OAKLAND ATHLETICS (6-7) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (6-7)

FRIDAY, APRIL 16, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won five straight and six of the last seven games after starting the year 0-6...the six-game season-opening losing streak matched the longest such streak in Athletics history (1916)...did not lose more than three in a row all last year...are tied for fourth in the American League West and trail first place Seattle by two games...were as many as 5½ games back at the conclusion of play on April 8...never trailed by more than one game last year...have spent two days in fourth place, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

FIRST SIX, LAST SEVEN: The A's are 6-1 over the last seven games after starting the season 0-6...have outscored the opposition 43-28 (+15) over the last seven games after being outscored 50-13 (-37) over the first six...the A's pitching staff has compiled a 4.00 ERA (28 er in 63.0 ip) and .237 (57-for-241) opponents batting average over the last seven games after logging an 8.00 ERA and .321 opponents average over the first six contests...have allowed six home runs over the last seven games after surrendering 13 over the first six...starting pitchers are 3-1 with a 4.21 ERA (17 er in 36.1 ip) over the last seven games after going 0-6 with a 9.00 ERA over the first six games...are batting .248 (60-for-242) with 12 home runs and 43 runs scored over the last seven games (6.1 runs per game) after hitting .169 with two home runs and 13 runs scored over the first six contests (2.2 per game).

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 1-0 in this seven-game stretch against American League Central teams that begins with this four-game series with Detroit and concludes with a three-game series with Minnesota...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 66-20 (.767) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

OFFENSE: The A's walked 12 times last night, which are their most in a game since April 18, 2018 against Chicago (AL) when they also had 12...have 52 walks for the season, which are second most in the American League...went 1-for-5 with two walks with the bases loaded last night and are 2-for-12 (.167) with a double and two walks for the season...are now batting .275 (49-for-178) with 37 runs scored and 11 home runs over the last five games after hitting .170 with 19 runs scored and three home runs over the first eight contests...overall, the A's have the second lowest batting average (.213) and slugging percentage (.364) in the AL...are tied for the lead in triples (3) and are tied for the second fewest grounded into double plays (6)...A's pinch hitters are 5-for-14 (.357) with a home run, four RBI and a walk...lead the AL in pinch hits and RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and extra base hits (1) and rank second in plate appearances (15).

PITCHING: The A's have a 5.85 ERA, which is the highest in the majors by more than half a run...the Tigers are second highest with a 5.29 ERA...also have the highest opponents batting average (.277) and the second highest OPS (.825), on-base percentage (.352) and slugging percentage (.473)...have the fewest strikeouts in the American League (99).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-0 with a 3.86 ERA (11 er in 25.2 ip) over the last five games after going 0-7 with a 7.91 ERA over the first eight contests...are 3-7 with a 6.30 ERA (45 er in 64.1 ip) for the season...have the highest opponents batting average (.290) and OPS (.853) in the majors and the highest ERA, opponents on-base percentage (.361) and slugging percentage (.492) in the American League...also lead the majors in losses.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 3.64 ERA (12 er in 29.2 ip) over the last eight games after logging a 7.43 ERA over the first five contests...recorded its first save of the season on Tuesday to become the last team in the majors with a save...it was the A's only save opportunity, which is tied with the Nationals and Pirates for the fewest in the majors...first batters faced are hitting .426 (17-for-40) with eight walks and two hit by pitches (.540 on-base percentage)...the bullpen has the highest first batter batting average, on-base percentage and slugging percentage (.925) in the majors...has allowed four first batter home runs after yielding just five all last year...has allowed 15 runs in the ninth inning, which is tied with the Marlins for the most in the majors...yielded just nine runs in the ninth inning all last year.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors in the last eight games and have five for the season, which is the fewest in the American League...lead the AL in fielding percentage (.989) and are tied with Houston and Cleveland for the fewest unearned runs (2).

