OAKLAND ATHLETICS (0-5) VS. LOS ANGELES DODGERS (4-1)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have started the season 0-5, which matches the worst start in Oakland history...the 1979 and 1987 A's also started the year 0-5 before winning the sixth game of the season...the worst start in Athletics history is 0-6 by the 1916 Philadelphia A's...the last Major League teams to start the year 0-5 were Atlanta and Minnesota in 2016 (both lost their sixth game)...the A's never lost more than three straight games all last year and the current five-game losing streak is their longest since May 28-June 2, 2019 when they also lost five in a row...have not lost more than five straight since losing six in a row from April 26-May 1, 2019...are five games under .500 for the first time since May 16, 2019 when they were 21-26...are four games out of first place in the American League West...never trailed by more than one game last year...were swept in a four-game series by Houston to start the season, which was the first time the A's were swept in a four-game series since July 24-27, 2017 at Toronto...it was the first time it happened in Oakland since June 19-22, 2017 by Houston...this is the A's 54th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in the previous 53 years in Oakland...only the Atlanta Braves (20), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4349-4004 (.521) record over the previous 53 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 121st season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's begin interleague play with this three-game series against the Dodgers...it marks the second time in Oakland history the A's have faced a National League team in April...the other time was in 2018 when they played Los Angeles on April 10 and 11 in their 12th and 13th games of the season...will also host Arizona (June 8-9), San Diego (Aug. 3-4) and San Francisco (Aug. 20-22) and play at Arizona (April 12-13), Colorado (June 4-6), San Francisco (June 25-27) and San Diego (June 27-28)...went 10-10 (.500) in interleague play last year and finished with a .500 record or better against the National League for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...are 238-207 (.535) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-5 on this season-opening seven-game home-stand against Houston (0-4) and Los Angeles-NL (0-1)...did not lose more than two straight home games all last year and this is the A's longest home losing streak since dropping six in a row from May 28-June 14, 2019...went 22-10 (.688) in Oakland last year, which was the sixth best home record in the majors and the second best home winning percentage in Oakland history...leave following the game tomorrow for their first road trip of the season, a five-game trip to Houston (three games) and Arizona (two games)...were 14-14 (.500) on the road in 2020.

THE FIRST 10: The A's begin the season with 10 games in 10 days against two 2020 playoff teams...began the season with a four-game series with the Astros and host this three-game series with the defending World Champion Los Angeles Dodgers before traveling to Houston for a three-game series...then have two off days over a four-day stretch (April 11 and 14)...the April 11 off day is the A's first scheduled Sunday off day since Aug. 26, 2012 following a three-game series at Tampa Bay.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have allowed at least eight runs in each of the first five games...they are the third team since 1901 to surrender eight or more runs in each of the first five games of the season (San Diego, 1974; Chicago-AL, 1995)...it's the first time Oakland has yielded eight or more runs in five straight games at any point in a single season since Aug. 18-22, 1984...the A's are batting .172, which is the lowest mark by an A's team over the first five games of the season since 1940 (.172)...have scored 12 runs, which is their fewest after five games since 1979 (8)...A's starting pitchers have taken the loss in all five games, marking the second time in Athletics history starters have been charged with the loss in each of the first five games of the season...the other time was in 1936 (Bill Dietrich, Hank Johnson, Harry Kelley, Dietrich, Gordon Rhodes)...the last time A's starters had five losses in five games at any point in the season was May 7-11, 2016...the A's have been

outscored 45-12 and the minus 33 run differential is fifth worst in Oakland history over a five game stretch...it is the worst since Oakland was outscored by 36 runs from May 7-11, 2016...the A's bullpen has allowed 11 runs in the ninth inning over the first five games...allowed just nine runs in the ninth inning all last year...first batters faced are 11-for-17 (.647) with four walks, three doubles and three home runs against the A's bullpen.

