OAKLAND ATHLETICS (4-7) VS. ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (4-7)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won last night against the D-backs for their third straight victory...won two of three at Houston to start the road trip for their first series win of the season...have won three consecutive games for the first time this year and have now won four of the last five games after starting the year 0-6...the six-game season-opening losing streak matched the longest such streak in Athletics history (1916)...did not lose more than three in a row all last year...are in sole possession of fourth place in the American League West for the, snapping a 10-day streak of holding sole possession of last place...trail first place Los Angeles-AL by 3½ games...never trailed by more than one game last year...have spent one day tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

FIRST SIX, LAST FIVE: The A's are 4-1 over the last five games after starting the season 0-6...the A's pitching staff has compiled a 3.80 ERA (19 er in 45.0 ip) and .233 (40-for-172) opponents batting average over the last five games after logging an 8.00 ERA and .321 opponents average over the first six contests...have 17 walks in the last five games after issuing 27 free passes in the first six...starting pitchers are 2-1 with a 3.25 ERA (10 er in 27.2 ip) over the last five games after going 0-6 with a 9.00 ERA over the first six games...are batting .241 (41-for-170) with seven home runs and 28 runs scored over the last five games after hitting .169 with two home runs and 13 runs scored over the first six contests.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 2-2 in interleague play after winning last night against the D-backs...lost two of three to the Dodgers in Oakland last week...in addition to this two-game series at Arizona, the A's will also travel to Colorado (June 4-6), San Francisco (June 25-27) and San Diego (June 27-28)...will host Arizona (June 8-9), San Diego (Aug. 3-4) and San Francisco (Aug. 20-22)...went 10-10 (.500) in interleague play last year and finished with a .500 record or better against the National League for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...are 239-208 (.535) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers went 0-for-3 with three strikeouts last night...went 6-for-21 (.286) with two walks and a RBI in 2019...the hits were the most by A's pitchers in the designated hitter era (1973-present) and were the most by an American League team since Kansas City also had six in 2013...A's pitchers are now batting .093 (40-for-432) with four doubles, 13 RBI, 14 walks and 201 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is second lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .078)...the last home run by an A's pitcher in the regular season was by Blue Moon Odom on Sept. 4, 1972 against California (Ken Holtzman homered in Game 4 of the 1974 World Series)...that is the longest active pitcher homerless drought by any team...Odom also had the last triple on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

OFFENSE: The A's scored a season-high nine runs last night at Arizona and have 41 runs for the season, which is tied for eighth most in the American League and is tied for 15th most in the Majors...also had a season-high 12 hits last night and are batting .203 for the season, which is the third lowest mark in the majors...it is the lowest mark by an A's team after 11 games since 1966 (.169)...have hit six home runs over the last three games after connecting for three over the first eight...the A's nine home runs are tied for second fewest in the AL...are tied for first in the AL in hit by pitches (9) and rank third in walks (34\8)...A's pinch hitters are 4-for-10 (.400) with a walk, a home run and four RBI...lead the AL in pinch hits and RBI and are tied for the lead in home runs and extra base hits (1).

PITCHING: Frankie Montas picked up the win on Saturday, which was the first win by an A's starting pitcher this year...it came in the 10th game of the season...the only times in Oakland history where the starters recorded their first win later in the season was in 1979 and 1997 when they did it in their 11th game...starters are 2-7 with a 6.14 ERA (38 er in 55.2 ip) for the season...have the second highest ERA in the American League...the A's are the only team in the majors without a save...the bullpen is 2-0 with a 6.02 ERA (29 er in 43.1 ip), which is second highest in the AL...first batters faced are 15-for-32 (.469) with seven walks and two hit by pitches (.585 on-base percentage)...have allowed four first batter home runs after yielding just five all last year...has allowed 13 runs in the ninth inning after yielding just nine runs all last year.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on their first road trip of the season, a five-game trip to Houston (2-1) and Arizona (1-0)...were 14-14 (.500) on the road in 2020...return home following the game today for a seven-game homestand against Detroit (four games) and Minnesota (three games)...went 1-6 on the season-opening seven-game homestand against Houston (0-4) and Los Angeles-NL (1-2)...it was the A's worst record on a homestand of more than three games since they went 1-8 on the first homestand of the 2001 season (1-2 vs. Anaheim, 0-3 vs. Seattle, 0-3 vs. Texas)...did not lose more than two straight home games all last year when they went 22-10 (.688)...that was the sixth best home record in the majors and the second best home winning percentage in Oakland history.

