# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (5-7) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (6-6)

THURSDAY, APRIL 15, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won four straight and five of the last six games after starting the year 0-6...the six-game season-opening losing streak matched the longest such streak in Athletics history (1916)...did not lose more than three in a row all last year...are tied for fourth in the American League West and trail first place Los Angeles by two games...were as many as 5½ games back at the conclusion of play on April 8...never trailed by more than one game last year...have spent two days in fourth place, two days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

*FIRST SIX, LAST SIX:* The A's are 5-1 over the last six games after starting the season 0-6...have outscored the opposition 35-24 (+11) over the last six games after being outscored 50-13 (-37) over the first six...the A's pitching staff has compiled a 4.00 ERA (24 er in 54.0 ip) and .233 (48-for-206) opponents batting average over the last six games after logging an 8.00 ERA and .321 opponents average over the first six contests...have allowed five home runs over the last six games after surrendering 13 over the first six...starting pitchers are 2-1 with a 4.45 ERA (15 er in 30.1 ip) over the last six games after going 0-6 with a 9.00 ERA over the first six games...are batting .249 (52-for 209) with 10 home runs and 35 runs scored over the first six games after hitting .169 with two home runs and 13 runs scored over the first six contests.

**AGAINST THE CENTRAL:** The A's will play seven consecutive games against American League Central teams beginning tonight (four vs. Detroit, three vs. Minnesota), which marks their first games against non-Western division teams since Sept. 18, 2019 against Kansas City...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 65-20 (.765) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

THE SEVENTH INNING OR LATER: The A's scored six times in the final three innings on Tuesday at Arizona and erased a 5-0 deficit in a 7-5 win...have scored 29 of their 48 runs (60.4%) in the seventh inning or later...lead the majors in runs scored in seventh inning or later, are tied with the Astros for the most home runs (8) and rank third with a .295 (43-for-146) batting average...are batting .163 (41-for-252) with 19 runs scored and four home runs over innings one through six.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .283 (41-for-145) with 29 runs scored and nine home runs over the last four games after hitting .170 with 19 runs scored and three home runs over the first eight contests...overall, the A's rank last in the American League in slugging percentage (.354), second to last in batting (.211) and OPS (.649) and have the third lowest on-base percentage (.295)... are tied for the lead in hit by pitches (9) and triples (3) but are tied for third in fewest runs (48)...A's pinch hitters are 5-for-13 (.385) with a home run, four RBI and a walk...lead the AL in pinch hits and RBI and are tied for the lead in home runs and extra base hits (1).

**PITCHING:** The A's compiled a 4.30 ERA and .238 opponents batting average on the last road trip after logging a 7.17 ERA and .305 opponents average on the first homestand...now have a 6.00 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the majors (Baltimore, 5.10)...also have the highest opponents batting average (.279), slugging percentage (.474) and OPS (.832) and the second highest on-base percentage (.358)...have the fewest strikeouts in the American League (89).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 2-0 with a 4.12 ERA (9 er in 19.2 ip) over the last four games after going 0-7 with a 7.91 ERA over the first eight contests...are 2-7 with a 6.63 ERA (43 er in 58.1 ip) for the season... have the highest ERA, opponents batting average (.297), on-base percentage (.373), slugging percentage (.502) and OPS (.875) in the majors as well as the most losses.