ROSTER NOTES: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.92 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)...Jesus Luzardo, who was 23 years and 183 days on April 1, is the youngest...Sergio Romo was the oldest at 38 years, 29 days...had two rookies on the Opening Day roster (Garcia, Tom) after opening with five last year...added a third rookie yesterday (Puk)...six players had six or more years of service (Romo, Lowrie, Andrus, Moreland, Petit and Diekmann)...17 players returned from last year's Opening Day roster, which matches the total from last year when Opening Day rosters were at 30...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...only Mark Canha has played for Oakland in each of the last seven seasons and only five players have been on each of the last four Opening Day rosters (Chapman, Olson, Petit, Pinder, Piscotty)...Matt Olson, who was drafted on June 4, 2012, has the longest uninterrupted tenure in the A's organization...opened the season with 13 pitchers and 13 position players.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have three players on the injured list (Fiers, Pinder, Rosenthal)...have used the IL four times this year as Frankie Montas began the spring on the Covid related IL before he was reinstated March 15...used the IL eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's posted a winning record for the third consecutive spring as they finished 16-10-2...the wins tied with Kansas City, Toronto and Boston for the most in the majors and matched the most by an A's team over the last six springs (also 2017)...compiled a 4.17 ERA, which was the lowest in the Cactus League and fifth lowest in the majors...also had the lowest opponents batting average (.228), on-base percentage (.312) and OPS (.714) in the CL and the third lowest slugging percentage (.402)...had the third fewest walks (90) and the fourth fewest home runs (27) but finished with the third fewest strikeouts (229)...offensively, the A's led the majors in on-base percentage (.357), OPS (.833), runs (161), doubles (67) and sacrifice flies (13)...topped the CL in fewest strikeouts (220), ranked second in batting (.267) and extra base hits (107) and fourth in slugging (.476)...were 9-for-11 (81.8%) in stolen base attempts...had the second fewest steals in the CL but the third best percentage...opponents were successful in just 6-of-17 (35.3%) stolen base attempts, which was the lowest mark in the majors...played all 28 games in Arizona, marking just the second time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981).

A's vs. DODGERS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2021 last night...lost the season series last year as they dropped two of three games at Los Angeles, Sept. 22-24...returned to Dodger Stadium two weeks later to face Houston in the ALDS (lost three of four)...have won nine of the last 11 games in Oakland...are 22-15 (.595) all-time against the Dodgers during the regular season...that is the best record by any team against the Dodgers (White Sox, 14-11, .560)...are 15-4 in Oakland and 7-11 in Los Angeles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha has reached base safely in each of the first five games, all batting leadoff...had never started a game in the leadoff spot prior to this year...has a .394 on-base percentage over the last three years, which is eighth best in the majors...**Mitch Moreland** has started each of the A's first five games at designated hitter...had just 54 career games at DH entering the season...**J.B. Wendelken** has pitched in four of the A's first five games and has not allowed a run or a hit (2.1 ip).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1982** an Opening Day crowd of 48,348 watches the A's defeat the California Angels 3-2 in 11 innings...the A's score the winning run when Davey Lopes walks with the bases loaded to force in Dwayne Murphy with the go-ahead run...in **2015** Sonny Gray tosses eight shutout innings of one-hit ball and combines with Evan Scribner on a one-hit, 8-0 shutout of the Texas Rangers to snap the A's Major League record 10-game Opening Day losing streak.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (0-1, 5.06 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...made his first career Opening Day start last Thursday against Houston to become the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas)...is in his seventh season in the majors and is on his third Opening Day roster (2016, 2020)...did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 17-11 with a 3.32 ERA (96 er in 260.0 ip) and is averaging 8.31 strikeouts per nine innings (240 so in 260.0 ip) in 51 games (42 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

INTERLEAGUE: Went 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 6 bb, 10 so, 1 hr) in two interleague starts last year...is now 1-3 with a 3.08 ERA (21 er in 61.1 ip) in 11 career interleague starts.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss to Houston on Opening Day last Thursday in Oakland...blanked the Astros on one hit over the first three innings before allowing a run in the fourth when Altuve walked, went to third on a Brantley double and scored on a Bregman ground out...the run snapped a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...was relieved by Petit with one out in the sixth inning, runners on first and second and the A's trailing 1-0...Petit allowed both runners to score

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 2-0 with a 1.74 ERA in three spring training starts...also pitched in simulated games, most recently last Friday...allowed a .179 opponents batting average and issued just two walks in 10.1 innings...struck out 12.

