OAKLAND ATHLETICS (3-7) VS. ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (4-6)

MONDAY, APRIL 12, 2021 — CHASE FIELD — 6:40 MST

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three at Houston to start the road trip for their first series win of the season...have won back-to-back games for the first time this year and have now won three of the last four games after starting the year 0-6...the six-game season-opening losing streak matched the longest such streak in Athletics history (1916)...did not lose more than three in a row all last year...have started the season 3-7, which is the A's worst record after 10 games since the 2001 club started the year 2-8 (lost game 11 in 2001)...went on to win 102 games in 2001...are in sole possession of last place in the American League West for the 10th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 3½ games...never trailed by more than one game last year...have spent one day tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

FIRST SIX, LAST FOUR: The A's are 3-1 over the last four games after starting the season 0-6...the A's pitching staff has compiled a 2.70 ERA (14 er in 36.0 ip) and .211 (33-for-139) opponents batting average over the last four games after logging an 8.00 ERA and .321 opponents average over the first six contests...have 12 walks in the last four games after issuing 27 free passes in the first six...starting pitchers are 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA (8 er in 22.2 ip) over the last four games after going 0-6 with a 9.00 ERA over the first six games...are batting .216 (29-for-134) with six home runs and 19 runs scored over the last four games after hitting .169 with two home runs and 13 runs scored over the first six contests.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 1-2 in interleague play after losing two of three to the Dodgers in Oakland last week...in addition to this two-game series at Arizona, the A's will also travel to Colorado (June 4-6), San Francisco (June 25-27) and San Diego (June 27-28)...will host Arizona (June 8-9), San Diego (Aug. 3-4) and San Francisco (Aug. 20-22)...went 10-10 (.500) in interleague play last year and finished with a .500 record or better against the National League for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...are 238-208 (.534) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers went 6-for-21 (.286) with two walks and a RBI in 2019...the hits were the most by A's pitchers in the designated hitter era (1973-present) and were the most by an American League team since Kansas City also had six in 2013...A's pitchers are now batting .093 (40-for-429) with four doubles, 13 RBI, 14 walks and 198 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is second lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .078)...the last home run by an A's pitcher in the regular season was by Blue Moon Odom on Sept. 4, 1972 against California (Ken Holtzman homered in Game 4 of the 1974 World Series)...that is the longest active pitcher homerless drought by any team...Odom also had the last triple on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

OFFENSE: The A's scored a season-high seven runs on Saturday at Houston but have 32 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Tigers, 29)...also had a season-high 11 hits on Sunday but are batting .189 for the season, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (Cubs, .167)...it is the lowest mark by an A's team after 10 games since 1966 (.169)...have the lowest slugging percentage (.307) and OPS (.584) in the majors and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.278)...have hit five home runs over the last two games after connecting for three over the first eight...the A's eight home runs are tied with Seattle for the fewest in the AL...are tied for second in the AL in hit by pitches (7) and rank fourth in walks (34)...A's pinch hitters are 4-for-9 (.444) with a walk, a home run and four RBI...lead the AL in pinch hits and RBI and are tied for the lead in home runs and extra base hits (1).

PITCHING: Frankie Montas picked up the win on Saturday, which was the first win by an A's starting pitcher this year...it came in the 10th game of the season...the only times in Oakland history where the starters recorded their first win later in the season was in 1979 and 1997 when they did it in their 11th game...starters are 1-7 with a 6.39 ERA (36 er in 50.2 ip) for the season...have the highest ERA in the American League and are tied for the fewest wins...the A's are the only team in the majors without a save...the bullpen is 2-0 with a 5.95 ERA (26 er in 39.1 ip), which is third highest in the AL...first batters faced are 14-for-28 (.500) with seven walks and two hit by pitches (.622 on-base percentage)...have allowed four first batter home runs after yielding just five all last year...has allowed 13 runs in the ninth inning after yielding just nine runs all last year...the A's pitching staff as a whole has the highest ERA (6.20), opponents batting average (.289), on-base percentage (.366), slugging percentage (.501) and OPS (.868) in the majors...has also surrendered the most home runs (17).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on their first road trip of the season, a five-game trip to Houston (2-1) and Arizona (two games)...were 14-14 (.500) on the road in 2020...return home following the game tomorrow for a seven-game homestand against Detroit (four games) and Minnesota (three games)...went 1-6 on the season-opening seven-game homestand against Houston (0-4) and Los Angeles-NL (1-2)...it was the A's worst record on a homestand of more than three games since they went 1-8 on the first homestand of the 2001 season (1-2 vs. Anaheim, 0-3 vs. Seattle, 0-3 vs. Texas)...did not lose more than two straight home games all last year when they went 22-10 (.688)...that was the sixth best home record in the majors and the second best home winning percentage in Oakland history.