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen tossed 6.1 scoreless innings on Tuesday at Arizona and now has a 3.38 ERA (10 er in 26.2 ip) over the last seven games after logging a 7.43 ERA over the first five contests...recorded its first save of the season on Tuesday to become the last team in the majors with a save...it was the A's first save opportunity and the A's and Yankees are the only American League teams without a blown save...first batters faced are hitting .432 (16-for-37) with eight walks and two hit by pitches (.553 on-base percentage)...has the highest first batter batting average, on-base percentage and slugging percentage (.946) in the majors...has allowed four first batter home runs after yielding just five all last year...has allowed 13 runs in the ninth inning after yielding just nine runs all last year...has allowed 10-of-24 (41.7%) inherited runners to score, which is third highest in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed just five errors, which is tied with Cleveland, Toronto and Baltimore for the fewest in the American League...rank second in the AL in fielding percentage (.989) and have turned te fourth most double plays (12).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have been successful in 10-of-11 (90.9%) stole attempts...are tied for second in the American League in stolen bases and rank third in stolen base percentage...lead the majors with four steals of third base.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their second homestand of the season tonight, a seven-game stand against Detroit (four games) and Minnesota (three games)...went 1-6 on the first homestand against Houston (0-4) and Los Angeles-NL (1-2), which was the A's worst record on a homestand of more than three games since they went 1-8 on the first homestand of the 2001 season (1-2 vs. Anaheim, 0-3 vs. Seattle, 0-3 vs. Texas)...did not lose more than two straight home games all last year when they went 22-10 (.688)... that was the sixth best home record in the majors and the second best home winning percentage in Oakland history...went 4-1 on the first road trip this year to Houston (2-1) and Arizona (2-0)...lost the first game but then won each of the final four, which matches the A's longest road winning streak from last year (Aug. 12-16)...were 14-14 (.500) on the road in 2020.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 5-0 when out-homering their opponent, 0-7 when they are out-homered...11 of the A's first 12 games have been at least 3 hours and 10 minutes, with the fastest game clocking in at 2:45 (April 6 vs. LAD)...are averaging 3:23 per game, which matches Arizona and Houston for the longest in the majors...10 of the A's 12 games have been decided by at least four runs...the two games decided by three runs or fewer are the fewest in the majors...have won both of those games...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.92 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have placed four players on the injured list since the start of the season and currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Guduan, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith)...that is their most at one point since Aug. 2, 2019 when they also had six...have now used the IL seven times this year after using it just eight times all last year...that was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

*DURING THE SPRING:* The A's posted a winning record for the third consecutive spring as they finished 16-10-2...the wins tied with Kansas City, Toronto and Boston for the most in the majors and matched the most by an A's team over the last six springs (also 2017)...compiled a 4.17 ERA, which was the lowest in the Cactus League and fifth lowest in the majors...also had the lowest opponents batting average (.228), on-base percentage (.312) and OPS (.714) in the CL...offensively, the A's led the majors in on-base percentage (.357), OPS (.833), runs (161), doubles (67) and sacrifice flies (13)...topped the CL in fewest strikeouts (220).

*A's vs. TIGERS:* The A's and Tigers meet for the first time since Sept. 8, 2019, a span of 585 days...Oakland won the season series in 2019, 6-1...went 2-0 in Oakland and 4-1 in Detroit...have won 18 of the last 19 games and are 24-6 (.800) dating back to June 2, 2015...have won two straight and seven of the last eight in Oakland...currently have an 11-game winning streak at Comerica Park, which is second longest in Athletics history for a road ballpark (12, Kauffman Stadium, May 31, 2003-April 30, 2006)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 270-248 against the Tigers...that includes 147-112 in Oakland, 121-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 45-28 (.616) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team...all-time, the A's are 938-1001 against the Tigers.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the American League in runs scored (13)...Ramón Laureano has stolen at least one base in each of the last three games (four stolen bases total) and now has a Major League leading eight stolen bases for the season...in Oakland history, the only player with more stolen bases over the A's first 12 games is Rickey Henderson (13 in 1982, 9 in 1990)... Yusmeiro Petit was credited with his third win of the season on Tuesday, which makes him the first three-game winner in the American League... Lou Trivino has a 7.0-inning scoreless streak.

#### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1924** Al Simmons collects his first major league hit off the Senators Walter Johnson in the A's 4-0 loss to Washington on Opening Day...in **1990** Dennis Eckersley records his 100th career save in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle... with 100 saves, he becomes just the sixth pitcher in major league history with 100 saves and 100 victories...in **2006** Eric Chavez, Frank Thomas and Milton Bradley hit back-to-back-to-back home runs on three consecutive pitches off Vicente Padilla in the sixth inning of the A's 5-4 win over Texas.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (0-1, 5.06 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...it will be the 100th appearance and 99th start of his career...begins his sixth season in the majors and is on his fourth Opening Day roster (2017-18, 20-21)...started the A's fourth game this year after starting the second game of the season in each of his previous three seasons in which he was on the Opening Day roster.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Will be making his first start against an American League Central team since defeating Detroit on Sept. 8, 2019...that was his only start against the Central in 2019 and it extended his winning streak against AL Central teams to eight games dating back to Aug. 23, 2016...has a 1.54 ERA (10 er in 58.1 ip) and .180 (37-for-206) opponents batting average during the streak, which spans nine starts...his last loss came on July 5, 2016 at Minnesota...is 9-2 with a 2.39 ERA (20 er in 75.1 ip) in 12 career starts vs. AL Central teams.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-2 loss to Houston on April 4 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Tucker in the first inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the bottom of the first...then allowed a tworun home run to Castro in the second and a two-run double to Gurriel in the third.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win at Houston last Friday. blanked the Astros on three hits over the first three innings and allowed his only run in the fourth when Gurriel walked, went to third on a Correa single and scored on a Tucker ground out...was relieved by Petit to start the seventh inning with the scored tied 1-1.