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 10-of-11 (90.9%) stole attempts...are tied for second in the American League in stolen bases and rank third in stolen base percentage...have four steals of third base, which is tied for the most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this seven-game homestand against Detroit (1-0) and Minnesota (three games) and are now 2-6 (.250) at home...went 1-6 on the first homestand against Houston (0-4) and Los Angeles-LN

(1-2), which was the A's worst record on a homestand of more than three games since they went 1-8 on the first homestand of the 2001 season (1-2 vs. Anaheim, 0-3 vs. Seattle, 0-3 vs. Texas)...went 4-1 on the first road trip this year to Houston (2-1) and Arizona (2-0)...lost the first game but then won each of the final four, which matches the A's longest road winning streak from last year (Aug. 12-16).

THE SEVENTH INNING OR LATER: The A's have scored 30 of their 56 runs (53.6%) in the seventh inning or later...lead the majors in runs scored in seventh inning or later, are tied with the Astros for the most home runs (8) and rank third with a .301 (47-for-156) batting average...are batting .164 (45-for-275) with 26 runs scored and six home runs over innings one through six.

MELVIN, LA RUSSA AND MACK: Tonight will be Bob Melvin's 1,469th game as manager of the Oakland A's...on Sunday, he will tie Tony La Russa's Oakland record for most games managed (1,471)...Melvin would need to manage the A's through the 2057 season to catch Connie Mack for the most games managed in Athletics history (7,396)...Melvin has 773 wins, which is 25 away from La Russa's Oakland record of 798...Mack won 3,582 games as manager of the Philadelphia A's from 1901-50.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 6-0 when out-homer their opponent, 0-7 when they are out-homered...12 of the A's first 13 games have been at least 3 hours and 10 minutes, with the fastest game clocking in at 2:45 (April 6 vs. LAD)...are averaging 3:22 per game, which is tied for second longest in the majors...11 of the A's 13 games have been decided by at least four runs...the two games decided by three runs or fewer are the fewest in the majors...have won both of those games...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.92 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have closed four players on the injured list since the start of the season and currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Guduan, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith)...that is their most at one point since Aug. 2, 2019 when they also had six...have now used the IL seven times this year after using it just eight times all last year...that was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's posted a winning record for the third consecutive spring as they finished 16-10-2...the wins tied with Kansas City, Toronto and Boston for the most in the majors and matched the most by an A's team over the last six springs (also 2017)...had the lowest ERA (4.17), opponents batting average (.228), on-base percentage (.312) and OPS (.714) in the Cactus League...offensively, the A's led the majors in on-base percentage (.357), OPS (.833), runs (161), doubles (67) and sacrifice flies (13).

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's won the first meeting of 2021 last night after winning the season series in 2019, 6-1...went 2-0 in Oakland and 4-1 in Detroit...have now won 19 of the last 20 games and are 25-6 (.806) dating back to June 2, 2015...have won three straight and eight of the last nine in Oakland...currently have an 11-game winning streak at Comerica Park, which is second longest in Athletics history for a road ballpark (12, Kauffman Stadium, May 31, 2003-April 30, 2006)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 271-248 against the Tigers...that includes 148-112 in Oakland, 121-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 45-28 (.616) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team...all-time, the A's are 939-1001 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha has scored a run in each of his last five games (eight total) and has 14 runs scored for the season, which is second most in the majors (Acuña, ATL 17)...**Ramón Laureano** leads the majors with eight stolen bases...that is double the next closest players and is more than 22 teams...in Oakland history, the only player with more stolen bases over the A's first 13 games is Rickey Henderson (14 in 1982, 10 in 1990)...**Jed Lowrie** has five straight multiple hit games (10-for-22, .455), which matches the longest such streak of his career and matches the longest streak by an Athletic over the last five years...leads the American League in multiple hit games (7)...**Lou Trivino** has a 7.0-inning scoreless streak.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1969** Sal Bando hits the first grand slam in Oakland history in the A's 6-1 win over California at the Coliseum...in **1984** Dave Kingman becomes the second player in Oakland A's history to homer three times in one game in the A's 9-6 win at Seattle...he has a grand slam in the first, and two-run shots in the third and fifth and drives in eight runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (1-1, 8.31 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...begins his sixth season in the majors and is on his fourth Opening Day roster (2017, 19-21)...was the A's Opening Day starter last year after beginning the 2019 season in the fourth spot in the rotation.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 5 in Oakland...tossed 90 pitches in 2.2 innings, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...allowed four runs in the second inning on a McKinstry sacrifice fly and a three-run double by Seager...yielded three more runs in the third on a Smith home run, a McKinstry RBI single and a wild pitch.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win at Houston last Saturday...it snapped a career-high three-game losing streak dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...shut out the Astros on five hits and a walk over the first six innings before allowing his only run on a leadoff home run to Tucker in the seventh...was relieved by Romo following the home run with the A's leading 6-0.

