OAKLAND ATHLETICS (2-7) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (6-2)

SATURDAY, APRIL 10, 2021 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 3:10 CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's won their second game for the season last night, beating the Astros 6-2...started the season 1-7, which matched the worst record after eight games in Athletics history (1951, 1952, 1979)...started 1-9 in 1979, 1-8 in 1952 and 1-12 in 1951...are five games under .500...have not been more than six games under .500 since finishing the 2017 season 12 games under at 75-87...are in sole possession of last place in the American League West for the eighth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 4½ games...never trailed by more than one game last year...have spent one day tied for fourth and eight days in fifth...began the season with a six-game losing streak, which matched the longest season-opening losing streak in Athletics history (1916)...did not lose more than three in a row all last year...were swept in a four-game series by Houston to start the season, which was the first time the A's were swept in a four-game series since July 24-27, 2017 at Toronto...it was the first time it happened in Oakland since June 19-22, 2017 by Houston...this is the A's 54th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in the previous 53 years in Oakland...only the Atlanta Braves (20), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 121st season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on their first road trip of the season, a five-game trip to Houston (1-1) and Arizona (two games)...were 14-14 (.500) on the road in 2020...went 1-6 on the season-opening seven-game homestand against Houston (0-4) and Los Angeles-NL (1-2)...it was the A's worst record on a homestand of more than three games since they went 1-8 on the first homestand of the 2001 season (1-2 vs. Anaheim, 0-3 vs. Seattle, 0-3 vs. Texas)...started the 2001 season 2-10 but ended up winning 102 games...did not lose more than two straight home games all last year when they went 22-10 (.688)...that was the sixth best home record in the majors and the second best home winning percentage in Oakland history.

THE FIRST 10: The A's begin the season with 10 games in 10 days against two 2020 playoff teams...were swept by Houston in a four-game series to start the season, lost two of three to the defending World Champion Los Angeles Dodgers and conclude the stretch with this three-game series against Houston...then have two off days over a four-day stretch (April 11 and 14)...the April 11 off day is the A's first scheduled Sunday off day since Aug. 26, 2012 following a three-game series at Tampa Bay.

OFFENSE: The A's have collected seven hits or fewer in nine of the first 10 games and are batting .175, which is the third lowest mark in the majors (Cubs, .157; Brewers, .172)...it is the lowest mark in Athletics history over the first nine games of the season (previous: .175 in 1966)...have the second lowest slugging percentage in the majors (.287) and the lowest OPS (.558) in the American League...are tied for the AL lead in most hit by pitches (7) and have the second lowest on-base percentage (.271) and third fewest runs scored (25)...had two pinch hits Thursday and are 4-for-9 (.444) with a walk, a home run and four RBI in the pinch this year.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed six or more runs in six of the first nine games and have a 6.56 ERA, which is the second highest in the majors (Pirates, 6.83)...have issued a American League-leading 38 walks and have the highest opponents on-base percentage (.372)...have yielded a ML-leading 16 home runs and have the highest opponents slugging percentage (.505)...A's starting pitchers are 0-7 over the first nine games and Oakland is one of three American League teams without a win from their starters (Los Angeles, Tampa Bay)...RHP Yusmeiro Petit has recorded the win in each of the team's first two victories...A's starters also went winless over the first eight games last year, which was the third longest-season opening streak in Oakland history (recorded their first win in the ninth game)...the longest season-opening streaks without a win from a starter is 10 in 1979 and 1997...Deolis Guerra allowed a home run to the first batter he faced yesterday and the A's bullpen has now allowed four home runs against first batters faced...had just five such home runs all last year...the bullpen has allowed 13 runs in the ninth inning after yielding just nine runs in the ninth inning all last year.

