OAKLAND ATHLETICS (0-4) VS. LOS ANGELES DODGERS (3-1)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept in a four-game series by Houston to start the season and have started the campaign 0-4 for the third time in Oakland history...the other times were in 1979 and 1987 when the A's opened at 0-5 before winning the sixth game of the season...prior to the Houston series, had not been swept in a four-game series since July 24-27, 2017 at Toronto and had not been swept in a four-game series in Oakland since June 19-22, 2017 by Houston...never lost more than three straight games all last year and the A's four-game losing streak is their longest since a five-game skid from May 28-June 2, 2019...are four games under .500 for the first time since May 17, 2019 when they were 21-25...are four games out of first place in the American League West...never trailed by more than one game last year...this is the A's 54th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in the previous 53 years in Oakland...only the Atlanta Braves (20), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4349-4004 (.521) record over the previous 53 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 121st season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9064-9476 (.489) in their previous 120 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's begin interleague play with this three-game series against the Dodgers...it marks the second time in Oakland history the A's have faced a National League team in April...the other time was in 2018 when they played Los Angeles on April 10 and 11 in their 12th and 13th games of the season...will also host Arizona (June 8-9), San Diego (Aug. 3-4) and San Francisco (Aug. 20-22) and play at Arizona (April 12-13), Colorado (June 4-6), San Francisco (June 25-27) and San Diego (June 27-28)...went 10-10 (.500) in interleague play last year and finished with a .500 record or better against the National League for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...are 238-206 (.536) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-4 on this season-opening seven-game home-stand against Houston (0-4) and Los Angeles-NL (three games)...did not lose more than two straight home games all last year and this is the A's longest home losing streak since dropping six in a row from May 28-June 14, 2019...went 22-10 (.688) in Oakland last year, which was the sixth best home record in the majors and the second best home winning percentage in Oakland history...leave following the game Wednesday for their first road trip of the season, a five-game trip to Houston (three games) and Arizona (two games)...were 14-14 (.500) on the road in 2020.

THE FIRST 10: The A's begin the season with 10 games in 10 days against two 2020 playoff teams...began the season with a four-game series with the Astros and host this three-game series with the defending World Champion Los Angeles Dodgers before traveling to Houston for a three-game series...then have two off days over a four-day stretch (April 11 and 14)...the April 11 off day is the A's first scheduled Sunday off day since Aug. 26, 2012 following a three-game series at Tampa Bay.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have allowed at least eight runs in each of the first four games...they are the fifth team since 1901 to surrender eight or more runs in each of the first four games of the season (San Diego, 1974; Chicago-AL, 1995; St. Louis, 2001; Cleveland, 2009)...A's starting pitchers have taken the loss in all four games, marking the first time A's starters were charged with the loss in each of the first four games of the season since the 1936 Philadelphia A's did it in the first five games (Bill Dietrich, Hank Johnson, Harry Kelley, Dietrich, Gordon Rhodes)...the A's were outscored 35-9 in the four-game series with Houston and the minus 26 run differential is the largest by an A's team in a four-game series since the Philadelphia A's were outscored by Cleveland 39-11, June 16-18, 1950 (-28)...the A's bullpen has allowed 10 runs in the ninth inning over the first four games...allowed just nine runs in the ninth inning all last year...the A's have gone to the bullpen 16 times this year and the first batters faced by a reliever have four singles, two doubles, two home runs and three walks.

ROSTER NOTES: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 29.92 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)...Jesús Luzardo, who was 23 years and 183 days on April 1, is the youngest...Sergio Romo was the oldest at 38 years, 29 days...have two rookies on the Opening Day roster (Garcia, Tom) after opening with five last year...six players have six or more years of service (Romo, Lowrie, Andrus, Moreland, Petit and Diekmann)...17 players return from last year's Opening Day roster, which matches the total from last year when Opening Day rosters were at 30...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...only Mark Canha has played for Oakland in each of the last seven seasons and only five players have been on each of the last four Opening Day rosters (Chapman, Olson, Petit, Pinder, Piscotty)...Matt Olson, who was drafted on June 4, 2012, has the longest uninterrupted tenure in the A's organization...open the season with 13 pitchers and 13 position players.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's begin the season with two players (Fiers and Rosenthal) on the injured list after starting the 2020 season with just one...have used the IL three times this year as Frankie Montas began the spring on the Covid related IL before he was reinstated March 15...used the IL eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's posted a winning record for the third consecutive spring as they finished 16-10-2...the wins tied with Kansas City, Toronto and Boston for the most in the majors and matched the most by an A's team over the last six springs (also 2017)...compiled a 4.17 ERA, which was the lowest in the Cactus League and fifth lowest in the majors...also had the lowest opponents batting average (.228), on-base percentage (.312) and OPS (.714) in the CL and the third lowest slugging percentage (.402)...had the third fewest walks (90) and the fourth fewest home runs (27) but finished with the third fewest strikeouts (229)...offensively, the A's led the majors in on-base percentage (.357), OPS (.833), runs (161), doubles (67) and sacrifice flies (13)...topped the CL in fewest strikeouts (220), ranked second in batting (.267) and extra base hits (107) and fourth in slugging (.476)...were 9-for-11 (81.8%) in stolen base attempts...had the second fewest steals in the CL but the third best percentage...opponents were successful in just 6-of-17 (35.3%) stolen base attempts, which was the lowest mark in the majors...played all 28 games in Arizona, marking just the second time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981)...in all other springs, played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.