MONTAS vs. DETROIT: Is 2-2 with a 6.86 ERA (19.2 ip, 20 h, 15 r, 15 er, 9 bb, 22 so, 1 hr) in five career appearances, including four starts...is 1-1 with an 8.59 ERA (14 er in 14.2 ip) in three starts at Comerica Park and 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA (1 er in 5.0 ip) in two games in his

home ballparks...was the winning pitcher in his only start in 2019, a 7-2 A's win at Detroit on May 27...tossed a career-high 8.2 innings and struck out 10...did not walk a batter, which marked the 27th time in Oakland history a pitcher struck out 10 or more and did not issue a walk...it was the first since Jeff Samardzija on Sept. 17, 2014 vs. Texas (10 so)...retired each of the first 12 batters before Cabrera doubled to start the fifth...Cabrera later scored on a Harrison double and Montas also allowed a two-out RBI double to Cabrera in the ninth...was relieved by Trivino following the double and he struck out Rodriguez to end the game.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA and .290 opponents batting average in three Spring Training starts...left his final start on March 25 against Seattle with a cuticle tear on his right middle finger...tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in his first start but allowed six runs in 5.0 innings over his final two.

2020 RECAP: Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks.

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers)...had a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 the

second time and .205 after that...allowed a .133 average with two strikes and has a .170 career opponents average in that situation.

2020 HOME AND AWAY: Was 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 31.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road...over the last three years, he is 6-2 with a 3.53 ERA (30 er in 76.1 ip) and five home runs in 76.1 innings over 14 starts in Oakland, 7-6 with a 4.32 ERA (39 er in 81.1 ip) and 14 home runs in 81.1 innings over 15 starts on the road.

2020 NIGHT AND DAY: Made eight of his 11 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was 2-4 with a 6.16 ERA during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night...his career numbers are 8-9 with a 4.82 ERA (62 er in 115.2 ip) in 31 games during the day, 11-6 with a 3.97 ERA (68 er in 154.0 ip) in 41 contests at night.

2020 THE WEST AND THE REST: Was 3-2 with a 3.61 ERA and .236 opponents batting average in eight starts against American League West competition, 0-3 with a 13.50 ERA and .391 opponents average in three interleague starts...is now 11-5 with a 3.61 ERA (56 er in 139.2 ip) in 34 career appearances against AL West competition, 8-10 with a 5.12 ERA (74 er in 130.0 ip) in 38 games against all other teams...is 2-5 with an 8.38 ERA (36 er in 38.2 ip) in 11 career interleague appearances.

