



## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (0-6) VS. LOS ANGELES DODGERS (5-1)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have started the season 0-6, which matches the worst start in Athletics history...the 1916 Philadelphia A's also started the year 0-6 before winning the seventh game of the season...the last Major League teams to lose at least each of their first six games in a season were Atlanta and Minnesota in 2016, who both started the year 0-9 before winning their 10th game...the A's never lost more than three straight games all last year and the current six-game losing streak is their longest since April 26-May 1, 2019 when they also lost six in a row...have not lost more than six straight since losing eight in a row from Aug. 27-Sept. 5, 2017...are six games under .500 for the first time since May 14, 2019 when they were 19-25...have not been more than six games under .500 since finishing the 2017 season 12 games under .500 at 75-87...are five games out of first place in the American League West...never trailed by more than one game last year...were swept in a four-game series by Houston to start the season, which was the first time the A's were swept in a four-game series since July 24-27, 2017 at Toronto...it was the first time it happened in Oakland since June 19-22, 2017 by Houston...this is the A's 54th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in the previous 53 years in Oakland...only the Atlanta Braves (20), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4349-4004 (.521) record over the previous 53 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 121st season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's begin interleague play with this three-game series against the Dodgers...it marks the second time in Oakland history the A's have faced a National League team in April...the other time was in 2018 when they played Los Angeles on April 10 and 11 in their 12th and 13th games of the season...will also host Arizona (June 8-9), San Diego (Aug. 3-4) and San Francisco (Aug. 20-22) and play at Arizona (April 12-13), Colorado (June 4-6), San Francisco (June 25-27) and San Diego (June 27-28)...went 10-10 (.500) in interleague play last year and finished with a .500 record or better against the National League for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...are 238-208 (.534) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-6 on this season-opening seven-game homestand against Houston (0-4) and Los Angeles-NL (0-2)...the last time the A's lost six games on a homestand was May 20-31, 2018 when they went 4-6...have not lost seven games on a homestand since going 3-7 from June 30-July 9, 2006...have never gone winless on a homestand of longer than three games in Oakland history...have never gone 0-7 on a homestand in Athletics history...went 0-6 with a tie on a seven-game homestand from July 5-11, 1937...did not lose more than two straight home games all last year and this is the A's longest home losing streak since May 28-June 14, 2019 when they also lost six in a row...have not lost more than six straight at home since June 19-July 3, 2017 when they lost eight straight...went 22-10 (.688) in Oakland last year, which was the sixth best home record in the majors and the second best home winning percentage in Oakland history...leave following the game today for their first road trip of the season, a five-game trip to Houston (three games) and Arizona (two games)...were 14-14 (.500) on the road in 2020.

**THE FIRST 10:** The A's begin the season with 10 games in 10 days against two 2020 playoff teams...began the season with a four-game series with the Astros and host this three-game series with the defending World Champion Los Angeles Dodgers before traveling to Houston for a three-game series...then have two off days over a four-day stretch (April 11 and 14)...the April 11 off day is the A's first scheduled Sunday off day since Aug. 26, 2012 following a three-game series at Tampa Bay.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have allowed at least five runs in each of the first six games, which is the longest such streak to open a season in Athletics history...have an 8.00 ERA, which is the highest mark in the majors...also have the highest opponents batting average (.321), on-base percentage (.402), slugging percentage (.567) and OPS (.969)...the A's are batting .169, which is

the second lowest mark by an A's team over the first six games of the season (.144 in 1916)...have scored 13 runs, which is tied for third fewest after six games (8 in 1916, 10 in 1966, 13 in 1978)...A's starting pitchers have taken the loss in all six games, marking the first time in Athletics history starters have taken the loss in each of the first six games of the season...the previous high was the first five games in 1936...the last time A's starters had six losses in six games at any point in the season was Sept. 27-Oct. 3, 2009 (E. Gonzalez, Cahill, Mortensen, Anderson, G. Gonzalez, Eveland)...the A's have been outscored 50-13 and the minus 37 run differential is tied for fourth worst in Oakland history over a six-game stretch...it is the worst since Aug. 5-11, 2000 when they were outscored by 39 runs (56-17)...the A's bullpen has allowed 12 runs in the ninth inning over the first six games...allowed just nine runs in the ninth inning all last year...first batters faced are 11-for-19 (.579) with five walks, three doubles and three home runs against the A's bullpen.