THIS AND THAT: This two-game series against Arizona comes after the A's season-opening stretch where they played 10 games in 10 days against two 2020 playoff teams (seven vs. the Astros, three vs. the Dodgers)...had their first off day of the season on Sunday and will have their second tomorrow...10 of the A's 11 games have been decided by at least four runs...the one exception was a 4-3 walk-off win in 10 innings against the Dodgers last Wednesday in Oakland...the A's are the only team in the majors with just one game decided by three runs or fewer.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have placed four players on the injured list since the start of the season and currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Guduan, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith)...that is their most at one point since Aug. 2, 2019 when they also had six...have now used the IL seven times this year after using it just eight times all last year...that was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

TAXI SQUAD: The A's taxi squad for the first road trip includes pitchers James Kaprielian and Miguel Romero, catcher Austin Allen and infielders Pete Kozma and Vimal Machin...Kozma is not on the 40-man roster.

ROSTER NOTES: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.92 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)...Jesus Luzardo, who was 23 years and 183 days on April 1, is the youngest...Sergio Romo was the oldest at 38 years, 29 days...17 players returned from last year's Opening Day roster, which matches the total from last year when Opening Day rosters were at 30...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...opened the season with 13 pitchers and 13 position players.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's posted a winning record for the third consecutive spring as they finished 16-10-2...the wins tied with Kansas City, Toronto and Boston for the most in the majors and matched the most by an A's team over the last six springs (also 2017)...compiled a 4.17 ERA, which was the lowest in the Cactus League and fifth lowest in the majors...also had the lowest opponents batting average (.228), on-base percentage (.312) and OPS (.714) in the CL...offensively, the A's led the majors in on-base percentage (.357), OPS (.833), runs (161), doubles (67) and sacrifice flies (13)...topped the CL in fewest strikeouts (220).

A's vs. DIAMONDBACKS: The A's and Diamondbacks split four games last year with the A's losing both games in Phoenix on Aug. 17 and 18 and then winning two straight in Oakland on Aug. 19 and 20...have lost eight of the last 11 in Arizona but have won four straight and seven of the last nine in Oakland...the A's are 20-18 all-time against the Diamondbacks...are 11-9 in Oakland and 9-9 in Arizona.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the Majors in runs scored (12)...**Ramón Laureano** stole his Major League leading seventh base of the season last night...no other player in the AL has more than two...over the last 23 years, the only other Athletic with five steals in the A's first 11 games of the season is Rajai Davis (5 in 2010)...**J.B. Wendelken** has pitched in seven of the A's first 11 games and leads the American League in games pitched.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1994** Oakland collects just two hits but defeats Toronto 8-4 as the Blue Jay pitchers walk 12 A's hitters...both hits come in the first inning as Oakland draws four consecutive walks in the third inning and two consecutive bases loaded walks in the fifth...Rickey Henderson walks in each of his first four at bats.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesús Luzardo (0-1, 6.10 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...is in his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...begins the season in starting rotation for the first time in his career as his first two outings last year came in relief.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Had a no decision in his first interleague start this year last Wednesday against Los Angeles in Oakland, a 4-3 A's win in 10 innings (5.1 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 6 so)...went 2-1 with a 5.33 ERA in six interleague games last year and is now 2-1 with a 5.01 ERA (18 er in 32.1 ip) in seven career interleague appearances, including five starts...is 1-2 with a 3.31 ERA (18 er in 49.0 ip) in 13 career games against the American League.

WITH THE BAT: Has never batted as a professional.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss to Houston on Friday in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters...allowed a three-run home run to Bregman in the third inning and surrendered two more runs in the fourth on a Gurriel home run and a Brantley RBI double.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win in Oakland last Wednesday...tossed a career-high 104 pitches and issued a career-high four walks...allowed a RBI single to Pollock in the first inning but then retired 12 of 13 hitters at one point from the second through sixth innings...was relieved by Kolarek with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth with the score tied 1-1 and Kolarek allowed one of the runs to score.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 1-1 with a 4.22 ERA in three starts this spring...also pitched in simulated games, most recently on Sunday...allowed a .205 opponents batting average but issued four walks in 10.2 innings...did not allow a run in two of his three starts...is now 4-1 with a 1.82 ERA (7 er in 34.2 ip) and .195 (24-for-123) opponents batting average in 13 career spring training appearances (10 starts).

2020 RECAP: Went 3-2 with a 4.12 ERA in 12 games, including nine starts, in his rookie campaign...ranked second among Major League rookies in strikeouts (59) and innings pitched (59.0), tied for fifth in games and tied for ninth in wins and games started...walked just 17 batters in 59.0 innings (2.59 per nine innings) and now has 25 walks in 81.1 career innings (2.76 per nine innings)...walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 12 appearances in 2020 and 18 of 20 in his career...however, surrendered nine home runs, which tied for fifth most among ML rookies.

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: Had a .257 opponents batting average, which broke down to .256 (45-for-176) against right-handed hitters compared to .260 (13-for-50) against left-handers...surrendered eight of his nine home runs and issued 15 of his 17 walks to righties...has allowed 11 of his 12 career home runs against righties...six of his nine home runs were solo shots...his opponents average increased to .317 with runners in scoring position, including .421 with RISP and two outs...opponents hit .322 when leading off an inning but he walked just three...has walked just six batters to lead off

an inning in his career...had a .228 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .280 with six of his nine home runs after that.

