OAKLAND ATHLETICS (1-6) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (5-1)

THURSDAY, APRIL 8, 2021 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 7:10 CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their season-opening six-game losing streak with a 4-3 win over the Dodgers yesterday in 10 innings...the 0-6 start matched the 1916 Philadelphia A's for the worst in franchise history...the six-game losing streak was the A's longest since April 26-May 1, 2019 when they also lost six in a row...did not lose more than three in a row all last year...are in sole possession of last place in the American League West for the sixth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 4½ games...never trailed by more than one game last year...have spent one day tied for fourth and six days in fifth... were swept in a four-game series by Houston to start the season, which was the first time the A's were swept in a four-game series since July 24-27, 2017 at Toronto...it was the first time it happened in Oakland since June 19-22, 2017 by Houston...this is the A's 54th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in the previous 53 years in Oakland...only the Atlanta Braves (20), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4349-4004 (.521) record over the previous 53 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 121st season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's placed A.J. Puk on the injured list today and have now placed four players on the IL since the season started...currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Guduan, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith), which is their most at one point since Aug. 2, 2019 when they also had six...have now used the IL seven times this year after using it just eight times all last year...that was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their first road trip of the season tonight, a five-game trip to Houston (three games) and Arizona (two games)...were 14-14 (.500) on the road in 2020...went 1-6 on the season-opening seven-game homestand against Houston (0-4) and Los Angeles-NL (1-2)...it was the A's worst record on a homestand of more than three games since they went 1-8 on the first homestand of the 2001 season (1-2 vs. Anaheim, 0-3 vs. Seattle, 0-3 vs. Texas)...started the 2001 season 2-10 but ended up winning 102 games...did not lose more than two straight home games all last year when they went 22-10 (.688)...that was the sixth best home record in the majors and the second best home winning percentage in Oakland history.

THE FIRST 10: The A's begin the season with 10 games in 10 days against two 2020 playoff teams...were swept by Houston in a four-game series to start the season, lost two of three to the defending World Champion Los Angeles Dodgers and concluded the stretch with this three-game series against Houston...then have two off days over a four-day stretch (April 11 and 14)... the April 11 off day is the A's first scheduled Sunday off day since Aug. 26, 2012 following a three-game series at Tampa Bay.

OFFENSE: The A's have collected six hits or fewer in seven of the first eight games and are batting .168, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (Cubs, .124)...it is the lowest mark in Athletics history over the first seven games of the season (previous: .172 in 1908)...have the lowest slugging percentage in the majors (.264) and the lowest on-base percentage (.265) and OPS (.528) in the American League...are tied for the AL lead in most hit by pitches (6), fewest runs scored (17) and fewest extra base hits (13) and are tied for the second fewest home runs (3).

PITCHING: The A's allowed a season-low three runs yesterday after yielding at least eight runs in the first five games and five or more in the first six contests...have a 7.17 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the majors (Pirates, 7.35)...have issued a Major League-leading 34 walks and have the highest opponents on-base percentage (.394)...have yielded a ML-leading 13 home runs and have the highest opponents slugging percentage (.523)...A's starting pitchers are 0-6 over the first seven games and are one of three American League teams without a win from their starters (Los Angeles, Tampa Bay)...last year, the A's did not get a win from their starter until the ninth game...first batters faced against A's relievers are 11-for-22 (.500) with three doubles, three home runs, six walks and a hit by pitch (.621 on-base percentage)...the bullpen has allowed 12 runs in the ninth inning after yielding just nine runs in the ninth inning all last year.

ON THE BASES: The A's are a perfect 5-for-5 in stolen base attempts and rank third in the American League in stolen bases...last year, the A's were successful in 26-of-29 (89.7%) stolen base attempts, which was the best percentage

in Major League history...were a perfect 13-for-13 in stolen base attempts on the road in 2020...have been successful in each of their last 19 stolen bases attempts on the road and have not been caught stealing in a road game since Aug. 27, 2019 at Kansas City.

THIS AND THAT: The A's recorded their first walk-off win and first extra inning win of the season with yesterday's 4-3 victory over the Dodgers in 10 innings...last year, the A's led the majors with six walk-off wins and six extra inning wins...have turned eight double plays, which is tied with Tampa Bay and San Diego for the most in the majors...have been outscored 53-17 over the first seven games and the minus 36 run differential is the lowest in Athletics history after the first seven games (previous: -32 in 1955).

TAXI SQUAD: The A's taxi squad for the first road trip includes pitcher James Kaprielian, catcher Austin Allen and infielders Pete Kozma and Vimael Machín...Kozma is not on the 40-man roster.