2020 RECAP: Spent the entire season on the active roster for the first time in his six-year career and went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions (Lamet, SD 2.09) and sixth in the majors...it was fifth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts...also tied for fifth in the West divisions in winning percentage (.714), ranked seventh in opponents OPS (.659), batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.371), tied for seventh in wins and eighth in on-base percentage (.288)...had career lows in ERA and opponents on-base percentage...walked 17 batters in 63.0 innings for a career-low 2.43 walks per nine innings...struck out 55 for a career-best 3.24 strikeout-to-walk ratio...led the A's in innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...received five votes (two third, one fourth, two fifth) in American League Cy Young balloting...went 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA over his first three starts, 1-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his next four starts from Aug. 12-29 and 3-0 with a 0.34 ERA over his final four starts.

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .233 opponents batting average, which broke down to .223 (31-for-139) with a .590 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .248 (25-for-101) with a .755 OPS against left-handers...yielded four of his six home runs to lefties and has surrendered 18 of his 27 home runs over the last three years to lefties...walked just one batter to lead off an inning and held opponents to a .203 (13-for-64) batting average and .227 on-base percentage in that situation...the on-base percentage was sixth lowest in the majors...five of his six home runs came with the bases empty...had a .244 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .176 with RISP and two outs...had a .204 opponents batting average and two home runs with zero or one out, a .295 average with four home runs with two outs...had a .130 opponent average with two strikes...surrendered three of his six home runs to the opponent's clean-up hitter.

2020 HOME AND AWAY: Went 2-1 with a 0.72 ERA, .207 opponents batting average and .512 OPS in five starts in Oakland last year compared to 3-1 with a 4.56 ERA, .270 opponents average and .683 OPS in five starts on the road...his home ERA was second lowest in the majors (Keller, KC 0.27) and second

lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 30 innings (Treinen, 0.63 in 2018)...did not allow a home run in 37.1 innings in Oakland and now has a 10-game, 53.1-inning, 217-batter faced homerless streak in the Coliseum...is 9-11 with a 2.51 ERA (54 er in 193.2 ip) in 36 career games in the Coliseum, 10-11 with a 4.63 ERA (108 er in 210.0 ip) in 44 games in all other ballparks...has yielded just 11 home runs in 193.2 career innings in Oakland (0.53 per nine innings).

2020 NIGHT AND DAY: Went 3-0 with a 1.15 ERA in six starts at night last year compared to 2-2 with a 4.13 ERA in five starts during the day...his night ERA was the lowest in the majors and in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 30 innings at night...is now 5-1 with a 2.57 ERA (22 er in 77.0 ip) over his last 14 games, 13 starts, at night dating back to July 19, 2019.