2020 HOME AND AWAY: Went 3-1 with a 2.40 ERA, .215 opponents batting average and .595 OPS in eight games, six starts, at home compared to 0-1 with an 8.15 ERA, .338 opponents average and 1.032 OPS in four games, three starts, on the road...allowed three home runs in 41.1 innings at home, six in 17.2 innings on the road...is now 3-2 with a 3.08 ERA (18 er in 52.2 ip) in 11 career appearances in the Coliseum, 0-1 with a 5.65 ERA (18 er in 28.2 ip) in nine games on the road.

2020 BY INNING: Allowed 12 of his 27 runs in the fourth and fifth innings...had a 2.67 ERA over the first three innings of a game and a 6.89 ERA in the fourth and fifth...had a 3.86 ERA from the sixth inning on, which includes his relief appearances.

2020 STARTING AND RELIEVING: Pitched in relief in his first two appearances of the season, made nine consecutive starts from Aug. 4 to Sept. 19 and then pitched in relief in his final outing...was 3-2 with a 3.83 ERA in his nine starts, 0-0 with a 5.59 ERA in three relief appearances...the A's were 6-3 (.667) in his starting assignments...first batters faced were 2-for-3 (.667) with a double in his three relief appearances.

2020 RUN SUPPORT: Received no run support in three of his starts and had two runs of support or fewer in six of his nine starts...had 22 runs of support in 12 games and 59.0 innings overall...his season run support average of 3.36 was ninth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched.

2020 AMERICAN LEAGUE AND NATIONAL LEAGUE: Was 1-1 with a 3.09 ERA in six games against the American League West compared to 2-1 with a 5.33 ERA in six games against National League West...the six interleague games are the first of his career...is 1-2 with a 3.31 ERA (18 er in 49.0 ip) in 13 career games against the AL.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the season pitching out of the bullpen and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in his first outing on July 25 against Los Angeles (AL)...tossed 3.2 innings in his next relief appearance on July 29 against Colorado...did not allow a run in the sixth or seventh inning before yielding a RBI double to Blackmon in the eighth...that snapped his scoreless streak at a career-high 12.0 innings dating back to Sept. 21, 2019...made his first Major League start Aug. 4 against Texas...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits and two walks, but had a no decision in the A's 5-1 win...at the age of 22 years and 309 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to start a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...recorded his first big league win in his second start, a 7-2 A's win over Houston on Aug. 9...at the age of 22 years and 314 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to win a game since Anderson in that Oct. 2, 2010 game...allowed a two-run home run to Gurriel in 5.2 innings of work...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high nine hits in 3.1 innings at San Francisco on Aug. 14 but had a no decision in the A's 8-7 win in 10 innings...it was the shortest start of his career...was charged with the first two losses of his career in back-to-back starts on Aug. 24 at Texas and Sept. 4 against San Diego...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings against Houston Sept. 9...allowed just two runs but had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win...allowed a career-high three home runs in the first game of the Sept. 14 doubleheader at Seattle...combined with Diekmann, Soria and Trivino on a six-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over San Francisco in his final start on Sept. 19 against San Francisco...then pitched in relief of Mike Fiers on Sept. 24 at Los Angeles (NL) to provide rotation flexibility for the postseason...walked three batters in 3.0 innings of relief, which was the first time he issued more than two free passes in a game...did not strike out a batter for the first time in his career...was 0-1 with a 8.22 ERA in two postseason starts...joins Jarrod Parker (2012) and Sonny Gray (2013) as the only rookie pitchers in Athletics history to make two postseason starts...allowed four home runs, which ties the Athletics record for a single postseason (fifth time, last: Dave Stewart, 1989)...started Game 1 of the ALWCs against Chicago on Sept. 29 and was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss (3.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 5 so, 2 hr)...the start came one day before his 23rd birthday, making him eighth youngest pitcher in Athletics history to start a postseason game...was the youngest since Barry Zito started Game 4 of the 2000 ALDS at the age of 22 years, 147 days...then had a no decision in the A's 9-7 win over Houston in Game 3 of the ALDS on Oct. 7 at Dodger Stadium (4.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 2 hr).

LHP Sean Manaea (0-1, 5.06 ERA):	Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...begins his sixth season in the majors and is on his fourth Opening Day roster (2017-18, 20-21)...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-2 A's win last Friday in Houston (6.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...is 2-1 with a 2.84 ERA (19.0 ip, 16 h, 6 r, 6 er, 5 bb, 16 so, 3 hr) in three career starts against Detroit...has an eight-game winning streak against American League Central teams dating back to Aug. 23, 2016...has a 1.54 ERA and .180 opponents batting average during the streak, which spans nine starts...went 3-1 with a 5.28 ERA and .250 opponents batting average in four starts this spring...was 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts last year...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average...went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his final six starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins tied for fourth most in the majors over that span.