**ROSTER NOTES:** The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.92 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)...Jesus Luzardo, who was 23 years and 183 days on April 1, is the youngest...Sergio Romo was the oldest at 38 years, 29 days...17 players returned from last year's Opening Day roster, which matches the total from last year when Opening Day rosters were at 30...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...opened the season with 13 pitchers and 13 position players.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have placed three players on the injured list since the season started and currently have players on the IL (Fiers, Guduan, Pinder, Rosenthal, Smith)...have used the IL six times this year as Frankie Montas began the spring on the Covid related IL before he was reinstated March 15...used the IL eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

**DURING THE SPRING:** The A's posted a winning record for the third consecutive spring as they finished 16-10-2...the wins tied with Kansas City, Toronto and Boston for the most in the majors and matched the most by an A's team over the last six springs (also 2017)...compiled a 4.17 ERA, which was the lowest in the Cactus League and fifth lowest in the majors...also had the lowest opponents batting average (.228), on-base percentage (.312) and OPS (.714) in the CL and the third lowest slugging percentage (.402)...had the third fewest walks (90) and the fourth fewest home runs (27) but finished with the third fewest strikeouts (229)...offensively, the A's led the majors in on-base percentage (.357), OPS (.833), runs (161), doubles (67) and sacrifice flies (13)...topped the CL in fewest strikeouts (220), ranked second in batting (.267) and extra base hits (107) and fourth in slugging (.476)...were 9-for-11 (81.8%) in stolen base attempts...had the second fewest steals in the CL but the third best percentage...opponents were successful in just 6-of-17 (35.3%) stolen base attempts, which was the lowest mark in the majors...played all 28 games in Arizona, marking just the second time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981).

**A's vs. DODGERS:** The A's have lost the first two meetings of 2021 and have never been swept in a three-game series by the Dodgers...now have a three-game losing to Los Angeles, which matches the longest in Oakland history against the Dodgers (June 13-Aug. 29, 1997)...lost the season series last year as they dropped two of three games at Los Angeles, Sept. 22-24...returned to Dodger Stadium two weeks later to face Houston in the ALDS (lost three of four)...are 22-16 (.579) all-time against the Dodgers during the regular season...that is the best record by any team against the Dodgers (White Sox, 14-11, .560)...are 15-5 in Oakland and 7-11 in Los Angeles.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Mark Canha** has started each of the first six games batting leadoff...had never started a game in the leadoff spot prior to this year...has a .392 on-base percentage over the last three years, which is eighth best in the majors...**Ramón Laureano** has hit safely in each of his first three games and has two multiple hit games...three of his five hits are for extra bases (two doubles, one home run)...**J.B. Wendelken** has pitched in four of the A's first six games and has not allowed a run or a hit (2.1 ip).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1996** Ernie Young starts the sixth triple play in Oakland history with a spectacular catch against Detroit in Las Vegas...after slamming into the wall to catch a Bobby Higginson fly ball, his return throw doubled up Alan Trammell and Chad Curtis.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: **Jesús Luzardo (0-0, 9.00 ERA)**

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...is in his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...begins the season in starting rotation for the first time in his career as his first two outings last year came in relief.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Went 2-1 with a 5.33 ERA (27.0 ip, 32 h, 16 r, 16 er, 9 bb, 26 so, 2 hr) in six games, including four starts, in interleague play last year...they were his first career interleague appearances...is 1-2 with a 3.31 ERA (18 er in 49.0 ip) in 13 career games against the American League.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss to Houston on Friday in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters...allowed a three-run home run to Bregman in the third inning and surrendered two more runs in the fourth on a Gurriel home run and a Brantley RBI double.