2020 THIS AND THAT: Received 35 runs of support in his 11 starts for a run support average of 5.00...is 15-1 in 25 career starts with three runs of support or more, 4-21 in 42 starts with two runs of support or fewer...allowed six of his 18 runs in the first inning...had a 4.91 ERA in the first inning, a 1.73 ERA from the second inning on...was 3-0 with a 1.75 ERA in four starts following an A's loss and is 8-1 with a 2.38 ERA (22 er in 83.1 ip) in 14 starts following a loss over the last three years...went 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA in six starts on five days rest or more...does not have a complete game in 67 career starts, including 62 with the A's...his streak of 62 consecutive starts with no complete games is fourth longest in Athletics history (3rd is 64 by Bob Welch)...allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 11 starts, including no runs four times...the A's went 8-3 (.727) in his starting assignments and are 23-14 (.622) when he starts over the last three years...is now 15-8 with a 3.39 ERA (80 er in 212.1 ip) in 40 games, including 37 starts, over the last three years.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the season as the A's fourth starter and combined with five A's relievers on a nine-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) on July 27...had a no decision as he tossed four innings...allowed just one run in a season-high 7.0 innings Aug. 7 against Houston but had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win...that gave him one run or fewer in each of his first three starts, to become the first A's pitcher to begin the season in the starting rotation and allow one run or fewer in each of his first three starts since Gio Gonzalez in 2011 (April 3-14)...picked up his second win of the season Aug. 12 at Los Angeles (AL) to extended his winning streak to a career-high five games dating back to Aug. 11, 2019...posted a 3.32 ERA and .228 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 13 games (10 starts)...the winning streak was snapped Aug. 22 against Los Angeles (AL) when he tossed a season-high 105 pitches...went 3-0 with a 0.34 ERA in four starts in September...allowed just one run in 26.2 innings...his September ERA was second lowest in Oakland history in any month to Cory Lidle's 0.20 ERA in August of 2002 (min. 25.0 ip)...it was the lowest in September in the majors since Greg Maddux had a 0.29 ERA for Atlanta in 1995...it was the first time in his career he won three games in a month...was named American League Pitcher of the Month for his efforts, his first such honor...combined with Diekman and Trivino on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Houston on Sept. 7...pitched a season-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed all seven of the hits...struck out a season-high eight in 6.0 innings a 10-1 win in the second game of the doubleheader at Texas on Sept. 12...allowed just one run but yielded a season-high eight hits...combined with Petit, Wendelken and Weems on a three-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over San Francisco on Sept. 18...tossed a season-high tying 7.0 scoreless innings in a no decision in a 3-1, 10-inning win over Seattle on Sept. 25...then went 1-0 with a 3.27 ERA in two postseason starts...started and won Game 2 of the ALWCS, a 5-3 win over Chicago (7.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...blanked the White Sox on five hits over the first seven innings before allowing a lead-off single to Anderson in the eighth...was relieved by Hendriks, who allowed the run to score...started Game 1 of the ALDS against Houston at Dodger Stadium and had a no decision in the A's 10-5 loss (4.0 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 so)...had right elbow surgery Nov. 13 in Cincinnati at the Beacon Orthopedic clinic...the surgery was performed by Dr. Timothy Kremchek.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHERS

LHP Jesús Luzardo (0-1, 9.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...is in his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...begins the season in starting rotation for the first time in his career as his first two outings last year came in relief...was the losing pitcher in his first start, a 9-5 A's loss to Houston on Friday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 8 so)...has faced the Dodgers once in his career and it came in relief last year on Sept. 24 at Dodger Stadium (3.0 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 0 so)...was 1-1 with a 4.22 ERA in three starts this spring...allowed a .205 opponents batting average but issued four walks in 10.2 innings...did not allow a run in two of his three starts...pitched in a simulated game in his last outing on Sunday...went 3-2 with a 4.12 ERA in 12 games, including nine starts, in his rookie campaign last year...ranked second among Major League rookies in strikeouts (59) and innings pitched (59.0).

- Begins his 10th season in the majors and is on his seventh Opening Day roster (2014-16, 18-21).
- Struck out his 500th career batter (Yordan Alvarez) on April 2.
- Walked the first batter he faced during the spring but then retired each of the final 18 batters he faced...opponents went 0-for-18 in his six appearances and he did not allow a run in 6.0 innings.
- Has a 3.38 ERA (5 er in 13.1 ip) in 16 career games against Los Angeles-NL.
- Did not allow a run during the day last year and now has a 14-game, 11.2-inning scoreless streak in day games.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

- Begins his fifth season in the majors and is with his third team (Tampa Bay, 2017-19; Los Angeles-NL, 2019-20)...is on his third straight Opening Day roster.
- Compiled a 6.75 ERA and .281 opponents batting average in seven outings during the spring.
- Faced the Dodgers twice in 2019, allowing 1 er over 2.0 ip...was acquired by Los Angeles-NL from Tampa Bay in 2019...appeared in 46 games for the Dodgers in 2019-20, compiling a 0.88 ERA (3 er in 30.2 ip) with 22 strikeouts and 6 walks.

Last Year: Went 3-0 with a 0.95 ERA, .164 opponents batting average and .432 OPS in 20 relief appearances over three stints with the Los Angeles Dodgers...his ERA was second lowest among relievers in the West divisions to the A's Jake Diekman (0.42).
