to a minor league contract Dec. 4 and was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas Thursday.
- Had three wild pitches in the ninth inning yesterday to tie the Oakland record for most wild pitches in a game by a reliever (Fernando Arroyo, July 4. 1982 vs. Texas).
- Begins his fourth season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...spent the first three seasons of his career with Houston (2017-19)... was originally signed by the Astros as a non-drafted free agent on Sept. 22, 2009 and spent the first 10 seasons of his professional career in the Astros farm system before signing a minor league deal with the Dodgers last year.
- Compiled a 0.96 ERA in nine relief appearances this spring...opponents were 3-for-29 (.103) with one walk in 9.1 innings...did not allow a run over his first eight outings (8.1 ip).
- Faced the Astros April 1 for the first time in his career.

Last Year: Was a non-roster invitee with the Los Angeles Dodgers and had a loss and a 3.00 ERA in six spring training appearances...was not added to the Dodgers 60-man player pool and did not pitch in 2020.

- Was acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers with minor leaguer Cody Thomas on Feb. 12 for Sheldon Neuse and Gus Varland.
- Begins his fifth season in the majors and is with his third team (Tampa Bay, 2017-19; Los Angeles-NL, 2019-20)...is on his third straight Opening Day roster.