ROSTER NOTES: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.92 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)...Jesús Luzardo, who was 23 years and 183 days on April 1, is the youngest...Sergio Romo was the oldest at 38 years, 29 days...17 players returned from last years Opening Day roster, which matches the total from last year when Opening Day rosters were at 30...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...opened the season with 13 pitchers and 13 position players.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's posted a winning record for the third consecutive spring as they finished 16-10-2...the wins tied with Kansas City, Toronto and Boston for the most in the majors and matched the most by an A's team over the last six springs (also 2017)...compiled a 4.17 ERA, which was the lowest in the Cactus League and fifth lowest in the majors...also had the lowest opponents batting average (.228), on-base percentage (.312) and OPS (.714) in the CL and the third lowest slugging percentage (.402)...had the third fewest walks (90) and the fourth fewest home runs (27) but finished with the third fewest strikeouts (229)...offensively, the A's led the majors in on-base percentage (.357), OPS (.833), runs (161), doubles (67) and sacrifice flies (13)...topped the CL in fewest strikeouts (220), ranked second in batting (.267) and extra base hits (107) and fourth in slugging (.476)...were 9-for-11 (81.8%) in stolen base attempts...had the second fewest steals in the CL but the third best percentage...opponents were successful in just 6-of-17 (35.3%) stolen base attempts, which was the lowest mark in the majors...played all 28 games in Arizona, marking just the second time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 0-4 against the Astros after being swept in a fourgame series in Oakland to start the season...it was the second time the A's were swept by Houston in a four-game series (June 19-22, 2017 at Oakland)...are scheduled to play the Astros in seven of the first 10 games this year and six of the final nine but just six of 143 games in between...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their first season series win since going 11-8 in 2014...went 7-1 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...the seven wins at home matched the A's most against the Astros (7-3 in 2013)...then lost to the Astros in the ALDS, 3 games to 1...are now 44-65 (.403) against Houston over the last seven years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 75-78 all-time, including 42-39 in Oakland and 33-39 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha was hit by a pitch for the second time this year and the 55th time in his career yesterday...the 55 hit by pitches are tied for third most in Oakland history and are four short of the record of 59 by Sal Bando... *Ramón Laureano* stole two bases yesterday for the second two-steal game of his career (June 12, 2019 at Tampa Bay)...now has a Major League leading four stolen bases, which match the most by an A's player over the first seven games of the season over the last 23 years (Rajai Davis, 2010).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1934** the A's and the Phillies meet in a City Series game before 15,000 fans at Shibe Park for the first legal Sunday baseball game ever played in Philadelphia...in **1982** Rickey Henderson ties a club record with five walks but the A's lose to California 8-6 in 16 innings...in **2003** Barry Zito extends his winning streak to 10 games in the A's 2-1 win at Texas, the fifth winning streak of 10 or more games in Oakland history...in **2006** Zito combines with the A's bullpen on a one-hit shutout in a 3-0 win at Seattle after the A's pitching staff tosses a two-hit shutout against the Mariners the night before...the three hits allowed in consecutive games sets an Oakland record.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (0-0, 8.31 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...it is the 21st appearance and fifth start of his career...begins his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...was the Phillies fifth round selection in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft and made his Major League debut with Philadelphia in 2019...was traded to the A's for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss to Houston last Saturday in Oakland...it was his first start since May 22, 2019 with Philadelphia at Chicago (NL)...tossed 4.1 innings, which was the shortest start of his career...allowed a RBI single to Tucker in the first but the A's came back to tie the game with a run in the bottom of the first...then allowed a RBI single to Altuve in the second...was relieved by Trivino with runners on first and second and one out in the fifth and Trivino allowed a three-run home run.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in five spring appearances, including three starts...walked just three batters in 18.0 innings and struck out 18...10 of the strikeouts came in his final start on March 26 at Los Angeles (NL)...those were the most in a single game by an A's pitcher in the MLB Spring Training database, which dates back to 2006...finished the spring with an 11.0-inning scoreless streak...allowed one run twice and no runs three times...tied for the team-lead in innings pitched.

LHP Sean Manaea (0-1, 9.64 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...begins his sixth season in the majors and is on his fourth Opening Day roster (2017-18, 20-21)...was the losing pitcher in his first start, a 9-2 A's loss to Houston last Sunday in Oakland (4.2 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...is 3-6 with a 3.66 ERA (76.1 ip, 70 h, 35 r, 31 er, 24 bb, 66 so, 9 hr) in 14 career regular season starts against Houston...also started Game 2 of the 2020 ALDS and was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss (4.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...went 3-1 with a 5.28 ERA and .250 opponents batting average in four starts this spring...tied for second in the Cactus League in wins...was 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts last year...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average ...went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his final six starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins tied for fourth most in the majors over that span.