**LUZARDO vs. LOS ANGELES:** Has faced the Dodgers once in his career and it came in relief last year on Sept. 24 at Dodger Stadium (3.0 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 0 so)...relieved Fiers to start the sixth inning of the A's 5-1 loss...allowed three runs in the sixth inning on a Hernandez RBI single, a Taylor bases loaded walk and a Seager sacrifice fly...retired nine of the final 10 batters he faced.

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Was 1-1 with a 4.22 ERA in three starts this spring...also pitched in simulated games, most recently on Sunday...allowed a .205 opponents batting average but issued four walks in 10.2 innings...did not allow a run in two of his three starts...is now 4-1 with a 1.82 ERA (7 er in 34.2 ip) and .195 (24-for-123) opponents batting average in 13 career spring training appearances (10 starts).

**2020 RECAP:** Went 3-2 with a 4.12 ERA in 12 games, including nine starts, in his rookie campaign...ranked second among Major League rookies in strikeouts (59) and innings pitched (59.0), tied for fifth in games and tied for ninth in wins and games started...walked just 17 batters in 59.0 innings (2.59 per nine innings) and now has 21 walks in 76.0 career innings (2.49 per nine innings)...walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 12 appearances in 2020 and 18 of 19 in his career...however, surrendered nine home runs, which tied for fifth most among ML rookies.

**2020 OPPONENTS BATTING:** Had a .257 opponents batting average, which broke down to .256 (45-for-176) against right-handed hitters compared to .260 (13-for-50) against left-handers...surrendered eight of his nine home runs and issued 15 of his 17 walks to righties...has allowed 11 of his 12 career home runs and has 18 of his 21 walks against righties...six of his nine home runs were solo shots...his opponents average increased to .317 with runners in scoring position, including .421 with RISP and two outs...opponents hit .322 when leading off an inning but he walked just three...has walked just five batters to lead off an inning in his career...had a .228 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .280 with six of his nine home runs after that.

**2020 HOME AND AWAY:** Went 3-1 with a 2.40 ERA, .215 opponents batting average and .595 OPS in eight games, six starts, at home compared to 0-1 with an 8.15 ERA, .338 opponents average and 1.032 OPS in four games, three starts, on the road...allowed three home runs in 41.1 innings at home, six in 17.2 innings on the road...is now 3-2 with a 3.04 ERA (16 er in 47.1 ip) in 10 career appearances in the Coliseum, 0-1 with a 5.65 ERA (18 er in 28.2 ip) in nine games on the road.

**2020 BY INNING:** Allowed 12 of his 27 runs in the fourth and fifth innings...had a 2.67 ERA over the first three innings of a game and a 6.89 ERA in the

fourth and fifth...had a 3.86 ERA from the sixth inning on, which includes his relief appearances.

**2020 STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Pitched in relief in his first two appearances of the season, made nine consecutive starts from Aug. 4 to Sept. 19 and then pitched in relief in his final outing...was 3-2 with a 3.83 ERA in his nine starts, 0-0 with a 5.59 ERA in three relief appearances...the A's were 6-3 (.667) in his starting assignments...first batters faced were 2-for-3 (.667) with a double in his three relief appearances.

**2020 RUN SUPPORT:** Received no run support in three of his starts and had two runs of support or fewer in six of his nine starts...had 22 runs of support in 12 games and 59.0 innings overall...his season run support average of 3.36 was ninth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched.

**2020 AMERICAN LEAGUE AND NATIONAL LEAGUE:** Was 1-1 with a 3.09 ERA in six games against the American League West compared to 2-1 with a 5.33 ERA in six games against National League West...the six interleague games are the first of his career...is 1-2 with a 3.31 ERA (18 er in 49.0 ip) in 13 career games against the AL.