18 DAYS IN FEBRUARY: Of the 26 players on the A's Opening Day roster, seven were added to the A's organization over an 18-day stretch from Feb. 6 to 23...the seven players have a combined total of 67 seasons and 5,298 games in the majors...they have 30 years and 164 games of postseason experience...it began on Feb. 6 when Elvis Andrus and Aramis Garcia were acquired from Texas for Kris Davis, Jonah Heim and Dane Acker...Jed Lowrie was signed to a minor league contract on Feb. 10 and Adam Kolarek was acquired from the Dodgers on Feb. 12 with Cody Thomas for Sheldon Neuse and Gus Varland...Oakland then signed free agents Sergio Romo (Feb. 18), Yusmeiro Petit (Feb. 19) and Mitch Moreland (Feb. 23)...additionally, Mike Fiers, who starts the year on the injured list, was signed on Feb. 16 and Trevor Rosenthal, who is also on the IL, was signed on Feb. 22.

A's vs. DODGERS: The A's lost the season series last year as they dropped two of three games at Los Angeles, Sept. 22-24...returned to Dodger Stadium two weeks later to face Houston in the ALDS (lost three of four)...have won nine of the last 10 games in Oakland...are 22-14 (.611) all-time against the Dodgers during the regular season...that is the best record by any team against the Dodgers (White Sox, 14-11, .560)...are 15-3 in Oakland and 7-11 in Los Angeles.

Mark Canha has reached base safely in each of the first four games, all batting leadoff...had never started a game in the leadoff spot prior to this year...has a .394 on-base percentage over the last three years, which is eighth best in the majors...**Mitch Moreland** has started each of the A's first four games at designated hitter...had just 54 career games at DH entering the season.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1993** Eric Fox hits the first Opening Day grand slam in Oakland history as the A's defeat the Detroit Tigers, 9-4...in **1994** Terry Steinbach hits the second Opening Day grand slam in Oakland history, but the A's lose 11-7 at Milwaukee.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (3-5, 5.60 ERA in 2020)

FOR STARTERS: Begins his sixth season in the majors and is on his fourth Opening Day roster (2017, 19-21)...was the A's Opening Day starter last year after beginning the 2019 season in the fourth spot in the rotation.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Went 0-3 with a 13.50 ERA (10.2 ip, 18 h, 16 r, 16 er, 7 bb, 7 so, 5 hr) in three interleague starts last year and is now 2-4 with a 7.25 ERA (29 er in 36.0 ip) in 10 career interleague appearances, including seven starts...is 18-14 with a 4.21 ERA (122 er in 261.0 ip) in 70 career appearances, 40 starts, against the American League.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA and .290 opponents batting average in three Spring Training starts...left his final start on March 25 against Seattle with a cuticle tear on his right middle finger...tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in his first start but allowed six runs in 5.0 innings over his final two.

MONTAS vs. LOS ANGELES: Was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 7-2 loss last year at Dodger Stadium on Sept. 22... allowed three home runs in a game for the first time in his career...Oakland scored once in the first but he allowed a RBI single to Seager in the bottom of the first...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Muncy in the third...yielded solo home runs to Taylor and Pollock in the fourth and was relieved by McFarland to start the fifth with the A's trailing 5-2.

2020 RECAP: Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks.

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers)...had a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 the second time and .205 after that...allowed a .133 average with two strikes and has a .163 career opponents average in that situation.

2020 HOME AND AWAY: Was 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 31.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road...over the previous two years, he is 6-1 with a 2.81 ERA (23 er in 73.2 ip) and four home runs in 73.2 innings over 13 starts in Oakland, 6-6 with a 4.54 ERA (38 er in 75.1 ip) and 14 home runs in 75.1 innings over 14 starts on the road.

2020 NIGHT AND DAY: Made eight of his 11 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was 2-4 with a 6.16 ERA during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night...his career numbers are 7-9 with a 5.01 ERA (61 er in 109.2 ip) in 30 games during the day, 11-5 with a 3.63 ERA (61 er in 151.1 ip) in 40 contests at night.

2020 THE WEST AND THE REST: Was 3-2 with a 3.61 ERA and .236 opponents batting average in eight starts against American League West competition, 0-3 with a 13.50 ERA and .391 opponents average in three interleague starts...is now 10-5 with a 3.70 ERA (55 er in 133.2 ip) in 33 career appearances against AL West competition, 8-9 with a 4.74 ERA (67 er in 127.1 ip) in

37 games against all other teams...is 2-4 with a 7.25 ERA (29 er in 36.0 ip) in 10 career interleague appearances.