2020 THIS AND THAT: The A's were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments... had two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings... went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA in six starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...had 10 of his 28 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and had a 4.75 RSA for the season...won both of his starts with support of three or more runs and is now 13-1 in 16 career starts with at least three runs of support.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and had a no decision in a 7-3, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (AL)...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the A's 13th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 15 years...was just the second foreign-born Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Ariel Prieto, April 2, 1997)...allowed just one run in 4.0 innings...took the loss in his second start on July 29 against Colorado, snapping a career-high five-game winning streak dating back to May 17, 2019...then picked up the win in back-to-back starts on Aug. 3 at Seattle and Aug. 8 against Houston for his only winning streak of the season...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings in each start...was named American League Player of the Week for the week of Aug. 3-9 after going 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA in two starts...struck out 14, walked four and allowed six hits in 14.0 innings...it was his first career Player of the Week honor...was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA in four starts when he was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness...allowed a career-high nine runs in 1.2 innings in his next start on Aug. 18 at Arizona, which was his shortest career outing as a starter...that began a season-ending stretch where he went 1-4 with a 8.70 ERA in six starts...lost his second consecutive decision in the second game of the Aug. 29 doubleheader at Houston, snapping a seven-game winning streak against AL West competition...was placed on the paternity list on Sept. 14...was reinstated Sept. 17 and allowed three home runs in a game for the first time in his career in his next start on Sept. 22 at Los Angeles (NL)...started the A's final game of the season on Sept. 27 against Seattle and struck out a career-high 13 batters on a career-high 113 pitches in 6.0 innings...the strikeouts were the most by an A's pitcher since Todd Stottlemire had 15 on June 16, 1995 against Kansas City and they tied for the seventh best single game performance in Oakland history...they matched the most in Athletics history by a pitcher with six innings or fewer...Vida Blue also had 13 in 6.0 innings on April 9, 1971 against Kansas City...it was his third career 10-strikeout game...was 1-1 with a 9.53 ERA and .346 opponents batting average in two games, including one start, in his postseason debut...picked up the win in relief in the A's series-clinching, 6-4 victory over Chicago in Game 3 of the ALWCSS (2.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so)...then took the loss in the deciding Game 4 of the ALDCS against Houston at Dodger Stadium, an 11-6 A's loss (3.2 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 3 so, 2 hr).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHERS

LHP Cole Irvin (0-2, 7.45 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...it is the 22nd appearance and sixth start of his career...has taken the loss in each of his first two starts, both against Houston, and now has a career-high four-game losing streak dating back to May 22, 2019...his last win came on May 17, 2019 against Colorado...begins his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-2 A's loss at Houston on April 8 (5.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...has never faced the Tigers in his career...went 1-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in five spring appearances, including three starts...walked just three batters in 18.0 innings and struck out 18... had two stints with Philadelphia last year and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings

- Begins his 10th season in the majors and is on his seventh Opening Day roster (2014-16, 18-21).
- Struck out his 500th career batter (Yordan Alvarez) on April 2.
- Walked the first batter he faced during the spring but then retired each of the final 18 batters he faced...opponents went 0-for-18 in his six appearances and he did not allow a run in 6.0 innings.
- Has posted a 1.98 ERA (3 er in 13.2 ip) with 17 strikeouts over 15 career outings against the Tigers.
- Last faced Detroit twice on Sept. 6, 2019, when he appeared in the completion of a suspended game from May 19, 2019, and also pitched in the regularly scheduled game...as a result, statistically speaking, Diekman pitched for two teams in two different cities on May 19 (also against Los Angeles-AL for Kansas City).
- Did not allow a run during the day last year and after Saturday's outing, and now has a 14-game, 15.0 ip scoreless streak over the last two seasons.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

- Was selected from the A's alternate site April 8.
- Begins his fifth season in the majors and is with his fifth team (Pittsburgh, 2015; Los Angeles-AL, 2016-17; Milwaukee, 2019; Philadelphia, 2020)...
- Did not allow a run in 6.2 innings over seven outings this spring...struck out 12 batters and held opponents to a .136 average (3-for-22).
- Tossed 3.0 scoreless innings against Arizona on Tuesday, tied for the longest outing of his career (3 times, also: June 30, 2015 vs. Detroit and July 15, 2015 vs. St. Louis with Pittsburgh).
- Has allowed one run over 5.0 innings against the Tigers in his career but has not faced them since 2017 with the Angels.