ON THE BASES: The A's were a perfect 5-for-5 in stolen base attempts before Laureano was thrown out yesterday...are tied for third in the American League in stolen bases...last year, the A's were successful in 26-of-29 (89.7%) stolen base attempts, which was the best percentage in Major League his-

tory...were a perfect 13-for-13 in stolen base attempts on the road in 2020...had been successful in each of their last 19 stolen bases attempts on the road and had not been caught stealing in a road game since Aug. 27, 2019 at Kansas City.

THIS AND THAT: The A's lost by four runs Thursday and all seven of their losses have been by at least four runs...the A's first win was a one-run victory on Wednesday against the Dodgers...that was a 4-3 walk-off win in 10 innings...last year, the A's led the majors with six walk-off wins and six extra inning wins...have turned eight double plays, which is tied for second most in the Majors...turned just 33 double plays last year, which was the fewest in the majors.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's placed A.J. Puk on the injured list Thursday and have now placed four players on the IL since the season started...currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Guduan, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith), which is their most at one point since Aug. 2, 2019 when they also had six...have now used the IL seven times this year after using it just eight times all last year...that was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

TAXI SQUAD: The A's taxi squad for the first road trip includes pitchers James Kaprielian and Miguel Romero, catcher Austin Allen and infielders Pete Kozma and Vimal Machin...Kozma is not on the 40-man roster.

ROSTER NOTES: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.92 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)...Jesús Luzardo, who was 23 years and 183 days on April 1, is the youngest...Sergio Romo was the oldest at 38 years, 29 days...17 players returned from last year's Opening Day roster, which matches the total from last year when Opening Day rosters were at 30...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...opened the season with 13 pitchers and 13 position players.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's posted a winning record for the third consecutive spring as they finished 16-10-2...the wins tied with Kansas City, Toronto and Boston for the most in the majors and matched the most by an A's team over the last six springs (also 2017)...compiled a 4.17 ERA, which was the lowest in the Cactus League and fifth lowest in the majors...also had the lowest opponents batting average (.228), on-base percentage (.312) and OPS (.714) in the CL...offensively, the A's led the majors in on-base percentage (.357), OPS (.833), runs (161), doubles (67) and sacrifice flies (13)...topped the CL in fewest strikeouts (220)...opponents were successful in just 6-of-17 (35.3%) stolen base attempts, which was the lowest mark in the majors.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 1-5 against the Astros...won the second game in Houston last night after being swept in a four-game series in Oakland to start the season...it was the second time the A's were swept by Houston in a four-game series (June 19-22, 2017 at Oakland)...are scheduled to play the Astros in seven of the first 10 games this year and six of the final nine but just six of 143 games in between...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their first season series win since going 11-8 in 2014...went 7-1 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...the seven wins at home matched the A's most against the Astros (7-3 in 2013)...then lost to the Astros in the ALDS, 3 games to 1...are now 45-66 (.405) against Houston over the last seven years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 76-79 all-time, including 42-39 in Oakland and 34-40 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jed Lowrie has played in each of the A's first nine games after playing in just nine games over the previous two seasons (0 in 2020, 9 in 2019)...the A's hit three home runs yesterday, matching their total for the season to that point...**J.B. Wendelken, Yusmeiro Petit, and Lou Trivino** have all made five appearances, which is tied for the most in the Majors...both of the A's wins have come when they've out-homered their opponents and all seven of their losses have come when being out-homered.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1968** the Oakland A's play their first game, a 3-1 loss at Baltimore...John Donaldson collected the A's first hit, a second inning single, and Reggie Jackson hit the first home run, an eighth inning solo shot...in **1975** Mike Norris tossed a complete-game three-hit shutout in his Major League debut in the A's 9-0 win over Chicago...in **1990** Rickey Henderson draws his 1000th career walk in the fourth inning off Minnesota pitcher Roy Smith...in **2019** Khris Davis homers twice at Baltimore, including his 200th career home run.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (0-1, 23.63 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...took the loss in his first start and now has a career-high three-game losing streak dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...begins his sixth season in the majors and is on his fourth Opening Day roster (2017, 19-21)...was the A's Opening Day starter last year after beginning the 2019 season in the fourth spot in the rotation.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss to Los Angeles (NL) last Monday in Oakland...tossed 90 pitches in 2.2 innings, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...allowed four runs in the second inning on a McKinstry sacrifice fly and a three-run double by Seager...yielded three more runs in the third on a Smith home run, a McKinstry RBI single and a wild pitch.