THIS AND THAT: This two-game series against Arizona comes after the A's season-opening stretch where they played 10 games in 10 days against two 2020 playoff teams (seven vs. the Astros, three vs. the Dodgers)...had their first off day of the season yesterday and will have their second on Wednesday...nine of the A's 10 games have been decided by at least four runs...the one exception was a 4-3 walk-off win in 10 innings against the Dodgers last Wednesday in Oakland...the A's are the only team in the majors with just one game decided by three runs or fewer.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have placed four players on the injured list since the start of the season and currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Guduan, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith)...that is their most at one point since Aug. 2, 2019 when they also had six...have now used the IL seven times this year after using it just eight times all last year...that was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

TAXI SQUAD: The A's taxi squad for the first road trip includes pitchers James Kaprielian and Miguel Romero, catcher Austin Allen and infielders Pete Kozma and Vimal Machin...Kozma is not on the 40-man roster.

ROSTER NOTES: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.92 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)...Jesus Luzardo, who was 23 years and 183 days on April 1, is the youngest...Sergio Romo was the oldest at 38 years, 29 days...17 players returned from last year's Opening Day roster, which matches the total from last year when Opening Day rosters were at 30...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...opened the season with 13 pitchers and 13 position players.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's posted a winning record for the third consecutive spring as they finished 16-10-2...the wins tied with Kansas City, Toronto and Boston for the most in the majors and matched the most by an A's team over the last six springs (also 2017)...compiled a 4.17 ERA, which was the lowest in the Cactus League and fifth lowest in the majors...also had the lowest opponents batting average (.228), on-base percentage (.312) and OPS (.714) in the CL...offensively, the A's led the majors in on-base percentage (.357), OPS (.833), runs (161), doubles (67) and sacrifice flies (13)...topped the CL in fewest strikeouts (220).

A's vs. DIAMONDBACKS: The A's and Diamondbacks split four games last year with the A's losing both games in Phoenix on Aug. 17 and 18 and then winning two straight in Oakland on Aug. 19 and 20...have lost two straight and eight of the last 10 in Arizona but have won four straight and seven of the last nine in Oakland...the A's are 19-18 all-time against the Diamondbacks...are 11-9 in Oakland and 8-9 in Arizona.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha is tied for second in the American League in runs scored (10) and tied for fourth in multiple hit games (4)...**Ramón Laureano** stole his Major League leading fifth base of the season on Saturday...no other player in the AL has more than two...over the last 23 years, the only other Athletic with five steals in the A's first 10 games of the season is Rajai Davis (5 in 2010)...**J.B. Wendelken** has pitched in six of the A's first 10 games and leads the American League in games pitched.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1909** the A's play their first game at Shibe Park, defeating Boston, 8-1...a crowd of 31,160 watches Eddie Plank defeat the Red Sox and 18-year old John "Stuffy" McInnis make his major league debut...in **1955** the Athletics open their first season in Kansas City with a 6-2 win over the Detroit Tigers...in **1994** Oakland collects just two hits but defeats Toronto 8-4 as the Blue Jay pitchers walk 12 A's hitters...both hits come in the first inning as Oakland draws four consecutive walks in the third inning and two consecutive bases loaded walks in the fifth...Rickey Henderson walks in each of his first four at bats.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (0-2, 5.56 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season, his second in interleague play...has taken the loss in each of his first two starts...was the Opening Day starting pitcher and is the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas)...is in his seventh season in the majors and is on his third Opening Day roster (2016, 2020)...did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 17-12 with a 3.38 ERA (100 er in 266.0 ip) and is averaging 8.26 strikeouts per nine innings (244 so in 266.0 ip) in 52 games (43 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

INTERLEAGUE: Was the losing pitcher in his only interleague start this year, a 5-1 A's loss to Los Angeles (NL) last Tuesday in Oakland (see last start below)...went 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 6 bb, 10 so, 1 hr) in two interleague starts last year...is now 1-4 with a 3.34 ERA (25 er in 67.1 ip) in 12 career interleague starts.

WITH THE BAT: Went 0-for-4 with two strikeouts in 2019 and is now 0-for-6 with three strikeouts and a sacrifice hit in his career...never batted as a minor leaguer.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 10-for-25 (.400) with the bases empty but are 3-for-20 (.150) with runners on...are 1-for-10 (.100) with runners in scoring position.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss to Houston on Opening Day, April 1 in Oakland...blanked the Astros on one hit over the first three innings before allowing a run in the fourth when Altuve walked, went to third on a Brantley double and scored on a Bregman ground out...the run snapped a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...was relieved by Petit with one out in the sixth inning, runners on first and second and the A's trailing 1-0...Petit allowed both runners to score.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (NL) last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed nine hits, which were his most since April 28, 2016 at Detroit when he yielded a career-high 10...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a RBI double to Barnes in the second...then allowed three more runs in the third on a two-run home run by Muncy and a solo home run by Rios...the home runs were the first he allowed in the Coliseum since Aug. 24, 2019, snapping a 10-game, 55.1-inning, 229-batter homerless streak.