**2020 HIGHLIGHTS:** Began the season pitching out of the bullpen and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in his first outing on July 25 against Los Angeles (AL)...tossed 3.2 innings in his next relief appearance on July 29 against Colorado...did not allow a run in the sixth or seventh inning before yielding a RBI double to Blackmon in the eighth...that snapped his scoreless streak at a career-high 12.0 innings dating back to Sept. 21, 2019...made his first Major League start Aug. 4 against Texas...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits and two walks, but had a no decision in the A's 5-1 win...at the age of 22 years and 309 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to start a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...recorded his first big league win in his second start, a 7-2 A's win over Houston on Aug. 9...at the age of 22 years and 314 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to win a game since Anderson in that Oct. 2, 2010 game...allowed a two-run home run to Gurriel in 5.2 innings of work...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high nine hits in 3.1 innings at San Francisco on Aug. 14 but had a no decision in the A's 8-7 win in 10 innings...it was the shortest start of his career...was charged with the first two losses of his career in back-to-back starts on Aug. 24 at Texas and Sept. 4 against San Diego...tossed a career-high 100 pitches in a career-high 7.0 innings against Houston Sept. 9...allowed just two runs but had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win...allowed a career-high three home runs in the first game of the Sept. 14 doubleheader at Seattle...combined with Diekman, Soria and Trivino on a six-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over San Francisco in his final start on Sept. 19 against San Francisco...then pitched in relief of Mike Fiers on Sept. 24 at Los Angeles (NL) to provide rotation flexibility for the postseason...walked three batters in 3.0 innings of relief, which was the first time he issued more than two free passes in a game...did not strike out a batter for the first time in his career...was 0-1 with a 8.22 ERA in two postseason starts...joins Jarrod Parker (2012) and Sonny Gray (2013) as the only rookie pitchers in Athletics history to make two postseason starts...allowed four home runs, which ties the Athletics record for a single postseason (fifth time, last: Dave Stewart, 1989)...started Game 1 of the ALWCS against Chicago on Sept. 29 and was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss (3.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 5 so, 2 hr)...the start came one day before his 23rd birthday, making him eighth youngest pitcher in Athletics history to start a postseason game...was the youngest since Barry Zito started Game 4 of the 2000 ALDS at the age of 22 years, 147 days...then had a no decision in the A's 9-7 win over Houston in Game 3 of the ALDS on Oct. 7 at Dodger Stadium (4.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 2 hr).

<b>LHP Cole Irvin (0-0, 8.31 ERA):</b> Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...it is the 21st appearance and fifth start of his career...begins his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...was the losing pitcher in his first start, a 9-1 A's loss to Houston last Saturday in Oakland...it was his first career appearance against the Astros...went 1-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in five spring appearances, including three starts...walked just three batters in 18.0 innings and struck out 18...finished the spring with an 11.0-inning scoreless streak...allowed one run twice and no runs three times...had two stints with Philadelphia last year and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...was traded to the A's for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021.

- Compiled a 6.75 ERA and .281 opponents batting average in seven outings during the spring.
- Faced the Dodgers twice in 2019, allowing 1 er over 2.0 ip...was acquired by Los Angeles-NL from Tampa Bay in 2019...appeared in 46 games for the Dodgers in 2019-20, compiling a 0.88 ERA (3 er in 30.2 ip) with 22 strikeouts and 6 walks.

*Last Year: Went 3-0 with a 0.95 ERA, .164 opponents batting average and .432 OPS in 20 relief appearances over three stints with the Los Angeles Dodgers...his ERA was second lowest among relievers in the West divisions to the A's Jake Diekman (0.42).*

- Begins his 14th season in the majors and is on his 10th Opening Day roster (Arizona, 2008-09; San Francisco, 2014-15; Washington, 2016; Los Angeles-AL, 2017; Oakland, 2018-21).
- Logged a 9.53 ERA and .393 opponents batting average in six spring training appearances...allowed at least one hit in each appearance.
- Faced Los Angeles-NL four times in 2018 with the A's, allowing 1 er over 4.0 innings...for his career, is 1-5 with a 5.08 ERA (32 er in 56.2 ip) and 42 strikeouts in 21 games, including 6 starts.