2-1 with a 4.11 ERA (15.1 ip, 14 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in three regular season starts last year...the first win came in a 3-1 A's victory in Oakland on Aug. 8...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits, his fewest hits allowed in a start of more than four innings in his career...retired the first four batters, allowed a double to Gurriel in the fourth, retired the next eight batters, allowed a single to Gurriel in the fifth and then retired the final nine batters...then took the loss in a 6-3 decision at Houston in the second game of the Aug. 29 doubleheader...allowed a bases loaded triple to Tucker in the first inning and a two-run home run to Springer in the second...retired seven of the final eight batters he faced before he was relieved by Wendelken with one out and a runner on first in the fourth...picked up the win in the A's 4-2 win in the first game of the Sept. 8 doubleheader in Oakland when the A's were the visiting team...shut out the Astros on four hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Brantley in the bottom of the fifth...Oakland came back with two in the top of the sixth and he was relieved by Diekman to start the bottom of the sixth with the A's leading 4-2...then took the loss in the deciding Game 4 of the ALDS against Houston at Dodger Stadium, an 11-6 A's loss (3.2 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 3 so, 2 hr)...blanked the Astros on one hit over the first three innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed five runs in the fourth inning on a two-run home run by Brantley and a three-run home run by Correa.

MONDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHERS

RHP Chris Bassitt (0-2, 5.56 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season, his second in interleague play...has taken the loss in each of his first two starts...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-1 A's loss to Los Angeles (NL) last Tuesday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 2 hr)...is now 1-4 with a 3.34 ERA in 12 career interleague starts...is 0-for-6 with three strikeouts and a sacrifice hit in his career as a hitter...had a no decision in his only career appearance against the Diamondbacks, a start in the A's 4-3 loss at Arizona on Aug. 17, 2020 (5.1 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...was 2-0 with a 1.74 ERA and .179 opponents batting average in three spring training starts...spent the entire 2020 season on the active roster for the first time in his six-year career and went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions (Lamet, SD 2.09) and sixth in the majors.

starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks.

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers)...had a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 the second time and .205 after that...allowed a .133 average with two strikes and has a .168 career opponents average in that situation.

2020 HOME AND AWAY: Was 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 31.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road...over the last three years, he is 6-2 with a 3.53 ERA (30 er in 76.1 ip) and five home runs in 76.1 innings over 14 starts in Oakland, 6-6 with a 4.54 ERA (38 er in 75.1 ip) and 14 home runs in 75.1 innings over 14 starts on the road.

2020 NIGHT AND DAY: Made eight of his 11 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was 2-4 with a 6.16 ERA during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night...his career numbers are 7-9 with a 5.01 ERA (61 er in 109.2 ip) in 30 games during the day, 11-6 with a 3.97 ERA (68 er in 154.0 ip) in 41 contests at night.

2020 THE WEST AND THE REST: Was 3-2 with a 3.61 ERA and .236 opponents batting average in eight starts against American League West competition, 0-3 with a 13.50 ERA and .391 opponents average in three interleague starts...is now 10-5 with a 3.70 ERA (55 er in 133.2 ip) in 33 career appearances against AL West competition, 8-10 with a 5.12 ERA (74 er in 130.0 ip) in 38 games against all other teams...is 2-5 with an 8.38 ERA (36 er in 38.2 ip) in 11 career interleague appearances.

2020 THIS AND THAT: The A's were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments...had two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings...went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA in six starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...had 10 of his 28 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and had a 4.75 RSA for the season...won both of his starts with support of three or more runs and is now 12-1 in 15 career starts with at least three runs of support.