2020 THIS AND THAT: The A's were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments... had two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings... went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA in six starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...had 10 of his 28 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and had a 4.75 RSA for the season...won both of his starts with support of three or more runs and is now 12-1 in 15 career starts with at least three runs of support.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and had a no decision in a 7-3, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (AL)...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the A's 13th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 15 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers)...was just the second foreign-born Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Ariel Prieto, April 2, 1997)...allowed just one run in 4.0 innings...took the loss in his second start on July 29 against Colorado, snapping a career-high five-game winning streak dating back to May 17, 2019...it was his first loss since April 29, 2019 at Boston...then picked up the win in back-to-back starts on Aug. 3 at Seattle and Aug. 8 against Houston for his only winning streak of the season...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings in each start...had a season-high four walks in the start against the Mariners...was named American League Player of the Week for the week of Aug. 3-9 after going 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA in two starts...struck out 14, walked four and allowed six hits in 14.0 innings... it was his first career Player of the Week honor...was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA in four starts when he was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness...allowed a career-high nine runs on six hits and four walks in 1.2 innings in his next start on Aug. 18 at Arizona, which was his shortest career outing as a starter...that began a season-ending stretch where he went 1-4 with a 8.70 ERA in six starts...yielded a season-high seven hits Aug. 23 against Los Angeles (AL), his first of three games with seven hits...lost his second consecutive decision in the second game of the Aug. 29 doubleheader at Houston, snapping a seven-game winning streak against AL West competition...the two-game losing streak matched his career high and it marked the first time he lost back-to-back decisions since July 29-Aug. 30, 2018...defeated the Astros in his next start in the first game of the Sept. 8 doubleheader in Oakland but lost back-to-back starts on Sept. 13 at Texas and Sept. 22 at Los Angeles (NL)...was placed on the paternity list on Sept. 14...was reinstated Sept. 17 and allowed three home runs in a game for the first time in his career in his next start on Sept. 22 at Los Angeles (NL)...started the A's final game of the season on Sept. 27 against Seattle and struck out a career-high 13 batters on a career-high 113 pitches in 6.0 innings...the strikeouts were the most by an A's pitcher since Todd Stottlemyre had 15 on June 16, 1995 against Kansas City and they tied for the seventh best single game performance in Oakland history...they matched the most in Athletics history by a pitcher with six innings or fewer...Vida Blue also had 13 in 6.0 innings on April 9, 1971 against Kansas City...it was his third career 10-strikeout game...was 1-1 with a 9.53 ERA and .346 opponents batting average in two games, including one start, in his postseason debut...picked up the win in relief in the A's series-clinching, 6-4 victory over Chicago in Game 3 of the ALWCS (2.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so)...then took the loss in the deciding Game 4 of the ALDS against Houston at Dodger Stadium, an 11-6 A's loss (3.2 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 3 so, 2 hr)...blanked the Astros on one hit over the first three innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed five runs in the fourth inning on a two-run home run by Brantley and a three-run home run by Correa.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHERS
RHP Chris Bassitt (0-1, 5.06 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...was the losing pitcher in his first start, an 8-1 A's loss last Thursday on Opening Day to Houston in the Coliseum (5.1 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 3 so)... has never faced the Dodgers in his career...was 2-0 with a 1.74 ERA and .179 opponents batting average in three spring training starts...spent the entire 2020 season on the active roster for the first time in his six-year career and went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions (Lamet, SD 2.09) and sixth in the majors...it was fifth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts...also tied for fifth in the West divisions in winning percentage (.714), ranked seventh in opponents OPS (.659), batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.371), tied for seventh in wins and eighth in on-base percentage (.288)...had career lows in ERA and opponents on-base percentage.

- Begins his 10th season in the majors and is on his seventh Opening Day roster (2014-16, 18-21).
- Struck out his 500th career batter (Yordan Alvarez) on April 2.
- Walked the first batter he faced during the spring but then retired each of the final 18 batters he faced...opponents went 0-for-18 in his six appearances and he did not allow a run in 6.0 innings.
- Has a 3.38 ERA (5 er in 13.1 ip) in 16 career games against Los Angeles-NL.
- Did not allow a run during the day last year and now has a 14-game, 11.2-inning scoreless streak in day games.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

- Was signed to a minor league contract Dec. 4 and was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas Thursday.
- Had three wild pitches in the ninth inning April 3 to tie the Oakland record for most wild pitches in a game by a reliever (Fernando Arroyo, July 4, 1982 vs. Texas).
- Begins his fourth season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...spent the first three seasons of his career with Houston (2017-19)...was originally signed by the Astros as a non-drafted free agent on Sept. 22, 2009 and spent the first 10 seasons of his professional career in the Astros farm system before signing a minor league deal with the Dodgers last year.
- Compiled a 0.96 ERA in nine relief appearances this spring...opponents were 3-for-29 (.103) with one walk in 9.1 innings...did not allow a run over his first eight outings (8.1 ip).
- Has never faced the Dodgers...was a non-roster invitee with Los Angeles -NL in 2020.

Last Year: Was a non-roster invitee with the Los Angeles Dodgers and had a loss and a 3.00 ERA in six spring training appearances...was not added to the Dodgers 60-man player pool and did not pitch in 2020.