2020 RECAP: Went 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average...his .427 slugging percentage matched his high...went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his final six starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins tied for fourth most in the majors over that span...went 0-2 with a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents average over his first five starts...tied for the team lead in starts...walked just eight batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 1.33 walks per nine innings...that was the lowest mark of his career and was sixth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...struck out 45

for a career-best 5.63 strikeout-to-walk ratio...had five starts without a walk, five with one and three in his other...has walked just 51 batters in 255.0 innings over the last three years (1.80 per nine innings).

2020 THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Had a 2.56 ERA and .233 opponents batting average over the first three innings of his starts compared to a 7.59 ERA and .319 opponents average from the fourth inning on...in 18 starts over the last three seasons, he has a 2.35 ERA (14 er in 53.2 ip) and .223 (43-for-193) opponents batting average over innings 1-3 and a 5.09 ERA (23 er in 40.2 ip) and .263 (42-for-160) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: His .270 opponents batting average broke down to .250 (13-for-52) against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (44-for-159) against right-handers...issued seven of eight walks to righties...had a .204 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .327 with seven of his eight walks after that...had a .281 batting average against batters leading off an inning but issued just one walk (.293 on-base percentage)...yielded a .222 average with the bases empty, .373 with runners on... opponents hit .375 with runners in scoring position and were 7-for-15 (.467) with RISP and two outs ... entered the season with a .227 career opponents average with RISP, including .199 with RISP and two outs...allowed a .248 opponents average and four of his seven home runs with two strikes

2020 NIGHT AND DAY: Went 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in four starts during the day, 2-2 with a 5.29 ERA and .321 opponent average in seven starts at night...is now 17-6 with a 3.39 ERA (79 er in 210.0 ip) and .214 (167-for-779) opponents batting average in 36 career day games compared to 22-26 with a 4.16 ERA (161 er in 348.1 ip) and .276 (372-for-1350) opponents average in 63 career starts at night.

2020 HOME AND AWAY: Was 3-1 with a 3.91 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland, 1-2 with a 5.02 ERA and .302 opponents average in five starts on the road...is now 21-14 in his career in the Coliseum compared to 18-18 on the road.

2020 AL AND NL: Was 2-1 with a 3.33 ERA in five interleague starts compared to 2-2 with a 5.67 ERA in six starts against the American League...however, is 5-8 with a 4.03 ERA (46 er in 102.2 ip) in 19 career starts against the National League compared to 34-24 with a 3.83 ERA (194 er in 455.2 ip) in 80 games against the AL.