BASSITT vs. ARIZONA: Had a no decision in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 4-3 loss at Arizona on Aug. 17, 2020...allowed a solo home run to Peralta in the third and two more runs in the sixth on an Escobar RBI fielders choice and a Kelly RBI single...was relieved by Petit with one out and a runner on first in the sixth inning with the A's trailing 3-0...Oakland then scored once in the seventh and twice in the eighth to get him off the hook.

2020 RECAP: Spent the entire season on the active roster for the first time in his six-year career and went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions (Lamet, SD 2.09) and sixth in the majors...it was fifth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts...also tied for fifth in the West divisions in winning percentage (.714), ranked seventh in opponents OPS (.659), batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.371), tied for seventh in wins and eighth in on-base percentage (.288)...had career lows in ERA and opponents on-base percentage...walked 17 batters in 63.0 innings for a career-low 2.43 walks per nine innings...struck out 55 for a career-best 3.24 strikeout-to-walk ratio...led the A's in innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...received five votes (two third, one fourth, two fifth) in American League Cy Young balloting...went 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA over his first three starts, 1-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his next four starts from Aug. 12-29 and 3-0 with a 0.34 ERA over his final four starts.

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .233 opponents batting average, which broke down to .223 (31-for-139) with a .590 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .248 (25-for-101) with a .755 OPS against left-handers...yielded four of his six home runs to lefties and has surrendered 20 of his 29 home runs over the last three years to lefties...walked just one batter to lead off an inning and held opponents to a .203 (13-for-64) batting average and .227 on-base percentage in that situation...the on-base percentage was sixth lowest in the majors...five of his six home runs came with the bases empty...had a .244 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .176 with RISP and two outs...had a .204 opponents batting average and two home runs with zero or one out, a .295 average with four home runs with two outs...had a .130 opponent average with two strikes...surrendered three of his six home runs to the opponent's clean-up hitter.

2020 HOME AND AWAY: Went 2-1 with a 0.72 ERA, .207 opponents batting average and .512 OPS in five starts in Oakland last year compared to 3-1 with a 4.56 ERA, .270 opponents average and .683 OPS in five starts on the road...his home ERA was second lowest in the majors (Keller, KC 0.27) and second lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 30 innings (Treinen, 0.63 in 2018)...did not allow a home run in 37.1 innings in Oakland...is 9-12 with a 2.61 ERA (58 er in 199.2 ip) in 37 career games in the Coliseum, 10-11 with a 4.63 ERA (108 er in 210.0 ip) in 44 games in all other ballparks...has yielded just 13 home runs in 199.2 career innings in Oakland (0.59 per nine innings).

2020 NIGHT AND DAY: Went 3-0 with a 1.15 ERA in six starts at night last year compared to 2-2 with a 4.13 ERA in five starts during the day...his night ERA was the lowest in the majors and in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 30 innings at night.

2020 THIS AND THAT: Received 35 runs of support in his 11 starts for a run support average of 5.00...is 15-1 in 25 career starts with three runs of support or more, 4-22 in 43 starts with two runs of support or fewer...allowed six of his 18 runs in the first inning...had a 4.91 ERA in the first inning, a 1.73 ERA from the second inning on...was 3-0 with a 1.75 ERA in four starts following an A's loss and is 8-2 with a 2.62 ERA (26 er in 89.1 ip) in 15 starts following a loss over the last three years...went 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA in six starts on five days rest or more...does not have a complete game in 68 career starts, including 63 with the A's...his streak of 63 consecutive starts with no complete games is fourth longest in Athletics history (3rd is 64 by Bob Welch)...allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 11 starts, including no runs four times...the A's went 8-3 (.727) in his starting assignments and are 23-15 (.605) when he starts over the last three years...is now 15-9 with a 3.46 ERA (84 er in 218.1 ip) in 41 games, including 38 starts, over the last three years.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Jesús Luzardo (0-1, 6.10 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...is in his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...begins the season in starting rotation for the first time in his career as his first two outings last year came in relief...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's win in 10 innings over the Dodgers last Wednesday in Oakland (5.1 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 6 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against Arizona, a start in the A's 4-1 win on Aug. 19, 2020 in Oakland (6.1 ip, 4 h, 2 bb, 7 so)...was 1-1 with a 4.22 ERA in three starts this spring...allowed a .205 opponents batting average but issued four walks in 10.2 innings...did not allow a run in two of his three starts...went 3-2 with a 4.12 ERA in 12 games, including nine starts, in his rookie campaign last year...ranked second among Major League rookies in strikeouts (59) and innings pitched (59.0).

- Did not allow a run in 6.2 innings over seven outings this spring...struck out 12 batters and held opponents to a .136 average (3-for-22).
- Has never faced Arizona in his career.

Last Year: Was on the Opening Day roster and appeared in nine games for Philadelphia in 2020 and went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip)...struck out eight batters and walked two.