2020 THIS AND THAT: Was charged with five unearned runs, which tied for eighth most in the majors...tossed fewer than six innings in nine of his 11 starts...was 0-3 in four starts with two runs of support or fewer, 4-0 in seven starts with three or more...is now 4-30 in 49 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 35-2 in 49 starts with support of three or more...the A's were 7-4 (.636) in his starting assignments and are 12-6 (.667) when he starts over the last three years.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the season as the A's number two starter and took the loss in each of his first two starts, going 0-2 with a 7.00 ERA in July. his first loss on July 25 against Los Angeles (AL) was his first since Aug. 19, 2018 against Houston and it snapped a career-high tying five-game winning streak...lost again on July 31 at Seattle when he allowed a season-high five runs in 4.1 innings...it was the first time he lost consecutive decisions since May 25-30, 2018...then went 2-0 with a 5.06 ERA in five starts in August... walked three batters Aug. 10 at Los Angeles (AL), his only outing with more than one walk...also allowed a season-high seven hits in a season-low 2.2 innings in that contest...had his third straight no decision on Aug. 15 at San Francisco, giving him an 0-2 record, a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents batting average over his first five starts...then won each of his next four starts from Aug. 20-Sept. 10...allowed one earned run in each start and compiled a 1.61 ERA and .210 opponents average during the winning streak, which fell one short of his career high of five...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings Sept. 10 against Houston...retired each of the first 15 batters he faced before Reddick doubled to lead off the sixth...struck out a season-high seven batters on Sept. 15 at Colorado but was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss...it snapped his four-game winning streak and it also snapped an eight-game winning streak in the month of September...it was his first September loss since Sept. 12, 2017 at Boston...tossed a season-high 91 pitches in his final start on Sept. 23 at Los Angeles (NL)...went 2-1 with a 3.04 ERA and .216 opponents batting average in four starts in September and is now 10-3 with a 2.17 ERA (24 er in 99.1 ip) in 17 career starts in September...the wins are his most for any month and his ERA is his lowest...was on the A's roster for the American League Wild Card Series but did not pitch...started and lost Game 2 of the ALDS against Houston on Oct. 6 at Dodger Stadium (4.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so, 2 hr).

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (1-1, 8.31 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 7-3 A's win at Houston last Saturday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...it snapped a career-high three-game losing streak dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...is 2-2 with a 6.86 ERA (19.2 ip, 20 h, 15 r, 15 er, 9 bb, 22 so, 1 hr) in five career appearances, including four starts, against Detroit...was the winning pitcher in his only start in 2019, a 7-2 A's win at Detroit on May 27 (8.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 10 so)...went 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA and .290 opponents batting average in three Spring Training starts...was off to a strong start last year as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA and .175 opponents batting average over his first four starts. was scratched from his start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA and .321 opponents average over his final seven starts.

#### **35 LHP JAKE DIEKMAN**

#### Last Outing: 4/12 at Arizona (ND, 1.1 ip, so) Saves/Opportunities: 0-0

Inherited Runners/Scored: 2/1 First Hitters: 2-4, bb

- Begins his 10th season in the majors and is on his seventh Opening Day roster (2014-16, 18-21).
- Struck out his 500th career batter (Yordan Alvarez) on April 2.
- Walked the first batter he faced during the spring but then retired each of the final 18 batters he faced...opponents went 0-for-18 in his six appearances and he did not allow a run in 6.0 innings.
- Has posted a 1.98 ERA (3 er in 13.2 ip) with 17 strikeouts over 15 career outings against the Tigers.
- Last faced Detroit twice on Sept. 6, 2019, when he appeared in the completion of a suspended game from May 19, 2019, and also pitched in the regularly scheduled game ... as a result, statistically speaking, Diekman pitched for two teams in two different cities on May 19 (also against Los Angeles-AL for Kansas City).
- Did not allow a run during the day last year and after Saturday's outing, and now has a 14-game, 15.0 ip scoreless streak over the last two seasons.
- Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

#### **65 RHP DEOLIS GUERRA**

Last Outing: 4/13 at Arizona (ND, 3.0 ip, h, 5 so) Saves/Opportunities: 0-0 First Hitters: 1-1 Inherited Runners/Scored: 0/0

- Was selected from the A's alternate site April 8.
- Begins his fifth season in the majors and is with his fifth team (Pittsburgh, 2015; Los Angeles-AL, 2016-17; Milwaukee, 2019; Philadelphia, 2020).
- Did not allow a run in 6.2 innings over seven outings this spring...struck out 12 batters and held opponents to a .136 average (3-for-22).
- Tossed 3.0 scoreless innings against Arizona on Tuesday, tied for the longest outing of his career (3 times, also: June 30, 2015 vs. Detroit and July 15, 2015 vs. St. Louis with Pittsburgh).
- Has allowed one run over 5.0 innings against the Tigers in his career but has not faced them since 2017 with the Angels.

Last Year: Was on the Opening Day roster and appeared in nine games for Philadelphia in 2020 and went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip)...struck out eight batters and walked two.
